That Was Last Time - St. Paul was able to muster three hits against Louisville in their series finale, dropping 6-1 to the Bats. Robinson Leyer went three innings in the spot start, giving up two runs on a home run, but Tom Hackimer walked six batters in the fourth as Louisville took a 5-1 lead and tacked on one more in the eighth to seal the win and the series.

Today's Game - The Saints returns home to CHS Field to begin another two-week homestand, starting against the Omaha Storm Chasers. Omaha enters the series in first place in the Triple-A East Midwest Division. LHP Charlie Barnes takes the hill for St. Paul, looking to stay undefeated. The Saints are 3-2 in games the lefty starts.

Trying to Remedy the OBP - Through 30 games this season, the Saints have seen their struggles with getting on base. They currently have an OBP of .298, which is the lowest in all of Triple-A. The 331 strikeouts for St. Paul also ranks 2nd in Triple-A as well.

Riddle is Raking - Dating back to May 23rd, JT Riddle has found his stride in the Saints offense. He's reached base in 10 of his last 11 games, with a .349 average in that stretch, with an OPS of 1.056. Riddle has also had a touch for the clutch, driving in 10 runs since the 23rd after collecting just four RBIs in his prior 16 contests.

Telis Timing it - Tomas Telís has been on a tear for the Saints since May 16th. He went on a five-game hit streak, the last four of which were multi-hit games. Telís is batting .292 in this stretch with 21 hits in his last 18 games. After driving in just two runs in his first 17 games of the year, Telís has driven in 13 runs in the his last 11 games.

Keeping it in the Park - The Saints pitching staff has a collective ERA of 4.30, good for 13th in the Triple-A East, and have not been damaged by round-trippers. St. Paul's pitching staff has given up just 16 homers, which is the the fewest in all of Triple-A, and nine fewer than any other Triple-A club.

Saints Dig the Long Ball - The Saints' offense has come in bunches through 29 games this season, because nearly half of it has come from home runs. Of the 121 runs that St. Paul has scored this season, 54 (44.6%) of them have been accounted for by home runs. Brent Rooker has the team lead in homers with seven.

Rooker's Good Reads - OF Brent Rooker has had a knack for getting on base this season, he is currently tied for third in walks in the Triple-A East, drawing 18 this eason. He's gotten on base in all but four games he's played in (21 of 25) with a on-base percentage of .365 this season. Rooker has two games with three walks this year.

Roster Notes - The Minnesota Twins sent Byron Buxton to St. Paul on a rehab assignment on Tuesday. RHP Tom Hackimer was released, and Juan Minaya was outrighted to St. Paul.

Twins Update - The Twins had Monday off, following their 2-1 win over Kansas City on Sunday. Miguel Sanó was a part in helping turn a triple play for the Twins, and also doubled home a run as well.

- Earned his first Spring Training invite prior to the 2020 season, was sent to the Twins' Alternate Training Site on September 5th, and spent the final month of the regular season there. Following his time there, he played in the Twins' Fall Instructional League in October.
- Pitched at three different levels in 2019, starting in Adv.-A Fort Myers, finishing at Triple-A Rochester. While with the Red Wings, he started 4 games that resulted in a 1-2 record and a 6.75 ERA. In total, he started 25 games, which was more than any other Twins' minor league pitcher.
- Has started all but two games in his minor league career, averaging a 7.7K/9 over the course of his three year career.
- Graduated from Clemson in three years, becoming the 13th member of his family to earn a degree from Clemson. His brother James, was a redshirt-freshman quarterback on the 2016 football team that won a national championship.

9 BROXTON, KEON OF

Last Series: 3-15, 2R, RBI, 3BB | Current Series:

- Started of the 2021 season with a 24-game strikeout streak, the longest of his carrer. He struck out 47 times in that span.
- Spent most of the 2020 season at the Brewers alternate training site, reuiniting with them after spending 2016-18 with Milwaukee.
- Saw Big League action with 3 different teams in 2019, suiting up for the New York Mets before being traded to the Baltimore Orioles and then being claimed off waivers by the Seattle Mariners hitting a combined .167 for the season.
- Was a 20-20 player in the Majors in 2017 hitting .220/20/49 and stealing 21 bases. Broxton was 5th in speed at 29.4 ft/sec. 30 ft/sec is elite & average is 27.0 ft/sec
- Played 2B and SS at Lakeland HS. On that team was Evan Chambers (3rd round pick by Pirates in 2009 & passed away in 2013), Drew Hutchison (15th round pick out of HS in 2009, 98 Major League pitching appearances) & Chris Sale (13th overall pick in 2010 out of FGCU)

