Dayton Dragons (0-2) at Lake County Captains (2-0)

RH Julian Aguiar/RH Jose Acuna vs. LH Rodney Boone

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) battle the Lake County Captains (affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians) in the last game of the three-games series and third game of the 2023 season for both teams.

Last Game: Friday: Lake County 1, Dayton 0. Captains reliever Tyler Thornton pitched out of a tough jam in the ninth inning to preserve a one-run lead as Lake County notched their second straight win over the Dragons to start the season. Dayton pitchers Thomas Farr, Braxton Roxby, and Javi Rivera combined to allow just three hits and two walks but the Dragons were 0 for 10 with runners in scoring position.

2022 Season Series: Captains 12, Dragons 10 (at Lake County: Captains 6, Dragons 4). The two clubs will meet 18 times in 2023 including 12 times in Dayton. The next series between the two clubs is April 25-30 in Dayton.

More about 2022: Lake County reached the 2022 Midwest League Championship Series, losing the final game of a best-of-three set against league champion South Bend. In 2022, Dayton finished the first half with a record of 39-27, one game behind Great Lakes. Lake County finished third in the first half at 35-31, five games out of first. Dayton finished the second half at 28-34, in fourth place, 12.5 games behind first place Lake County, who went 41-22 to earn a playoff berth. Lake County defeated Great Lakes, two games to one, to win the Division Series of the playoffs. Dayton finished the 2022 season with a record of 67-61 while Lake County finished at 76-53, the best full-season record in the league.

Familiar Opponents: The two clubs should hold a high level of familiarity with the opposition. Affiliates of the Reds and Guardians met six times during the 17-game spring training season from March 13-April 2. The two organizations train at adjacent complexes in Goodyear, Arizona.

Home Opener: The Dragons 23rd home "Opening Night" game is set for Tuesday, April 11 when they host the Great Lakes Loons at Day Air Ballpark at 7:05 p.m. For Dragons season tickets, single-game tickets, and group options, go to daytondragons.com/tickets.

Basics for 2023

- This is the third year in which the league is classified at the High-A level of Minor League Baseball. The Midwest League was a Low-A league prior to 2021. The 12-team Midwest League operates with two six-team divisions.
- Each team in the Midwest League is scheduled to play a 132-game schedule in 2023 (66 home games).
- The Midwest League will continue to utilize a Pitch Timer to encourage a quicker pace of play. Pitchers are required to deliver each pitch within a 12-second time limit (or 18 seconds with a runner on base). Defensive positioning rules require at least two infielders on each side of second base, with at least four infielders positioned on the infield dirt. Pitchers are limited in the number of unsuccessful pick-off throws they can make to a base. The third pick-off throw must result in an out, or the runner will be awarded the next base.
- Roster limits in 2023 are set at 30 players, the same as in 2021-22, after teams had played with 25-player limits in previous years.

Team Notes

- The Dragons roster is headlined by Edwin Arroyo, a shortstop who entered spring training as the Reds #3 prospect (based on *MLB.com* and *Baseball America*). Arroyo is the 10th player in Dragons history to enter a season ranked as the Reds #3 prospect or higher based on *Baseball America's* list. Others have included Homer Bailey, Adam Dunn, Jay Bruce, Billy Hamilton, and Hunter Greene.
- The Dragons roster includes three of the top 22 players in *MLB.com's* ranking of top Reds prospects. They include Arroyo (#3); outfielder Jay Allen II (#13); and outfielder Austin Hendrick (#22).
- The roster includes 20 players who spent all or part of the 2022 season with the Dragons, led by Hendrick, who finished second on the team in both home runs and RBI. Four of the top seven in base hits for the 2022 Dragons return, including Justice Thompson (3rd in hits), Mat Nelson (4th), Hendrick (5th), and Tyler Callihan (7th). Returning starting pitcher Thomas Farr led the 2022 Dragons in innings. Reliever Donovan Benoit led the Dragons in saves in 2022 with 13, finishing second in the entire Reds farm system.
- Nelson led the entire nation in home runs at the college level in 2021 at Florida State University.
- The Dragons roster includes five players selected in the first three rounds of the draft: Austin Hendrick (1st round, 2020); Jay Allen II (1st round, 2021); Mat Nelson (supplemental 1st round, 2021); Edwin Arroyo (2nd round, 2021); and Tyler Callihan (3rd round, 2019).

