YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels shut out the Baysox, 2-0, at Prince George's Stadium. **Yunior Marte** threw six scoreless innings and struck out seven, holding the Baysox to three hits. Richmond broke the scoreless tie in the top of the sixth with a two-out single by **Gavin Kilen**. **Dayson Croes** added a run with a two-out RBI single in the top of the eighth for a 2-0 lead. **Dale Stanavich** and **Marques Johnson** combined to cover the final three innings for Richmond. The Flying Squirrels handed Baysox starter Anthony Eyanson the first loss of his professional career.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The June 12 win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. The Flying Squirrels will play the second-half division champion in the Division Series. Game 1 will be at the home of the second-half champion on Tues., Sept. 15. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3 will be at CarMax Park on Thurs., Sept. 17 and Sat., Sept. 18. If Richmond advances to the EL Championship Series, Game 1 will be at CarMax Park on Sun., Sept. 20. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels face the Chesapeake Baysox, Double-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles, in the fourth of a six-game series and the 10th of a 12-game road trip. This is the second of three series between these two teams this year. The Flying Squirrels lost four-of-six in Bowie from June 16-21, their first of three series loses this season. The Baysox will come to Richmond for a six-game series to conclude the regular season from Sept. 8-13.

RECORD YEAR: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 68-47 record is the best in team history through 115 games, ahead of a 67-68 record in 2014. Richmond has won seven series, split 10 and lost three so far this year. After opening the season with a 27-7 record through May 13, the Flying Squirrels are 41-40 in their last 81 games since.

RELENTLESS: In their 68 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 34 of them. In 22 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. The Flying Squirrels have 11 walk-off wins at CarMax Park this season, including at least one in all but one home series. **Diego Velasquez** has three walk-off hits this year, all in 10th innings. **Drew Cavanaugh**, **Parks Harber** and **Dayson Croes** each have two walk-off winners this year. Richmond has four wins after trailing by five-or-more runs this season. The Flying Squirrels are batting .287 in the ninth inning this year, which leads the EL and is fifth in MiLB. The Flying Squirrels have won 26 one-run decisions this year, the most in the EL.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won the Southwest Division first-half title by seven games over second-place Erie. For the year, Richmond is tied for first among all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.269), tied for first in sacrifice flies (47), third in doubles (210), third in hits (1027) and fourth in triples (29). The team has combined for 112 homers this year, surpassing 12 of the franchise's previous 15 season totals. On Aug. 18 at Chesapeake, the Flying Squirrels set new single-season record for stolen bases, passing 168 in 2014. The Flying Squirrels are on pace to set offensive single-season franchise records for batting average, runs, total bases, doubles, RBIs, OBP, SLG, OPS and sacrifice flies. Richmond's No. 9 batters have combined to hit .315 this year, which leads the minors. The Flying Squirrels have scored 10-or-more runs 12 times this year, passing 2023 (11) for the most in a season in franchise history. The Richmond pitching staff has thrown 10 shutouts this season, which is tied for first in the Eastern League, tied for second in Double-A and tied for third in MiLB.

THE BAYSOX are in second place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, 6.5 games behind first-place Erie. They went 3-2 in last week's road series at Reading with Sunday's series finale being canceled. The Chesapeake roster features eight players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Orioles prospects list, including RHP Antony Eyanson (No. 1), LHP Joseph Dzierwa (No. 3), LHP Caden Hunter (No. 4), RHP JT Quinn (No. 13), SS Wehiwa Aloy (No. 15), LHP Sebastian Gongora (No. 24), 2B/OF Aron Estrada (No. 25) and RHP Brock Moore (No. 28). MLB.com's top-30 Orioles prospects list features six Baysox players, including Eyanson (No. 2), Dzierwa (No. 3), Hunter (No. 4), Aloy (No. 8), Estrada (No. 13) and Quinn (No. 14).

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander **Miguel Mendez** makes his Richmond debut. He was assigned to the Flying Squirrels earlier this week after pitching a rehab outing for Low-A San Jose last week. Mendez was acquired by the Giants along with SS Joniel Hernandez from the San Diego Padres on August 3 in a trade for LHP Robbie Ray. Mendez spent the start of his season with Double-A San Antonio, going 2-2 with a 4.93 ERA in 11 starts before landing on the injured list on June 27. He worked two relief appearances for High-A Fort Wayne before being traded at the deadline. Mendez originally signed with the Padres in 2021 as an international free agent. He was a Midwest League All-Star with Fort Wayne in 2025. Entering this season, Mendez was rated by Baseball America as the No. 4 Padres prospect and No. 3 by MLB.com. He is currently ranked by Baseball America as the No. 20 Giants prospect and No. 16 by MLB.com. **For more on Mendez, see page two.**

FOR CHESAPEAKE: Right-hander Patrick Reilly makes his fifth Double-A start of the season and the second of his career against the Flying Squirrels. In his last start last Thursday, he was charged with a loss after allowing two runs over four innings at Reading. He faced the Flying Squirrels on April 19, 2025, at The Diamond and threw inning before leaving the game, ending his season. Reilly returned to the field this June on a rehab assignment and joined the Baysox in late-July. Reilly was selected by the Pittsburgh Pirates in the fifth round of the 2023 MLB Draft out of Vanderbilt. He was traded to the Orioles on July 30, 2024, for OF Billy Cook.