- He's spent parts of his last five seasons on a Triple-A roster, three with Salt Lake, one with Louisville, and the 2021 season with St. Paul.
- After signing with the Twins, Johnson was assigned to Double-A Wichita, where he hit .107 through 11 games. Two of his three hits were doubles.
- In his 2019 season with the Louisville Bats, he hit .241 with four home runs and 15 RBIs. The 2018 season, his final with the Angels system, he hit .277 in 46 games with the Salt Lake Bees which was his best average for any season he's played at Triple-A.
- In 2014 with High-A Inland Empire, he finished the season as the league leader in triples (13), and finished top 10 in the California league in walks (2nd 88), runs (3rd 107), hits (8th 146), stolen bases (9th 26, his career-high) and total bases (9th 246). - Did not see any action in the 2020 season. In 2019, he spent time between Double-A Pensacola and Triple-A Rochester. He played 108 games with the Red Wings in 2019, smacking ten homers and collecting 46 RBIs.
 In those 108 games, he finished with a career-high .788 OPS. His
- In those 108 games, he finished with a career-high .788 OPS. His ten home runs were also a career-high, doubling his previous best of five long balls with 2017 Oklahoma City Dodgers.

- A true utility man, spent time with Pittsburgh at: third base, shortstop, left, center and right field, as well as second base and an appearance at first base.
- Has played 85 games with Triple-A New Orleans (Miami), where he's batted .284 with ten home runs and 46 RBIs. In 2019 he had a career-high 10 doubles at Triple-A.

- While with the Twins, he reached base safely in all seven games he played, and collected a hit in his final six games.
- Got his first invite to Spring Training before the 2019 season. He spent the year with Triple-A Rochester, and was named a midseason All-Star in the International League.
- Ranked the 12th best prospect in the Twins' system by MLB.com
- Played his college baseball at Mississippi State, where he won the Triple Crown in the SEC his junior season. He was also a finalist for the Dick Howser trophy for National Player of the Year after being named First Team All-SEC and SEC player of the year.
- He's a two-time Twins' draft pick, having been picked in the 38th round in 2016, but then picked again by Minnesota in 2017

- Had one of his best seasons at the plate in 2019, playing 82 games hitting .330 with 21 doubles, eight home runs and 46 RBIs leading to an .846 OPS.
- Has been on Triple-A rosters since 2014, spanning 441 games, and has a .308 average at Triple-A.
- Made the 2018 Opening Day roster with Miami, the first and only of his career.
- Signed back in 2007 with the Rangers as a shortstop before being converted to catcher full-time in 2009.

- Spent most of the 2020 season at the Alternate Training Site, had his contract selected on August 22nd and made two appearances with the Twins throwing 2.2 scoreless innings.
- Has spent parts of six of the last seven seasons on Major League rosters. He spent most of his time in the Bigs with Oakland, making 134 appearances with the A's over three seasons.
- The 2017 season called Coulombe's name 72 times with the A's. He
 was didn't allow a run in 57-of-72 games but pitched less than 1.0 IP
 in 42-of-72 outings.
- He was a two-time selection of the Los Angeles Dodgers draft pick.

- Spent the 2020 season with the Texas Rangers. Had his contract selected on July 23rd. Was optioned to the Alternate Training Site in August while he led the team in appearances with 14.
- Allowed runs in just five of his 14 games, he held lefties to a .192 average, while righties faired a bit better, hitting .273 against him.
- Prior to his time with Texas, he was a member of the Tampa Bay Rays organization, where Baseball America ranked him the 18th best Rays' prospect after the 2018 season.
- During the 2018 campaign, he was named an International League All-Star with the Durham Bulls.
- Has had his run-ins with injuries, missing his junior season of HS and most of his sophomore year of college due to injury.

- In 2018, he was named the second best relief prospect in the White Sox' system behind Zach Burdi. He was also named a Southern League All-Star with Birmingham that season as woll.
