Year in Review

Reading finished the 2023 season with a 59-77 record, which was two-wins shy of the 2022 marks, and the same number of losses. The R-Phils went 28-40 in the first half and finished last in the Eastern League. In the second half, Reading improved by three wins and finished with a 31-37 record, which was fourth in the Northeast Division.

Packing the Park

Reading's total attendance was 384,563, which was its highest total since 2019, when 406,307 fans attended games at FirstEnergy Stadium. But, that 2019 number includes postseason. When factoring in just regular season, it is the highest since the 2018 total of 388,511. An average of 5,916 fans attended games at FirstEnergy Stadium this season, which was the highest mark since 2017 of 6,054. Overall, Reading ranked fourth in the Eastern League in average home attendance and fourth in total attendance as well. The Fightin Phils also ranked fourth in Double-A in both average and total attendance. They ranked 21/120 in all of Minor League Baseball for average and 25/120 for total attendance. Reading played 65/69 scheduled openings in 2023. Factoring in the average of 5,916, if the R-Phils played all 69 openings, they would have an estimated attendance of 408,227, which would rank second in the Eastern League. The most attended game in 2023 was on May 27 against Harrisburg at 8,959, which was the Saturday of Memorial Day Weekend.

At the Plate

Reading set a team record for strikeouts for the second-straight year with 1,364, which surpassed last year's mark of 1,242. They also had the most strikeouts in the Eastern League in 2023. The R-Phils finished fifth in the Eastern League in hitting at .240. They began the season hot at the plate, leading the league with a .267 average in the first half. But, the Fightin Phils' offense tailed off down the stretch, hitting a league-worst .212 in the second half. Offensively, Reading scored 601 runs this season, which was their most since scoring 642 in 2017. Their 1,082 hits are their most since 1,104 in 2018. The R-Phils hit 159 home runs this season, which was their most since slugging 185 in 2016. It was just the fourth time in history Reading hit over 150 homers in a season (2023, 2017, 2016, 2004). Reading finished third in the Eastern League in home runs this season. Reading's 529 walks were their most since 533 in 2008. The R-Phils ranked second in the league with 229 doubles and third with a .406 slugging percentage. On the base paths, Reading swiped 119 bags, which was their most since 130 in 2010.

On the Mound

Reading pitching allowed 166 home runs in 2023, which came three shy of the team record for homers allowed of 169 in 1997. Late in games, Reading pitching had just 29 saves, which was their fewest since 2008. They issued 599 walks, which was the most since 617 in 1999. They did strike out 1,285 hitters this season, which is the second-most in team history. The record was 1,310 strikeouts from last season. Defensively, Reading committed 110 errors, which was their most since 114 in 2008. The R-Phils did not commit over 100 errors in a season from 2019-21. Reading had a starter going 6+ innings 29 times this season and was 16-13 in such games. A starter went 7+ innings three times (McGarry, Abel, Osterberg) was was 2-1 in such games.

Franchise Milestone Watch

The Fightin Phils are 79 wins away from 4,000 wins as a Phillies' affiliate (since 1967). They're 126 wins away from 5,000 wins as a Minor League organizations, which dates back to 1952.

Sharing Names

Two players that played for Reading in 2023 shared names with former R-Phils. Shortstop Pedro Martinez is the second player with that name to play for the R-Phils. Famously, Hall of Fame pitcher Pedro Martinez made a rehab start with Reading in 2009. Relief pitcher Jake Thompson is also the second player to hold that name to play for Reading. Starting Pitcher Jake Thompson played for Reading in 2015. Thompson was acquired in the 2015 Cole Hamels trade.

Roster Breakdown

In total, 61 different players suited up for the R-Phils in 2023. There were 24 hitters and 37 pitchers. 37 of the 61 players were either drafted or signed by the Phillies originally. Of the current Top 30 Phillies Prospects (via MLB Pipeline) six played for Reading in 2023 (Abel, McGarry, De La Cruz, Kerkerling, Wilson and McCollum).

Fightin to the Big Leagues

Two members of the 2023 R-Phils made their major league debuts this year. Johan Rojas was called up in July and Orion Kerkerling in September. Both were on the Phillies postseason roster. Drew Ellis played for Reading this season and also played in big leagues games in 2023, but he had previously made his MLB debut with Arizona in 2021. Nine players with big league service time (before or after Reading stint) appeared for Reading this season (Rojas, Kerkerling, Ellis, Crouse, Uelman, Moore, Alvarado, Suraz, Nelson). Alvarado, Suarez and Nelson were all big-league rehab assignments. Noah Song (2023 Rule Five) also made a rehab appearances, but he does not have big league service time.

Postseason Accolades

At the conclusion of the Minor League season, Johan Rojas and Orion Kerkerling received the Paul Owens Award. The award is annually given out to the top pitcher and hitter in the Phillies organization. Both Carlos De La Cruz (1B) and Oliver Dunn (2B) were named Eastern League All-Stars after the season. Also, five members of the 2023 R-Phils were invited to participate in the Arizona Fall League (Dunn, Kroon, Baker, Pipkin, Martinez). Orion Kerkerling was also named to the MiLB Prospect Team of the Year.

Pipeline to Allentown

In total, 17 R-Phils were called up to Triple-A Lehigh Valley in 2023. Most notably, Phillies No. 2 Prospect Mick Abel received a promotion to the IronPigs on September 22, after Reading's season concluded.

League Leaders

A variety of R-Phils led the league in various categories. Carlos De La Cruz finished 2023 with the most hits in the Eastern League at 132. Matthew Kroon qualified for the highest average in the league at .319. Oliver Dunn led the league in OBP (.396) and OPS (.902). Dunn also led the league in walks (82) and extra-base hits (52), while De La Cruz paced the league in total bases at 231. Keylan Killgore appeared in the most games of all Eastern League pitchers at 46. On the mound, David Parkinson finished the season fourth in the league in ERA (3.56), wins (9) and innings pitched (126.1). Parkinson was also third in winning percentage (.643) and seventh in strikeouts (131). Mick Abel finished ninth in the league in strikeouts at 126.

Team Awards

At the end of the season, Reading handed out various team awards. Oliver Dunn was MVP, David Parkinson Pitcher of the Year, Parkinson and Mick Abel Strikeout Leaders, Johan Rojas the Stolen Base Leader, Madison Stokes the Unsung Hero, Josh Hendrickson the Community Service Award, Carlos De La Cruz the Big Stick Award and Oliver Dunn won the Most Clutch Player Award.

Going Going Gone

Carlos De La Cruz's 24 home runs in 2023 were the most by an R-Phil since Mitch Walding hit 25 in 2017. De La Cruz fell one home run short of becoming the 20th player in Reading history with 25 home runs in a season. He finished tied for third in the league with his 24 home runs and second in the Phillies organization, behind Lehigh Valley's Weston Wilson's 31. Just five players hit 20+ home runs in 2023 and Reading had two of them, with Oliver Dunn hitting 21.

Inside the Numbers

Reading was vastly better on the road this season, going 36-33, compared to 23-44 at home. The R-Phils won seven series, lost 13 and split four. Friday's were the best day, going 12-10 and Sunday's the worst at 9-14. August was their best month of the year at 13-12, which was Reading's only winning month of the season. They won their most games in road grey uniforms (25-33) and was also above .500 in Navy (6-5). When scoring first, Reading was 35-30. Five runs was the magic number, as Reading was 39-18 when scoring 5+ runs and just 19-60 when scoring less than five. Reading was 47-16 when outhitting opponents, and was 10-60 when being outhit. Reading went 46-58 vs the Northeast Division and 13-19 against the Southwest. Their best record against an opponent was 14-10 vs Hartford. They also owned winning records against Portland (11-9) and Somerset (10-8).

