First Impression

Renegades starting pitcher Bryce Cunningham has wowed on-lookers in his pro debut In his first two seasons at Vanderbilt, Bryce Cunningham primarily spent his time in the bullpen. Across his first 30 collegiate appearances in 2022 and 2023, Cunningham made just 10 starts. It set an important foundation for the young Alabaman.

"It taught me this versatility mentality," Cunningham said. "You can't rely on everything to go perfectly, because when you're in the bullpen, that never happens. Being able to take that into the starter mindset, and using that to my advantage was really helpful and really key for me."

Cunningham was a second-round pick in the 2024 First-Year Player Draft by the Yankees. In his pro debut season with the Renegades, he has worked exclusively as a starter to great success. A diverse set of pitching experiences during his collegiate career has helped build Cunningham into one of the best prospects in the Yankees organization.

After the conclusion of his freshman and sophomore seasons, Cunningham spent his summer in the Cape Cod League, a collegiate wood-bat league. For the first time at the college level, Cunningham was used primarily as a starter. This gave him an important trial run at a new consistent role.

"It was huge going up there and pretty much staying the whole time both years," Cunningham said. "Getting my routine set in stone and hammering that down, I was able to use that as I went into school season. I had key things that I wanted to take care of and do."

The intensity of an SEC schedule at one of the top college baseball programs can be quite taxing mentally. Cunningham relished the opportunity to pitch in a more relaxed environment during the summer.

"It is a different feel," Cunningham said. "It's almost like a breath of fresh air because you're not stressing too much. One, you don't have to go to class and two it's pure baseball. You finally get to face guys hitting wood bats. It's a totally different environment."

A quieter, slower pace is where Cunningham is most comfortable. He grew up in the small Alabama town of Headland, with a population of just over 5,300. The community is very strong.

"It's a pretty rural area," Cunningham said. "It's a lot of hunting and fishing, and hanging out with your buddies from high school. That's something I hold pretty close to my heart. It's really cool." Coming out of high school, Cunningham knew pretty quickly where he wanted to play his college ball. Once Vanderbilt expressed interest, he jumped at the opportunity to join a Commodore program that has reached five College World Series in the last 14 years.

"They're just so well known for all the incredible pitchers that have come through," Cunningham said. Just being able to work with [pitching coach] Scott Brown, and getting to know him and his approach to the game, it was really special."

Brown has been the Vanderbilt pitching coach since 2012, working with the likes of All-Star Walker Buehler and Rangers No. 2 prospect Kumar Rocker. Cunningham's head coach was multi-time National Coach of the Year Tim Corbin, responsible for making Vanderbilt a national powerhouse since he arrived in 2003. Corbin was an important mentor for Cunningham.

"He's just intense and he really cares about everyone," Cunningham said. "If he gets onto you, it's because he loves you and he cares about you. He's just so knowledgeable too. Just being able to pick his brain every day, it's a really cool environment to be in."

After his second summer on the Cape, Cunningham became the Friday night starter in his final season at Vanderbilt in 2023, making 16 starts. The privilege to pitch in a loaded SEC is not something Cunningham takes for granted.

"It's really cool," Cunningham said. "You get to play in pretty much the best conference in the country and you're playing incredible competition. You have incredible players around you on campus as soon as you step foot there. It's really special to be a part of."

Last July, Cunningham went into the draft unconcerned about his landing spot. He was confident that things would work out just fine.

"I really truly let it play out," Cunningham said. "I knew whatever happened, it was meant to be. I'm very grateful to be a part of this organization."

It has been an excellent debut season in the Yankees organization for Cunningham, as he quickly rises up the prospect ranks. The access to advanced technology has been eye-opening for the 22-year-old. He looks forward to using more of those tools as he grows in the system.

"Just the analytical side of things, it's a different monster here," Cunningham said. "All the analytics people that are surrounding us, it's really cool to ask them questions and talk through that side of the game. I think that's been very helpful."

This season in Hudson Valley, Cunningham has been a part of a starting rotation that at one point featured six top-30 prospects in the Yankees system. There is so much talent all together at Heritage Financial Park, a luxury that Cunningham takes advantage of any chance he gets.

"It's so cool being around a lot of high-level guys because we're just constantly picking one another's brain," Cunningham said. Seeing what I can take away from this guy, and in the same boat, what they can take away from me."

It can be hard in the midst of numerous transitions to take a second and reflect. When Cunningham was asked to remark on what he's most proud of this season, it took him a second to respond. "You got me with that one," he laughed.

