**Today:** Following the four-day All-Star Break, the Lansing Lugnuts, High-A affiliate of the Oakland Athletics, and the West Michigan Whitecaps, High-A affiliate of the Detroit Tigers, renew acquaintances for a three-game miniseries. The Caps are 7-5 against the Lugnuts this year, winning four of six games against the Nuts in West Michigan in May.

**Last Game: Lugnuts 5, Captains 4.** With the score tied in the bottom of the sixth inning and two outs, **Jack Winkler** sent a fly ball deep into the right field corner, where **Jorge Burgos** leapt for it, couldn't secure the catch, and crashed into the wall, leaving him hurt and immobile while Winkler circled the bases with a decisive inside-the-park home run. The Nuts split the six-game series with Lake County, which saw Burgos carted off the field a day after second baseman **Christian Cairo** landed on his head in an on-field collision and was also pulled off the game early due to injury precaution.

**On Deck:** The Lugnuts and the Whitecaps play through Sunday, enjoy a day off on Monday, and then the Nuts return home to welcome in the Great Lakes Loons in a six-game series running from July 18-23 featuring Wizarding Weekend at Jackson Field.

### LUG NOTES

**Inside the Park:** The Lugnuts hit inside-the-park home runs in the opening game and the series final against the Lake County Captains, the club's first inside-the-parkers since **Denzel Clarke** hit inside-the-park roundtrippers in back-to-back games against West Michigan last season, August 2-3.

**Welcome to the Show:** The No. 1 prospect in the A's system and a Lugnuts standout last season, 1B/C **Tyler Soderstrom** was called up to the Major Leagues today by the Oakland Athletics alongside fellow top prospect **Zack Gelof** from Triple-A Las Vegas. The 21-year-old Soderstrom was hitting .254 / .303 / .536 with 15 doubles, two triples and 20 home runs in 69 games for the Aviators.

**Red Hot in July:** The Lugnuts are batting .301 through nine games in July, led by sizzling starts for **Danny Bautista, Jr.** (15-for-38, .391) and **Daniel Susac** (11-for-29, .379). The Nuts are averaging 5.6 runs per game this month. Bautista, Jr., enters today on a nine-game hitting streak, his third hitting streak this year of at least eight games, and has hit safely in 17 of his last 18 games.

**Stealing is a Virtue:** The Nuts have also stolen 20 bases in 22 attempts in July, giving them 125 steals for the year – best in the Midwest League. Lansing has 96 more stolen bases than West Michigan.

**Roster Transactions:** Earlier today, SS **Max Muncy**, 1B/3B **Jack Winkler** and OF **Caeden Trenkle** were promoted to Double-A Midland, replaced on the Lugnuts' roster by INF **Joshwan Wright** from Triple-A Las Vegas and INF **T.J. Schofield-Sam** from Single-A Stockton. The Nuts also added P **Pedro Santos** from Stockton.

**Two for the Price of One:** The Lugnuts' defense leads the league with 71 double plays this year, five more than second-place West Michigan.

**Historic on the 4th:** A crowd of 11,521 packed in to Jackson Field on July 4, the largest home attendance in Lansing since July 4, 2013. It was also the largest single game crowd in all of High-A, let alone the Midwest League, and an attendance larger than any crowd drawn by every Minor League Baseball team save for six Triple-A teams (Buffalo, Albuquerque, Salt Lake, Indianapolis, Norfolk and Round Rock) and one Double-A team (Frisco).

**The Cycle:** On June 21 at Wisconsin, **Jack Winkler** went 4-for-4 with a single, double, triple, home run and four RBIs, becoming the eighth player in team history to hit for the cycle. The other cycles: **Corey Patterson** (7/5/99 at South Bend); **Donnie Hood** (4/21/03 vs. Dayton); **Chip Cannon** (6/2/05 vs. Clinton); **Travis Snider** (7/7/07 at Fort Wayne); **Brad Glenn** (7/26/10 vs. Clinton); **Edward Olivares** (4/24/17 vs. South Bend); and **Ryan Gold** (4/18/19 vs. Dayton).

**They Know Their Trade:** Lansing has three players acquired via trade by the Oakland Athletics on its roster: **Christian Fernandez** (Tampa Bay Rays, 7/9/22, for Christian Bethancourt); **Euribiel Angeles** (San Diego Padres, 4/3/22, for Sean Manaea); and **Junior Pérez** (San Diego Padres, 6/30/20, for Jorge Mateo).

- The All-Star Game included three former Lugnuts in **Vladimir Guerrero, Jr.** (who won the Home Run Derby), **Bo Bichette** and **Jordan Romano**.

