SEASON RECAP

1ST HALF: 24-44, 4TH SL NORTH 15.0 GB • **2ND HALF:** 21-48, 4TH SL NORTH 22.0 GB • **OVERALL:** 45-92, 4TH SL NORTH, 35.5 GB

TRASH PANDAS OVERALL: The Rocket City Trash Pandas, managed by Andy Schatzley concluded their fifth season with a 45-92 record, finishing fourth in the Southern League's North Division, 35.5 games behind the champion Birmingham Barons. Rocket City went 24-45 at Toyota Field and 21-47 on the road, being outscored 637-445 for a -192 run differential.

In the first half, the Trash Pandas posted a 24-44 record, placing fourth, 15 games back of the Chattanooga Lookouts. The team went 13-26 at home and 11-19 on the road, ending the half on a nine-game losing streak, including a seven-game sweep by Chattanooga, a new club record. Rocket City scored 219 runs while allowing 310.

The second half saw the team finish 21-48, again fourth in the division and 22 games behind Birmingham. The Trash Pandas went 11-19 at home and 10-29 on the road, scoring 226 runs while surrendering 327.

PACKING OUT TOYOTA FIELD: Since the opening of Toyota Field in 2021, the Trash Pandas have outperformed every other Southern League team in fan attendance, welcoming a remarkable 1,511,011 fans—an impressive average of 6,559 per game.

The April 4 crowd of 6,597 led the Southern League in attendance on Opening Night, with Birmingham coming the closest at 5,346. Through the first two months of 2025, and despite two brand new ballparks, Rocket City led the league by averaging 4,432 fans per game. According to wunderground.com, rain was recorded on 22 out of 37 home game days. Despite these challenges, Rocket City led the league in attendance by averaging 4,366 fans per game. The Trash Pandas led the Southern League in attendance over the Independence Day stretch, drawing a league-best 7,157 fans to Toyota Field on July 3. The next closest was Chattanooga, which welcomed 6,311 fans on July 4.

CLOSE CALLS: Of Rocket City's first 60 games, 31 were decided by two runs or fewer, with the Trash Pandas posting a 17-14 record in those contests. They went 9-10 in one-run games, including 7-4 at Toyota Field, and 8-4 in two-run games, with a 3-1 mark at home. When scoring four or more runs, Rocket City had a 17-9 record. Through the first 84 games of the season, 51% of their contests were decided by two runs or less, including 26 one-run games (11-15) and 17 two-run games (9-8).

SEASON SUPERLATIVES: The Trash Pandas had three Southern League Players of the Week — **Denzer Guzman** (June 30–July 6), **Sam Brown** (July 7-13), and **Walbert Ureña** (Sept. 8-14). OF **Nelson Rada** ranked among league leaders, finishing 4th in OBP (.380), 6th in stolen bases (34), and 7th in batting average (.277). LHP **Mitch Farris**, who was promoted to the Angels on September 1, led the league with 142 strikeouts and ranked top 10 in ERA (4.27) among qualified starters.

AT THE PLATE: Offensively, the Pandas struggled at the plate, finishing with a .203 team batting average, last in all of Minor League Baseball and nine points behind the 119th-place clubs. Despite that, Rocket City hit 94 home runs, ranking third in the Southern League and 18th in Double-A.

ON THE MOUND: On the mound, Rocket City posted a 4.26 ERA, ranking eighth in the Southern League and 24th in Double-A. The staff recorded 1,184 strikeouts, third in the Southern League and 13th in Double-A, but issued 578 walks, the most in the Southern League and 29th of 30 teams in Double-A.

ELEPHANT IN THE ROOM: The Trash Pandas ended the season 21-57 over their last 78 games. Their 92 losses were the most in Minor League Baseball this season, with Corpus Christi (AA-HOU) next at 89. Since 2022, only five MiLB teams—and just one at the Double-A level—have reached 90 losses: Albuquerque (92 in 2024), Charlotte (92 in 2022, 96 in 2023), and Chattanooga (90 in 2024). The only other in the Southern League teams to lose 91 games in a single season was Birmingham (49-91 in '16), and Carolina (52-92 in '92).

The Trash Pandas also endured a Southern League-record 16-game losing streak from June 14 to July 2, the longest of the Minor League Baseball this season. The streak surpassed the previous Southern League mark of 15 straight losses set by the 1971 Columbus (GA) Astros during the interlocking the "Dixie Association" schedule with the Texas League.

FIRST SERIES WIN: The Trash Pandas earned their first series win of the 2025 season by taking three straight games to close out the May 4 doubleheader in Knoxville. The 3-2, rain-shortened series victory from April 29–May 4 marked not only the team's first series win of the year but also their first series win since June 25-30, 2024, at Chattanooga, when they won four of six games.

SPORTS CENTER? MORE LIKE PANDA CENTER: The Trash Pandas grabbed national attention in 2025 with four highlights on ESPN's SportsCenter Top 10 and one on the "Not Top 10," putting Rocket City in front of millions of viewers. **Joe Redfield's** leaping catch over the berm railing at Toyota Field landed at No. 6 on May 15, while intern Cason Clarke's tarp slip and barrel roll five days later earned a Not Top 10 nod. The team closed the season with three more Top 10 plays in the second-to-last week: **Mac McCroskey's** sliding stop at No. 8 on August 31, and Ben Gobel earning back-to-back spots with a barehanded play (No. 9, Sept. 2) and diving snag (No. 7, Sept. 5). In total, Rocket City delivered four Top 10 moments—and one unforgettable blooper—that reached ESPN's massive national audience.

BUILDING THE BRAND: From January through August 2025, the Trash Pandas generated 41.3 million social media impressions—an average of 5.2 million per month—ranking second among all Double-A clubs and ninth across Minor League Baseball. The team's combined audience on Facebook, Instagram, Tik Tok, and X grew by 10% this year to 356,000 followers. Since debuting in 2021, the Trash Pandas have surpassed 200 million total impressions, establishing themselves as one of the most consistently engaging brands in MiLB. In addition, The Trash Pandas hit the West Coast in 2025 with four games (July 31 vs. Birmingham, August 14 vs. Knoxville, August 28 vs. Columbus, and September 10 vs. Chattanooga) televised and streamed live on FanDuel Sports Network West during the second half of the 2025 season.