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

Brian LaHair is in his second season as Dragons manager and his sixth year in the Reds organization. Under LaHair's leadership last season, the Dragons posted a first half record of 39-27 to finish second in the Midwest League's East Division, one game out of first place. The 2022 Dragons broke the club record for home runs in a season, leading the league with 152. The Dragons also narrowly missed leading the league in stolen bases, finishing with five fewer than the league leader despite playing four fewer games. LaHair served as manager with the Reds affiliate in the Arizona Complex League in 2021 and was the manager at Billings in 2019. LaHair opened his coaching career as the Billings hitting coach in 2018. As a player, LaHair played professionally for 14 seasons from 2003-14 and 2016-17, appearing in more than 1,000 games. He was primarily a first baseman but also saw considerable time as a corner outfielder. He played in 195 major league games with the Seattle Mariners and Chicago Cubs. In 2012, he appeared in the MLB All-Star Game. LaHair played for TEAM USA's national team three times (2005 World Cup, 2006 regional Olympic qualifier, 2007 Olympic qualifier). LaHair led all of Minor League Baseball in home runs in 2011 with 38 with the Iowa Cubs and was selected as the Pacific Coast League Most Valuable Player. LaHair, 40, is a native of Worcester, Massachusetts and was chosen as the 2000 Massachusetts High School Player of the Year. He was selected by the Mariners in the 39th round of the 2002 draft out of St. Petersburg College in Florida.

Todd Naskedov (NASK-uh-duv) joins the Dragons as pitching coach in 2023, his second season in the Reds organization. The 2023 season is Naskedov's sixth year in professional baseball after more than 20 years as a coach at the high school or college levels. He was the pitching coach at Single-A Daytona in the Reds organization in 2022. Naskedov spent four years as a coach in the Houston Astros organization before joining the Reds. He was the pitching coach at Single-A Fayetteville in 2021 after three years as the Astros pitching rehab coordinator at their complex in West Palm Beach, Florida. Naskedov coached college or high school baseball in Arizona, Oregon, Texas, and Washington, has coached with USA Baseball's national team, and has coached abroad in the United Kingdom and the Netherlands as a Major League Baseball international envoy. Naskedov, 46, is originally from Kelso, Washington.

Eric Richardson joins the Dragons as hitting coach in 2023, his second season in the Reds organization and 10th year as a professional coach. He was the hitting coach at Double-A Chattanooga in 2022. Richardson began his coaching career in the Phillies organization with stints as hitting coach with Single-A Lakewood in 2004; the GCL Phillies in 2005; and Short-Season Batavia in 2006. He served as the hitting coach in the White Sox organization with Great Falls for three seasons from 2017-2019. Richardson played for seven seasons in the White Sox organization from 1991-97, spending two years in the Midwest League with South Bend. In 1994, Richardson played in the outfield with NBA legend Michael Jordan during spring training in Jordan's lone season as a professional baseball player. Richardson was a base stealing threat, leading the South Atlantic League in stolen bases in 1993. Richardson, 50, was drafted by the White Sox in the fifth round in 1991 out of Brenham High School in Texas.

Osmín Meléndez joins the Dragons as a coach in 2023, his first year in the Reds organization and 21st year in coaching in professional baseball. Meléndez served as a coach in the Chicago Cubs system for seven seasons from 2013-19 after coaching in the Pirates organization for 13 years. He spent the 2015 season in the Midwest League as the infield coach with South Bend. Meléndez began coaching as the coordinator of the Pirates academy in Venezuela from 1999-2011. He was the manager of the Pirates affiliate in the Venezuelan Summer League for six seasons, 2006-2011. His teams posted a record of 272-142 (.657), earning the VSL's best regular season record all six years and winning the league championship in 2008 and 2010. He served as manager of the Cubs affiliate in the Venezuelan Summer League in 2013. He was the hitting coach for the AZL Cubs in 2014 and 2017. He was the hitting/infield coach at Double-A Tennessee in 2016; the hitting coach at Short-Season Eugene in 2018; and the hitting/infield coach with Single-A Myrtle Beach in 2019. Meléndez is a former infielder who played for two seasons with the GCL Orioles in the Baltimore Orioles organization, 1993-94. Meléndez, 47, was born in Barquisimeto, Venezuela and currently resides in Orlando, Florida.
