Today's Game

The Clippers will send LHP **Logan Allen** to the mound today, looking to take a 3-0 lead in the series (1-3 after winning first 2G of the series). The Mud Hens will counter with RHP **Dylan File**. Columbus is 43-30 (.589) versus right handers this year. File has pitched against the Clippers five times in his career, going 2-1 with a 2.73ERA (26.1IP, 21H, 10R, 8ER, 7BB, 22K).

vs. the Mud Hens

Columbus has pulled ahead in the season series vs. Toledo (10-4) after going 10-11 opposing the Mud Hens last year (have not won a season series since going 11-10 in 2022). The Clippers have scored first in 11 of 14 against Toledo this year (9-2), compared to 37 times (20-17) in their other 89G. Individually, **Daniel Schneemann** has hit .344 with 6HR and 19RBI against Toledo in his career (24G).

Brushing Off the Hits

The Clippers were outhit 10-6 last night, but Columbus prevailed for the 12th time when watching the opposition collect more (t-3rd most, -1 from lead) and the 18th time when surrendering at least 10 hits (most in the IL, +4 on 2nd). Columbus is sitting with a negative differential in hits (-34, 13th), homers (-15, 15th) and runs (-27, 14th), but the Clippers own the 8th best winning percentage (.524).

Ingle is Back

In 14G since his option, **Cooper Ingle** is 23x59 (.390), drawing 8BB (.463OBP) with 10XBH (3HR, .661SLG). Thursday's 4x5 game pushed his season average over .300, while also qualifying him for rate statistics, as he is one of two players in the IL, along with Iowa's **BJ Murray**, hitting .300/.400/.500. At catcher, Ingle has a 1.334OPS (13HR) in 36G (.613OPS and 2HR in 28G between DH and LF).

Angel Ascendant

Over his last 32G, since 6/18, **Angel Genao** leads the IL in OBP (.469), while ranking 2nd in batting (.370, 44x119), 4th in walks (23) and 9th in OPS (1.007). He owns a 16% walk rate in that time (145PA; 8% in first 35G with Columbus) and his 12K yield an 8% rate (21% in first 35G). Saturday's multi-K game was his first since 5/31 (40G between; 40PA with 0K from 7/8-7/22, 50PA with 0K from 6/23-7/3).

Walks Waning

Though the Clippers maintain a comfortable lead in the IL in walks (530, +34 on 2nd), they have drawn just 50BB in 11G since the All-Star Break (t-7th). **Kahlil Watson** has only 10BB in his last 30G with Columbus (30BB in first 31G, ranked 2nd in the IL through 5/9). **Bo Naylor** has just 4BB in his last 15G (24BB in first 28G with Columbus) and **Cooper Ingle** has 2BB in his last 7G (8BB in 8G prior).

Looking to Rebound

Ralphy Velazquez produced a multi-hit game on 7/19 vs. Indianapolis, a day after his career best 30G on base streak was snapped (.383OBP from 6/3-7/10, t-4th longest in the IL this year), but he went 0x21 in 6G after (average dipped 31 points). He collected a pair of extra base hits on Tuesday, boosting his OPS in Huntington Park to .897 (.579 in 25G on the road; 23x67 with 3HR in last 19G at home).

Serious Growth

Kody Huff clubbed his 15th HR of the season on Tuesday (all in last 255AB; had 15HR in previous 856AB, 6/28/23-4/5/26). Having already established career highs in runs, triples, RBI, walks, and steals, Huff is just seven hits and four doubles from personal bests. He is 7x22 in his last 7G (3HR) and his .910OPS is 5th best in the IL (.682OPS in MiLB career prior; **Cooper Ingle** leads: 1.006).

In a Slump

After doubling twice on 6/25 at Omaha, **George Valera** hit .107 (6x56, all singles) with only 3RBI in his next 15G. He broke out on 7/21 at St. Paul (double, 2BB, 2RBI; first multi-RBI game since 5/30), but he is 1x13 in 4G since. His next RBI will be his 150th as a Clipper (38th, **Juan Brito** is at 147). Valera has not homered since 5/19 vs. Louisville (122AB) and has 2HR in his last 52G (184AB, .288SLG).