WALK-OFF MAGIC: The Trash Pandas delivered plenty of late-inning drama in 2025, recording three walk-off victories at Toyota Field. The first came on April 5, when **Denzer Guzman** capped a six-run comeback with a three-run walk-off homer in the ninth to beat Chattanooga 8-6 — his second career walk-off with Rocket City, following a grand slam in May 2024. **Cole Fontenelle** added the second on June 11 with a walk-off single in the 10th against Pensacola, and **Oscar Colás** provided the third on August 27, ripping a three-run walk-off triple to stun Columbus 6-5 after the Trash Pandas rallied from three runs down in the ninth. Overall, the club notched its 24th walk-off win in Toyota Field history, adding to a tradition of dramatic finishes that included six walk-offs in 2024.

BRUNCH BASEBALL: The Trash Pandas finished the 2025 season 2-3 in midweek school day games and are now 2-11 over their last 13 such contests. They snapped a 10-game losing streak in midweek day games with a 5-1 win over Birmingham on April 23 at Toyota Field. Their previous midweek day victory came on May 18, 2022, at Birmingham.

WEATHER WOES: The 2025 season was marked by persistent weather challenges at Toyota Field, as rain impacted 14 home games, resulting in five postponements and more than nine hours of total delays. According to Wunderground.com, rain was recorded on 22 of the first 37 scheduled home dates. During the June 10-22 homestand alone, the Trash Pandas endured 6 hours and 20 minutes of stoppages, while from June 12-29, weather delays totaled 9 hours and 20 minutes, making it one of the most weather-disrupted stretches in franchise history.

ARIZONA FALL LEAGUE: **David Mershon** was selected to represent the Angels in the Arizona Fall League, suiting up for the Salt River Rafter's. He'll be joined by fellow Angels prospects RHP Ryan Costeiu, RHP Brandon Dufault, LHP Will Gervase, RHP Fulton Lockhart, RHP Najer Victor, C Juan Flores, and OF Raudi Rodriguez. The 2025 AFL season runs from Oct. 6 through Nov. 15, concluding with the Championship Game at Salt River Fields.

THE ROSTER AND HISTORIC MOVEMENT: The Trash Pandas made a club record 128 roster moves during the 2025 season, reflecting a busy and ever-changing lineup. The moves were distributed throughout the year with eight in April, 13 in May, 28 in June—including 11 on June 17—plus 17 in July, 24 from August 1-6 (16 on August 2), six on June 2-3, and 16 in September. These frequent changes shaped the team's roster and contributed to the dynamic nature of the season. 57 players took the field for the Trash Pandas in 2025, which included 32 pitchers and 25 position players.

THE SHUFFLE: In May, the team added veteran pitchers Jordan Holloway, **Sean Poppen**, and José Quijada, while several positional moves included **Christian Moore** being promoted to Triple-A, Cole Fontenelle transferring to the ACL Angels, and **Mitch Daly** joining Rocket City. Injuries and development assignments also impacted the roster. June saw recalls, releases, and transfers involving players such as Sam Aldegheri, **Oscar Colás**, **Jared Southard**, Korey Holland, and AJ Block. August brought the promotions of **Brady Choban**, **Denzer Guzman**, and Nelson Rada, while injuries, releases, and new arrivals from Triple-A and High-A continued to shuffle the roster. In September, the roster saw additional additions, including Mitch Daly, Chris Clark, Carlos Espinosa, and Keythel Key, keeping Rocket City's lineup constantly in flux throughout the season.

BRIEF STEADYING OF THE SHIP: From May 26 to June 13, the Trash Pandas went 10-6 and posted a 2.59 ERA, ranking second in the Southern League, third in Double-A, and tied for sixth among all full-season Minor League teams. After 10 roster moves significantly impacted the roster on June 17, the Pandas did not win another game until July 3.

YOUNG GUNS: Rocket City featured three of the nine youngest players in the Southern League. **Nelson Rada** (8/24/05) was the youngest player in the league for the second consecutive year. **Denzer Guzman** (2/8/04) was the eighth-youngest, and **Walbert Urena** (1/25/04) was the ninth-youngest, just 14 days older than Guzman, showcasing a promising core of young talent on the roster.

IT JUST MEANS MORE: The 2025 Opening Day roster featured seven players with SEC roots, beginning with Hoover native and Auburn standout **Sonny DiChiara**. Other SEC alumni included **Ryan Costeiu** (Arkansas), **Houston Harding** (Mississippi State), **Luke Murphy** (Vanderbilt), **Jared Southard** (Texas), **Evan White** (Kentucky), and **Christian Moore** (Tennessee).

PROSPECTS WITH A HALO: The Opening Day roster featured five of the Angels' top 10 prospects and 11 of the top 25. In the top 10 were OF **Christian Moore** (1), RHP **George Klassen** (3), LHP **Sam Aldegheri** (5), OF **Nelson Rada** (6), and INF **Denzer Guzman** (9). The other members of the roster included in the Top-30 include LHP **Samy Natera Jr.** (16), RHP **Walbert Ureña** (17), RHP **Joel Hurtado** (19), RHP **Camden Minacci** (20), INF **Cole Fontenelle** (23), and RHP **Ryan Costeiu** (24).

PAST MLB EXPERIENCE: The 2025 Trash Pandas roster featured seven players with Major League experience, combining for 231 MLB appearances. **Sam Aldegheri** debuted with the Angels in 2024, **Kelvin Cáceres** also pitched for the Angels in 2020, appearing in two games. **Jesús Cruz** logged eight outings between the Cardinals and Braves since his 2020 debut. **Jordan Holloway** appeared in 15 games (four starts) for the Marlins from 2020-23 with a 3.29 ERA. **Sean Poppen** pitched in 63 games for four MLB teams since 2019. **José Quijada** owned 140 career appearances and eight saves with the Marlins and Angels. The lone position player, **Travis Blankenhorn**, debuted with the Twins in 2020, appearing in 100 games between the Twins, Yankees, and Nationals.

