Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Jean Carlos Mejia** to the mound tonight, making his Triple-A debut (has never pitched above High-A). Louisville will counter with RHP **Tony Santillan**. The Clippers are 1-0 (1.000) against right handers this year. Santillan has never pitched against the Clippers in his career and will make his Triple-A debut tonight.

vs. the Bats

Columbus was 13-11 and -7 in the run department against Louisville in 2019 (15-9 with a +6 differential in 2018; 12-13, +4 in 2017; 11-12, +12 in 2016). **Daniel Johnson** has hit .340/.414/.700 with 3HR and 11RBI in 13 games against the Bats in his career. **Bobby Bradley** has 3HR and 14RBI in 23G opposing the Bats, including a pair of bombs at Louisville Slugger Field.

Returning Clippers

Half of the 28 man roster played for the Clippers in 2019, though the majority of those were brief stints (the six returning pitchers, **Logan Allen**, **Kyle Dowdy**, **Eli Morgan**, **Scott Moss**, **Kyle Nelson** and **Dalbert Siri**, combined for 60.1IP, less than 5% of the team total). **Bobby Bradley** (107) and **Daniel Johnson** (84) are the only position players that logged at least 31G for Columbus during 2019.

Record Roster

Bradley Zimmer, **Ryan Lavarney** and **Ernie Clement** joined the Clippers in the last week of the 2019 season, then **Kyle Dowdy** was added to the roster for the playoffs, as the Clippers saw a record 83 different players suit up (record 259 transactions). Among those 83, five position players appeared in fewer than five games and eight pitchers took the mound only once.

Looking for Hardware

Ben Gamel returned to the International League (we still call it that) last night, going 3x5 in his first action since his 2016 MVP season (also the 2015 IL Rookie of the Year). He is the fourth former MVP to play for the Clippers in the Huntington Park Era (**Shelley Duncan**, **Russ Canzler** and **Chris Colabello**) and third Rookie of the Year (**Austin Jackson**, **Colabello**).

Back at It

Over his last 49G with Columbus, dating to 8/16/18, **Oscar Mercado** is hitting .311/.408/.481 with 4HR and 21RBI, after having hit .119 (5x42) through his first 14 games as a Clipper. His hot streak includes an 11G hit streak in early 2019 (4/11-4/25) that came immediately after an 0x10 series vs. Louisville (4/8-4/10). He has been successful in 75% of his steal attempts in that time (18 of 24).

King and His Court

The Clippers finished 2019 with an IL-best 213HR, as **Bobby Bradley** (33HR) became the 9th HR King in franchise history. He added a pair in the IL Playoffs, but was outdone by **Ka'ai Tom**'s 3HR (IL Playoff MVP, has since made MLB debut with Oakland and now plays for Pittsburgh). **Eric Haase** (28), **Brandon Barnes** (24) and **Trayce Thompson** (24) joined Bradley among the IL leaders.

Ranked Infield

Joining #21 prospect **Bobby Bradley** in the infield tonight will be #2 **Nolan Jones**, #6 **Gabriel Arias** and #18 **Owen Miller**, while #23 **Ernie Clement** will DH. Of that quintet, only Bradley has seen MLB time (15G). The OF has a combined 757G between **Ben Gamel** (442), **Bradley Zimmer** (164) and **Oscar Mercado** (151). **Gavin Collins** will start behind the dish (0G).

Road to the Cup

The Clippers were far and away the best road team in the IL in 2019, posting a record of 49-24 (.671), including the playoffs (18-4-3 in road series, 9-0 in sweeps). They won eight straight road contests over the end of the season and the playoffs, clinching the Governors' Cup in Durham (last four Cup clinchers on the road). Louisville was the only team to beat the visiting Clippers more than three times.

Undefeated

For the sixth straight season, the Clippers have made it to day two with a shot at the first undefeated record in professional history. Only twice in those last five seasons did the Clippers make it to 2-0 (2015 and 2019, won Governors' Cup in both seasons). The last time the Clippers opened with a win in Louisville, in 2017, they left Kentucky with an even record (2-2) on the way to their first ever .500 season.

