STILL UNDEFEATED: The Omaha Storm Chasers prepare for their first doubleheader of the season on Thursday after Wednesday's game was postponed due to rain. On Tuesday, the Storm Chasers beat the Indianapolis Indians, 4-1, on Opening Day at Victory Field behind 4.0 scoreless innings from RHP Ronald Bolaños, a 461-ft., two-run homer from OF JaCoby Jones, and 5.0 combined innings of one-run ball from the bullpen. After scoring two runs in the fifth thanks to RBI singles from INF Clay Dungan and C MJ Melendez, Omaha added a pair on Jones' home run in the sixth. After Indianapolis scored its lone run in the sixth on a solo home run from Cal Mitchell, LHP Sam Freeman, RHP Jose Cuas, and RHP Arodys Vizcaino combined for 3.1 scoreless innings of relief with four strikeouts to secure the win.

FEELIN' 2022: 2022 marks the 11th season of Storm Chasers baseball (2011-pres.) and the 53rd season in franchise history (1969-pres.). Since 1969, 1,311 players have appeared in either an American Association, Pacific Coast League, or Triple-A East game. Of those 1,311 players, 982 (75%) have appeared in a Major League game. 309 players in franchise history (24%) made their debut with Omaha prior to their Major League debut.

THE MIGHTY THOR: Scott Thorman embarks on his first season as the manager of the Omaha Storm Chasers, taking over for Brian Poldberg, who retired from managing following the 2021 season. Thorman, who played for Omaha in 2009 and 2010, is the 19th manager in franchise history and the sixth Omaha manager to have previously played for the franchise. He has won Minor League titles in each of the last three seasons, winning with Double-A Northwest Arkansas in 2021, High-A Wilmington in 2019, and Low-A Lexington in 2018. Thorman, 40, was drafted by the Atlanta Braves in the first round (30th overall) of the 2000 MLB Draft and later made his Major League debut with Atlanta on June 18, 2006. A Kitchener, Ontario, Canada, native, Thorman began his coaching career in 2014 as the bench coach for the Burlington Royals under manager Tommy Shields, who serves as the Storm Chasers' bench coach in 2022.

RETURN OF THE KING: C MJ Melendez, who led all of Minor League Baseball with 41 total home runs in 2021, returns to the Storm Chasers to begin the 2022 season. Melendez split the 2021 season between Double-A Northwest Arkansas and Triple-A Omaha, batting .288/.386/.625. In addition to leading the minors in home runs, he ranked second in RBIs (103), fourth in extra-base hits (66), and fourth in OPS (1.011) to earn Top Offensive Player honors as part of MiLB Award voting. Melendez enters the 2022 season as the No. 3 prospect in the Royals organization per MLB Pipeline and the No. 62 prospect in baseball.

PARTY WITH A CAPITAL P: 1B Nick Pratto (No. 3) and 1B Vinnie Pasquantino (No. 5) each rank among MLB Pipeline's Top 10 First Basemen prospects. Pratto, the Royals' No. 3 prospect and No. 62 prospect in baseball per MLB Pipeline, returns to the Storm Chasers after making his Triple-A debut in 2021. He finished the 2021 season second in Minor League Baseball in extra-base hits (71), tied for second in home runs (36), third in RBIs (98), tied for third in runs (98) and fifth in walks (83). Pasquantino, who ranks as the organization's No. 5 prospect per MLB Pipeline, tallied the same number of walks (64), strikeouts (64), and extra-base hits (64) across 116 games between High-A Quad Cities and Double-A Northwest Arkansas in 2021.

FOR OMAHA, GAME ONE: LHP Austin Cox makes his season debut in Game 1 and his second career Triple-A start (third appearance). He made his Triple-A debut with Omaha against Indianapolis on Sept. 26, 2021 at Werner Park in the 2021 home finale, recording his first Triple-A strikeout in a scoreless inning before allowing five runs on three homers in his second inning of relief. Cox made his first Triple-A start on Oct. 2, 2021 at Iowa, allowing five runs on five hits while walking three, hitting two batters, and striking out two in 3.0 innings. A fifth-round pick (152nd overall) out of Mercer University in 2018, Cox posted a 3.00 ERA across 15 starts with Double-A Northwest Arkansas in 2021. The 26-year-old earned a non-roster invite to Major League Spring Training in 2022, throwing 2.0 perfect innings with three strikeouts.

FOR OMAHA, GAME TWO: LRHP Jonathan Heasley takes the hill in Game 2 in what will be his Triple-A debut. The 24-year-old posted a 3.33 ERA in 22 games (21 starts) with Double-A Northwest Arkansas last season before making his Major League debut with Kansas City—skipping Triple-A—on Sept. 17, 2021 vs. Seattle. He made three starts for the Royals in 2021, recording a 4.31 ERA in 14.2 innings with six strikeouts and three walks. During 2022 Major League Spring Training, he allowed 10 runs on 12 hits in 8.0 innings (an 11.25 ERA) with seven walks and five strikeouts.