HOMECOMING FOR MITCH: On May 20, **Mitch Daly** was added to the Trash Pandas roster, becoming the first player in team history to hail from the Madison area. A 2019 graduate of Bob Jones High School, Daly was a four-year starter at shortstop under head coach Jared Smith, earning All-State and All-Region honors in 2018 and 2019. As a junior, he hit .321 with 18 doubles, eight home runs, and 52 runs scored, ranking as Alabama's top shortstop by Perfect Game. The son of a U.S. Army four-star general, Daly grew up in a military family, moving eight times before settling in Madison. He was born in Fort Hood, Texas, and comes from an accomplished family — his mother, Cathy, played volleyball at Army West Point; his sister, Nicole, is a Yale graduate; and his brother, Connor, graduated from Auburn University.

DRESSED TO IMPRESS: The Trash Pandas wore 17 different uniform combinations, led by the Halo Blue top (52 games), followed by the gray jersey (25), white jersey (22), military camo (11), throwback pinstripe (10), Lunáticos de Rocket City (3), and Rickwood Classic Huntsville Stars jerseys (2). From May 28 to June 4, the Pandas completed an eight-game stretch in which they wore a different jersey for each game. Highlights included the home white jersey, military camo, throwback pinstripe, Oat Milkers, Harry Potter-themed, Lunáticos de Rocket City, Halo Blue, and the Huntsville Stars Negro Minor League jerseys for the Rickwood Classic.

BUTTS AND SAUCE WEEKEND: On June 13 and 14, the Trash Pandas celebrated Alabama's rich BBQ heritage with two themed identities. On June 13, the team played as the Bama Butts, honoring the backbone of Alabama BBQ—pork. On June 14, the team transformed into the Alabama White Sauce, celebrating the state's iconic tangy condiment, first created in 1925 at Big Bob Gibson's Bar-B-Q. The weekend included a White Sauce sampling contest with a \$1,500 prize for the best sauce, highlighting the community's love for local flavors.

SWEET HOME ALABAMA: The Trash Pandas completed a stretch of 34 consecutive games in Alabama from May 27 to July 3. During this span, the team played 22 home games at Toyota Field and traveled for six games in Birmingham (June 3–8) and six games in Montgomery (June 24–29).

2025 PITCHING HIGHLIGHTS

PITCHING HIGHLIGHTS: Rocket City's pitching staff served as the backbone of the 2025 season, anchored by a "five-headed monster" of starters — RHP Walbert Ureña (135.1 IP), LHP Sam Aldegheri (128.1 IP), LHP Mitch Farris (116.0 IP), RHP George Klassen (102.2 IP), and RHP Joel Hurtado (86.2 IP). Ureña, Aldegheri, and Farris each ranked among the Southern League's top ten in innings pitched, now standing 3rd, 4th, and 7th in franchise history, respectively, behind only Chase Chaney's 138.0 innings in 2024. Klassen moved into fourth all-time in Trash Pandas history with 31 career starts, while the quintet combined for 115 of the team's 137 starts (84%) and 39 quality outings on the year.

BEATING UP ON BILOXI: During Rocket City's first series win at Toyota Field, May 27–June 1, a 4-2 series victory over Biloxi, the staff posted a 1.98 ERA, struck out 50 batters, walked 16, and recorded the second-best WHIP in Double-A at 0.88.

LAUNCHING STRIKEOUTS: Through the first 18 games of the season, the Trash Pandas pitching staff led the Southern League and ranked fourth in Double-A, recording 199 strikeouts in 158.2 innings pitched (11.29 SO/9 IP). The staff's back-to-back 17-strikeout performances on April 12–13 were the highest outputs of the season and the most since 17 strikeouts on August 17, 2024, at Chattanooga. The franchise record for strikeouts in a single game remains 19, set on opening night, April 6, 2023, at Chattanooga.

START ME UP: After a slow start, the Trash Pandas' starting rotation performed exceptionally well. In an 11-game stretch in late April, the rotation posted a 2.48 ERA, allowed 17 earned runs over 61.2 innings, struck out 71 batters, and issued 20 walks. Four starters ranked among the Southern League strikeout leaders: Aldegheri (T-9th, 29), Klassen (3rd, 34), Farris (T-5th, 27), and Ureña (10th, 26). Additionally, Hurtado ranked 4th in ERA (2.03) and T-8th in innings pitched (26.2).

THE UREÑA-SANCE MAN: Walbert Ureña set a new franchise record in his final outing of 2025 with his 27th start, and he didn't dissappoint. Over his last five starts, the 21-year-old right-hander was 2-1 with a 1.67 ERA, striking out 31 against 11 walks across 32.1 innings. Ureña ranks among the league leaders in starts (T-1st, 27), quality starts (T-1st, 11), innings pitched (1st, 135.1), BAA (10th, .231), and strikeouts (9th, 115).

FERRIS WAS WHEELIN' AND DEALIN': Mitch Farris led the Southern League with 142 strikeouts before having his contract selected by the Angels on September 1 and earned his first MLB win the following day against Kansas City. He became the 14th player promoted directly from Rocket City. Farris joined Chase Silseth (2022) and Caden Dana (2024) as the only Trash Pandas to win their MLB debut. He was the eighth Angel to make his MLB debut in 2025 and the first to debut as a starting pitcher since Dana. Farris finished his first big-league stint 1-3 with a 6.66 ERA (24.1 IP, 18 ER) and 24 strikeouts.

PACKED A PUNCH IN JULY: The Rocket City pitching staff struck out 213 batters over 24 games in July, averaging 8.9 strikeouts per game, which ranked third in the Southern League and ninth in Double-A. From August 18-27, the staff posted a 2.30 ERA with 64 strikeouts in 66.2 innings, leading the Southern League and ranking second in Double-A during that stretch.