"I think I'm most proud of how I'm handling the day-to-day stress," Cunningham continued. "In college, you played one game during the week, and three on the weekend, so it wasn't this constant. So I'm happy with how I'm getting used to that and attacking that, in the same sense as summer ball. I'm proud of how I'm approaching this year."

Keeping It Light: Josh Moylan living the dream of professional baseball in HV

It's not often that someone gets to re-live their college experience. This offseason, Josh Moylan was blessed with that opportunity. Moylan returned to East Carolina University, where he finished his degree and used the Pirates' facilities to train this winter. Moylan cherished the time spent back in Greenville, North Carolina.

"That's a place where I made some of my favorite memories in baseball," Moylan said. "It's really cool to get back there and be there from a different perspective. When you're there as a student, it's got to go to class, then got to go to baseball, got to do this and that. When you're there just to enjoy it, you really get to see how the city is."

In his trip back to campus, Moylan learned how much the community still appreciated him. It was a moving realization.

"People still remember me," Moylan said. "They come up to me and say 'Josh, so good to see you in town'. I think it's really special to have that and feel like it's home."

As Moylan plays his second season with the Renegades in 2025, he encounters friendly reminders of East Carolina. His college roommate and great friend Josh Grosz is alongside him for another season in Hudson Valley. The pair finished their degrees at East Carolina, reliving the special moments together.

"He's like a brother to me," Moylan said of Grosz. "We spend so much time together on and off the field that it's almost weird sometimes. We know what the other is going to say before we even say it. it's so awesome to be able to share the field with him again. When I look at the lineup and [see he's] pitching, and he saw I was playing third, we both had a smile on our face. We were ready to get after it. It's really special to do it with him."

Playing in front of the home fans at Heritage Financial Park also feels very much like the college baseball atmosphere to Moylan. It's not something that one often sees in the minor leagues. Moylan enjoys every moment he gets to play in front of the Renegades faithful.

"We have great support," Moylan said. "A lot of places you look up and might just have friends and family. But here there's a very loyal fanbase, and there are season ticket holders that know us by name and see us around when we're going grocery shopping. It's something I actually had at school that was very similar, where I'd go grocery shopping and run into people and we'd have that core following of people. It's really special we have that here."

Moylan is sharing the field this season with a number of familiar faces. He was one of 20 returning players from the 2024 team that reached the South Atlantic League Championship Series on the Opening Day roster. At times, it can be very challenging to develop chemistry in affiliated baseball with players always on the move between different levels, but this Renegades team has already established a strong connection, making the early season a smoother process.

"It's awesome to share the field [with these guys]," Moylan said. "Knowing each other and how we play, and what we can do to make each other better is huge. Having spent that time together and having that team chemistry is a really big thing. I think that's why we're seeing success early in the season. I think we understand how everybody plays and it helps us to gel and really work as a unit."

Early in the 2025 season, Moylan has been unlucky at the plate. However, he has been hitting the ball hard and making improvements in his internal hitting metrics, even if the hits aren't falling in. It's always a relief when a ball falls in for a hit, but that can't determine feelings about performance. Moylan is forced to trust that his luck will turn at some point and be content with knowing that the process has been good.

"It's easy, especially in pro ball, to be selfish at times," Moylan said. "Where you care about how your numbers are and how you're doing as a player. But I think the easiest to way to stay out of your own head is to focus on your teammates. I've been enjoying every single game here, and we've been winning, which is awesome. I think the biggest thing is continuing to be me. Not trying to do anything out of my comfort zone or out of my game."

Alongside teammates who have become close friends in recent years, grappling with slumps becomes a lot easier. Moylan has watched his teammates support each other through difficulties on and off the field. It makes him especially thankful to be a part of this group.

"Some guys might not be having the best start to seasons, and some guys might have things off the field that aren't great," Moylan said. "But we know once we're here we can tell when somebody is not having the best day, and we can pick each other up. Which is honestly the biggest part of the chemistry."

Whenever he's having a tough time, Moylan reminds himself of the reality that he's getting a chance that few receive: to be a professional baseball player.

"There's no point of having a bad day when you're doing stuff you dreamt of as a little kid," Moylan said.


Getting to know:

Renegades relief pitcher Ocean Gabonia

The Renegades bullpen has been a strength of the team throughout the first two months of the season. One of the familiar faces in the bullpen for Hudson Valley this season is right-handed pitcher Ocean Gabonia.

Gabonia grew up and still lives during the offseason in Hilo, Hawaii, and was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent in 2020 out of Everett Community College in Washington. On a recent road trip to Aberdeen, he sat down with Renegades Magazine for a conversation.



