SUNDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Baysox, 8-0. Richmond was held to three hits by Cade Povich, Zane Barnhart and Sebastian Gongora. Douglas Hodo hit two homers for the Baysox. Richmond dropped four-of-six in to Chesapeake on the week, their first series loss of 2026.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The June 12 win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. The Flying Squirrels will play the second-half division champion in the Division Series. Game 1 will be at the home of the second-half champion on Tues., Sept. 15. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3 will be at CarMax Park on Thurs., Sept. 17 and Sat., Sept. 18. If Richmond advances to the EL Championship Series, Game 1 will be at CarMax Park on Sun., Sept. 20. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the opener of a six-game series against the Akron RubberDucks, Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians. This is the third season between these two teams this year and the RubberDucks' second trip to Richmond. Today is the first game of the Eastern League's second half.

STRONG START: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 43-25 start is the best in team history through 68 games, passing a 40-28 start in 2014. Richmond has won six series, split four and lost one so far this year. After opening the season with a 27-7 record through May 13, the Flying Squirrels are 16-18 in their last 34 games since.

RELENTLESS: In their 43 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 20 of them. In 15 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. On April 4, they scored two in the ninth for an 11-9 win at Erie. In the April 7 home opener, they never trailed but jumped ahead in the bottom of the eighth for a 3-2 win over the Curve. On April 9, they scored two in the eighth for another 3-2 win against Altoona. On April 11, the Curve scored two in the top of the 10th before the Flying Squirrels walked off with three in the bottom of the 10th. On April 15 in Hartford, the Flying Squirrels scored five runs with two outs in the ninth to win 13-11. On April 24, **Drew Cavanaugh** hit a walk-off, two-run homer in the ninth for a 7-6 win over the Patriots. On April 26, Richmond tied the score with two outs in the ninth before **Parks Harber** hit a walk-off single in the 10th. On April 30, the Flying Squirrels rallied from a two-run deficit in the eighth to take the lead in the ninth and 10th but were answered by Altoona before a 12-run top of the 11th. On Wednesday against Akron, **Jonah Cox** hit a two-run homer to tie the score in the ninth before Cavanaugh won the game, 5-4, with a walk-off double. On Friday, the Flying Squirrels tied their largest come-from-behind win in franchise history, overcoming a 6-0 deficit to win, 9-6, over Akron. On May 20 against Binghamton, **Ty Hanchev** hit a game-tying homer in the bottom of the ninth and Harber won the game with a walk-off single. After trailing, 6-1, early on June 5, the Flying Squirrels rallied and **Diego Velasquez** won the game with double in the 10th. On June 6, Richmond posted five runs in the bottom of the ninth to walk off against Erie, the largest ninth-inning comeback in team history, tying to score with a two-run homer by **Bo Davidson** and winning the game on a double by **Onil Perez**. On June 14, Richmond trailed by three runs twice before **Jean Carlos Sio** tied the score with a two-run homer in the sixth and **Maui Ahuna** was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded in the 10th for a 5-4 win. Sio hit a two-run, go-ahead homer in a 5-3 win in Bowie on Wednesday.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won the Southwest Division first-half title by seven games over second-place Erie. Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.272), doubles (136) and triples (21) and ranks second in hits (623). Over the last three games since Friday, the Flying Squirrels are batting .140 (13-for-93), which is tied for 11th in the EL.

THE RUBBERDUCKS finished the Eastern League's first half in third place in the Southwest Division, eight games behind Richmond and one game behind Erie. Akron has lost four-of-five since last Thursday. The Akron roster features five players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Guardians prospects list, including OF Jaison Chourio (No. 9), C Jacob Cozart (No. 14), OF Alfonso Rosario (No. 24), LHP Josh Hartle (No. 25) and LHP Rafe Schlesinger (No. 29). MLB.com's top-30 Guardians prospects list features seven Akron players, including Chourio (No. 9), Rosario (No. 13), Cozart (No. 17), RHP Justin Campbell (No. 21), Hartle (No. 25), Schlesinger (No. 26) and INF Luke Hill (No. 30).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Charlie McDaniel** makes his fourth Double-A start and his first against the RubberDucks. He last pitched last Wednesday against the Baysox and allowed two runs (one earned) over five innings in a no-decision. After allowing six runs over three innings in his Double-A debut on June 5 against the SeaWolves, McDaniel has gone 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (3 ER/11.0 IP) in his last two starts. He went 3-1 with a 3.99 ERA in nine starts with High-A Eugene before being promoted to Double-A on June 2. With the Emeralds, McDaniel was the Northwest League Pitcher of the Month for April after going 1-0 with a 1.10 ERA (2 ER/16.1 IP) in four starts. He pitched his first professional season in 2025 and split the season between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene, going 8-6 with a 3.68 ERA in 23 outings (12 starts). McDaniel signed with the Giants as a non-drafted free agent out of Presbyterian College in 2024 after being named First-Team All-Big South in his senior season. **For more on McDaniel, see page two.**