2023 R-PHILS GAME NOTES

April Notes

New Skipper

With Shawn Williams' relocation to the Phillies complex in Clearwater, the R-Phils welcome Al Pedrique as the manager for the 2023 season. Pedrique brings years of both playing and coaching in the minor leagues. Most recently, he served as the third-base coach for the Miami Marlins. Prior to that, Pedrique managed Miami's triple-A affiliate, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp. He also has experience coaching within the Diamondbacks, Astros, Yankees and many more organizations.

Loaded with Prospects

Reading's Opening Day lineup features five of the Phillies top-30 prospects. Mick Abel ranks second, Johan Rojas sixth, Carlos De La Cruz ninth, Ethan Wilson 14th and Andrew Baker 17th. All those players spent time in Reading last season.

Put it in the Rearview Mirror

The R-Phils continued to struggle to open the season as they were swept out by the Richmond Flying Squirrels in an opening day doubleheader on Apr. 8. Richmond outscored Reading 14-8 over the three game series. Bright sports in the series was a two-run homerun from McCarthy Tatum and Carlos De La Cruz has hits in the first three games of the season. Reading is 0-3 for the first time since 2021, and third time in last five years. In 2006, the R-Phils lost their first three games and went on to drop six of their first seven games.

De La Cruzin'

Carlos De La Cruz has been one of the bright spots for Reading to open the season. He owns hits in the R-Phils first three games, including a double that was roped to straightaway center field in Sunday's game at Richmond. De La Cruz, who ranks as the Phillies number-nine prospect, leads the team with a .444 average. The 6'8" De La Cruz has also split time early in the year in both the outfield and first base.

Runnin' Rojas

Johan Rojas snapped a three-game hitless spell Apr. 11 with two hits against Hartford. Rojas also added two stolen bases to lift his season total to three. Rojas is someone who can elicit lots of damage on the base paths. In 2022, Rojas swiped 62 bags between high-A Jersey Shore and double-A Reading.

Carlos De La Crushed

Carlos De La Cruz continued his red-hot start to the season on Apr. 12. De La Cruz went 3-5, including a long home run and also a then-game-tying RBI single in the 8th. The Phillies ninth-ranked prospect enters tonight hitting .389 to lead the team. He also has a home run and two RBI. Carlos De La Cruz continued his red-hot start to the season on Apr. 13. De La Cruz smoked a long home run into the brand-new Redner's Event Center in right-center field. It was the second-straight night De La Cruz hit a home run. De La Cruz hit home runs in back-to-back games once last season, on July 26 and 27 for Jersey Shore. He also did it once in 2019 for Lakewood and in 2018 for the Phillies Rookie Team. De La Cruz has never hit a home run in three-straight games.

Wacky Numbers

When looking at Reading's early-season results, there are a lot of numbers that stand out. The R-Phils lead the entire Eastern League in hitting at .265, but ranks 10th in runs scored with 29, which is good for 4.1 per game. The R-Phils early-season achilles heal has been its pitching. Reading ranks in the bottom-half of the league in all major pitching categories through seven games.

Early Game Success

One part of the game the R-Phils have found success in has been the first inning. In the first inning of games, Reading is outscoring opponents by seven runs. But, over the rest of the game, opponents are outscoring the R-Phils by 16 runs. The third inning has been a struggle spot for Reading, as opponents are outscoring the R-Phils by six runs in the frame.

Home Cookin'

Reading, wearing its famous Hot Dogs uniforms, cooked up a dominant 7-1 win over the Hartford Yard Goats on Apr. 16. It was the R-Phils best all-around game of the season. The bats collected 11 hits, including three from Johan Rojas. Rojas and Carlos De La Cruz both also hit home runs in the win. The R-Phils bullpen, which has struggled this season, dazzled with 4.2 innings of no-hit baseball to close the game.

Carlos De La Crushed

On Apr. 16, Carlos De La Cruz hit his team-leading third home run of the season. De La Cruz has started every game this season for the R-Phils and is third on the team amongst qualifiers in hitting with a .343 average. The Phillies ninth-ranked prospect also is moving to first base from the outfield this season.

Recent Razzle Dazzle

After early-season struggles, the R-Phils bullpen has looked strong the last two games on Apr. 16 and 18. Reading's bullpen has allowed just one run and two hits between Sunday's win against Hartford and last night at Portland. Last night, the R-Phils bullpen went four innings of one run ball.

Madison Stokes

After starting the season on the development list, Madison Stokes has looked strong in his first two starts. After three hits in Apr. 16's win over Hartford, Stokes added two more hits, including the eventual game-winning RBI in Apr. 18's win against Portland. Through two starts, Stokes is 5-8 at the plate.

Away From Home

While still early, Reading's offense has performed drastically different when at home, versus on the road. In five games away from FirstEnergy Stadium, the Fightin Phils are hitting .190, which compares to .303 at home. The R-Phils are also scoring two more runs per game at home, while additionally having picked up 23 extra base hits (eight home runs) at the friendly confines, compared to just 9 (2 home runs) while away.

Fielding Finding its Footing

After a struggle in the field to open the season, Reading's defense has been a bright spot these last few games. After ranking at the bottom of the league in fielding percentage, the R-Phils now rank 8th in the Eastern League. The R-Phils have now gone four-straight games without a defensive error.

Win the Battle Johan

After a slow start to the season, R-Phils center fielder Johan Rojas has been red hot. Over his last 10 games, Rojas is hitting .310 and also owns a six-game hitting streak, with hits in 8/9. The Phillies sixth-ranked prospect has led off and played in center field for every game this season.

Road Blues Reversed?

While still early, Reading's offense has performed drastically different when at home, versus on the road. But on Apr. 22 that trend seemed to reverse, at least for the night. The R-Phils raised its road scoring average by one whole run and boasted its batting average away from home into the .200s, after sitting below the Mendoza line for their first six road contests of the season.

Oliver Getting it Dunn

Oliver Dunn reached base five times on Apr. 22, which included a season-high three hits. Dunn now has six multi-hit games on the young season so far. The three-hit affair was Dunn's first since Apr. 9, 2022, when he played for Somerset, and it came against the Reading Fightin Phils.

Home Luck

Though early, the Fightin Phils are playing much better at FirstEnergy Stadium this season, then away from the friendly confines. Through six home games, the R-Phils are hitting .303 and scoring 4.8 runs per game. On the road, Reading is slashing just .201 and scoring 3.2 runs per contest. Additionally, the R-Phils have 23 extra base hits at home compared to just 16 on the road in three more away games.

Wacky Numbers

Through 15 games, the Fightin Phils sit second in the Eastern League with a .244 batting average. But, Reading is ninth across the league in runs scored at 58, which is 3.9 per game. A culprit would be the R-Phils sit last in the league with a .203 average when runners are in scoring position. Also, Reading has struggled moving runners as the R-Phils are ninth in stolen bases and ninth in total home runs.

Fast Starts

Abel their slow start, the Fightin Phils have started game quickly in 2023. Reading has scored first in nine of 15 games so far, but holds just a 3-6 record in such contests. Additionally, Reading is outscoring opponents by eight runs in the first innings of games this season. The third inning has been a trouble spot, as the R-Phils are being outscored by ten runs in that frame.