HOT JULY FOR ALDEGHERI AND KLASSEN: In July, Aldegheri and Klassen were among the Southern League's best starters. Aldegheri led the league with a 0.78 ERA over four starts (3-0, 19 strikeouts, 10 walks, 23.0 IP), while Klassen tied for the league lead with 26 strikeouts and posted a 3.32 ERA over 21.2 innings. The Rocket City staff tallied 213 strikeouts in 24 games in July, averaging 8.9 strikeouts per game—third in the Southern League and ninth in all of Double-A. Over eight games from August 18-27, the team posted a 2.30 ERA, leading the Southern League and ranking second in Double-A, striking out 64 over 66.2 innings.

FUTURES GAME FOR KLASSEN: George Klassen represented the Angels in the 2025 All-Star Futures Game on July 12 at Truist Park in Atlanta, becoming the sixth player in Rocket City history selected for the event—joining Caden Dana (’24), Kyren Paris (’23), Edgar Quero (’23), Ky Bush (’22), and Reid Detmers (’21).

- The Outing:** Klassen delivered an electric inning for the American League squad, throwing just 11 pitches that included a pair of 99 mph fastballs. He struck out Chicago's Owen Caissie, forced a groundout from Colorado's Charlie Condon, and allowed only an infield single and a walk in his brief but impressive appearance.

GOOD STRETCH IN AUGUST: Over eight games from August 18-27, the Trash Pandas' pitching staff held a 2.30 ERA, which included 64 strikeouts over 66.2 innings. That ERA led the Southern League and was second in all of Double-A baseball. In 12 games, from August 18-31, posted a 2.54 ERA — second- best in Double-A and eighth among all full-season MiLB clubs.

PUTTING THE HURT ON 'EM: Joel Hurtado led the staff in the first two months, recording five quality starts and 54.2 innings pitched. Before being shut down for load management in June, he ranked among the league leaders in starts, innings pitched, wins, ERA, WHIP, and groundouts.

STEADY RELIEF: Veteran reliever José "Spicy" Quijada tossed 9.0 scoreless innings over his final nine appearances (2-0, 12 strikeouts, 3 walks, .194 opponent average) before being promoted to the Angels on July 24. Other bullpen standouts included Jared Southard, who recorded five saves over 22 appearances, striking out 28 in 27.2 innings with a 2.93 ERA, and Samy Natera Jr., who went 4-1 with a 0.93 ERA over his last nine outings and left Rocket City with 68 strikeouts in 47.2 innings. Veteran Sean Poppen added 10 straight scoreless appearances from May 13–June 15, covering 11.1 innings with 11 strikeouts.

DOMINANT FERMIN: Jose Fermin became the first Southern League pitcher to earn three wins after his victory on April 17 in Montgomery. In six relief appearances for Rocket City, he allowed just one run on three hits over 8.0 innings, with one walk and an impressive 15 strikeouts (16.88 strikeouts per nine innings), holding opponents to a .115 batting average. He made his Major League debut on April 26 at Minnesota with a scoreless inning of relief ent 3-2 with a 4.46 ERA (34.1 IP - 17 ER) with 39 strikeouts in 40 games in his rookie season.

RACKING UP THE APPEARANCES: The Trash Pandas had five relievers record 30 or more appearances in 2025, led by Camden Minacci with 47. Natera followed with 41 outings, while Nick Jones (36) and Kelvin Cáceres (30) also topped the mark. Veteran right-hander Luke Murphy returned for his fourth season in Rocket City, making 36 appearances and extending his franchise record to 122 career outings. Jones now ranks second in team history with 109.

2025 BATTING HIGHLIGHTS

HITTING FOR THE CYCLE: On April 8, third baseman Cole Fontenelle made history by hitting for the first cycle in Rocket City Trash Pandas history during a 4-3 win over the Knoxville Smokies at Toyota Field. The 23-year-old completed the feat in the bottom of the eighth inning, driving a 1-2 pitch from AJ Puckett into the left-center gap for a double to seal the milestone.

- Rocket City overcame an early 2-0 deficit in the win, fueled by home runs from Fontenelle and Myles Emmerson. Fontenelle's achievement marked the first cycle in the Southern League since former Smokie Moises Ballesteros did it on June 15, 2024, at Biloxi, and the first by an Angels minor leaguer since José Rojas accomplished the feat on May 11, 2018, with the Double-A Mobile BayBears. Fontenelle became one of just six players in Minor League Baseball to hit for the cycle during the 2025 season.

CHICKS DIG THE LONG BALL: In a season when power numbers were down all around baseball, despite the lowest total in club history, Rocket City finished third in the Southern League with 93 home runs.

FIREWORKS IN JULY: In July, the Trash Pandas launched 19 home runs over 24 games, 3rd in the Southern League and ranking T-10th in all of Double-A baseball. That stretch included a five-homer outburst on July 3 against Knoxville at Toyota Field, tying a franchise record. The surge was fueled by Oscar Colás and Ben Gobbel, who combined for 10 of the 19 homers. Colás led the league in that span with six, while Gobbel was T-4th.

- Over 13 games from July 3-20, the Trash Pandas launched 16 home runs, leading the Southern League and ranking second in all of Double-A baseball. That stretch included a five-homer outburst on July 3 against Knoxville at Toyota Field, tying a franchise record. Prior to that, Rocket City had hit 53 home runs over 76 games—an average of just 0.7 per game. The recent surge has seen that average jump to 1.2 per game. From July 1 to August 21, the Trash Pandas lead the Southern League, and rank 9th in Double-A with 35 home runs in 41 games. Colás (11), and Gobbel (5) combined for 16 of those homers.

GRAND SALAMI TIME: Sonny DiChiara launched his first career grand slam as a Trash Panda in Game Two of the May 4 doubleheader at Knoxville. It was the 11th grand slam in franchise history, and the first since Arol Vera on June 28, 2024, at Chattanooga. Oscar Colás blasted his grand slam on August 8, marking the second of the season and the 12th in franchise history.