Rare Company

Dating to the nightcap vs. Scranton/WB on 6/19, **Milan Tolentino** is 26x89 (.292) in his last 28G, collecting 14XBH (.562SLG) and 18RBI (was 5x39, .128, in 13G prior). Over his last 21G, Tolentino has drawn 18BB to 18K (84PA; 8BB and 42K in previous 33G, 114PA). He is one of 11 in the IL with at least a dozen HR and SB, along with **Kahlil Watson** (Columbus and Omaha are only teams with two).

This Date in Clipper History

7/30/2014

Tyler Cloyd twirled the first no-hitter in Huntington Park history, coming within one hit batter of a perfect game (plunked Louisville's **Donnie Murphy** to lead off the 9th). The crowd of 10,100, and Cloyd, had some lengthy layoffs on the way to history, as the Clippers scored five times in the 7th and four in the 8th on the way to a 13-0 win. **Jesus Aguilar** was the offensive star, homering and driving in four.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,463 to 1,404).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 150-120 (.556) in pitch reviews, with batters going 77-76 (.503) and pitchers/catchers going 73-44 (.624). They have run out of challenges in 42G and have not challenged in 5G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 797, would rank as 6th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 120 through 103G (on pace for 174SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 33CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 3rd most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (48; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 153 runs while crafting a .901OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 88 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +65 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 240-149 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 79 grand slams and 1,964RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.38 through the first 103G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 195HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 6th in the IL this year (.982), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 58G this season (34-24, .586), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 3rd most last at bat wins this year (14, two off the lead) while playing in the 3rd most games decided in the last at bat (26, Memphis has 28). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 100G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-52 (.480, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 440-455 (.492), 410-409 with Columbus (.501).

Workhorse:

Allen is the only Clipper averaging over 81 pitches a start this season, at 87.2 (along with **Ryan Webb**, only pitchers to throw more than 90 in a game multiple times; no Clipper has thrown more than 90 since **Pedro Avila** on 5/30). Averaging almost 93 pitches per outing in the Majors last season, Allen hit triple digits six times (Columbus has not had a pitcher reach 100 since **Peyton Battenfield** on 9/2/22, 567G ago).

On Guard(ians):

In three stints in the Majors this season (27th man in a DH on 4/5 and 7/18, two-day excursion from 5/24-5/25), Allen has appeared twice for Cleveland. He closed out the game on 5/25 vs. Washington (4.0IP, 5H, 0R, 0ER, 1BB, 7K), his second in relief at the Major League level (once last season). Allen made a start in the second game of a DH on 7/18 at Pittsburgh (3.1IP, 6H, 3R, 2ER, 3BB, 3K), his first start in the Majors since last year's season finale.

Better Half:

Allen has 5GS in the second half of the season, going 2-1 with a 2.67ERA (27.0IP, 22H, 8R, 8ER, 7BB, 36K). He ranks 1st in the IL in strikeouts this half, while placing 4th in ERA and 6th in WHIP (1.07). The first half of the season saw him 10th in strikeouts (68, 104K overall rank 3rd), 22nd in ERA (5.15) and 26th in WHIP (1.58) among 29 pitchers with at least 57.0IP.

Stellar Support:

Through 17GS, the bullpen has graced Allen with a 2.79ERA in relief (61.1IP, 19ER), stranding four of seven runners inherited. The defense has committed only 12E in Allen's starts, while the offense has put forward 5.3 runs per game. That all adds up to a 14-3 record for Columbus when he takes the hill.

Month to Month:

In his first 5GS (103BF), Allen recorded 32K (31%) against only 10BB (10%), while painting the zone with strikes on 63% of his offerings. Once the calendar flipped to May, however, he made 4GS (87BF), watching his strikeout rate dip to 16% (14K) and his walk rate inflate to 14% (12BB; strikes on 57% of pitches). He found his groove in June, starting with a 10K outing (fifth of career) on 6/6 vs. Omaha (40K to 105BF last month, 38%; 5BB, 4%, 67% of pitches were strikes). In July, his strikeouts are down once more (18K to 67BF, 27%), while walks are up (6BB, 9%; still sitting at 64% strikes thrown, however).

Cleaning Up:

Opposing cleanup hitters had just one hit off Allen in their first 30AB of the season, though the hit went over the wall (**Charles McAdoo**, 4/26 at Buffalo). Coming into today, they are 7x41 (3HR, 1BB, 10K) and, looking at the lineup as a whole, the top five in the order have slashed .213/.288/.362 with 7HR in 207AB against Allen, while batters 6-9 have hit .350/.423/.577 with 6HR in 123AB.