2023 R-PHILS GAME NOTES

“Cannon” Ball

Cam Cannon grand slam on April 25, landed in the Reading Hospital Tower Health Pool in right field. His grand slam was the R-Phils first of the season and first grand slam since Jhailyn Ortiz hit one on August 21, 2022 against the Portland Sea Dogs. Cannon also picked up a Reading season-high five RBI. Those five runs driven in match a career high for Cannon, who did it on July 18, 2019.

Reading Rehab

Two members of the Philadelphia Phillies are expected to make rehab appearances in Reading the week of Apr. 25-30. On Apr. 26, Phillies reliever Nick Nelson is slated to get the ball for about three innings. Then, Apr. 27, lefty Ranger Suarez is expected to throw about two innings for the R-Phils. Suarez pitched in Reading in 2018 and Nelson was a member of former-Eastern League member Trenton in 2018 and '19.

Wonderful Wilson

Ethan Wilson has been a bright spot for the R-Phils in the Altoona series. Wilson has now homered in back-to-back games on Apr. 25-26, both nearly-identical shots off the top of the Redner's Event Center. This is the first time in Wilson's career that he has hit home runs in back-to-back games. Wilson recently spent time on the IL, but came off it last week at Portland.

Ranger Rehab

Phillies starter Ranger Suarez made the second-straight rehab start by a member of the Phillies on Apr. 27, after Nick Nelson threw three innings on Apr. 26. Suarez looked solid, pitching two innings and striking out one Curve hitter. Suarez is expected to make 3-4 rehab starts before returning to the Phillies rotation. He was sidelined to open the season after experiencing forearm tightness in the World Baseball Classic.

May Notes

Nick is Nice

Nick Nelson made his second rehab start for Reading and fourth overall this season on May 3. Nelson threw a season-high five innings, allowing six hits and one run, which was unearned. The Phillies rightly did not allow a walk and struck out four batters. Nelson is scheduled to pitch again Sunday as he makes his way back to provide bullpen reinforcement for the Phillies.

Ethan is Excellent

Ethan Wilson continued his hot return from the injured list with three hits, two runs and three RBI last night. The latter of each came from an opposite-field home run in the 11th inning to help give Reading the win. In eight games since coming off the IL on Apr. 22, Wilson is hitting .333 with three home runs and 10 RBI. That stretch also includes two three-hit games and a four-game hit streak from Apr. 23-27. Ethan Wilson homered for the second-straight game on May 3. Marking the second time he has homered in back-to-back games this season. Prior to this season, Wilson had never homered in back-to-back contests, and now he has done it twice in a one-week span. Wilson now has four home runs in just 11 games and 41 plate appearances. Last year, Wilson didn't hit his fourth home run until June 25, his 64th game of that season.

New Faces

A pair of new players made their reading debuts on May 2 in Garrett Whitley and Drew Ellis. Whitley signed with the Phillies in December and was a 2015 First-Round Pick of the Rays. Ellis signed with the Phillies in April and was a Second-Round pick of the Diamondbacks in 2017. Ellis will provide some infield reinforcement with the recent injuries to both Pedro Martinez and Cam Cannon. The emergence of new faces Drew Ellis and Garrett Whitley continued May 3. After homering on May 2, Whitley chipped in with a hit, RBI and run to now reach base in both of his starts so far. Ellis introduced himself to the Reading fans with a two-run home run in the third inning last night. Whitley and Ellis have now each homered in back-to-back games.

Lopsided Wins

Reading has now picked up three lopsided victories in its last three series. The R-Phils had a 10-1 win at Portland two-weeks ago, an 11-5 win against Altoona last week and now a 12-6 victory last night. With those victories, Reading now holds a +2 run differential this season and leads the league in hitting at .252. But, the R-Phils sit six-games below .500 after a slow start to the season.

Rojas Reurgence

Johan Rojas is having his best stretch of the season. He's reached base in his last 11 games and owns a nine-game hit streak, both season highs. Since moving to the three hole on Apr. 29, Rojas is hitting .485 with one home run, six RBI and 13 runs scored. Last week, he hit .519 in six games at Hartford.

Double Trouble

Reading turned a season-high three double plays on May 4, with the last being a 1-3 twin killing on a line drive that pitcher Tyler Phillips snared out of mid air. The three double plays puts Reading at 13 double plays which remains last in the Eastern League. But, the R-Phils have turned 10 double plays since Apr. 25, which leads the League over that time. After only turning three over the season's first 15 games.

Everybody Hits! (Again)

On May 6, Reading matched a season-high with 17 hits in a 14-12 win over Hartford. The 17 hits matched the season best, which was set just one night prior. Seven Fightin' Phils had multi-hit games, which featured three hits and five RBI from Matthew Kroon. Johan Rojas added two hits and scored four runs as well. Ethan Wilson registered his fifth-straight multi-hit game in a 2-5 performance with two runs scored.

Wonderful Wilson

After a stellar week of May 2-7, Ethan Wilson was named the Eastern League Player of the Week. Over five games at Hartford, Wilson hit .480 with three home runs, 11 RBI and seven runs scored. Since coming off the IL on April 22, Wilson is slashing .383 with five home runs and 18 RBI.

Heart of the Lineup

The 2-3-4 hitters in Reading's lineup had an excellent week at Hartford from May 2-7. Carlos De La Cruz, Johan Rojas and Ethan Wilson, hitting in that order respectively, went .468 with six doubles, a triple, five home runs and 22 RBI. Those three set the tone for what was an offensive onslaught at Hartford last week.

New Faces in Town

On May 9, two Fightin' Phils made their home debuts. Drew Ellis said hello to the Reading crowd, filled mostly with school kids, with his third home run in a week and a two-for-three performance in his home debut. Ellis has reached base in his last three games too. Garrett Whitley had a strong week at Hartford to, going 7-20 at the plate, including a home run and five RBI. Whitley snapped a five-game hit streak yesterday, but has reached base in his last six. Also, familiar face Matt Seelinger joined the Fightin' Phils yesterday.

Carlos De La Cruzin'

Carlos De La Cruz is picking up where he left off during the first home stand of the season. De La Cruz is riding a seven-game hit streak and has reached base in his last 12 games. So far in May, De La Cruz is hitting .400 with two home runs and six RBI.

Kroon Crushing It

After a bit of a slow spell, Matthew Kroon is heating up as of late. Kroon currently is riding a four-game hitting streak and has reached base in his last eight games. Over his last five games Kroon is hitting .444 and added a couple more hits and a RBI last night. Kroon set a season-high with five RBI on May 6 at Hartford.

Chasing 1K

R-Phils Manager Al Pedrique is closing in on a couple of milestones in his storied managerial career. Including winter ball, May 10's win gave Pedrique 1,000 wins in his career. But, when including just minor and major league wins, Pedrique needs to get to 46 wins this season to achieve the mark of 1,000 professional wins in affiliated baseball.

Carlos De La Crushed

Carlos De La Cruz continued his hot streak with another home run on May 12, his second of the series. De La Cruz is hitting .326 over his last ten games and 5-19 this week. De La Cruz has seven home runs this season in 28 games and 115 at bats. That is good for a home run every 16.4 at bats. In 2022, De La Cruz hit 17 home runs over 365 at bats, which was good for a homer every 21.5 at bats. He's on pace for 34.5 homers this year.

Flipping the Script

After recent struggles, the Fightin' Phils bullpen turned in its best performance of the season on May 13. Six pitchers combined to throw nine innings, allowing just one run on five hits, with nine strikeouts. They also combined to allow no walks. That mark helped move the Fightin' Phils from sixth to second-ranked in the Eastern League in walks, per nine innings pitched, with a mark of 4.27.

