YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the Harrisburg Senators, 7-2. Harrisburg took a 2-0 lead in the top of the second inning with a two-run homer by Caleb Lomavita. In the bottom of the second, **Maui Ahuna** hit a solo homer to cut the lead in half. **Bo Davidson** hit a two-run homer in the bottom of the third to move Richmond ahead, 3-2. It was his sixth homer in his last eight games. In the bottom of the fourth, **Ty Hanchey** hit an RBI single and Davidson brought home a run with a sacrifice fly for a 5-2 lead. **Jean Carlos Sio** hit a solo homer, his first at Double-A, and a run scored on a balk in the sixth to open a 7-2 lead. **Greg Farone** picked up his first Double-A win, allowing two runs over five innings. **Will Bednar** and **Shane Rademacher** each pitched two scoreless relief innings.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the third of a six-game series against the Harrisburg Senators, Double-A affiliate of the Washington Nationals. This is Harrisburg's first-ever visit to CarMax Park and the first series between the two teams this year. There are 10 games remaining in the Eastern League's first half.

STRONG START: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 38-20 start is the best in team history through 58 games, passing a 33-25 start in 2014 and 2022. Richmond has won five series and split four so far this year.

RELENTLESS: In their 38 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 19 of them. In 13 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. On April 4, they scored two in the ninth for an 11-9 win at Erie. In the April 7 home opener, they never trailed but jumped ahead in the bottom of the eighth for a 3-2 win over the Curve. On April 9, they scored two in the eighth for another 3-2 win against Altoona. On April 11, the Curve scored two in the top of the 10th before the Flying Squirrels walked off with three in the bottom of the 10th. On April 15 in Hartford, the Flying Squirrels scored five runs with two outs in the ninth to win 13-11. On April 24, **Drew Cavanaugh** hit a walk-off, two-run homer in the ninth for a 7-6 win over the Patriots. On April 26, Richmond tied the score with two outs in the ninth before **Parks Harber** hit a walk-off single in the 10th. On April 30, the Flying Squirrels rallied from a two-run deficit in the eighth to take the lead in the ninth and 10th but were answered by Altoona before a 12-run top of the 11th. On Wednesday against Akron, **Jonah Cox** hit a two-run homer to tie the score in the ninth before Cavanaugh won the game, 5-4, with a walk-off double. On Friday, the Flying Squirrels tied their largest come-from-behind win in franchise history, overcoming a 6-0 deficit to win, 9-6, over Akron. On May 20 against Binghamton, **Ty Hanchey** hit a game-tying homer in the bottom of the ninth and Harber won the game with a walk-off single. After trailing, 6-1, early on June 5, the Flying Squirrels rallied and **Diego Velasquez** won the game with double in the 10th. On June 6, Richmond posted five runs in the bottom of the ninth to walk off against Erie, the largest ninth-inning comeback in team history, tying to score with a two-run homer by **Bo Davidson** and winning the game on a double by **Onil Perez**.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS lead the Southwest Division by 7.5 games over Harrisburg and Akron with 10 games remaining in the Eastern League's first half. Richmond's magic number over Akron and Harrisburg to win the first half is three. They have the second-best record in Double-A. Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.279), hits (547), doubles (127) and triples (19).

THE SENATORS are tied for second place in the Southwest Division, 7.5 games behind first-place Richmond. Harrisburg went 2-4 in last week's series against Somerset. The Harrisburg roster features six players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Nationals prospects, including 2B/SS Devin Fitz-Gerald (No. 5), OF Ethan Petry (No. 11), LHP Alex Clemmey (No. 12), OF Sam Petersen (No. 17), C Caleb Lomavita (No. 24) and 3B Cayden Wallace (No. 28). MLB.com's top-30 Nationals prospects list features five Harrisburg players, including Fitz-Gerald (No. 5), Clemmey (No. 12), Petry (No. 13), Petersen (No. 23) and Lomavita (No. 27).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Charlie McDaniel** makes his second Double-A start. He was promoted from High-A Eugene last Tuesday and debuted on Friday, allowing six runs over three innings in a no-decision. With the Emeralds, he went 3-1 with a 3.99 ERA in nine starts. With the Emeralds, McDaniel was the Northwest League Pitcher of the Month for April after going 1-0 with a 1.10 ERA (2 ER/16.1 IP) in four starts. He pitched his first professional season in 2025 and split the season between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene, going 8-6 with a 3.68 ERA in 23 outings (12 starts). McDaniel signed with the Giants as a non-drafted free agent out of Presbyterian College in 2024 after being named First-Team All-Big South in his senior season. **For more on McDaniel, see page two.**

FOR HARRISBURG: Right-hander Josh Randall makes his third Double-A start. He made his debut on May 30 at Reading and allowed one unearned run over five innings. In his first home start at FNB Field last Friday, Randall threw seven scoreless innings an allowed three hits with a career-high nine strikeouts. He began the year with High-A Wilmington and went 2-2 with a 4.40 ERA in nine starts. Randall was selected by the Detroit Tigers in the third round of the 2024 MLB Draft out of the University of San Diego. He was traded at last year's trade deadline on July 31 to the Washington Nationals along with RHP R.J. Sales for RHP Kyle Finnegan.