### TODAY IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

**2012:** Noah Syndergaard tossed three hitless innings, striking out four, before the first of two rain delays forced him out. In the top of the ninth inning, at 12:15 a.m., with Lansing one out away from victory, the Cedar Rapids Kernels' Matt Scioscia knocked an RBI double to left-center... and the skies opened up in a torrent of rain, causing a third rain delay. The Lugs never did get that last out – the game was eventually called – but they did pick up a 9-4 win over Cedar Rapids near 1 a.m. The game lasted 2 hours and 38 minutes, while the delays totaled 3 hours, 2 minutes.

**2016:** The Lugnuts were swept in a doubleheader, 3-2 and 1-0, at Peoria. Game 2 saw the Lugnuts' Jordan Romano and Josh DeGraaf pitch a six-inning no-hitter, the second no-hitter in franchise history, but a leadoff walk to Craig Aikin, a sacrifice bunt/DeGraaf fielding error, a fielder's choice and an Eli Alvarez sacrifice fly in the bottom of the sixth gave the Chiefs the game's only run. In Game 1, 20-year-old right-hander Sandy Alcantara brought a 2-0 Chiefs lead to the seventh, but the Lugnuts rallied to tie the game. In the bottom of the seventh, the Chiefs walked off on an unusual play: With Carlos Torres at second base, Magneuris Sierra sent a grounder to the left side of the infield. Third baseman Carl Wise initially attempted to make the play before dodging baserunner Torres. Shortstop J.C. Cardenas's subsequent throw escaped first baseman Juan Kelly, and Torres scored the game-winning run amid Lugnut protests of interference.

**The King:** First name is pronounced “yo-el-vis,” with the emphasis on the middle syllable... nicknamed Elvis... one other Joelvis played professional baseball, Joelvis Gonzalez, a Twins prospect from Venezuela in 2006-07 who hit .270 in 79 games but never made it higher than rookie ball... has been clocked as hot as 98 mph this year; says that he has hit 100 mph once in his life, the first time his mother came in from the DR to watch him pitch in a professional game, in 2022 in the Florida State League... currently rated the No. 29 prospect in the Athletics’ organization by MLB Pipeline; Fastball 55, Slider 50, Changeup 50, Control 50, Overall 40.

**Path Through the Pros:** After signing at age 16 for \$33,000, Del Rosario debuted as a reliever in 2018 in the Dominican Summer League before converting to a starter in the DSL in 2019, tossing 5 2/3 innings at most... made United States debut in 2021 in Florida Complex League; twirled five hitless innings in second start, July 5, striking out seven Orioles and walking one... made full-season debut with Bradenton in 2022, posting three six-inning starts in a four-start span in June; allowed .248 avg. to right-handers compared to .299 to lefties; runners stole six bases in 10 attempts; outstanding in the first inning, limiting opposition to .191/.295/.353 splits; far better on the road (2.95 ERA in 55 IP) than at home (4.74 in 38 IP).

**Joining the Athletics:** Del Rosario was the first overall selection of the 2022 MiLB portion of the Rule 5 Draft... in the Major League portion, the A’s had selected 2018 Lugnut Ryan Noda from the Dodgers with the second overall pick; Noda debuted in the Majors on his birthday on March 30th and has already launched his first MLB home run... Del Rosario was one of a staggering 11 Pittsburgh Pirates prospects to be selected in the Rule 5 MiLB portion after two Pirates prospects, Jose Hernandez and Blake Sabol, were taken consecutively (3rd and 4th) in the MLB portion.

**A Taste of the Cactus League:** Del Rosario appeared in one Spring Training game for the A’s, pitching well initially before bowing out having allowed four runs on four hits and three walks in 2 2/3 innings, striking out four, hitting one and tossing a wild pitch.

**Lugnuts Lineage:** Del Rosario tossed 4 2/3 scoreless innings as the Opening Day starter, April 7 at Great Lakes... he joined such other Opening Day Lugnuts starters as: Blaine Mull (1996), Steve Hueston (1997), Justin Pederson (1998), Mike Wuertz (1999), Matt Bruback (2000), Wilton Chavez (2001), Angel Guzman (2002), Andrew Sisco (2003), Sean Marshall (2004), Casey Janssen (2005), Chi-Hung Cheng (2006), Zach Dials (2007), Trystan Magnuson (2008), Henderson Alvarez (2009), Ryan Shopshire (2010), Misaul Diaz (2011), Noah Syndergaard (2012), Javier Avendano (2013), Jairo Labourt (2014), Chase De Jong (2015), Jon Harris (2016), Justin Maese (2017), Yennsy Diaz (2018), Josh Winckowski (2019), Seth Shuman (2021) and Grant Holman (2022).