FOR AKRON: Right-hander Dylan DeLucia makes his 13th start of the season and the fourth of his career against the Flying Squirrels. He last pitched on Wednesday against the Curve and allowed two runs over five innings in no-decision. In his previous three starts against Richmond, he is 0-1 with a 0.64 ERA (1 ER/14.0 IP). Today marks his third start against Richmond this season. On May 6, he threw four scoreless innings at CarMax Park. On May 30 in Akron, he allowed one unearned run over four innings. DeLucia split last season between High-A Lake County and Double-A Akron, going 7-7 with a 3.57 ERA in 24 outings (22 starts). DeLucia was selected by the Guardians in the sixth round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Ole Miss. This spring, he pitched for Team Italy in the World Baseball Classic, posting a 2.35 ERA (2 ER/7.2 IP) in two appearances.

IT'S BO TIME! **Bo Davidson** had his 17-game on-base streak snapped on Friday night, going 0-for-4. He is 0-for-12 in his last three games. In his 17 games since June 2, Davidson is batting .314 (22-for-70) with eight homers, two doubles and 18 RBIs, adding six walks. From June 4-7, he homered in four consecutive games, a new Flying Squirrels franchise record. From June 2-June 7, he picked up at least one RBI in six consecutive games, one shy of the franchise record. Davidson hit a two-run homer in the ninth on June 6, part of a team-record five-run comeback in the final inning. Last week in Bowie, he homered on two of the first three games of the series. Davidson leads the team and the Giants minor leagues with 14 homers on the season.

SIO LATER: **Jean Carlos Sio** has five homers and 12 RBIs in his last nine starts since June 10. He began the stretch with his first Double-A homer on June 10 at CarMax Park against Harrisburg, a solo shot. The following game on June 11, he went 2-for-5 with a solo homer and a two-run triple. In the division-clinching win on June 12, he drove a two-run single in the first inning. On June 14, he hit a game-tying, two-run homer in a comeback win. Last Wednesday, Sio drove a two-run, go-ahead homer in the eighth in Bowie. He hit a solo homer on Friday night.

JACK ATTACK: In his last 12 games since June 5, **Jack Payton** is batting .415 (17-for-41) with a homer, two doubles, a triple, four RBIs, three walks and nine runs scored. He has six multi-hit performances in his last 10 games dating back to June 9, including four two-hit games and two three-hit games. He had three of Richmond's four hits on Saturday night.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 303 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

PACKING THE HOUSE: In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. April 7's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels. This season, the Flying Squirrels rank third among the 120 MiLB teams in average attendance (6,991).

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Jonah Cox** is first in triples (5), third in stolen bases (27) and tied for eighth in hits (64). **Parks Harber** is eighth in batting average (.284). **Charlie Szykowny** is tied for fifth in doubles (16) and tied for eighth in extra-base hits (28). **Bo Davidson** is tied for fifth in homers (14) and tied for fifth in RBIs (44). **Tyler Vogel** is first in saves (9). **Mitch White** is tied for sixth in saves (5). **Trystan Vrieling** is first in shutouts (1) and tied for first in complete games (1). **Cesar Perdomo** is first in BAA (.200), first in WHIP (1.04), tied for second in strikeouts (75) and eighth in ERA (3.79).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Parks Harber** (No. 16), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 24) and RHP **Junior Marte** (No. 29). **Adrián Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 6), Harber (No. 13) and INF **Maui Ahuna** (No. 18) and Marte (No. 25).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1956: The Richmond Virginians beat the Buffalo Bisons, 5-4, at Parker Field for their fifth straight win. Buffalo lead, 3-0, in the fourth before Bill Renna hit a two-run homer. Down, 4-2, in the fifth, Dee Phillips hit a two-run homer to tie the score, 4-4. Richmond starter Al Cicotte left with the bases loaded in the fifth and was replaced by Wimpy Nardella, who did not allow a hit over his four innings. Neal Wallington won the game with a walk-off single in the bottom of the ninth. **1971:** The Richmond Braves beat the Louisville Colonels, 5-4, in 15 innings at Parker Field. Louisville opened a 4-2 lead in the top of the ninth with a two-run homer by Carlton Fisk. After two Louisville errors in the bottom of the ninth, Guy Rose and Shaun Fitzmaurice hit RBI singles to tie the score and force extras. In the bottom of the 15th, Jack Crist hit a two-out single to score Jim Breazeale and win the game, 5-4. The game lasted four hours and four minutes and 31 players saw action. Richmond stranded 20 runners on base.
