NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK: INF Michael Massey and OF Nate Eaton have had impressive starts to their Triple-A careers. Massey is slashing .293/.348/.512 through his first 11 games with the Storm Chasers after being assigned to Omaha from Double-A Northwest Arkansas on June 14. Massey has failed to reach base in just one game during the first two series since joining the club and has a pair of homers for Omaha. Massey's slugging percentage and OPS are both third best on the active roster. Eaton has raised his batting average to .322 thanks to a stellar last week, now leading the team by almost 30 percentage points. His .600 slugging percentage and .992 OPS are second best on the team. Over the last four games, Eaton is hitting .600 (9-for-15) with a .647 on-base percentage (a walk and a hit-by-pitch).

STREAKING: Two Storm Chaser infielders are tied for the team's longest active hitting streak, with each streak starting on June 18 at Iowa. INF Michael Massey, and INF Vinnie Pasquantino are both riding seven-game hitting streaks. Each is also riding a nine-game on base streak that began two games earlier. Nick Pratto has reached base safely in eight games, a streak that also began during the same game as Massey and Pasquantino, on June 16.

ATTEMPT IF YOU DARE: Omaha catchers have allowed the fewest stolen bases in the all of Triple-A this season. The 31 stolen bases allowed is 13 fewer than second place Toledo. The Storm Chasers catch would-be base stealers 31.1 percent of the time, allowing the third lowest stolen base percentage in the league. C José Briceño has thrown out the runner 50 percent of the time, catching 3-of-6. C Freddy Fermin leads the team with six caught.

THEIVERY: Omaha has the second highest stolen base percentage in the International League. Omaha is stealing successfully 85.5 percent of the time, trailing the Memphis Redbirds by one percentage point. Omaha's 12 caught stealing is the second lowest mark in the league, while Jacksonville has only been caught 11 times but made 22 fewer attempts. Two Storm Chasers are now in the top-10 in stolen bases. OF Brewer Hicklen stole a pair of bases Thursday to move into a tie for ninth place in the International League at 15. Hicklen is the only member of the top 10 that has yet to be caught stealing. OF Dairon Blanco was caught stealing on Thursday, the first time he has been caught this season. He is also tied for ninth in the league with 15 stolen bases.

FOR OMAHA: LHP Marcelo Martinez is set to make his seventh start—12th total appearance—of the season for the Storm Chasers. In his last start, Martinez went 1.2 innings at Iowa, allowing four earned runs on six hits with one walk and a season-high eight strikeouts. Martinez started the season with Triple-A Omaha before being transferred to Double-A NW Arkansas, throwing three starts with the Naturals. The 25-year-old split the 2021 season between Triple-A Omaha and Double-A Northwest Arkansas, amassing a 6-9 record across 24 starts between the two levels. Martinez signed with the Royals organization in March of 2018 as an international free agent and has worked his way up through the Royals farm system. The Mexican native has played for Rookie-Level Burlington and Idaho Falls, Single-A Lexington, High-A Wilmington, Double-A Northwest Arkansas, and Triple-A Omaha, but is still waiting to make his Big-League Debut.

FOR COLUMBUS: RHP Peyton Battenfield is set to make his 15th start of the season for the Clippers. Battenfield started the series opener against Omaha on Tuesday, throwing 6.0 innings of scoreless baseball, allowing just four hits en route to his fifth win of the season. Battenfield has gone 6.0 innings or more during six of his 14 starts with five being quality starts. In 2021, Battenfield split time between the High-A and Double-A levels, posting a 7-1 record with a 2.53 ERA. The Oklahoma State University product was drafted by the Houston Astro organization in the 2019 MLB Draft. He was traded to the Tampa Bay Rays in Jan. of 2020 before landing in the Cleveland Guardians organization on July 30, 2021.

MARTINEZ NOTES

- Began the 2021 season with Double-A Northwest Arkansas and made seven starts before earning a promotion to Triple-A Omaha
- Combined for a Royals-organization-leading 24 starts and 112.2 innings between two levels in 2021
- Allowed a career-high 26 home runs, including 19 in 84.1 innings with Omaha
- Led the Storm Chasers in starts (17) and quality starts (5) while ranking second on the team in innings (84.1) and fourth in strikeouts (84)
- Posted a 2.82 ERA in 44.2 innings on the road and a 7.71 ERA in 39.2 innings at home in 2021
- Eclipsed 5.0 innings in 11 of 17 starts and completed 6.0 innings a team-best six times
- Went 19.1 innings from Sept. 2-Sept. 19, 2021, without issuing a walk, a streak that spanned his final five starts of the season
- Gave up career-high eight runs on nine hits in Triple-A debut on June 19, 2021 vs. LOU, exiting game with no outs in the third inning after allowing the first five batters to reach on leadoff walk and four straight hits, including a three-run homer
- Allowed career-high 10 hits on July 13, 2021 at Indianapolis, allowing three runs in 4.2 innings
- His combined 130.1 innings and 118 strikeouts in 2019 between Low-A Lexington and High-A Wilmington were both career bests
- Named Burlington's Pitcher of the Year in 2018, his first professional season in affiliated baseball, after leading the Appalachian League in ERA (2.68), strikeouts (71), K/9 (11.2), batting average against (.216), and WHIP (1.00)
- Signed with Kansas City as an international free agent on March 7, 2018
- Made four appearances in the Mexican League in 2017 with Sultanes de Monterrey, striking out three batters in 3.0 innings
- Pitched four seasons in the Mexican Pacific Winter League for Naranjeros de Hermosillo from 2017-2021, posting a 2.23 ERA in 72.2 innings across 54 games (one start)