Renegades Magazine: You were part of the big August run in 2024 in the to the South Atlantic League Championship Series. How much did you enjoy being a part of all those exciting games, big time games, and the way the team really developed incredible chemistry?

Ocean Gabonia: It was pretty fun last year, and just being able to come from Tampa and compete with a bunch of the guys [I had been with] and a lot of the guys I know from the org as well was really cool. I got a little fired up in a lot of those games, and, you know, it really tested me as a pitcher. So we were very blessed to be able to be in in those games and having a fun series, and so it was a great time and way to, like finish the season off.

RM: How much have you enjoyed being a part of a bullpen that's pretty familiar, some guys who you got to be close with last year that are that are back, and continuing to succeed at a really high level?

OG: Yeah, it's great. I mean, I've been in the org for a while, so I know a good amount of them. Some of them were my buddies back in Tampa when we were in Low-A. So we all have a pretty good chemistry together, and some new faces as well thatwe get to grow and just learn about each other, help each other out. So it's been fun. You know me and Matt Keating have been friends for a while now, and just having a good, strong relationship with each other has been awesome. And being able to go through a season, through the thick and thin and things as well.

RM: How special is it to have relationships like that in the minor leagues, where that could be hard to come by, with guys moving up and down, and you don't see that same consistency having that relationship, particularly with Matt. What does that mean to you?

OG: I mean, it means a lot. I think, if you know me and his story, like we're both on fire for God, and we have our faith. We used to butt heads a little bit about certain things, but as we grew and matured in a lot of our faith, and it just shows how much stronger we can get, and we tend to now have way more mature conversations about our faith in baseball. And it's, it's kind of relieving to know that, like I have a brother and that I can go to and brother in Christ as well. So it is super special.

RM: You're from Hawaii, I hope you got the chance to go home during the off season, and if so, how great is it to be able to do that and get home because you're so far away? It's very different on the East Coast, obviously, from where you grow up.

OG: Yeah, I mean, it's fun. I love going back home. Home will always be [Hawaii], and it's a special place. I think everybody should always go there and experience it. You know, it was awesome this off season. I got married to my wife, and so it was fun, you know, little, fun wedding and getting see my parents and siblings, and even just, like a lot of the like training that I do over there with a lot of the young kids trying to, like, grow the game of baseball again back home and get it to be more competitive as well.

RM: How are you seeing the game grow in Hawaii? We talked about this a little bit last year, but of course, Devin Saltiban, a prospect in the Phillies system who was with the Jersey Shore BlueClaws when the Renegades faced them, there's a lot more guys coming out of your state. And where do you see kind of the progress being made?

OG: I think there is a lot of progress in it. I think kids are realizing what it takes to be a pro baseball player or a college baseball player, and they see more of us now, so they're more motivated to do it. Not a lot of them know what it's really like in pro ball, but I see kids slowly maturing and I see them slowly learning more and more about the in and outs of actual baseball and the stats on it and even just development and self. With Devin Saltiban, he's a close friend of mine. I grew up with him, and I grew up with his family and everything. So we played together from the same city, same high school, everything. So it's, it's super cool to be able to compete against him as well, because there he was childhood friend. You know, I grew up with his brother as well and stuff like that.

RM: For those of us who are from the mainland and don't necessarily know what, what being on an island is like to grow up on, how strong a community do you have as a kid growing up, being in those types of environments and kind of knowing everybody in a way?

OG: It's really strong. I think that's the one thing a lot of Hawaii kids, when they come to the mainland, they kind of miss is, like that community. Because when you grew up with a lot of your friends and boys, and even, like the family and your friends family, it's a more satisfaction of, you know, having away from baseball. So it's definitely cool having that back home, and it's definitely hard trying to bring that here, but, you know, we bring the Aloha Spirit and try to make as much friends as we can here and build that community as well, in a way, like bring Hawaii to the mainland.

RM: You mentioned your time in the Yankees organization, been here for a while now since signing in 2020. What are some of the lessons that you've taken from this pitching department and just seen yourself develop, really, from a kid into an adult and as a pitcher.

OG: Oh, man, I've learned a crazy amount. I think patience is has been one of them. Like, it's really hard, you know, sometimes you go out there and what you've been working on and for years, maybe hours, months like, it doesn't always show up in the game, and it's like pattering, and I keep going at it, and you're not getting the results as you want, but just like, having the patience to keep pushing on towards that is huge, you know? I think we have a really good coaching staff, and I think we have good educational things on how to become a good baseball player and hopefully a big leaguer one day, and so I've grown a lot in it. It's funny, I feel old in this org, but, you know, I'm still pretty young in baseball reference, I guess. But yeah, I've grown a lot in patience and just strength and a lot of it has to do mindset with it.

