SATURDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Sea Dogs, 5-1. In the third, **Justin Wishkoski** hit a double and scored on a single by **Diego Velasquez** to give Richmond a 1-0 lead. In the fourth, Ronald Rosario hit a two-run homer to give the Sea Dogs a 2-1 lead. Rosario homered again the eighth, a solo shot to push to lead to 3-1. In the ninth, Portland scored a run on a fielder's choice and Max Ferguson added an RBI single for a 5-1 lead. The Flying Squirrels left the bases loaded in the eighth and ninth innings. Sunday's game started but was canceled before the bottom of the second due to rain.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the opener of a six-game series against the Somerset Patriots, Double-A affiliate of the New York Yankees. When these two teams met at The Diamond from April 29-May 4, the Patriots won the first two before the Flying Squirrels won the next three. Somerset won the series finale for a series split. The Flying Squirrels are 4-1 in their last five series openers since July 1.

In the series, the Flying Squirrels have hit .177 (11-for-62) with runners in scoring position and have left 47 on base.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,556 fans per home game, which ranks seventh among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won Friday night to snap a three-game losing streak, their first since mid-June, before losing again on Saturday night. Sunday's game was canceled for rain. They are in second place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, 1.5 games behind Altoona. Last week, they had a three-series win streak snapped, dropping four-of-five to the Sea Dogs at The Diamond. After going 10-2 from July 4-20, they are 1-4 in their last five games since July 22. Of Richmond's 58 losses this season, 32 of them have been by two runs or less (21 by one, 11 by two). Their 21 one-run losses are the most in the EL, one more than Reading. Richmond's +19 run differential in the second half is third-best in the league. In the five games of last week's series, the Flying Squirrels hit .177 (11-for-62) with runners in scoring position and left 47 on base.

THE PATRIOTS are in second place in the Northeast Division second-half standings, three games behind first-half champion Binghamton. They are 1.5 games ahead of third-place Hartford. Somerset is 3-5 in its last eight games and split last week's six-game series at Erie. For the year, the Patriots lead the Eastern League in homers (106) and rank second in runs (445). Somerset's roster features five of Baseball America's top-30 Yankees prospects, including SS George Lombard (No. 1), RHP Carlos Lagrange (No. 5), RHP Elmer Rodriguez-Cruz (No. 6), LHP Brock Selvidge (No. 11) and 2B Roc Riggio (No. 22). MLB.com's top-30 prospects list features eight Somerset players, including Lombard (No. 1), Lagrange (No. 2), Rodriguez-Cruz (No. 6), Riggio (No. 10), Selvidge (No. 12), RHP Trystan Vrieling (No. 21), OF Brandon Jones (No. 26) and LHP Ben Shields (No. 29).

STRONG ARMS: Since June 18, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 3.04 ERA (91 ER/269.0 IP) in 31 games, which is the second-best in the Eastern League. The Richmond bullpen has posted a 2.36 ERA (35 ER/133.2 IP) in that stretch. In their last 12 road games since June 17, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 2.29 ERA (28 ER/110.0 IP).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Joe Whitman** makes his 18th start of the season and his second against the Patriots. He last pitched on Wednesday against the Sea Dogs and allowed three runs over 3.2 innings in a no-decision. In his last two starts before the All-Star Break on July 3 against the Baysox and July 9 at Akron, Whitman went 1-0 with a 2.46 ERA (3 ER/11.0 IP) and struck out 13 batters. On May 3, Whitman threw six perfect innings against the Patriots at The Diamond, retiring all 18 batters he faced, and set a then-career high with 10 strikeouts. He was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week on May 5. In his first full professional season last year, Whitman split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene, going 3-8 with a 4.63 ERA in 23 starts. He finished the year ranked ninth in the Giants organization in strikeouts (108) and tied for ninth in games started. Whitman was selected in the second round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Giants out of Kent State, where he was the MAC Pitcher of the Year that season. Before transferring to Kent State near his hometown of Akron, Ohio, Whitman pitched at Purdue. Entering 2025, Whitman was ranked by Baseball America as the No. 8 Giants prospect and No. 7 by MLB.com. **For more on Whitman, see page two.**

FOR SOMERSET: Right-hander Elmer Rodriguez-Cruz makes his third Double-A start. He last pitched last Tuesday at Erie and allowed two runs over seven innings, striking out seven. He made his Double-A debut on June 12 against the Fisher Cats and surrendered six runs (three earned) over six innings in a loss. Rodriguez-Cruz started the season with High-A Hudson Valley and went 6-4 with a 2.26 ERA in 15 outings. He was promoted to Double-A on July 11. Rodriguez-Cruz was selected by the Boston Red Sox in the fourth round of the 2021 MLB Draft out of Leadership Christian Academy in Puerto Rico, which has also produced former Flying Squirrels **Heliot Ramos** and **Dilan Rosario** as well as Twins infielder José Miranda. Rodriguez-Cruz is ranked by Baseball America and MLB.com as the No. 6 Yankees prospect.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan** and **Onil Perez** have combined to catch 49 stolen base attempts this season, which first among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 36 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing **Jackson Williams'** mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 49 runners caught stealing for his career is tied for third-most in franchise history, even with **Brandon Martorano** (2021-24) and trailing **Eliezer Zambrano** (53, 2010-2017).