MULTI HOMER GAMES: The Trash Pandas had four multi-homer performances in 2025. Oscar Colás recorded his second career three-homer game on August 14 vs. Knoxville, becoming only the second player in franchise history to accomplish the feat, joining Orlando Martinez (May 7, 2021). Travis Blankenhorn hit two home runs on June 27 at Montgomery, Ben Gobbel went deep twice on July 8 at Chattanooga, and Korey Holland added a two-homer performance on August 14 vs. Knoxville, highlighting the team's power surge throughout the season.

WALK THIS WAY: The Trash Pandas walked 506 times in 2025, which ranked fifth in the Southern League. The Pandas walked 12 times in their 5-1 win over Birmingham on April 23 vs. Birmingham, falling two shy of the most in a single game in club history. The Pandas walked 14 times in a 17-4 win at Chattanooga on June 25, 2024.

A COLÁSSAL IMPACT: Oscar Colás made an immediate and lasting impact after joining the Angels organization, becoming one of the Southern League's most dangerous hitters down the stretch. Released by the White Sox on May 24 and signed by the Angels on May 27, Colás quickly made his presence felt in Rocket City, hitting .324 with a double, home run, four RBI, and a .784 OPS over his first nine games.

- Over his final 51 games, Colás led the Southern League with 37 RBI and finished second with 14 home runs from May 30 through season's end. His 15 total home runs ranked among the league's best, and he capped his year with a blast on September 10 vs. Chattanooga.
- Three-Homer Game (July 3 vs. Knoxville):** Became the second player in franchise history with a three-homer performance, joining Orlando Martinez (May 7, 2021).
- Big July:** Ranked 4th in all of Double-A with six home runs, adding three doubles, 15 RBI, and 11 runs scored.
- Grand Slam Power:** Hit a grand slam on August 8, the Trash Pandas' second of the season and the 12th in team history.
- Hot Stretch:** From May 30–August 9, led the league with nine home runs and went deep in back-to-back games (August 8-9), bringing his total to a league-best 10 during that span.
- On-Base Consistency:** Recorded a 14-game on-base streak (August 7-22) and an 11-game streak (July 5-22).

RADA'CAL STAR ON THE RISE: At just 19 years old, **Nelson Rada** was the youngest player in the Southern League in 2025, and he made every game count before his promotion to Triple-A on August 2.

- **Stolen Base Machine:** First Double-A player to reach 20 steals on May 23. He finished his Rocket City stint with 34 stolen bases, ranking third in franchise single-season history—just one shy of his 2024 total of 35. His 69 career steals now stand as the most in Trash Pandas history.

- **Career Highs:** Set a career mark with three steals in a game on May 6 vs. Montgomery.
- **Hot Hitting:** Led the Southern League from May 21 to June 24 with a .337 batting average over 30 games, collecting 35 hits.
- **On-Base Streaks:** Reached base safely in 16 straight games (May 21-June 7) and 15 straight games (July 2-26), the two longest by any Trash Pandas player in 2025.
- **Multi-Hit Games:** Recorded 26 multi-hit games, including five three-hit games.
- **May Success:** Placed at the top of the lineup with **Sam Brown** on May 14, finishing 2nd in the Southern League in batting (.325) and OBP (.467), and leading all of Double-A with 19 steals that month.
- **League Rankings at Promotion:** Stole 34 bases (3rd), OBP .380 (5th), batting average .277 (12th), and hits 91 (T-9th).

- WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU:** Before being traded to the Washington Nationals on July 30, **Sam Brown** was one of Rocket City's most consistent offensive contributors. The first baseman hit .244 with 12 doubles, five home runs, and 40 RBI over 92 games for the Trash Pandas. From April 18 to May 20, Brown reached base safely in 24 of 26 games, raising his average from .136 to .290 during that stretch and earning Rocket City's Player of the Month honors in May. Posted an 11-game on-base streak from April 17-May 1, hitting .342 with 13 hits, four multi-hit games, two doubles, six RBI, eight walks, and a .458 OBP.
- **Streaking:** Added an eight-game on-base streak (May 11-18) and a nine-game streak (July 8-22 Reached base in 32 of his last 37 games with Rocket City before the trade, batting .317 (40-for-126) — one of the top marks in the Southern League over that span.
 - **Traded:** The Angels dealt Brown to Washington on July 30 in exchange for LHP Andrew Chafin and RHP Luis García, with LHP Jake Eder heading to the Nationals and José Quijada designated for assignment. Brown finished the season with Double-A Harrisburg, batting .307 with eight doubles, two triples, three home runs, and 17 RBIs, over 35 games.



- THE TOP PROSPECT:** Top Angels prospect **Christian Moore**, the 8th overall pick in the 2024 MLB Draft, returned to Rocket City, and made an early impression before quickly climbing the organizational ladder. The Tennessee alum returned to Knoxville on April 29, where he homered and went 3-for-5 in front of his college crowd — a fitting encore for one of the most decorated players in Volunteers history.
- In Rocket City, Moore wrapped up his stint with a seven-game hitting streak and reached base safely in 16 of his final 17 games, hitting .234 with five homers and five steals over 34 games
 - After his promotion to Triple-A Salt Lake on May 20, Moore's bat exploded — hitting .424 with four home runs and 18 RBI in just 20 games — before becoming the second Trash Panda from the 2025 roster to reach the majors.

- THE GUZ WAS LOOSE:** **Denzer Guzman** delivered one of Rocket City's most productive stretches of the season, earning Southern League Player of the Week honors (July 1-6) after leading the league with a 1.316 OPS, seven extra-base hits, and six walks in a six-game series against Knoxville. His standout performance came on July 2, when he went 2-for-4 with a double, home run, and three RBIs.
- **Five-Hit Game:** Posted a historic five-hit game on July 13 at Chattanooga, becoming just the second player in franchise history to achieve the feat. Guzman's stellar July earned him Trash Pandas Player of the Month honors and a promotion to Triple-A on August 2 after ranking among Double-A's top hitters.



