RHP SHAUN ANDERSON (1-0, 1.80) vs. RHP THOMAS PONTICELLI (0-3, 16.33)

TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes and Express meet for the first of three series between the clubs in 2024, including two in the Duke City ... Albuquerque has won two straight for the second time this season (also: April 17-18 at El Paso) ... Thomas Ponticelli is expected to make his first career start against Round Rock while the Express are slated to send Shaun Anderson to the hill.

FRANCHISE RECORD: Sam Hilliard belted his 66th homer as an Isotope Saturday—tying the franchise record set by Jordan Patterson from 2016-18.

SWIPES: Albuquerque swiped one bag Sunday, giving them a stolen base in 10-straight games, tying the team record set Sept. 8-19, 2023. They have stolen multiple bases in six games during the stretch and 12 contests on the year.

MARGINS: Seven of the Isotopes eight wins in 2024 have been by a margin of three or fewer (other: 10-2, April 18 at El Paso).

THREE-BAGGERS: The Isotopes have a Triple-A leading 13 triples on the year (second: 11, Oklahoma City). They've tallied a triple in nine of 27 games.

LAST WEEK: At the plate last series, Albuquerque slashed .358/.443/.602 and tallied series highs in runs (54), hits (81), homers (11) and extra-base hits (32). They also tallied 15 stolen bases and scored at least nine runs in five of the six games.

WALK THIS WAY: The Isotopes pitching staff walked only one batter Sunday. It was the first time they have totaled three or fewer free passes in a two-game stretch since last May 11-12 at Las Vegas (also three) ... At the plate, the offense drew eight walk, matching the season-high set twice (also: April 20 at El Paso and April 3 at Oklahoma City).

TWO BLASTS: Ryan Ward connected on two more blasts for Oklahoma City, his second multi-homer performance of the week. It was the third time an opposing player went deep multiple times in a game this season.

LEAD CHANGE: Last series was the third time the Isotopes have been involved in a six-game set in which each club led at some point during every contest (also: Aug. 19-24, 2021 and July 26-31, 2022, both against Las Vegas).

BY WAY OF THE K: The Isotopes' 273 punchouts on the year are second in Triple-A (most: Norfolk, 277).

EXIT VELOCITY: Sam Hilliard tallied Isotopes two highest EV of year Sunday: 114.7 MPH line out and 113.6 double MPH.

HITTING STREAKS: Drew Romo extended his team-leading hitting streak to 15 Sunday, which is the second-longest active streak in Triple-A (longest: 17, Jonathan Arauz, OKC). Meanwhile, Aaron Schunk has a 14-gamer. Jimmy Herron, however, had his 14-game hit streak snapped Sunday.

TONY: Drew Romo is, six games away from matching his career-long hitting streak of 21 reached in 2021. He is slashing .397/.406/.524 with six doubles, a triple, 11 RBI and eight multi-hit contests during the stretch ... Has three consecutive games with multiple knocks for first time since Aug. 22-25, 2021 with Low-A Fresno. He has eight multi-hit games during stretch.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk extended his hit streak to 14 games with his second homer of the year Saturday, first since March 31 vs. El Paso. It's the longest hit streak of his professional career (previous: 13, June 13-July 6, 2023). During the stretch he is slashing .362/.415/.534 with seven doubles, a homer and 12 RBI. Has five multi-hit contests during stretch.

TAKE FLIGHT: Jimmy Herron saw his season-opening 14-game hit streak come to an end Sunday. He compiled a .296/.406/.537 slash line with two doubles, a triple, three homers and 12 RBI to start the campaign.

HE GETS ON-BASE: Herron did draw a walk, extending his on-base streak to 15 games ... Dating back to June 25, 2023, Herron has reached base in 60 of his last 66 ballgames.

FAN FAVORITE: Coco Montes went 2-for-4 Sunday, his fourth multi-hit game in last five played and 11th in 2024. Also extended his current on-base streak to 17 contests ... Has a modest five-game hitting streak (10x21 with two doubles, two homers and five RBI). Had five-game RBI streak snapped Sunday.

HOME SWEET HOME: Montes has a .348 batting average in 122 career games at Isotopes Park.

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard compiled his team-leading 12th multi-hit contest Sunday. He went 12-for-28 with five doubles, two homers, six RBI, and two steals during the OKC series. Has multiple hits in five of his last six contests.

GRANNY: Grant Lavigne launched a go-ahead two-run homer in the fifth Sunday, his third long ball in the past seven games.

PCL LEADERBOARD: Coco Montes is 1st in OBP (.454) and T-3rd in walks (21) ... Sam Hilliard is T-3rd in hits (31), 5th in OBP (.434), 8th in runs (22) and 9th in average (.333) ... Julio Carreras is T-3rd in triples (3).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
