YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the SeaWolves, 8-6, to clinch a series win. Max Anderson gave Erie a 1-0 lead in the bottom of the first. In the top of the second, **Turner Hill** scored on a wild pitch and **Sabin Ceballos** singled to give Richmond a 2-1 lead. The SeaWolves took a 3-2 lead in the third with a two-run homer by Josue Briceño. In the top of the fourth, **Scott Bandura** tied the score with a double and Ceballos hit an RBI single for a 4-3 lead. In the fifth, Bandura hit a two-run triple to pad the lead to 6-3. Anderson brought in a run with a sacrifice fly in the fifth and Max Clark drove in a run with a groundout in the sixth to pull the SeaWolves within a run. In the seventh, **Carter Howell** scored on a wild pitch and **Justin Wishkoski** drove in a run with a groundout to push the Richmond lead to 8-5. Carlos Mendoza hit an RBI single in the seventh to cap the scoring. Bandura had three hits and finished a triple shy of the cycle with three RBIs. Hill had four hits and scored three runs.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the finale of a six-game series against the Erie SeaWolves, Double-A affiliate of the Detroit Tigers. This is the third and final series between the two teams this year. The Flying Squirrels went 2-4 against the SeaWolves at The Diamond from May 13-18. They also went 2-4 at UPMC Park from June 3-8. In the MiLB current schedule format, which dates back to 2021, the Flying Squirrels the Flying Squirrels have won two series and six sets at UPMC Park. Prior to this weeks, lone series win for Richmond on Erie since 2021 was a 4-2 series the close the 2023 regular season. Since the start of the 2021 season, the Flying Squirrels are 17-30 in Erie.

PACKING THE HOUSE: This season the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,556 fans per home game, which leads Double-A and ranks seventh among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history. Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance was the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS are in second place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, 1.5 games behind Altoona. Last week, they dropped four of six at Somerset. It was their second straight series loss after winning their previous three series. After going 10-2 from July 4-20, they dropped six of seven from July 22-30 before going 6-3 in their last nine games dating back to August 1. Of Richmond's 63 losses this season, 36 of them have been by two runs or less (23 by one, 13 by two). Their 23 one-run losses are tied for the most in the EL, even with Reading. Richmond's +18 run differential in the second half is second-best in the league. In the last three games, the Flying Squirrels are hitting .333 (36-for-108) and averaging seven runs per game (21 total).

THE SEAWOLVES won the Southwest Division first-half title to clinch their fourth consecutive postseason appearance. They are tied for fourth place in the division's second-half standings. Erie split last week's series at Akron, winning three straight from Thursday through Saturday before dropping the finale on Sunday. The Erie offense leads the Eastern League in batting average (.261), runs (551), hits (921), total bases (1472), doubles, (205), RBIs (507), OBP (.349), SLG (.418) and OPS (.767). The Erie pitching staff is third in the EL in ERA (3.36). Erie's roster features seven of Baseball America's top-30 Tigers prospects, including SS/2B Kevin McGonigle (No. 1), OF Max Clark (No. 2), C Thayron Liranzo (No. 4), C Josue Briceño (No. 5), RHP Jaden Hamm (No. 7), 2B Max Anderson (No. 13) and OF Justice Bigbie (No. 27). There are also four players on Baseball America's top-100 prospects list, including McGonigle (No. 2), Clark (No. 9), Liranzo (No. 69) and Briceño (No. 75). MLB.com's top 30 Tigers prospects list features nine Erie players, including McGonigle (No. 1), Clark (No. 2), Briceño (No. 4), Liranzo (No. 5), Anderson (No. 9), Hamm (No. 10), OF Roberto Campos (No. 20), Bigbie (No. 26) and RHP Yosber Sanchez (No. 30). MLB.com's top-100 prospects list features four Erie players, including McGonigle (No. 6), Clark (No. 10), Briceño (No. 51) and Liranzo (No. 76).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Nick Zwack** makes his fourth Double-A start of the year. He started the series opener on Tuesday against the SeaWolves and threw five scoreless innings, allowing two hits, in a 1-0 win. It tied the longest start of his Double-A career and was his second consecutive five-inning start, his longest since returning from injury. Zwack missed all of last year and the beginning of this season with an elbow injury. He began rehab work with the ACL Giants on May 20 and pitched six scoreless starts, spanning 12.1 innings. He made four starts with High-A Eugene before being assigned to Richmond on July 19. Zwack was selected by the New York Mets in the 17th round of the 2021 MLB Draft out of Xavier. He was traded to the Giants along with J.D. Davis, Carson Seymour and Thomas Szapucki for Darin Ruf on August 2, 2022. Zwack spent the 2023 season with the Flying Squirrels and went 5-7 with a 6.56 ERA in 24 outings, including 16 starts. **For more on Zwack, see page two.**

FOR ERIE: Right-hander Kenny Serwa makes his 12th Double-A start. In the series opener against Richmond on Tuesday, he threw five scoreless innings, allowing three hits. In his last six outings since July 4, Serwa has gone 1-2 with a 1.93 ERA (6 ER/28.0 IP), but has allowed five unearned runs. Serwa signed with the Tigers in January and began the season with High-A West Michigan, going 3-1 with a 2.75 ERA in 10 outings (five starts). He was promoted to Double-A on June 5. He began his college career with one season at NCAA DII St. Joseph's (ind.) College before spending three seasons at SIU Edwardsville. He then pitched one season at the University of Central Florida before spending his final college season at Dayton in 2022. Serwa pitched in independent baseball with the Billings Mustangs in 2022, did not pitch in 2023 and spent the 2024 season with the independent Chicago Dogs.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan** and **Onil Perez** have combined to catch 54 stolen base attempts this season, which first among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 39 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing **Jackson Williams'** mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 52 runners caught stealing for his career is third-most in franchise history, trailing **Eliezer Zambrano** (53, 2010-2017). The SeaWolves have only attempted two stolen bases in this week's series.