SECOND-HALF SABIN: **Sabin Ceballos** is batting .310 (18-for-58) in his last 17 games since July 3 with two homers, four doubles, nine RBIs, 10 walks and 10 runs scored. The stretch has raised his season batting average from .176 to .205. He reached base four times on Tuesday night against the Sea Dogs, going 3-for-3 with a double and a walk. He repeated on Wednesday, going 3-for-3 with a double and a walk. He had reached base in eight consecutive plate appearances entering Friday's game before flying out in his first plate appearance. Last year, Ceballos hit .295 with seven homers and 30 RBIs in his last 32 games of the season, all with High-A Eugene after being traded from the Braves to the Giants.

KING OF THE HILL: **Turner Hill** had his 13-game on-base streak snapped on Thursday, going 0-for-2. It was tied for the second-longest on-base streak by a Richmond player this year. In his last 15 games since July 3, Hill is batting .320 (16-for-50) with three doubles, two triples, a homer, 10 walks and 10 RBIs. Despite not starting his season until May 27, Hill is tied for third in the Eastern League with five triples this year.

SAVING THE DAY: **Tyler Myrick** recorded his seventh save of the season on July 12 in Akron. It was the 19th save of his Richmond career, which sits seventh on the franchise's all-time list, one behind sixth-place Cody Hall (20). Myrick has converted all three of his save attempts since July 1 over six appearances. He picked up his first win of the season on Friday night, working the final four outs.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is ranked sixth in walks (48), sixth in hits (88) and eighth in OBP (.366). **Turner Hill** is tied for third in triples (5). **Seth Lonsway** is fourth in innings pitched (92.0), sixth in ERA (3.52) and ninth in strikeouts (84). **John Michael Bertrand** is second in innings pitched (95.2), fourth in ERA (3.10) and ninth in WHIP (1.30). **Jack Choate** is tied for fourth in strikeouts (95) and, seventh in ERA (3.59) and eighth in BAA (.230). **Joe Whitman** is 10th strikeouts (82). **Tyler Myrick** is tied for fifth in saves (7).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 239 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 4), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 7), **Joe Whitman** (No. 8), **Jack Choate** (No. 24) and **Sabin Ceballos** (No. 29). **John Michael Bertrand** is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeverson Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features four Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 5), Whitman (No. 12), Velasquez (No. 18) and Choate (No. 27).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1968: The Richmond Braves lost to the Rochester Red Wings, 6-0, at Parker Field. Roger Nelson started for Rochester and threw five perfect innings. Picked up by Baltimore in a trade for Luis Aparicio, it was Nelson's first start in two seasons. He spent most of July in service. He had been in California over the previous weekend before coming to Richmond and slept three hours before his start. Tom Fisher carried the perfect-game bid into the ninth inning before it was broken up on a two-out single by pinch-hitter Jesse Gonder. **1989:** The Richmond Braves beat the Rochester Red Wings, 7-5, on the road. Ron Gant hit for the cycle, capping the feat with a go-ahead, ninth-inning triple to score David Justice. It was the fourth cycle in R-Braves history, joining Albert Hall, Gerald Perry and Tommy Dunbar. Mike Stanton picked up the win in his Triple-A debut, working two scoreless relief innings. **1993:** The Richmond Braves beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 8-2, at The Diamond. Brian Bark started and allowed one unearned run over eight innings, striking out eight. Chipper Jones and Javy Lopez each hit two-run homers. **2011:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Trenton Thunder, 3-2, at Mercer County Waterfront Park. Eric Surkamp started for the Flying Squirrels and struck out 12 batters over six innings, tying his own single-game franchise record he had set earlier in the month. Austin Romine gave the Thunder a 1-0 lead in the first with a groundout. In the fifth, Wendell Fairley and Francisco Peguero drove in runs for a 2-1 Richmond lead before Corban Joseph tied the score, 2-2, with a double in the bottom half. In the top of the eighth, Chris Dominguez hit a solo homer for a 3-2 Richmond lead. **2017:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Erie SeaWolves, 3-0, in seven innings at The Diamond. Cory Taylor threw a one-hit shutout, a franchise record for the fewest hits allowed by a Richmond pitcher in a complete game. K.C. Hobson and Brandon Bednar singled in runs in the fourth. Hunter Cole hit a solo homer in the sixth. Richmond won the second game of the doubleheader, 2-0. **2023:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Portland Sea Dogs, 4-3, at The Diamond. Brady Whalen hit an RBI single in the fourth for a 1-0 lead. John Michael Bertrand started for Richmond and allowed three runs (two earned) over five innings. All three runs scored on an single by Tyler McDonough in the fifth, which turned into a Little League home run after it got passed right fielder Victor Bericoto. Andy Thomas closed the score to 3-2 with a homer in the fifth. In the bottom of the ninth, Ismael Munguia tied the scored with a single and Whalen won the game with a walk-off sacrifice fly.