Offensive Production

Through a little over a month, Reading's offense continues to rank towards the top of the Eastern League in multiple categories. The Fightin' Phils lead the league in hitting at .257, which is 12 points ahead of second-place Portland. Reading also ranks fourth in runs scored. The offensive production has been helped by five double-digit scoring games so far. Reading had nine double-digit scoring games in 2022.

Unique Numbers

Through 32 games, Reading has scored first in 17 games. In those 17 games, Reading holds just a 7-10 record. In 2022, the Fightin Phils were 56-30 when scoring first. So history would suggest that those trends will likely flip at some point. Also, when looking at a tell-tale number for Reading's season, the Fightin Phils are 8-4 when scoring north of five runs and 4-16 when scoring less than five runs. Reading is also above .500 when committing no errors and 2-11 when committing one error or more.

McCarthy Mashers

McCarthy Tatum is another Fightin Phils who is bouncing back strong after a recent dry spell. Tatum has hits in his last four games and is hitting .400 over that span with a home run and seven RBI. In seven games prior, from April 21-May 11, Tatum was just 1/27 (.037) and was hitless in six of those seven games.

Shutout Streak

Through 35 games this season, Reading has yet to be shut out. The Fightin Phils are one-of-four teams in double-A and one-of-18 in all of Minor League Baseball who have yet to be blanked. Altoona joins Reading as the only Eastern League teams to not be shutout. Reading and Altoona are also the only teams in Double-A to not throw a shutout this season. The Fightins and Curve are the only double-A teams to have both marks.

Bullpen Dominance

Reading's bullpen has a dominant outing on May 20 at Somerset. Matt Seelinger, Braden Zarbnsky, Max Kuhns and Taylor Lehman combined to throw five shutout innings, with only one-hit allowed. It also featured three-straight strikeouts from Kuhns with runners on second and third, with no outs. Reading's bullpen, and pitching as a whole, has been much better following losses, than wins. After a loss, Reading has a 4.75 ERA and 10-13 record, while the R-Phils own a 6.28 ERA and 3-9 record in games following a win.

Elite Defender

Johan Rojas continues to play elite defense in center field for the R-Phils. He has two outfield assists on the season, which leads Reading outfielders. Rojas has nine defensive runs saved this season, which is tied for the most amongst minor league center fielders.

Fightins' Streaks

After a walk on a pitch-clock violation, Nick Podkul (.320) has now reached base in 14-straight games, which is tied for Oliver Dunn for the most this season. Carlos De La Cruz has reached in a season-high 13 games and McCarthy Tatum (.429) isn't far behind with eight games. Reading has also hit home runs in six-straight games, which is a season-long streak of long balls as well.

Comeback Kids

The Fightin Phils put the exclamation on a comeback when Max McDowell blasted a three-run home run to give Reading the 10-9 win on May 26. Reading fell behind 6-0 in the fifth when Mick Abel was chased from the game. Abel did register a season-high nine strikeouts. A home run from Oliver Dunn and double from McCarthy Tatum helped lead to the comeback victory. It was Reading's first win this season when trailing after six (0-16), seven (0-21) or eight innings (0-18).

Puttin' the Fight in Fightins

The Fightin Phils pulled a walk off victory out for the second-straight night on May 27. Reading trailed 4-2 going into the bottom of the eighth, then back-to-back home runs from Madison Stokes and Carlos De La Cruz evened the game up at four. After a scoreless top of the ninth, the R-Phils loaded the bases off Joel Peguero and McCarthy Tatum smacked a walk off single off the right field wall. Reading has now won back-to-back games after trailing following both the sixth and seventh innings, after losing every previous instance this season.

Some Firsts in a Win

On Sunday, Reading won its third-straight game to earn a series-split with Harrisburg on May 28. The R-Phils pitched its first nine-inning shutout of the season and first as a team since Sept. 9, 2022. Nick Podkul stayed red-hot with another home run and Johan Rojas hit two homers, the first time an R-Phil has done that this season and first since Wendell Rijo on July 14, 2022. Reading preceded Sunday's win with back-to-back walk offs.

Home Run Merchants

Reading continues to pile on home runs as of late. The Fightin Phils have hit home runs in eight-straight games, having 14 home runs over that span, which leads the Eastern League since May 20. Reading now sits with 51 home runs on the season, which is third in the Eastern League and just six behind first-place Somerset. Nick Podkul, who also owns a 16-game on-base streak, had three home runs last week, including back-to-back games. To add, Johan Rojas hit two home runs Sunday, the first time an R-Phil has hit multiple home runs in a game this season.

June Notes

Historic Night for Kroon

Matthew Kroon's five runs scored on June 1 were the first time an R-Phil has done that since Nick Williams on Aug. 5, 2015. The five runs are a career high for Kroon, passing his previous high of three. Kroon also chipped in two doubles, the second time he's done that this season.

Hot and Cold

On June 1, Reading's bullpen was strong: going four innings and allowing just one-earned run. Continuing its dominating trend in wins this season. When Reading wins, the bullpen has a 2.41 ERA, which compares to 7.63 in losses. Reading's bullpen success has been helped by the work of Matt Seelinger (0.79 ERA), Adam Leverett (2.12), Cristian Hernandez (2.63) and Tyler McKay (3.00).

Podkul Keeps Rolling

Nick Podkul stayed hot on June 1 with a three-hit performance, including a home run and four RBI. Podkul's now reached base in 19-straight games. If he plays tonight, he can become the first R-Phil to reach base in 20 or more games since Logan O'Hoppe in 2022. Much of Podkul's success has come with runners in scoring position, as he leads Reading with a .333 average in such situations.

Odds and Ends

Ethan Wilson's three extra base hits on June 1 were a season and career high for the Phillies 14th-ranked prospect. Carlos De La Cruz has now reached base in 18-straight games, trailing Podkul by one game. Reading went 12-14 in May, compared to 6-14 in April. The R-Phils hit .266 in May, compared .245 in April and scored 5.8 runs per game in May, compared to just 4.1 per game in April.

Weekend Warriors

Reading has played its best baseball on weekend's the previous two series. Two weeks ago at Somerset, Reading was down 3-1 in the series at Somerset entering the weekend, but pulled out back-to-back wins to split the series. Last week, Harrisburg won the first three games of the series, but the R-Phils won Friday, Saturday and Sunday to earn another series split.

Gettin' On Base

With a single on June 3, Carlos De La Cruz has now reached base in 20-straight games. He's the first R-Phil to reach base in 20-straight since Logan O'Hoppe last season (21). De La Cruz also owns an 11-game hitting streak and McCarthy Tatum a 13-game on base streak.

Odds and Ends

With two more walks on June 3, Oliver Dunn now sits at 39 on the season, which leads Reading and is third in the Eastern League. Dunn has a .420 on-base percentage, which is third in the league. Last night, Johan Rojas recorded his fourth outfield assist of the season, which leads the R-Phils. Last season Rojas had eight outfield assists, and his career high was 14 with the DSL Phillies in 2018. With two hits last night, Nick Podkul has now reached base in 20-of-21 games he's played in this season since coming off the Development List on 4/20.

Dueling Superfectas

Johan Rojas and Matthew Kroon each had four hits on June 6, marking the first time two R-Phils have had four-or-more hits in a game since Dylan Cozens and Jake Fox did it on June 2, 2016 at the Portland Sea Dogs.