RM: What do you think your new pitching coach, Demetre Kokoris, has done for you? Some of the things that he's provided that are maybe different, coming from different organizations, having coached at a number of different levels in college as well?

OG: I think taking like, a new perspective of things. We have a very strict thing on certain ERAs or certain strengths and how we can do pitch design and stuff, but also him bringing in the fact that, like, don't take it out of the game. Being a gamer and having some feel in the game, you know? Some things that you just can't teach with statistics.

RM: What are your goals for the rest of the season?

OG: I would say, change the season around. You know, start putting up more zeroes, just pitching better. I think we got off to a slow start, and I have to be aware of that. You know, I can't be over-positive on things, but definitely be optimistic on knowing that there's a new month and we can be better, and we can help the team out in that. So putting up more zeroes getting better stuff and just enjoying the game.

Bryce'd For Success:

Bryce Warrecker proving to be a late-draft gem in 'Gades bullpen

It's not everyday that an 18-year-old is tasked with making a decision that could radically change the course of their lives, but that is exactly the situation that Renegades pitcher Bryce Warrecker found himself in heading into the 2020-21 school year – his freshman season at Cal Poly in San Luis Obispo, California.

Growing up on the central California coast, Warrecker was a standout two-sport athlete. He was a standout baseball player, but also starred on the hardwood at Santa Barbara High School, where he was a two-time Channel League MVP in basketball, averaging 22.7 points and 10 rebounds as a senior.

Warrecker was recruited to Cal Poly, his dream school, to play both basketball and baseball, and committed with the dream of being a rare two-sport athlete in Division I athletics.

However, when Cal Poly head basketball coach Joe Calero was fired, his whole plan was put in jeopardy. John Smith was hired to replace Calero, and he told Warrecker that he would have to decide between basketball and baseball.

"He basically said he has enough other guys that can do what I do and just play basketball that he'd rather have," Warrecker said. "I wasn't going to hang up the baseball spikes yet, so I kept going with that. I really decided to turn some of my interests more into baseball at that moment and try to really get better." 29 It wasn't an easy decision, especially since it meant turning down a full scholarship for basketball for a partial baseball scholarship at the rigorous academic school.

While it wasn't the original plan, Warrecker embraced the opportunity to attend college at a place that meant a lot to him, a place that he had always envisioned being in his future. His uncle, Teddy Warrecker, was hired to be an assistant baseball coach at Cal Poly when he was nine years old and Bryce grew up going to a lot of games.

"It was a dream school for me," Warrecker said. "It was kind of a home away from home. I have some family in Morro Bay as well which is a 10-15 minute drive away from campus. And academically – I was always big on my education – and I liked what Cal Poly had to offer from an education standpoint. They gave me the chance to keep going with baseball, so I'm very thankful for that."

Legendary Mustangs head coach Larry Lee originally recruited Warrecker largely for his swing as a left-handed hitter. Warrecker, though, worked hard to build his velocity on the mound in high school, jumping from 80 to 90 mph on his fastball between junior and senior year at Santa Barbara HS. It was soon clear that pitching was the future in his career.

During his time in college, Warrecker shared the field with some teammates that have already reached the big leagues, including Brooks Lee and Drew Thorpe. Thorpe starred in a Renegades uniform in 2023, before breaking into the big leagues with the White Sox last season.

"It's always cool to play with guys that end up making it," Warrecker said. "Thorpe in particular is a guy I've been with a lot. He was a year older, and seeing how he goes about his business, it's been really cool."

Following his sophomore season, Warrecker's turning point came during a summer in the Cape Cod League in 2022 with the Orleans Firebirds. At this point, Warrecker was a reliever in San Luis Obispo. On the Cape he was used as a starting pitcher and flourished, being named the league's Most Outstanding Pitcher with a 2.09 ERA in 39 innings with the Firebirds.

"After my third relief appearance on the Cape, the pitching coach told me he liked that I have more than just two pitches to work with," Warrecker said. "As a starter, he thought that was something that would play well. So I made a start out there and ended up just running with it, had a great summer. I gained a lot of confidence in myself, being able to play with some of the best players in the country."



Warrecker made 14 of 16 appearances as a starter with Cal Poly the following season and produced his best collegiate season. In July 2023, Warrecker was selected by the Yankees in the 20th round of the MLB Draft.

"No other organization is like the New York Yankees," Warrecker said. "It's the global team. Putting the NY on the hat, putting the pinstripes on is really special. We have a really great supporting staff that helps all the players. They put a lot into us and they expect a lot out of it as well."