KILEN IT: In his first 29 Double-A games, **Gavin Kilen** is batting .330 (37-for-112) with a homer, 10 doubles, three triples and 16 RBIs. For the season, he is tied for second among all MiLB hitters with 37 doubles. He is tied for second among all Giants minor league hitters with 81 RBIs this year. After playing in the All-Star Futures Game in Philadelphia, Kilen was promoted to Double-A on July 17. He has at least one hit in 24 of his 29 games in the Eastern League. Kilen was selected by the Giants last year out of the University of Tennessee with the 13th overall pick in the MLB Draft. He is tied for the third-highest pick in the MLB Draft in Flying Squirrels franchise history with Patrick Bailey (2020) and trailing only Joey Bart (2, 2018) and Hunter Bishop (10, 2019). On August 13, he became the sixth player in Flying Squirrels franchise history to triple twice in the same game. On Wednesday, he tied his career high with four hits and drove in the go-ahead run in the ninth.

SABIN SURGING: **Sabin Ceballos** had his third two-homer game of the season on Wednesday night. He has seven walks over his last five games dating back to August 14. He had reached base in 13 consecutive games dating back to August 5, batting .293 (12-for-41) with 13 walks and a .482 OBP in that stretch, prior to going 0-for-4 on Thursday. Ceballos has 62 walks this season, tied for fourth-most in a season in franchise history with Mark Miniccozzi (2013) and Jarrett Parker (2013). In his career, Ceballos has worked 109 walks, which is fifth-most in Flying Squirrels franchise history.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 328 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Charlie Szykowny** is tied for third in triples (4), eighth in hits (104) and 10th in total bases (172). **Sabin Ceballos** is fifth in walks (62). **Diego Velasquez** is fifth in batting average (.295) and seventh in OBP (.384). **Bo Davidson** is tied for eighth in homers (19), sixth in SLG (.521) and ninth in OPS (.861). **Jonah Cox** is tied for first in triples (5) and ninth in stolen bases (27). **Tyler Vogel** is first in saves (14) and tied for seventh in wins (8). **Trystan Vrieling** is first in shutouts (1), tied for first in complete games (1) and sixth in ERA (4.26).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Gavin Kilen** (No. 10), **Trevor Cohen** (No. 12), RHP **Miguel Mendez** (No. 20), and RHP **Yunior Marte** (No. 27). Jordan is rated as the organization's best athlete. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Kilen (No. 6), Cohen (No. 14), Mendez (No. 16), **Jancel Villarroel** (No. 19), Marte (No. 25) and **Lisbel Diaz** (No. 30).

ROAD TO THE SHOW: With his MLB debut on Wednesday for the San Francisco Giants, **Matt "Tugboat" Wilkinson** became the 127th Flying Squirrels alum to reach the majors. Wilkinson was traded to the Giants from the Guardians on May 9 as part of the return for Patrick Bailey. He made three starts for the Flying Squirrels, going 2-0 with 2.40 ERA. He debuted in Cleveland on Wednesday and threw two scoreless innings. Wilkinson is the 11th former Richmond player to debut in the majors this season, joining **William Kempner** (MIA), **Victor Bericoto** (SF), **Bryan Torres** (STL), **Tanner Andrews** (TOR), **Jonah Cox** (SF), **Drew Cavanaugh** (SF), **Matt Seelinger** (NYM), **Nate Furman** (SF) and **Trent Harris** (SF) and **Turner Hill** (SF). Along with Cox, Cavanaugh and Hill, Wilkinson is the fourth member of the 2026 Flying Squirrels to reach the majors.

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1959: The Richmond Virginians beat the Miami Marlins, 3-1 at Parker Field. Deron Johnson broke the tie with a two-run homer in the bottom of the eighth inning. Bill Short started for the Vees and allowed one run on six hits in a complete game to pick up his 16th win of the season, moving him into first in the International League and setting a then-franchise record for the modern era of the Virginians. **2013:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Harrisburg Senators, 4-3, at The Diamond. In the bottom of the ninth, Jarrett Parker hit a two-out, solo homer to win the game. It was his 16th homer of the year. **2016:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Harrisburg Senators, 6-5, at The Diamond. In the bottom of the ninth, Brandon Bednar hit an RBI single and later scored the tying run on a wild pitch with two outs. C.J. Hinojosa won the game with a walk-off single. **2019:** The Flying Squirrels split two games with the Erie SeaWolves. The first game was the completion of a suspended game from the previous night and Erie won 7-3 in 10 innings. In the bottom of the 13th inning of the second game, Peter Maris won the game, 11-10, with a walk-off single.