Rojas Rolling

Johan Rojas is establishing himself as one of the best two-way players in Minor League Baseball. Offensively, he is 6-8 this week and Rojas is hitting .450 over his last five games. Rojas also leads all Minor League center fielders with 14 defensive runs saved. He also ranks seventh in the Eastern League with a .301 average.

Extra Extra

Reading and Binghamton played in their third-straight extra-inning game with two in a June 10 doubleheader. The last time that happened was from May 5-7 in 2019 at Akron. Dating back to 1992, the Fightin Phils have not played in four-straight extra-inning games.

2023 R-PHILS GAME NOTES

Long Ball Disparity

At home this season, Reading pitching has allowed a whopping 52 total home runs. On the road, that number is all the way down to 13. The R-Phils have only played two more home games than road in 2023 so far. Offensively, Reading has 36 home runs at home, compared to 22 away, a similar disparity, but certainly not as drastic as home runs allowed.

Keeping the Zeros Away

Through 56 games, Reading has not been shutout this season. The R-Phils are one-of-two double-A teams to not be shutout, along with Arkansas. In all of minor league baseball, Reading is one-of-nine teams to not be shutout.

A Look at Last Night

on June 13 against Hartford, Reading matched a season-high with 14 runs and fell one-hit shy of a season-high in hits. The ten-run fourth was a season high for runs in an inning and most in a frame in 11 years. Victor Vargas went a season-high six innings, which also matched an R-Phils season high. Ethan Wilson hit two home runs, which is the second time an R-Phils' has done that this season with the last being Rojas on May 28 vs Harrisburg. It was the first time Reading won a game by 10-or-more runs since Sept. 9, 2022 vs New Hampshire. Matthew Kroon, Ethan Wilson and Casey Martin all had multiple hits in the fourth inning, and Kroon had multiple extra-base hits in the frame. Finally, Martin made his double-A debut with Reading last night and had two hits, two RBI, while also flashing stellar defensive play at the shortstop position.

Consistent Kroon

Matthew Kroon has established himself as one of the most consistent bats in the Reading lineup. After missing all, but two games, in 2022 with an injury, Kroon has played in nearly every game this season and leads the team with a .308 average; which also ranks fourth in the Eastern League. Kroon also has played third base and all the outfield positions this season.

Bullpen Blues

Reading's bullpen struggled in the final-two frames on June 14. After seven no-hit innings from Phillips and Brett Schulze, the bullpen combined to allow six-earned runs in the final three innings. In wins this season, Reading's bullpen has a 2.31 ERA, but in losses it's a 7.43 ERA.

The Big 3-0 for Carlos

With a triple in the first on June 15, Carlos De La Cruz extended his on-base streak to 30 games, which dates back to May 12. De La Cruz is the first R-Phil to have a 30-or-more game on-base streak since Cameron Perkins reached base in 33-straight games in 2014.

Looking Back

On June 16, six-unanswered runs for Hartford in the seventh and ninth innings helped the Yard Goats to an 8-5 win. Griff McGarry only lasted two innings, as he walked six batters, the most by an R-Phils' pitcher since 2017. At the plate, Oliver Dunn hit home runs in back-to-back at bats, becoming the first Fightin' to do that since Logan O'Hoppe at Somerset on May 17, 2022.

History for De La Cruz

On June 20, Carlos De La Cruz set the longest on-base streak by an R-Phil, dating back to 2009. His walk last night put him on base for the 34th-straight game, passing Cameron Perkins mark set in 2014. The mark for De La Cruz was recognized on last night's Phillies broadcast.

Can't Stop Johan

Johan Rojas had four hits and three stolen bases on June 20. It was Rojas' third four-hit game of the season and sixth of his career. Three stolen bases is the second time this season, with the last on Saturday; also, the eighth three-stolen base game of Rojas' career. Rojas also had a home-run saving catch on June 21 that was number-two on this morning's SportsCenter Top-10 Plays.

Amongst the League Leaders

Johan Rojas and Carlos De La Cruz are tied for first in the Eastern League in runs scored with 46. Nick Yorke of Portland is tied with them. Rojas is second in the league in hitting at .323 and Matthew Kroon is fourth at .318. Rojas is second in the league in hits with 83 and De La Cruz is tied for third with 75 hits. De La Cruz is also tied for third in the league with 14 home runs on the season.

Gettin' On Base

Oliver Dunn has quietly put together a 22-game on base streak, that dates back to May 26. Additionally, Johan Rojas had hits in eleven straight, before last night; while Madison Stokes has been aboard in nine in a row. Matthew Kroon has reached in nine in a row too.

Kroon On a Roll

Matthew Kroon has been unstoppable as of late. He had three hits on June 25 to increase his average to .327, which leads the team and ranks second in the league. Kroon is hitting .409 in his last ten games and has reached base in 11-straight games.

Trip Trip Triples for Podkul

On June 25, Nick Podkul entered the game at DH after Jhailyn Ortiz was ejected in the first inning. Podkul proceeded to go two-for-three and hit two triples. Podkul is the first R-Phil to hit two triples in a game since Art Charles did it on April 24, 2015. It was a season-high in triples in a game for the team and for a player on Reading. It was also a career-high in triples for Podkul in a single game.

Clean Slate

With the first half in the rearview mirror, Reading's record resets to 0-0, after a 28-40 first half. Aside from the record, the R-Phils still turned in a strong first half, especially on the offensive side of the ball. They led the league in hitting and ranked second in runs scored.

Streak Snapped

With an 0-4 night on June 28, Carlos De La Cruz's 38-game on-base streak came to an end. It dated back to May 12 and passed Cameron Perkins mark of 33-straight games set back in 2014. It was the longest on-base streak for an R-Phil dating back to 2009.

Bats Kept Quiet

June 28 marked the first time Reading has been shutout this season, which took until game 69. Entering last night, the R-Phils were one-of-two teams in double-A (Arkansas) and just one-of-eight across Minor League Baseball who have yet to be shutout. Reading has also not scored a run in a season-high 11 innings in a row offensively. It was the first time Reading was shutout since Sept. 11, 2022.

Hey Now You're an All Star

Mick Abel was selected to the All Star Future's Game on June 26. Abel is one-of-two Phillies' prospects to be selected, with the other being Justin Crawford of Clearwater. Abel ranks as the Phillies' second-ranked prospect and will return just three hours from home for the game in Seattle on Saturday, July 8.

Pitching Struggles

The 14 runs allowed to Richmond on June 29 matched a season-high in runs allowed for Reading pitching. Additionally, the seven runs in the seventh inning for Richmond tied a season-high in runs allowed in an inning. Reading pitching did strike out Shane Matheny five times, which was the most by an opposing player against Reading this season.

July Notes

Kroon Krushing It

Matthew Kroon had two doubles on June 30, marking the third time he's had two in a game this season. He also is tied for third in the Eastern League with 19 doubles this year. Additionally, Kroon's .323 average ranks third in the Eastern League and he's also reached base in a personal-season-best 14-straight games. This all comes one year after Kroon missed all but two games in 2022 due to an injury.

Oliver Gettin' It Dunn

Oliver Dunn had two more hits on June 30 to raise his average to .266 this season. The last two nights, Dunn is five-for-eight, and had two doubles on Thursday. Across his last five games, Dunn's hitting .389 and is at .324 over his last ten. Dunn's Eastern League ranks currently sit at the following: 4th OBP (.405), 3rd walks (50), 7th OPS (.896) and 4th RBI (42).