That following spring training, Warrecker made his professional debut in a moment he will never forget. The 6-foot-8 right-hander appeared in a big league spring training game against the Phillies.

"Going into the bullpen that day, I'll always remember watching our starting pitcher that day warming up, Marcus Stroman," Warrecker said. "And then turning around and seeing the Phillies starting pitcher warming up that day, Aaron Nola. Seeing both of those guys on TV for years before becoming a professional, it's really cool to say I'm playing in the same game as them that day."

In his outing, Warrecker got a strikeout of Matt Kroon on three straight sliders. The video of his sliders went viral on the X account "Pitching Ninja".

"That was a fun one," Warrecker said. "I think every pitcher watches Pitching Ninja's stuff. I always thought it would be really cool to be on there. Getting an appearance on the account was really fun. I woke up in the morning, and Spencer Medick, who was the Renegades pitching coach last year, he sent me the clip. It was a cool text to wake up to. I guess you could say it's a bucket list item for me."

Warrecker spent 2024 exclusively as a starter, with 19 appearances across three levels of the Yankees organization. This season, he has returned to the bullpen and become one of the most reliable bullpen arms in the Yankees minor league system. The switch to a reliever role would bother some pitchers, but Warrecker is well-equipped to make the transition. He's flipped between starting and relieving for years now.

"I feel comfortable out there," Warrecker said. "It can be interesting for starters who haven't relieved before to figure out how they're going to warm up to be game ready. But I think I've had enough of a background, where when my name gets called I know what I need to do. There's a confidence in my mindset out there. I enjoy the adrenaline bit coming out of the bullpen."

While he had to forego his basketball pursuits to push forward in baseball, that hoops skillset is always there in the back of his mind. It's an asset that he wants to use more on the field, as he continues his journey professionally.

"The conditioning and athleticism you learn is something I need to tap into," Warrecker said. "That's something that I think I've lost at times, and the Yankees have been good about tapping more into that. Getting me moving more fluidly on the mound, especially being a taller guy, is important for me."

The choice to pursue baseball has paid huge dividends for Warrecker so far, and could end up seeing him on the mound in the Bronx before too long.

Cooper, 42, begins his first season as the manager of the Renegades in 2025, and his third season overall as a minor league manager in the Yankees organization. He spent the 2024 season as the skipper for the Single-A Tampa Tarpons of the Florida State League, and managed the FCL Yankees in 2023, where he was named Florida Complex League Manager of the Year. Under his guidance, the Tarpons led the FSL in Stolen Bases (242) ranked second in AVG (.239), Hits (982) and Doubles (204), and fourth in OPS (.701). That came on the heels of his FCL team pacing its league in runs, hits, triples, RBIs, AVG, OBP, SLG and OPS in 2023.

Before managing in the Yankees system he was a defensive coach for one season with the FCL Yankees, where he won the FCL Championship in 2022 as part of a coaching staff that featured 2023 Renegades manager Sergio Santos, current Yankees Assistant Pitching Coach Preston Claiborne, and 2024 Renegades hitting coach Rick Guarno.

Before joining the Yankees, Cooper previously served as the head baseball coach at Grambling State University for 12 seasons from 2010 through 2021. He led the Tigers to the 2010 Southwestern Athletic Conference championship, and was named SWAC Head Coach of the Year in 2010 and 2017. He led the team to the SWAC Tournament 10 of the 11 years it was held in his tenure, and finished in the top two teams in the SWAC West Division in each of his final five full seasons at the helm.

Code of Conduct



In order to provide a welcoming experience for all, the Hudson Valley Renegades have implemented a Fan Code of Conduct. Out of respect for fellow guests, players, coaches, and ballpark staff, all guests are prohibited from...

- Trespassing on the playing field at any time
- Interfering with baseballs that are in play
- Throwing or tossing objects
- Using foul, obscene or derogatory language (see below) or gestures
- Misusing or overconsuming alcohol, Including underage consumption
- Behaving in a manner that is disruptive, unruly, or abusive
- Accessing areas of the ballpark without a proper ticket, pass, or credential
- Misuing tickets, passes, or credentials in any way
- Bringing prohibited items into the ballpark

Derogatory language is defined as offensive language concerning a person's race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation, or national origin. Anyone using such language is subject to automatic ejection from the ballpark.

Violations of the Fan Code of Conduct will not be tolerated and may lead to ejection from the ballpark, a ban on attending future games, or other consequences. Guests who are found to have used derogatory language will be ejected from the ballpark.

Guests are encouraged to report violations of the Fan Code of Conduct to the nearest ballpark staff member. This can be done in person, at the nearest Quest Services location, or directly with Ballpark Security.
