TAYLOR, PODKUL HOMER EN ROUTE TO FOURTH STRAIGHT VICTORY: Samad Taylor and Nick Podkul delivered two-run home runs, and five Fisher Cats relievers combined to hold the Baysox to five runs as New Hampshire won the series opener, 10-5. Sean Rackoski picked up his first win of the season, as he, Mike Ellenbest, Marcus Reyes, Will McAffer, and Andrew McInvale combined to lead the 'Cats to their fourth straight win. Samad Taylor's home run was his league-leading 12th of the season and his ninth in the month of June, tying the single-month franchise record (Eric Thames and David Smith).

A WALK IN THE PARK, OR 13? The Fisher Cats set their season record for walks last night, taking 13 free passes over the course of the game. Gabriel Moreno took four, Otto Lopez took three, and Nick Podkul, Austin Martin, and Brock Lundquist took two walks each. The previous single-game high for walks this season was seven, and the all-time Fisher Cats record for walks in a game is 14.

MORENO WINS AWARD, SHOWS VERSATILITY: Gabriel Moreno was named as the Double-A Northeast player of the week on Monday after hitting three home runs and driving in ten in the series against Hartford. He currently leads the league in average (.388), on-base percentage (.438), runs batted in (40), and OPS (1.128). On Sunday, Moreno played third base for the first time in his professional career. Moreno was initially a shortstop but was converted into a catcher upon signing with Toronto as a 16-year old. Moreno was also named to MLB Pipeline's Prospect Team of the Week, becoming the first player in the Blue Jays organization to do so this year.

BOB LIPMAN'S THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS HISTORY: June 23, 2013- The Fisher Cats scored an easy 7-0 win in just 2:19 at Harrisburg behind a complete-game, three-hitter by Marcus Walden (90 pitches, 64 strikes). Brian Van Kirk and Kevin Ahrens each drove in a pair of runs to give New Hampshire a series win.

MANCHESTER BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: Lourdes Gurriel Jr. delivered a go-ahead double in the top of the ninth, as the Blue Jays defeated the Marlins in game one of their two-game series. Jordan Romano delivered the save, as the Jays improved to one game over .500. Elsewhere, Nate Pearson was placed on the 7 day IL with a right groin strain, as Buffalo's game got postponed due to contact tracing within the Mets organization. Dunedin and St. Lucie were rained out in Florida, and Vancouver scored twice in the top of the ninth but could not work the tying run across in their 4-3 loss to Eugene.

COMING UP: The Fisher Cats take on Bowie for the first and only time this season, before returning to Manchester for their fourth series of the season against the Portland Sea Dogs.

ROSTER MOVES: June 22: OF Demi Orimoloye placed on development list. **June 21:** LHP Marcus Reyes and OF Tanner Kirwer added from Adv. A Vancouver. RHP Connor Law transferred to Vancouver.

STARTERS: Johnny Barbato gets the start for New Hampshire today, coming off his only loss this season. He gave up career highs in runs, earned runs, and hits in his last outing against Hartford. This will be his fourth start since being signed by Toronto on June 3rd.

Opposite Barbato, Blaine Knight will be making his third start at the Double-A level. Knight's last appearance was a four inning outing in relief, where he allowed just one run on one hit last Thursday against Akron. His win was the last winning decision for any Baysox pitcher. Knight was a third round draft pick in 2018 out of Arkansas, where he went 14-0 his junior year, and he was promoted to the Baysox in early June.