Nick's Knack for the Dramatics

Nick Podkul's game-winning home run on June 30 was his 11th of the season, after only hitting five last year. Over his last two games, Podkul had two triples Sunday and reached base four times yesterday, including a double and homer to raise his season-average to .302.

2023 R-PHILS GAME NOTES

Putting the Fight in Fightins

July 4 was another win in which Reading trailed going into the eighth inning. Entering last night, the R-Phils were 3-34 when trailing after seven innings. Additionally, last night was the first time Reading won a game this season when committing three-or-more errors, as they were previously 0-6. Over the last seven days, Reading has just a .962 fielding percentage, which ranks 11th in the Eastern League.

Slow Starts

Dating back to the begining of the Richmond series on June 28, Reading has failed to score first in six-of-seven games. This season, Reading has failed to score first in 42/75 games and holds a record of 14-28 when not scoring first. Which compates to 15-18 when striking first in a game.

Heating back Up

After going just one-for-19 over his last five games in June, Johan Rojas is hitting .500 with three home runs since July began. He has home runs in his last three games, marking the second time an R-Phil has done that this season, with the last being Oliver Dunn from June 20-22 at Portland. Rojas was also featured on SportsCenter for the second time this season, having the number-four play in the Top 10 on July 4's show.

Podkul Back on a Roll

Over his last 10 games (dating back to June 17), Nick Podkul is hitting .355 with five home runs and 12 RBI. That included two home runs last week against Richmond, one that gave the R-Phils a lead late, and another to tie a game late.

Power Outage Restored

Carlos De La Cruz homered on July 5 for the first time since June 18, snapping a 12-game homerless drought. His previous long homerless streak this season was eight games. De La Cruz was just two-for-22 from June 28 to July 3, but has responded by going four-for-six the last two games.

Collecting Accolades

R-Phils releiver Carlos Francisco was named Phillies Minor League Pitcher of the Month of June. With Jersey Shore in June, he had a 0.93 ERA and was four-for-four in save oppurtunities. Overall, Francisco struck out 15-of-40 batters he faced and walked just one, with a .205 opponents batting average. He led the South Atlantic League with four saves and was fifth with a 0.62 WHIP. Francisco was promoted to Reading on June 29.

Wonderful Wilson

Ethan Wilson is turning in the best season of his professional career. His .272 average sits 37 points higher than his .235 mark from 2022. Wilson is five-for-eight against Somerset, with a double and two runs scored. This comes after a brief 0-for-11 spell against Richmond.

Road Warriors

Reading has been vastly better on the road this season, then compared to at home. The R-Phils road winning percentage is .457 and it's just .341 at home. Reading is scoring over half a run more per game on the road and also has 20 more stolen bases in road contests. But, at home Reading's hit 56 home runs compared to 29 on the road.

Rollin' Rojas

Johan Rojas had three hits and two RBI on July 8, with all hits going for extra bases (two doubles and one triple). It was the second time Rojas had three extra-base hits in a game in his career, with the last coming on Sept. 1, 2022. Rojas now is tied for the lead league with five triples and is tied for third with 20 doubles. He also leads the league in hits with 98 and is first with 56 runs scored.

Hey Now You're an All Star

Phillies No. 2 Prospect Mick Abel got the start for the NL in July 8's All-Star Futures Game in Seattle. Abel pitched one inning, allowing one hit, no runs and striking out two.

Sunday Suspension

Reading and Somerset's matchup on Sunday, July 9, was suspended due to rain and will be resumed on Tuesday, August 15, in Reading. Overall, Reading won four-of five at the Patriots for the R-Phils third series win of the season. In Sunday's game, Reading trailed 4-0 going into the sixth, but scored a run in the sixth and three in the seventh to tie the game. Casey Martin had three hits for the R-Phils and Carlos De La Cruz drove in two runs.

Relievers Rolling

Reading's bullpen turned in perhaps its best series of the season from July 4-9 at Somerset. Over the six games at Somerset, R-Phils relievers combined to allow four-earned runs across 26.2 innings, which is good for a 1.35 ERA. The bullpen added Phillies No. 21 Prospect Orion Kerkering, in addition to Dominic Pipkin and Zach Haake last week. Additionally, Phillies Minor League Pitcher of the Month Carlos Francisco has been stellar in relief.

Double Trouble

In their series at Somerset, the Fightin Phils turned eight double plays over six games. That mark lead the Eastern League from July 4-9. Overall this season, the R-Phils rank tenth in the league in double plays tuned with 54 (0.7 per game). When factoring out last week, Reading was 11th in double plays turned, so a strong week in the field helps the R-Phils climb up the league's double play rankings.

Welcome to the Show

Johan Rojas was called up to the Philadelphia Phillies on July 14 and made his debut the following day. Rojas is the second member of the 2023 R-Phils to play in a Major League game, with the other being Drew Ellis. Rojas is the third former R-Phil to make a big-league debut in 2023.

A Look at Last Night

With the win on July 14, Reading has now set a new season-high with four-straight wins. The R-Phils had nine extra-base hits which is a season high. The pitching staff struck out 16, led by 10 from David Parkinson. Parkinson's 10 punchouts are a season-high for him, the most by an R-Phils starter in 2023 and the first 10 strikeout game by an R-Phil since James McArthur on Aug. 13, 2021 against Bowie.

Some More Numbers

Oliver Dunn has three extra-base hits on July 14 (2 2B, 1 3B), marking his second three-XBH game of the season and his career. It matched a season-high in XBH for an R-Phil too. Baron Radcliff's two home runs was the fourth multi-homer game by an R-Phil this season and the fourth of Radcliff's career, with the last coming on Aug. 30, 2022 with Jersey Shore. Reading also hit back-to-back homers (De La Cruz/Kroon - 7 th), marking the fourth time that has happened in 2023. The last time Reading went back-to-back was when De La Cruz and Podkul did it on June 18 against Hartford.

Pitching Efficiency

A key to the pitching staff's recent success has been its ability to limit walks, while picking up strikeouts. Over the last two nights (7/14-15), Reading's staff has 32 strikeouts to just four walks. Ironically, the staff had 16 strikeouts and two walks in each game. Those numbers come out to 16 K's/9 and 2 BB's/9. Over the season Reading's numbers sit at 9.54 K's/9 and 4.51 BB's/9.

Taking Down Top Dogs

Reading has excelled against better competition this season. Against Somerset (first-half champion) and Portland (runner up), Reading owns a 15-11 record, including three series wins against those teams over the last month. Against the remaining teams in the Northeast Divison, Reading is 14-22 when facing Hartford, Binghamton and New Hampshire (114-131 combined record). Portland and Somerset are 100-66 in total.

Johan To The Show

Johan Rojas made his big-league debut on Saturday, July 15. He had three hits and a remarkable defensive play in center. Rojas became the first player to make it to the bigs who began his career at the Phillies Dominican Academy, which opened in 2017 (HT: Steve Potter/Larry Shenk). With Rojas departed, the R-Phils now have a void to fill in center field. Last weekend, Carlos De La Cruz started two games in center and Madison Stokes the other. Manager Al Pedrique said he plans to approach the center field position on a committee basis moving forward.

Home Run Merchants

With four-more homers on July 19, Reading is now up to 99 long balls this season, which ranks third in the league behind Somerset then Erie. Over the last seven days, Reading has the most homers in the Eastern League with 12 total, and five more than any other team over that span.