- **Postseason All-Star:** Joined an exclusive group of Trash Pandas to earn postseason All-Star recognition, the fourth-straight Postseason All-Star selection to make the majors: **Mitch Nay** (2021, 3B), **Eric Torres** (2022, Reliever of the Year), **Kyren Paris** (2023, SS), **Gustavo Campero** (2024, OF), and **Caden Dana** (2024, RHP). He hit .247 with 17 home runs, 30 doubles, one

- triple, 74 RBIs, and 65 runs scored in 129 games between Rocket City and Triple-A Salt Lake before being selected to the Angels' Major League roster on September 13. He collected his first MLB hit that night, and just three days later, hit his first career home run in Milwaukee.
- **League Rankings at Promotion:** Doubles: 2nd (23), Extra-base hits: T-1st (35), RBIs: 6th (53), Total bases: T-6th (139), Home runs: T-7th (11), Slugging: 7th (.415), OPS: 12th (.749)
- **Three double-digit on-base streaks:** 14 games (May 11-27), 13 games (June 29-July 13), and 10 games (July 20-30)
- Six straight games with a walk (July 2-8) for a .538 OBP over that span
- 16 multi-RBI games, leading the team

BROWN AND GUZMAN GO BACK-TO-BACK FOR POW: **Sam Brown** and **Denzer Guzman** went back-to-back with Player of the Week honors in the first two weeks of July. Guzman was named Southern League Player of the Week for July 1-6 after leading the league with a 1.316 OPS and seven extra-base hits, along with six RBIs and six walks during a six-game series against Knoxville. One week later, Brown earned the honor for July 8-13, posting a league-best .444 batting average (8-for-18) over five games in Rocket City's road series at Chattanooga. Brown added four extra-base hits, six RBIs, five walks, four runs scored, and a 1.398 OPS—also the highest in the league that week. Guzman and Brown became the 13th and 14th players in Trash Pandas history to win the award, and for the second consecutive season, Rocket City produced back-to-back weekly honorees, following **Tucker Flint** (Aug. 12-18) and **Christian Moore** (Aug. 5-11) in 2023.

- SOUND THE BLANKENHORN:** Veteran outfielder **Travis Blankenhorn** was one of Rocket City's most dangerous bats after returning from the Injured List on June 13, igniting a power surge that carried through the summer. Over 41 games after his return, Blankenhorn reached base in 32 of them, hitting .293 (22-for-75) with five doubles, seven home runs, 18 RBIs, and a 1.012 OPS, ranking 2nd in the Southern League and 7th in Double-A over that stretch.
- He became just the fifth Trash Panda in franchise history to homer in three straight games (June 22-25) and the first since **Jeremiah Jackson** in 2023. During that run, Blankenhorn launched six home runs in eight games (June 22-29), including a two-homer performance on June 27 at Montgomery—tied for the most in Minor League Baseball during that span.
 - At the time he was placed on the temporary inactive list on August 19, Blankenhorn ranked among the Southern League's top power hitters, sitting tied for the league lead in home runs (8) and 9th in OPS (.752).

- CATCHING CONSISTENCY :** The Rocket City catching duo of **Myles Emmerson** and **Josh Crouch** provided remarkable durability and dependability in 2025, as the Trash Pandas were the only team in Minor League Baseball to use just two catchers all season. Together, they handled all 137 games and 1,165 innings behind the plate, combining to throw out 27.3% of attempted base stealers while committing only 11 errors.
- **Defensively:** Emmerson led the Southern League with 60 assists and caught 26.7% of runners attempting to steal. Crouch ranked third in assists (42) and caught 28.1% of base stealers. The two combined to catch 63 total base runners, the third-most in Double-A.
 - **Offensively:** The pair opened the season red-hot, going 8-for-15 with three home runs, five RBIs, and five runs scored in the first week. Emmerson hit .375 (9-for-24) to start the year, with two home runs, three doubles, and four RBIs, while his five extra-base hits ranked T-3rd in the league early on. Crouch finished third on the team with nine home runs and second with a .726 OPS. Emmerson added 13 doubles, tied for third-most on the team.
 - **On the Mound:** Emmerson also showed versatility, making four pitching appearances, allowing no earned runs over 4.1 innings. He threw 35 total pitches, 29 for strikes.

- GOBBLING UP THE COMPETITION:** **Ben Gobbel** emerged as one of Rocket City's most consistent bats after joining the Trash Pandas on June 17, hitting .286, and providing steady middle-of-the-order production and timely power before his late-season call-up.
- **Hot Stretch:** From July 1-31, Gobbel hit .304 with 21 hits in 18 games, adding five doubles, three home runs, and 13 RBIs.
 - **Power Display:** He homered in back-to-back games—once on July 6 at Knoxville and twice on July 8 at Chattanooga, marking his second career multi-homer game, both coming against the Lookouts (also June 6, 2024 at Toyota Field).
 - **Consistency:** At the time of his promotion to Triple-A Salt Lake on September 13, Gobbel was riding a five-game hitting streak and had reached base in 11 of his last 12 games.
 - **League Ranks:** From July 1 to September 13, he ranked T-4th in the Southern League with eight home runs.
 - **Streaks:** Posted a 10-game on-base streak from August 7-17, and recorded an extra-base hit in three straight games from September 9-11.

TRASH PANDAS STAFF

- STAFF HONORS:** Athletic Trainer **Dylan Culwell** and Strength & Conditioning Coach **David Robertson** have been named the Southern League's 2025 Athletic Trainer and Strength Coach of the Year, respectively.
- Culwell: Joined Rocket City in 2024; previously honored as the Northwest League Athletic Trainer of the Year (2022) and served with Team Italy in the 2023 World Baseball Classic.
 - Robertson: Joined the Angels system in 2023; former Army veteran and 2022 Northwest League Strength & Conditioning Coordinator of the Year with Hillsboro.

SCHATZLEY REPORT: Manager **Andy Schatzley** completed his fourth season at the helm of the Trash Pandas in 2025, continuing to solidify his reputation as one of the Angels' top developmental leaders. The Paragould, Arkansas native has compiled 245 wins with Rocket City and 288 overall across five managerial seasons. Under his guidance, 33 players have reached the Major Leagues, including 10 more in 2025 — with **José Fermín** and **Mitch Farris** earning direct promotions from Rocket City to the Angels.