FOR INDIANAPOLIS, GAME ONE: LHP Cam Vieaux starts Game One for Indianapolis and will make his first career start against Omaha. Vieaux split the 2021 season between Double-A Altoona and Triple-A Indianapolis, posting a 3.68 ERA in 44.0 innings across 17 outings (five starts) with the Curve and a 7.67 ERA in 29.1 innings across eight starts with the Indians. A sixth-round pick by Pittsburgh in 2016, Vieaux pitched three seasons at Michigan State University from 2014-2016.

FOR INDIANAPOLIS, GAME TWO: RHP Beau Sulser starts Game Two for Indianapolis. He spent all of 2021 with the Indians, pitching to a 5.65 ERA in 122.2 innings—fifth-most in Triple-A East—across 26 outings (including 24 starts, tied for the most in the league). Sulser faced Omaha three times last season, combining to allow 19 runs on 23 hits—including six home runs—in 11.0 innings (15.55 ERA) with nine walks and eight strikeouts. On Sept. 25, 2021 against Omaha at Werner Park, Sulser yielded a career-high 10 runs on nine hits—including three home runs—in 3.2 innings with three walks and three strikeouts, getting ejected from the game in the fourth inning following allowing a two-run home run to former Omaha 1B/DH Ryan McBroom.

DOPPLER RADAR: SS/3B Bobby Witt Jr., who played for Omaha in 2021 and enters 2022 as the No. 1 prospect in baseball per MLB Pipeline, is poised to make his Major League debut with Kansas City on Opening Day at Kauffman Stadium against Cleveland. Witt Jr. was named *Baseball America* Minor League Player of the Year in 2021, batting .290/.361/.575 with 99 runs scored, 35 doubles, 33 home runs, 97 RBIs, and 29 stolen bases in 123 games between Double-A Northwest Arkansas and Triple-A Omaha.

- Earned non-roster invite to 2022 Major League Spring Training, throwing 2.0 perfect innings with three strikeouts
- Enters 2022 as the No. 19 prospect in the Royals organization per MLB Pipeline
- Spent most of 2021 season with Double-A Northwest Arkansas before finishing the year with Triple-A Omaha and making his Triple-A debut
- Made 2021 debut on 5/26 vs. San Antonio after dealing with arm soreness to start the season
- Posted a 5.06 ERA in five Double-A starts in June before recording a 1.80 ERA in five starts in July
- Earned Double-A Central Pitcher of the Week honors with a 7.0-inning complete game on 8/4 @ Arkansas

- Earned South Atlantic League Midseason All-Star honors in 2019 with Low-A Lexington, earning a promotion to High-A Wilmington in the second half of the season
- Helped Blue Rocks win 2019 Carolina League Championship, throwing 12.0 scoreless innings with 14 strikeouts across two postseason starts
- Spent first professional season with rookie-level Burlington, posting a 3.78 ERA across nine starts
- Pitched three seasons at Mercer University (2016-2018), the same college as fellow Royals minor leaguer and current teammate Brandon Barker

- Was a two-sport athlete in high school, lettering in baseball and football and serving as captain of both teams

HEASLEY NOTES

- Made four outings (two starts) during 2022 Major League Spring Training, posting a 11.25 ERA in 8.0 innings, allowing 10 runs on 12 hits (including three home runs) with five strikeouts and seven walks
- Made his Major League debut with Kansas City on Sept. 17, 2021 vs. Seattle, allowing four runs on six hits—including two home runs—with two strikeouts and one hits batter in 4.0 innings
- Upon his MLB debut, became the fifth member of the Royals' 2018 draft class to make a start in 2021, marking the first instance of an organization have five pitchers from the same draft class (Brady Singer, Jackson Kowar, Kris Bubic, Daniel Lynch, Jonathan Heasley) make a start in the same season in MLB history
- Spent all of 2021 with Double-A Northwest Arkansas prior to making his MLB debut, earning a promotion from Double-A and skipping Triple-A Omaha
- Did not allow more than two earned runs in his first five starts with the Naturals, posting a 1.78 ERA in 25.1 innings in May
- Threw a 7.0-inning, complete-game shutout on Aug. 14, 2021 (1) vs. Frisco, striking out five, allowing five hits and vomiting behind the mound before delivering a 3-2 pitch with two outs to record the final out
- Recorded a 1.00 ERA across five starts in August with Northwest Arkansas
- Spent the 2020 season at the Royals' Alternate Site in Kansas City, Kan., and then participated in the organization's postseason camp at Kauffman Stadium
- Earned Lexington Pitcher of the Year honors with the Legends in 2019, ranking third in the South Atlantic League in ERA (3.12) and opponent's batting average (.222) among qualified starters
- Made two starts during the 2019 postseason, allowing three runs across 12.0 combined innings to help lead Legends to South Atlantic League Championship
