August 29: RubberDucks 7, Baysox 5: Juan Brito had two RBI doubles while Milan Tolentino picked up two hits and a RBI to lead Akron to the series opening win. Josh Naylor went 1-for-2 with a RBI in his rehab game.

Odor and Clark reach milestones: On June 18, the RubberDucks swept a doubleheader from the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. The win in the second game of the doubleheader was the 245th win for the RubberDucks with Rouglas Odor as manager, which passed Brad Komminsk for most in franchise history. Returning for a fourth season to Akron, Odor becomes the longest-tenured manager in franchise history. The RubberDucks also reached 2,500 as a franchise since moving to Ohio in 1989 (Canton 1989-1996, Akron 1997-present) with the sweep of the June 18 doubleheader. RubberDucks broadcaster Jim Clark is in his 30th season with the franchise. Clark joined the broadcast booth for the Canton-Akron Indians for the 1990 season and has been a mainstay on Indians, Akron Aeros and RubberDucks broadcasts ever since. On July 7, Clark called his 3,500th game for the franchise.

Connor heats up: Connor Kokx has been on fire in the month of August. The outfielder is batting .307/.402/.453 with five doubles, two home runs and eight RBI in 24 games during the month. Kokx has also been a menace on the bases swiping 13 bases (leads the Eastern League) during the month including a franchise record five stolen bases against Somerset on Aug. 6. The hot month has raised his season average from .220 to .245 and increased his stolen base total to a team high 25 (fifth most in Guardians organization and 10th most in Eastern League).

Brito's big season: Juan Brito has been on fire all season long. Between Lake County (High-A) and Akron, Brito is batting .284/.374/.454 with 12 homers and 59 RBI in 99 games. From July 8-August 11 (with Akron), Brito reached base in 24 consecutive games, which is longest by a RubberDuck since 2019 (Ka'ai Tom, 27 games). During that stretch, Brito hit .330/.402/.545 with eight doubles, three homers and 19 RBI while walking 11 times and scoring 13 runs. The majority of this on-base streak also saw Brito record his longest hitting streak of the year, recording a base hit in 14 straight games from July 16-Aug. 1. Since being promoted to Akron on May 26, Brito leads the team in hits (76), doubles (19) and RBI (52) while being second on the team in homers (9), batting average (.295) and runs scored (39). His impressive batting totals also rank high among the entire Eastern League as he is fifth in batting average, second in RBI, fourth in hits and first in doubles.

Awesome Aleman: Franco Aleman is finding success with Akron. After pitching to an ERA over 6 with Single-A Lynchburg in 2022 and an ERA over 5 with High-A Lake County in 20 games this season, Aleman has not allowed a run over his first 20.1 innings (14 games) with Akron. The Florida Gators product has struck out 30 of the 71 batters he has faced while allowing just 12 baserunners (five hits, two hit-by-pitch and five walks).

Former RubberDucks make MLB debuts: 11 recent RubberDucks have made MLB debuts in 2023. Carlos Vargas (2022) debuted with the Arizona Diamondbacks on Mar. 30 against the Los Angeles Dodgers striking out two and allowing a run. Kevin Kelly (2022) debuted for the Rays on April 1 allowing one run over two innings against the Detroit Tigers. Tim Herrin (2021-2022) debuted for the Guardians on April 2 against the Seattle Mariners and struck out the first four batters he faced (first pitcher since 1893 to face at least four hitters and strike them all out in his MLB debut). On April 12, Peyton Battenfield (2021) debuted against the New York Yankees and struck out three over 4.2 innings, allowing just one run. Logan Allen (2021-2022) struck out eight over six innings in a win for the Guardians over the Miami Marlins on April 23 in his debut. Tanner Bibee (2022 Eastern League Pitcher of the Year) debuted for Guardians on April 26 against the Colorado Rockies (W, 5.2IP, 1R, 8K). Braynan Rocchio (2021-22) made his debut with Cleveland on May 16 recording a hit against the Chicago White Sox. Andruw Monasterio (2019-21) made his debut with the Milwaukee Brewers on May 28. Akron's 2023 Opening Day starter Gavin Williams (2022-23) made his debut with Cleveland tossing five and two third innings with four strikeouts against the Oakland A's on June 21. Jose Fermin (2021) made his debut with the St. Louis Cardinals against the White Sox on July 7. Jose Tena (2021-23) made his debut for Cleveland against the White Sox on Aug. 5 scoring a run.