An infield specialist, Schatzley's club again reflected his defensive emphasis, posting a .975 fielding percentage and turning 107 double plays, eighth-most in Double-A. The 2021 Preston Gómez Award winner as the Angels' Minor League Manager of the Year, Schatzley also earned Southern League Manager of the Year honors in 2022, when he guided Rocket City to both half-season division titles and the league's best record at 81-57.

April 8 vs. Knoxville

The Trash Pandas rallied from a six-run deficit to beat the Chattanooga Lookouts 8-6 at Toyota Field, capped by a three-run walk-off homer from Denzer Guzman—his second career walk-off with Rocket City. The Trash Pandas scored four in the fifth with RBI hits from Christian Moore, Travis Blankenhorn, and Cole Fontenelle, while Sonny DiChiara added a solo shot in the eighth. The bullpen closed out four scoreless innings with six strikeouts to seal the comeback win.

April 8 vs. Knoxville

Cole Fontenelle made Rocket City Trash Pandas history by hitting for the first cycle in team history during a 4-3 win over the Knoxville Smokies at Toyota Field. The 23-year-old completed the feat with a double in the eighth inning after already collecting a single, triple, and home run. Fontenelle's solo shot and a two-run homer from Myles Emmerson gave Rocket City an early lead, while Sam Brown's RBI single in the eighth put them ahead for good. The bullpen — Southard, Minacci, Fermin, and Choban — combined for five scoreless innings to seal the victory.

April 18 at Montgomery

In one of the wildest games of the year, Rocket City fell 13-12 in extras after an early 6-0 lead and an 11-run Biscuits inning—the most runs ever allowed in a single frame by the Trash Pandas. Both teams used position players to pitch before Montgomery walked off in the 12th. The 3-hour, 41-minute slugfest featured 13 pitchers and 20 stranded runners.

May 24 at Chattanooga

After a 69-minute rain delay, Rocket City stormed back with a six-run sixth inning to beat Chattanooga 8-5. Mac McCroskey drove in two and stole two bases, Sam Brown added his 13th multi-hit game, and Nelson Rada swiped his league-leading 21st bag. Walbert Ureña earned the win with seven strikeouts in five innings.

May 28 vs. Biloxi

Returning home, the Trash Pandas edged Biloxi 3-2 behind Cole Fontenelle's solo homer and Nelson Rada's clutch RBI single. Starter Sam Aldegheri struck out seven before leaving with an injury, while Jared Southard closed with four strikeouts over two innings for the save. It marked the first win of the season when scoring fewer than four runs.

May 31 vs. Biloxi

Rocket City clinched its first home series win with a 2-1 victory before 7,162 fans. Sam Brown and Sonny DiChiara each homered, while Joel Hurtado tossed six strong innings for his fifth quality start. The bullpen combined for three no-hit innings as the Pandas secured their fourth win in five games.

May 28 Doubleheader Sweep vs. Biloxi

The Pandas swept Biloxi in a twin bill, winning 2-1 and 4-1. Walbert Ureña went the distance in Game 1, while Denzer Guzmán and Myles Emmerson led Game 2's offense. Guzmán and Rada reached base nine times combined, and Rada extended his hitting streak to eight games and his league-leading stolen base total to 24.

June 3 at Birmingham

Rocket City opened the series with a 3-2, 10-inning win. Joe Redfield drove in two runs, including the game-winner, while Jared Southard earned the victory with two scoreless innings. Nelson Rada extended his on-base streak to 12 games.

June 4 – Rickwood Classic (at Birmingham)

The Rocket City Trash Pandas made history in their first-ever appearance at the Rickwood Classic, shutting out the Birmingham Barons 1-0 at Rickwood Field—the oldest professional ballpark in America. The game celebrated the legacy of baseball and the Negro Leagues, with Rocket City honoring the Negro Minor League's Huntsville Stars and the Barons suiting up as the Birmingham Black Barons.

Walbert Ureña delivered a dominant start, allowing just four hits over six shutout innings, while Jordan Holloway, Nick Jones, and Camden Minacci combined to finish off the seven-hit shutout. The lone run came in the fifth inning when Mac McCroskey drove in Cole Fontenelle, sealing Rocket City's first 1-0 win since September 17, 2022—also against Birmingham. The victory improved the Trash Pandas to 6-2 over their last eight games, during which their pitching staff posted a league-best 1.70 ERA.

The game drew a crowd of 4,190 and featured notable performances from Denzer Guzmán, who tallied two hits, and Oscar Colás, who made his Trash Pandas debut.

Playing at the storied Rickwood Field—opened in 1910 and once home to both the Barons and the famed Birmingham Black Barons—the Trash Pandas paid tribute to baseball's rich heritage. Their dark gray uniforms featured "Huntsville" in black script, honoring the 1940s-50s Huntsville Stars, a Negro League minor league team that provided opportunities for Black players such as Otha Bailey, Carl Holden, and Eugene Scruggs.

The modern-day Huntsville Stars previously appeared in the Rickwood Classic in 1999, 2003, and 2004, making Rocket City's 2025 victory a historic continuation of Huntsville's connection to America's oldest professional ballpark.

**June 8 at Birmingham**

Joel Hurtado's 7.0-inning gem powered a 3-1 win over Birmingham. Denzer Guzmán's two-run homer and Josh Crouch's solo shot provided the offense. The bullpen held firm, with Jose Quijada and Jared Southard sealing the win as Rada stretched his on-base streak to 16 games.

June 12 vs. Pensacola

Behind Mitch Farris' 10 strikeouts over 6.1 innings, Rocket City rallied from a 3-0 deficit for a 5-4 victory. Josh Crouch and David Calabrese homered, and Rada doubled home the go-ahead run in the eighth.

June 13 vs. Pensacola

To kick off the BBQ Butts and Sauce Weekend, playing as the "Bama Butts," Rocket City won 4-1 before 5,381 fans. George Klassen threw six shutout innings, Travis Blankenhorn drove in two, and Rada and Brown each added multi-hit games for the team's third straight win.