IT'S BO TIME! **Bo Davidson** is riding an eight-game hitting streak since June 2, during which he is batting .406 (13-for-32) with six homers, a double and 11 RBIs. From last Thursday through Sunday, he homered in four consecutive games, a new Flying Squirrels franchise record, and he hit five homers over six games in last week's series against Erie. From last Tuesday through Sunday, he picked up at least one RBI in six consecutive games, one shy of the franchise record. **Clay Timpner** (April 28-May 5, 2010) and **Victor Bericoto** (Sept. 1-10, 2024) hold the RBI streak record at seven consecutive games. Davidson hit a two-run homer in the ninth on Saturday, part of a team-record five-run comeback in the final inning. He hit a solo homer in the first inning of Sunday's game. He belted a two-run homer on Wednesday night against the Senators. Davidson leads the team and the Giants minor leagues with 12 homers on the season.

SIZZLING: **Charlie Szykowny** had a six-game hit streak snapped on Tuesday night. In his last eight games since June 2, Szykowny is batting .333 (11-for-33) with a homer, three doubles, a triple and four RBIs. From June 2-5, he had two hits in four consecutive games. He began the streak with the first game of this homestand, going 2-for-4 with a homer and four RBIs. He also picked up an RBI on Sunday afternoon against the SeaWolves. Among Giants full-season minor leaguers this year, Szykowny ranks tied for second in triples (3), tied for third in extra-base hits (24), tied for sixth in doubles (15) and tied for sixth in total bases (96).

PARKS & WRECK: **Parks Harber** has homered seven times and picked up 27 RBIs in his last 29 games since May 7. He had seven RBIs over two games on May 13 and 14 at Erie, including two homers. He hit a solo home run on May 20 against Binghamton before driving a game-winning single in the bottom of the ninth, his second walk-off hit for the Flying Squirrels this year. Harber had 23 RBIs in the month of May, which was fourth-most in the Eastern League.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 298 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

PACKING THE HOUSE: In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. April 7's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels. This season, the Flying Squirrels rank third among the 120 MiLB teams in average attendance (7,040).

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Jonah Cox** is first in batting average (.400), first in OBP (.453), first in SLG (.644), first in OPS (1.097), first in triples (5), second in hits (64), third in stolen bases (27) and tied for fifth in total bases (103). **Parks Harber** is tied for fourth in doubles (15), 10th in batting average (.308) and 10th in OPS (.922). **Scott Bandura** is second in OBP (.430) and fourth in batting average (.324). **Charlie Szykowny** is tied for fourth in triples (3), tied for fourth in doubles (15) and eighth in hits (57). **Bo Davidson** is tied for seventh in homers (12). **Joe Whitman** is first in WHIP (0.97), tied for third in wins (5), fourth in strikeouts (65), fourth in ERA (3.22) and fourth in BAA (.198). **Jack Choate** is tied for third in wins (5). **Tyler Vogel** is tied for first in saves (7). **Mitch White** is tied for fourth in saves (5). **Cesar Perdomo** is first in strikeouts (68), first in BAA (.188), second in WHIP (1.01), fifth in ERA (3.35) and tied for 10th in innings pitched (53.2).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Parks Harber** (No. 16), **Joe Whitman** (No. 18), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 24) and RHP **Yunior Marte** (No. 29). **Adrián Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 7), Harber (No. 14) and INF **Maui Ahuna** (No. 20).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1963: The Richmond Virginians beat the Indianapolis Indians, 5-4, in 11 innings at Parker Field. Don Buddin flared a single into shallow right field to bring home the winning run in the bottom of the 11th inning. **2011:** The Flying Squirrels beat the New Hampshire Fisher Cats, 2-0, in Manchester. Daryl Maday started on the mound and pitched five scoreless innings, striking out eight batters. Henry Sosa worked the final four innings. In the seventh, Justin Christian broke a scoreless tie with a two-out, two-run double, one of his three hits in the game. **2022:** The Richmond Flying Squirrels beat the Erie SeaWolves, 6-5, at The Diamond. In the top of the ninth, Dillon Dingle gave the SeaWolves a 5-4 lead with a two-out, RBI single. In the bottom of the ninth, Tyler Fitzgerald led off with a single before walks by Shane Matheny and Robert Emery loaded the bases with one out. Michael Gigliotti was hit by a pitch to plate the tying run. Brandon Martorano followed with a walk-off sacrifice fly for a 6-5 win.