This Date in Clipper History

5/5/2014

Matt Carson did it all in a 6-4 win over Rochester, going 3x3 with a double, a HR (2-run, go-ahead shot in the 8th), 3RBI, a steal and an outfield assist. Carson threw out seven baserunners from the outfield in 74 games in 2014, second most on the team (**Carlos Moncrief**, 22 in 129 games). The year prior, Carson led the IL with 19 outfield assists (3rd most in franchise history) in just 104 games.

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). Last year, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (923 to 894).

Record Destruction

The Clippers broke the established mark for homers in a season (182 in 1983) on 8/7/19 and finished with a total of 213 (most in the IL). From 5/14-6/2, they homered in 20 straight games (44HR total) and they had seven straight multi-HR games from 6/14-6/21 (22HR). On the mound, they broke the record for homers allowed (156 in 1998) on 7/31/19, giving up 198 for the year (2nd most in the IL).

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

Since the start of the 2014 season, no team has had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus (35 last season) and no team has produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB ranks 2nd in win percentage at .338 and wins, 192).

Walk-Off Magic

Columbus was 5-2 in walk-off games last season, winning four thanks to the courtesy runner in extra innings (Columbus pitching did not allow a run through first 9.0IP in extras last year). On 6/29/19 at Louisville, they suffered their first walk-off loss of the year, snapping an 81 game streak without (previous loss was 5/31/18 at Buffalo). Additionally, the Clippers ranked 1st in the IL with a 16-8 (.667) record in games decided in the last at bat.

Trending Downward

While ranking in the top three of the IL with a 4.71ERA (3rd), the 2019 Clippers registered their worst mark since the 1998 season (4.85ERA). In 2018, they ranked dead last in the IL with a 4.34ERA, marking the third straight (now fourth) season that the team ERA had gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 30 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016).

Doing Damage

In 2019, the Clippers ranked tied for 5th in the IL with 112RBI with the bases loaded, while carrying a .252 average (10th, 36x143, 4HR). In both 2017 and 2018, the Clippers led the IL in RBI with the bases loaded (243RBI total) and paced the circuit in grand slams (16 total, no other team had more than eight).

Free Swingers

After two straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup was atop the IL again in 2019 (1,392K, 60 more than 2nd place). They obliterated the franchise record (1,297, set in 2017; 2018's total of 1,290 was 2nd worst in franchise history), passing it on 8/22/19 (reduced strikeout rate to 8.3 per game after setting record, 10.1 prior). On the season a Clipper was punched out at least four times in a game on 15 occasions (**Eric Haase** led the team with three golden sombreros).

That's More Like It

In 2019, the Clippers were 50-30 (.625) when playing errorless baseball, while turning in a 31-29 (.517) mark with at least one error. Contrary to logic, in 2018 they actually had a worse winning percentage when playing mistake free (.514), than when committing at least one error (.530). The Clipper defense finished 1st in 2019 (.983) after falling to 6th in the IL in 2018, ending a run of three consecutive seasons ranked among the top three (2015-17 resulted in the three best seasons in franchise history).

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). From 4/13-4/20/19, the Clippers hit 16 leadoff doubles over 72 innings, including four straight innings in a win at Louisville on 4/15/19.

Good Baseball

Bradley Zimmer advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 8/29/19 at Louisville and he came around to score in the win. During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department (12 successes), but when the advanced runners did score, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt (54 successes; won 17 in a row from 4/12-7/31/18).

International Accolades

Bobby Bradley was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes**, **Eric Haase**, **Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**- '79, **Joe Altobelli**- '80, **Frank Verdi**- '81, **Bucky Dent**- '87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**- '10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 31-46 (.403), 1-0 with Columbus (1.000).

Another Debut:

For the second straight night, the Clippers will use a starter that has never pitched above High-A (**Kirk McCarty** allowed 2ER in 5.0IP of his Triple-A debut last night). The 4th and 5th starters, **Scott Moss** and **Eli Morgan**, have a combined 5GS in Triple-A, as both debuted in 2019. Tomorrow night's starter, **Logan Allen**, is the most seasoned of the bunch, with 23GS in Triple-A and 17G in the Majors, but Allen is also the youngest of the group at 23 years of age.