Cutting Down the Strikeouts

As an offense, Reading has not struck out as much the last couple of nights, compared to the first few games out of the All-Star Break. This week, Reading has 23 strikeouts (7.7/game), which is the third-lowest mark in the Eastern League. Last weekend against Portland, the Fightin Phils struck out 33 times (11/game), which ranked as the third-most in the league.

2023 R-PHILS GAME NOTES

McGarry's Night

Reading won 4-1 on July 21 as Griff McGarry was the star with a season-high ten strikeouts over a career-high seven innings pitched. He allowed just three hits, no runs and issued zero walks. It matched a season-high for strikeouts for an R-Phils pitcher and set a new team-high in innings pitched. It was the fourth time McGarry struck out 10+ batters in his career. Carlos De La Cruz also hit his 18th homer of the season in the win.

De La Cruz Amongst the Leaders

With a hit on July 21, Carlos De La Cruz now leads the Eastern League in hits (99) and surpassed Johan Rojas' previous league lead. The closeset player to De La Cruz is 10 hits behind. With his 18th home run last night, De La Cruz is in third in the league in home runs, and five behind the league. He also ranks second in the Phillies organization in home runs, trailing Lehigh Valley's Weston Wilson, who has 23 on the season.

Above .500

For the first time this season on July 22, Reading's record is above .500 in one of the respective halves. After going 28-40 in the first half, Reading is 10-9 since the second half began. After starting the second half 1-5, the Fightin Phils hold a record of 9-4 since July 4.

Pitching Powers

Reading's pitching has been strong as of late, especially the starting staff. Last week at Altoona, Reading's pitchers threw 51 innings, allowed 43 hits (0.8/inning), walked 20 batters (3.5 per nine) and had 49 strikeouts (8.6 per nine). In the Altoona series, the staff had a 2.29 ERA, which was best in the Eastern League last week. Reading's starters combined to allow just four-earned runs. Mick Abel (5.0), Griff McGarry (7.0) and Zach Haake (5.0) all did not allow an earned run in their respective outings.

Off the Board

Between the start of the second inning on July 22, until the bottom of the seventh inning on July 23, Reading pitching did not allow a run. It was a 14-inning shutout streak, marking the longest such streak Reading pitching has had in 2023.

Got 'Em

Reading's catchers have combined to be very difficult to run against as of late. Over the last ten games, the group of Max McDowell, Cody Roberts and Herbert Iser have thrown out 17 of 38 would-be base stealers. That's good for a 45% clip.

Cannon Ball

Cam Cannon's two home runs on July 26 marked the first multi-homer game of his career. It also marks the fifth time this season a member of the R-Phils have blasted two home runs in a game.

Remember Me for Centuries

On July 26, Carlos De La Cruz became the first player in the Eastern League to record 100 hits in 2023. He now has 103 after four hits last night and sits at first in the league in hits.

On the Move

Three former R-Phils were promoted to triple-A Lehigh Valley on July 26 in Tyler Phillips, Braden Zarbnisky and Brett Schulze. Tommy McCollum joined the team from high-A Jersey Shore and Max Kuhns also re-joined Reading yesterday.

One-Hit Wonder

July 28 was the first time Reading pitching tossed a one-hitter since they did it on Apr. 25, 2019 against New Hampshire. Mauricio Llovera started for Reading, and he was followed by JD Hammer and Garrett Cleavinger in the 2019 game. The one-hit allowed was also a season-low in hits around for Reading in 2023.

Snapped Decision Streak

With a no-decision on July 29, David Parkinson's streak of six-straight starts with decisions was snapped, which was the longest streak of such by a Reading starter in 2023. Parkinson was 4-2 over that stretch and in seven starts dating back to June 17, he owns a 3.54 ERA. Parkinson missed all of the 2022 season and has proven to be a steady arm in the Reading rotation as of late.

August Notes

Cannon is Cookin'

Cam Cannon had a red-hot week against Binghamton to end July. Overall, he hit .353 with four home runs last week. Cannon entered the week with just one home run, then hit two Tuesday, and one each Thursday and Sunday. Tuesday was the first multi-homer game of his career.

A July Barbecue

Overall, Reading went 10-13 in July, but from July 4-22, the Hot Dogs had a 9-4 record, which featured series wins over first place Somerset and second-place Portland. Reading's pitching was stellar in the month, posting a 2.91 ERA, which ranked first in the Eastern League. The Hot Dogs' bullpen also led the Eastern League with a 2.93 ERA. The bats for Reading were more quiet in the month, hitting just .214.

Who are the Hot Dogs?

Reading introduced their Hot Dogs alter-ego in the summer of 2020, to begin play in 2021. It pays homage to famous Berks Hot Dogs and of course the famous Crazy Hot Dog Vendor. Reading also sells the most hot dogs in Minor League Baseball. Now, Reading typically wears its Hot Dogs uniforms on Sunday and holds a 3-7 record in the uniforms in 2023, after going 5-6 in them in 2022.

Carlos De La Crushin' It

With three RBI last on August 1, Carlos De La Cruz now has 52 RBI on the season, to go with 100 hits. The last R-Phil to have over 100 hits and 50 RBI in a season was teammate Jhailyn Ortiz, who had 106 hits and 61 RBI over 119 games in 2022. De La Cruz has done the feat in 93 games so far.

Making a Home in Hartford

Reading has enjoyed a lot of success at Dunkin' Park in 2023. Overall, Reading holds a 5-2 record at the home of the Yard Goats. Overall, the Fightin Phils are 10-9 against Hartford in 2023. The offense has dominated Yard Goats' pitching, hitting .316 and averaging 6.9 runs per game.

Bullpen Buzzing

Reading's bullpen continued its dominance on August 1 with four-shutout innings, allowing just two hits and garnering six strikeouts. Since July 1, R-Phils pitching leads the Eastern League with a 2.93 ERA, and much of that success can be credited to Reading's much-improved bullpen.

Deadline Day

No members of the current R-Phils were included in any trade deadline deals. Phillies No. 5 prospect Hao Yu Lee (Jersey Shore) was traded to Detroit for Michael Lorenzen. Lehigh Valley's Bailey Falter was dealt to the Pirates in exchange for Rodolfo Castro.

Dunn's Night

It was a career-night for Oliver Dunn on August 2. His two home runs matched a season and career-high, with the other coming June 16 vs Hartford. He also had three extra-base hits, which matched a season and career best. The prior coming July 14 against Portland. Dunn set a career high with five RBI last night as well. That matched a season-high for RBI in a game by an R-Phils player. Dunn's two homers was also the sixth multi-homer game this season by an R-Phil. Dunn now ranks in the top-10 in the Eastern League in AVG, OBP, SLG, OPS, RBI, BB, amongst others.

McGarry's Month

Griff McGarry was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Month on August 3. The Phillies No. 4 Prospect made four starts in July, going 1-1 with a 2.01 ERA. He went six-innings on July 16, allowing just one run with nine strikeouts against Portland. Then, on July 21 at Altoona, McGarry twirled seven-shutout innings, allowing just three hits and striking out a season-high ten batters.

Odds and Ends

After August 4's shutout, Reading pitching has thrown 13-straight shutout innings. That is one shy of their season-high of 14, which happened in the Altoona series two weeks ago. Matthew Kroon's four hits last night matched a season-high, with his other on June 6 against Binghamton. Kroon raised his team-best average to .321, which is four-points behind first place in the Eastern League. Additionally, the one-through-six hitters in Reading's lineup combined last night: 11-23 (.478), 6 R, 4 XBH, 6 RBI, 5 BB, 2 SO, and also had a .571 on-base percentage.

