CHASED BY THE STORM: The Omaha Storm Chasers lost the series opener—which was suspended on Tuesday, April 12 and completed on Wednesday, April 13—to the Louisville Bats, 5-4, before rebounding to win Wednesday's scheduled game, 4-1, and snap a four-game losing streak.

SETTING THE TABLE: 2B Clay Dungan has hit leadoff in each of the Storm Chasers' first eight games this season and has reached base at least once in all eight games, batting .219 (7-for-32) with a .286 on-base percentage. His eight-game on-base streak is tied for the longest in the Minor League Baseball with Nick Allen (LV), Adam Haseley (CLT), Zach McKinstry (OKC), Robert Neustrom (NOR), and Yolmer Sánchez (WOR). Dungan led Double-A Central with 128 hits in 2021, when he played 108 games for the Northwest Arkansas Naturals and hit .288/.357/.405 with 17 doubles, nine home runs, 56 RBIs, and 28 stolen bases.

COLD BREWIN': RHP Colten Brewer has retired all 13 batters he's faced across three relief appearance with the Storm Chasers, including striking out each of the first seven. Brewer has thrown 4.1 perfect innings to start for the season, tied for second in Minor League Baseball with Jake McSteen (ATL, A+) for the most innings without allowing a baserunner. Julian Aguilar (CIN, A) leads Minor League Baseball with 5.0 perfect innings to begin the season. Brewer signed with Kansas City as a minor league free agent on Jan. 23, 2022, after three seasons in the Boston Red Sox organization. He made his Major League debut with the San Diego Padres in 2018 and has 81 career games of Major League experience, including 70 games with Boston from 2019-2021.

RUNNING ON EMPTY: The Storm Chasers have scored 3.25 runs/game through eight games in 2022, batting .231 (59-for-255) with 10 doubles and seven home runs. Omaha has tallied at least one home run in seven of eight games played, accounting for 10 of the team's 26 total runs (five solo home runs, one two-run home run, one three-run home run). Omaha's 26 runs are tied for third-least in the International League with Buffalo, topping only Syracuse (14) and Louisville (25).

THE MIGHTY THOR: Scott Thorman is in his first season as the manager of the Omaha Storm Chasers, taking over for Brian Poldberg, who retired from managing following the 2021 season. Thorman, who played for Omaha in 2009 and 2010, is the 19th manager in franchise history and the sixth Omaha manager to have previously played for the franchise. He has won Minor League titles in each of the last three seasons, winning with Double-A Northwest Arkansas in 2021, High-A Wilmington in 2019, and Low-A Lexington in 2018. Thorman, 40, was drafted by the Atlanta Braves in the first round (30th overall) of the 2000 MLB Draft and later made his Major League debut with Atlana on June 18, 2006. A Kitchener, Ontario, Canada, native, Thorman began his coaching career in 2014 as the bench coach for the Burlington Royals under manager Tommy Shields, who serves as the Storm Chasers' bench coach in 2022.

FOR OMAHA: RHP Daniel Mengden makes his second start of the season and his 2022 home debut. He made his season debut and Royals organization debut on Friday, April 8 at Indianapolis, allowing one run on four hits in 3.1 innings with three strikeouts and two walks. Mengden has made three career starts at Werner Park, all as a visitor. He made his Major League debut with Oakland at Cincinnati on June 11, 2016, following his first start at Werner Park on June 5, 2016 with Nashville. Mengden spent the 2021 season pitching for the KIA Tigers in the KBO, posting a 3.60 ERA across 120.0 innings in 21 starts with 104 strikeouts and 35 walks. Mengden enters 2022 with 60 career Major League outings (48 career starts)—all with Oakland from 2016-2020—recording a career 4.64 ERA in 302.2 career innings with 224 strikeouts and 102 walks. A 29-year-old from Houston, Texas, Mengden was originally drafted in the fourth round (106th overall) of the 2014 MLB Draft by the Houston Astros out of Texas A&M University.