BERI BOMBS: **Victor Bericoto** hit his ninth homer of the season in the second game last Friday's doubleheader at Somerset, which leads active Richmond players for the year. It was the 31st homer of his Flying Squirrels career, moving him into third place on the franchise's all-time home run list, passing **Jarrett Parker** (2013-14). He is now two homers behind **Jacob Heyward** (2019, '21-22) for second place on the list and six behind **Richy Oropesa's** (2013-16) franchise record of 37. He also drove the 118th RBI of his Richmond career in the first game of Friday's doubleheader, moving him ahead of **Hunter Cole** (2015-17) for second place on the franchise's all-time RBI list. Bericoto now has 124 career RBIs with Richmond, trailing only Oropesa's record of 165. In nine August games, Bericoto is batting .345 (10-for-29) with a homer, two doubles and seven RBIs.

UNLUCK: **Tyler Myrick** recorded his 10th save of the season in Wednesday's 6-3 win at Erie. It was his second straight day closing out a save. For the year, he is tied for the league lead in saves. It was the 22nd save of his Flying Squirrels career, moving him into a tie for fifth place on the franchise's all-time saves list with **Josh Osich** (2013-16). His next save will tie him with **Rafael Cova** (2010) for fourth on the franchise's all-time saves list with 23. Myrick has converted six of his seven save attempts since July 1 over 11 appearances. He picked up his first win of the season on July 25 against the Sea Dogs, working the final four outs. Since June 28, Myrick has posted a 1.23 ERA (2 ER/14.0 IP) in 12 appearances.

KING OF THE HILL: In his last nine games since July 30, **Turner Hill** is batting .464 (13-for-28) with two doubles, three walks, one RBI and seven runs scored. On Saturday night at Erie, he tied his Double-A career high with four hits and set a Double-A career high with three runs scored.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is ranked sixth in walks (53), and tied for sixth in hits (93). **Turner Hill** is tied for fifth in triples (5). **Seth Lonsway** is seventh in ERA (3.52). **John Michael Bertrand** is third in innings pitched (105.0), third in ERA (2.91), eighth in WHIP (1.27) and eighth in BAA (.242). **Jack Choate** is fourth in strikeouts (102), sixth in ERA (3.43) and tied for eighth in BAA (.232). **Joe Whitman** is seventh in strikeouts (97). **Tyler Myrick** is first in saves (10).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 244 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 4), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 8), **Joe Whitman** (No. 9) and **Jack Choate** (No. 28). **John Michael Bertrand** is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeverson Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 5), Whitman (No. 14) and Velasquez (No. 21).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1959: The Richmond Virginians beat the Buffalo Bisons, 1-0, at Parker Field. Jim Bronstad and Johnny James threw a one-hit shutout. Bronstad had a no-hitter working until one out in the fifth when Bobby Morgan hit a single. The game's only run scored in the sixth on a bases-loaded walk by Frank Leja. Buffalo loaded the bases in the ninth with two hit batters, a double steal and an intentional walk before James struck out Johnny Coker and Jack Phillips to end the game. **1971:** The Richmond Braves beat the Toledo Mud Hens, 9-8, at Parker Field. Pinch-hitter Clyde King hit a two-run homer in the bottom of the eighth to give Richmond a 7-5 lead. Toledo scored three in the top of the ninth to take a 8-7 lead. Bob Didier brought in Dusty Baker with a single to tie the game and pinch-hitter Fred Velasquez hit a game-winning single. Baker had four hits, including a homer in the fifth. **1976:** Dale Murphy made his R-Braves debut as a late pinch-runner in a 5-4 win over the Rhode Island Red Sox in Pawtucket. He was throwing out trying to score in the eighth inning. He singled in his first Triple-A at-bat in extra innings. Reggie Sanders hit a go-ahead single in the 11th inning. **2013:** The Flying Squirrels beat the New Hampshire Fisher Cats, 7-2, in 13 innings in Manchester. Juan Ciriaco opened the scoring with an RBI single in the fourth and Andy Burns tied the score with a double in the fifth. Joe Panik moved Richmond ahead, 2-1, with an RBI single in the 12th, but the Fisher Cats tied the game in the bottom of the inning. In the top of the 13th, Panik hit a go-ahead single and Javier Herrera followed with a grand slam for a 7-2 lead. **2022:** The Flying Squirrels lost to the Portland Sea Dogs, 1-0, at Hadlock Field. Tyler Dearden hit a walk-off single against Ryan Walker in the bottom of the 10th for the game's only run. Matt Frisbee started and struck out 13 over six scoreless innings, breaking the franchise single-game record. Chris Wright threw two scoreless innings. Cole Waites struck out three straight batters in the ninth to strand the bases loaded and force extras. Casey Schmitt made his Double-A debut and went 0-for-3. **2024:** The Flying Squirrels split a doubleheader with the Hartford Yard Goats at The Diamond. Hartford won the first game, 15-1. The second game went into extras scoreless. Sterlin Thompson gave Hartford a 1-0 lead in the top of the 10th with a sacrifice fly. Luis Toribio tied the game in the bottom of the 10th with a single. Three batters later, Jairo Pomares hit a walk-off single to score pinch-runner Jimmy GLOWENKE.