Dunn's Week

Oliver Dunn had a stellar week at Hartford. He hit .462 (12-26), with four homers, 11 RBI, seven runs scored and seven extra-base hits. Dunn also reached base at a .500 clip, slugged 1.038 and had a 1.538 OPS. The series included two three-hit games, including being a triple-shy of the cycle on Wednesday night. He also hit two home runs on Wednesday, which marked the second time he's done that this season.

Scoreless Streak

Prior to allowing two runs in the sixth on August 5, Reading pitching had tossed 18.1-straight scoreless frames, which marks a new season high. Reading's previous high was 14 in a row during the Altoona series a few weeks back.

Making Moves

Reading's roster continues to change over the last few weeks, which included four more moves entering this August 8's series. Matthew Kroon and Max McDowell both earned promotions to Triple-A Lehigh Valley. Kroon is having a career year, hitting .319, after missing all, but two games, in 2022 with an injury. McDowell has proved to be a steady presence behind the plate, and hit .333 last week at Hartford. Reading added catcher Arturo De Freitas and infielder Nick Ward from High-A Jersey Shore. De Freitas has thrown out 30% of base stealers this season and nearly 40% in his career. Ward is from Kennett Square, PA, and signed with the Phillies this offseason after playing Independent Baseball and for Great Britain in the World Baseball Classic. Ward played collegiately at nearby West Chester University and is hitting .270 over 94 games this season for the Blue Claws.

He Dunn Can't Be Stopped

Oliver Dunn's red-hot stretch continued with a home run, double and three RBI on August 10t. He has homers in back-to-back games, which is the fifth time he's done that this season. In August, Dunn is slashing .457/.474/1.086, with a 1.560 OPS. He also has six homers, 18 RBI and nine runs scored. His recent stretch sees Dunn ranked at the following in the league: 6th AVG, T5th HR, T7th Hits, 3rd RBI, 3rd SLG and 2nd OBP.

A New Warden

Nick Ward's second start with Reading came with multiple career highs on August 10. Ward's three runs matched a career high, two homers set a career high, along with his three extra-base hits. His five RBI was a career best as well. He is the sixth R-Phil to have five RBI in a game this season and the eighth to hit two homers in a contest (fifth over the last month). His leadoff home run was the third time Reading has done that in 2023.

New Prospect Rankings

MLB Pipeline dropped a new set of prospect rankings last night. Reading has five players ranked in the Phillies Top 30: Mick Abel (2), Carlos De La Cruz (7), Orion Kerkering (8), Ethan Wilson (17) and Tommy McCollum (22). Former R-Phils listed were Andrew Painter (1), Johan Rojas (5), Griff McGarry (6) and Simon Muzziotti (9). Orion Kerkering had the biggest jump amongst R-Phils, going from 20 to eight and Tommy McCollum went from 28 to 22. The Phillies had four players ranked in the MLB Top 100: Andrew Painter (29), Mick Abel (49), Justin Crawford (83) and 2023 First Round Pick Aidan Miller (97).

Parkinson Shines

Over his last six starts (dating back to July 7), David Parkinson is 5-0, with a 1.30 ERA, and 35 strikeouts, with opponents hitting .208 against him. Parkinson holds the following league ranks: 6th ERA, 4th Wins, 10th SO, 5th IP, 10th WHIP and 3rd WPCT.

The Big 2-0 for De La Cruz

Carlos De La Cruz hit his 20th homer of the season on August 11, building on a career-high and marking the first time in his pro career De La Cruz has 20-plus home runs. His previous high was 17 in 2022 and De La Cruz ranks third in the Eastern League in homers, trailing the leader by six.

The Fightin' Phils completed their season-long 12-game road trip with 7-5 record, going 5-1 at Hartford and 2-4 at New Hampshire. Over the trip, the R-Phils hit .273, which was second-best in the Eastern League over that span. The pitching staff owned an ERA of 4.12 on the trip.

Rollin' Roberts

Cody Roberts has been red-hot as of late. In August, Roberts is slashing .400/.455/.550, with a 1.005 OPS. Roberts had scored six runs and has three doubles over six games in August as well. Roberts is poised to be the team's everyday catcher with Max McDowell's call-up to Triple-A.

Newcomers Starting Strong

Some of the new R-Phils' players had strong weeks at New Hampshire. Robbie Glendinning was 3-7 on the week, which included a two-double performance on Sunday. Nick Ward burst onto the scene with three hits, five RBI and two home runs on Thursday night en route to a .444 week. Matt Osterberg made his first start for the Fightin' Phils on Sunday and earned a win, going 5.2 strong innings.

Gettin' It Dunn

Oliver Dunn has now homered in three-straight games, marking the second time he's done that this season (6/20-22). It's also the third time in 2023 a Reading player has homered in three-straight. Dunn now has 20 home runs on the season along with 73 RBI, both marks are career highs. His previous career highs for homers was seven and RBI was 25. August has treated Dunn was too, as he's slashing .383/.424/.900 with a 1.324 OPS. He's also added nine home runs, 25 RBI and 15 runs over 15 games this month. Three Reading starters have finished their 2023 seasons on a high note. Mick Abel tossed five-strong on September 13, Matt Osterberg went seven-shutout frames on September 14 and David Parkinson five-quality innings on September 15 to cap off strong 2023 seasons, and second halves, for all three.

Quick Hits

Reading was held to just three hits on September 15, marking a season low for the eighth time this season. Entering last night, the R-Phils were 7-46 in games when they were out of this year. But, they got on base plenty, as Resding worked 10 walks. With 12 strikeouts as well, it marked the first time since May 30, 2022, at New Hampshire, that Reading's offense worked 10+ walks and strikeouts in the same game.

Piling Up Strikeouts

Through four games this week, Reading's pitching staff has 48 strikeouts, good for 12 per game. That total includes 17 on September 13 night and 16 on September 15 from the staff. Reading ranks second in the Eastern League in strikeouts per nine innings this week, with 12.46.

Leading the League

With one game to go, a few R-Phils have themselves in the spot to take home the league crown in various statistical categories. Oliver Dunn is poised to finish 2023 atop the league in OBP, OPS, extra-base hits and walks. He ranks second in average, RBI and SLG. Carlos De La Cruz will be the 2023 Eastern League hit leader, as he is 14 hits up on second place Nick Yorke, as well as total bases. De La Cruz is second in runs scored, extra-base hits, and third in home runs, two behind the leader. Keylan Killgore will finish 2023 with the most appearances in the Eastern League. Mick Abel also qualifies for the league lead in opponents batting average and David Parkinson is fourth in ERA.

Going Going Gone

Reading hitters have compiled 159 home runs this season, which will finish third in the league. This comes after finishing last in the league in homers with 119 last season. Carlos De La Cruz leads the way with 24 and Oliver Dunn has 21. No R-Phil had more than 20 home runs in 2022. In total, five R-Phils had double-digit home runs this season: De La Cruz (24), Dunn (21), Ethan Wilson (17), Nick Podkul (12) and Baron Radcliff (11).

Second Half Success

After going 28-40 in the first half and finishing last in the Northeast Division, Reading has compiled a 31-36 second-half record, which is fourth in the division. Improved pitching has driven that success. The R-Phils have a 4.00 ERA in the second half, which ranks sixth in the Eastern League. Their first-half ERA was 5.18, which was 11th across the league. But, offensively has been a different story. After leading the league with a .267 average in the first half, Reading ranks last in the league with a .212 average in the second half.