**June 29 at Montgomery**

In a rain-shortened 6-5 loss, Travis Blankenhorn hit his sixth homer in seven games, while Evan Edwards' ninth-inning pinch-hit homer was wiped out by weather per MLB Rule 7.02(B).

July 2 vs. Knoxville

Rocket City ended its 16-game losing streak with a 9-1 rout. Denzer Guzmán hit a three-run homer, Ben Gobbel tallied three hits and two RBIs, and Sam Aldegheri earned his first win since May with six strong innings.

July 3 vs. Knoxville

Oscar Colás crushed three solo home runs and Josh Crouch added a three-run blast in a 10-8 win. The Pandas totaled 11 hits as Samy Natera Jr. struck out the side to close it out.

July 13 at Chattanooga

Denzer Guzmán recorded the first five-hit game in Trash Pandas history, going 5-for-5 with three doubles, a homer, and four RBIs in an 8-2 win. Sam Aldegheri earned the win as the Pandas split the series heading into the All-Star break.

July 20 vs. Columbus

In the franchise's first meeting with Columbus, Rocket City won the opener 4-1 behind Mitch Farris and Oscar Colás' three-run homer. The series also raised over \$14,000 through the Margaritaville Jersey Auction for the Center for the Developmentally Disabled of North Central Alabama.

July 27 at Biloxi

Sam Brown's ninth-inning, two-run homer lifted the Pandas to a 3-2 win. Walbert Ureña struck out eight over six innings, and Oscar Colás added an RBI double. The win evened the season series with Biloxi, 6-6.

July 31 vs. Birmingham

On Negro League Night, Rocket City shut out Birmingham 3-0 behind a combined five-hitter from Jones, Poppen, Natera Jr., and Choban. Mac McCroskey tripled and Nelson Rada added a perfect RBI bunt as the Pandas snapped Birmingham's 31-inning shutout streak.

August 10 at Columbus

Sam Aldegheri spun seven dominant innings in a 7-3 win, allowing just one run on four hits. Matt Courtney, Ryan Nicholson, and Oscar Colás all homered, including back-to-back blasts in the ninth—the team's first time going back-to-back since July 2024.

August 13 vs. Knoxville

Rocket City recorded its second straight shutout over Knoxville, 5-0. Mitch Farris fanned seven over six scoreless innings to lead the club's first back-to-back shutouts of 2025. Josh Crouch drove in two, and Colás added a late homer.

August 26 vs. Columbus

Mitch Farris struck out a career-high 13 over 6.2 scoreless innings in a 2-0 win. Korey Holland homered and went 3-for-4, while Ryan Nicholson added an RBI single as the Pandas opened the series strong.

August 27 vs. Columbus

Rocket City rallied for a thrilling 6-5 walk-off win, capped by Oscar Colás' triple in the ninth. Walbert Ureña tossed 7.1 innings of one-run ball, while Arol Vera homered and Ben Gobbel reached base four times.

August 30 vs. Columbus

Aldegheri was brilliant in a historic night at Toyota Field, tossing eight shutout innings with six strikeouts as the Trash Pandas blanked Columbus 4-0 in just 1 hour and 57 minutes — the fastest game in Toyota Field history. The Italian lefty allowed only four hits, walked none, and faced just one over the minimum thanks to strong defense and two double plays. Camden Minacci closed it out with a scoreless ninth for Rocket City's seventh shutout of the season, while Oscar Colás drove in two runs and Will Mershon extended his on-base streak to six games.

September 2 at Knoxville

Behind Walbert Ureña's 6.2 scoreless innings and eight strikeouts, Rocket City edged Knoxville 1-0. Oscar Colás drove in the lone run, and Camden Minacci earned his first save.

September 13 vs. Chattanooga

Walbert Ureña carried a no-hitter into the eighth in a 2-1 win, striking out eight over a career-best eight innings. Josh Crouch drove in both runs with doubles, and Camden Minacci closed for his fourth save to end a nine-game skid.

- The highlight of his season came on August 26 vs. Columbus, when he struck out 13 batters, the third-highest total in franchise history, trailing only Reid Detmers (16 in 2021) and Brett Kerry (14 in 2021).
- Recorded seven quality starts, including four in his final six outings, and went 2-1 with a 1.52 ERA (23.2 IP, 4 ER) and 32 strikeouts in his last four MiLB starts beginning August 7.

Season Highlights

- Delivered the best start of his career on September 13 at Toyota Field, carrying a no-hitter into the eighth inning and allowing just one hit over 8.0 dominant frames with eight strikeouts and no walks to lead Rocket City to a 2-1 win over Chattanooga, earning Southern League Pitcher of the Week honors.
- Made a league-leading and franchise-record 27 starts, tying for the Southern League lead in quality starts (11) and finishing first in innings pitched (135.1). Also ranked among league leaders in strikeouts (9th, 115) and opponent average (10th, .231).
- Anchored the rotation during a mid-season surge: in an 11-game stretch in late April, the rotation posted a 2.48 ERA, 71 strikeouts, 20 walks, 17 earned runs over 61.2 innings.
- Closed the season strong, going 2-1 with a 1.67 ERA and 31 strikeouts over his final five starts (32.1 IP), recording quality outings in each.
- Recorded standout back-to-back wins on May 29 and June 4, combining for 13.0 innings with one earned run allowed, including six shutout frames in the Rickwood Classic vs. Birmingham and a seven-inning, eight-strikeout gem vs. Biloxi.
- Overcame a rocky April (7.36 ERA) to settle in by midseason, recording a 3.21 ERA in May before a strong finish. His command and ability to induce ground balls improved dramatically over the second half.
- Became the first Rocket City pitcher to earn a weekly league honor in 2025, and the first Trash Panda pitcher to win since September 2024, the third Pitcher of the Week award of his professional career, adding to honors earned with Single-A Inland Empire (August 2023) and the ACL Angels (July 2022).
- Signed by the Los Angeles Angels as an international free agent on March 31, 2021, Ureña, just 21 years old, finished the 2025 season as one of the youngest qualified starters in the Southern League and one of the Angels' most durable arms.