2023 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, *Manager (Fourth Season)* – Odor, 55, is in his 36th season with the Cleveland organization as a player, coach and manager. The 2023 season is Odor's fourth as RubberDucks manager, making him the longest-tenured Akron manager. Odor led Akron to a 79-59 record in 2022. He guided Akron to the Double-A Northeast championship and a 73-46 record in 2021 and was named Double-A Northeast Manager of the Year. Odor also led the RubberDucks to a 61-79 record in 2019. He enters the 2023 season 213-184 as RubberDucks manager. Odor enters 2023 ranked fourth all-time in franchise managerial wins.

Odor was the first member of the Guardians organization to be a member of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and RubberDucks. He was an infielder for Canton-Akron for parts of the 1991, 1993 and 1994 seasons. Odor served as the Aeros hitting coach in 2012 and served as the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014.

A native of Maracaibo, Venezuela, Odor was a 32nd round selection by Cleveland in the 1988 draft out of the University of New Orleans. The former shortstop played in the minor leagues for Cleveland from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. The 2019 season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League (1999-2000), the Burlington Indians (2001-2004), the Mahoning Valley Scrappers (2005-2006), and Gulf Coast League Indians (2007-2008). In 2009, Odor began serving as hitting coach for the Kinston Indians (2009-2010), Double-A Akron Aeros (2011-2012), High-A Carolina Mudcats (2013), Double-A Akron RubberDucks (2014), and Triple-A Columbus Clippers (2015-2017).

Odor resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of major league infielder Rougnd Odor.

#30 Brad Goldberg, *Pitching Coach (First Season)* — Brad Golberg, 33, enters his second season with the Guardians and first with the RubberDucks. In 2022, Goldberg served as a pitching development coach on the Arizona Complex staff.

A native of Beachwood, Ohio, Goldberg pitched at the Ohio State University before being a 10th round selection of the Chicago White Sox in the 2013 draft. He spent six years between the White Sox and Diamondbacks systems, appearing in 200 games. Goldberg made his Major League debut with the White Sox in 2017 with 11 relief outings.

#28 Mike Mergenthaler, *Hitting Coach (Third Season, First as Hitting Coach)* — Mergenthaler, 34, enters his seventh year with the Guardians organization and third season with Akron. Mergenthaler spent 2022 as Akron's assistant hitting coach after serving as the bench coach for the RubberDucks in 2021.

Prior to coming to Akron, Mergenthaler was the bench coach with Lynchburg in 2019. In 2017 and 2018, Mergenthaler worked as a hitting coach for the Cleveland and Milwaukee joint Dominican Summer League team. The Thiells, New York, native was a 32nd round pick of the San Francisco Giants in the 2011 draft out of the University of Richmond. In two professional seasons, he hit .252 in 102 games.

#1 Ian Forster, *Assistant Hitting Coach (First Season)* — Forster enters his fourth season in the Guardians organization and first season with the RubberDucks. Prior to coming to Akron, Forster spent 2022 as the hitting development coach on the Arizona Complex staff.

A graduate of North Olmsted High School, Forster played four years at Baldwin Wallace University in Berea, graduating in 2018.

#4 Daniel Robertson, *Bench Coach (First Season)* – Robertson, 37, enters his second season in the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Robertson spent 2022 as the bench coach for Single-A Lynchburg.

A native of West Covina, California, Robertson was a 33rd round pick in the 2008 draft by the San Diego Padres out of Oregon State University. Robertson played 12 professional seasons including 148 Major League games. He appeared in 32 games as an outfielder for Cleveland in 2017.

Jacob Legan, *Athletic Trainer (Third Season)* — Legan is in his 10th season in the Cleveland organization and third season in Akron. Prior to coming to Akron, Legan served as the athletic trainer for Lynchburg in 2019. He earned his bachelor's degree in Athletic Training from East Carolina, his master's degree in Exercise Physiology from the University of Akron and his Doctor of Athletic Training from Temple University.

Mo Cuevas, *Strength and Conditioning Coach (First Season)* – Cuevas enters his eighth season with the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Cuevas served as the rehab strength and conditioning coach in 2022.

Zach Block, *Baseball Technology Fellow (Second Season)* – Block returns to Akron after serving in the same role in 2022. Since graduating with a bachelor's degree from the University of Miami in 2015, Block has worked in the Cincinnati Reds, Toronto Blue Jays, Los Angeles Angels and Washington Nationals organizations. He earned his master's degree in sports analytics and management in 2022.

We Are the RubberDucks

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Babby** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World.**" Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "*the 'Ducks*" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
