"FUN IS GOOD" FACTOIDS

SAINTS & TIDES SPLIT IN SECOND DOUBLEHEADER IN 3 DAYS: The St. Paul Saints bullpen couldn't back a dazzling performance by Twins No. 6 prospect Marco Raya, who went 12 up and 12 down to begin the day, as St. Paul fell 12-1 in game one of a doubleheader before launching three home runs in game two to bounce back with a 6-4 victory over Norfolk and reclaim the series lead at CHS Field on Saturday night. Despite entering play with an ERA of 12.06 and more walks than strikeouts through his first seven starts, Raya looked like a new man as he set down the first six of the night on the strikeout and finished with seven punchouts across 4.0 innings before being pulled on a pitch count. The Saints briefly led 1-0 on Mike Ford's leadoff blast in the fourth, but the St. Paul bullpen went on to walk nine over the final three frames of the 7-inning contest as the Tides rolled. In game two, Mickey Gasper grabbed the attention back from Saints fans by homering in his first two plate appearances, a pair of solo homers that each tied the game, including at 3-3 at the end of three. After Norfolk took a 4-3 lead on Chadwick Tromp's second homer of the game in fourth, Anthony Prato swatted a two-run blast to left to put the Saints in front. Andrew Morris got stronger as the night went along and became the third Saint pitcher this year to finish six innings, allowing four runs with five strikeouts and a walk to pick up his second win.

THE MERRIMACK MISSILE: Saints UT Mickey Gasper continued to turn heads with a two-homer game in the nightcap of yesterday's doubleheader, his 3rd career multi-HR game. The switch-hitter from New Hampshire now has nine round-trippers in 21 games with the Saints. With another home run in the next three games, he would reach double-digit homers in a Saints uniform faster than any other hitter in franchise history in a single season (see below). With the Saints this year, he is averaging a home run every 19 PA, the best HR/PA average of any hitter in the minors at the full-season level this year with at least 5 homers. A switch-hitter, Gasper now has 7 homers from the left-side and is hitting .328/.423/.754 while he has 2 homers from right-side in which he is a .400/.423/.754 hitter. He is the fourth hitter in Saints franchise history with multiple homers from both sides of the plate in the same season:

PITCHING PARTICULARS: Despite some recent strong pitching performances, the Saints have struggled on the mound recently as they've yielded 66 runs across their last 77.1 innings of baseball going back to the start of their last series in Iowa. Since the start of May, St. Paul pitching has produced a 6.40 ERA (119 ER, 167.1 IP), the 3rd-worst mark in Minor League Baseball and 2nd-worst in the International League since the turn of the calendar page. Despite the pitching struggles, the Saints' team OPS of .862 as an offense is the third-highest in MiLB in May, and the 2nd best in Triple-A (Lehigh Valley-.888).

GOING, GOING, GONE: After hitting just 7 homers in their first 12 games of the season, which ranked tied for the second-fewest in the International League at the time, the Saints have touched off for 50 round-trippers in their last 35 games since April 14, which ranks third in the minors in that stretch, trailing only the Charlotte Knights (55) and Greensboro Grasshoppers (54). St. Paul have left the yard at least once in 16 of their past 20 games.

FORGET ABOUT THE CURVEBALL, RICKY. GIVE 'EM THE HEATER!: The Saints have crushed fastballs this season and lead the International League in batting average (.308) and rank 2nd in slugging% (.499) against fastballs as a team this season. 31 of the Saints' 57 home runs as a team have come against the hard stuff (all four homers in Saturday's doubleheader came against breaking balls). Some of the Saints' best hitters currently on the roster against fastballs are:

"I'M JUST LOOSENING MY ARM!:" Saints utility-man Jefferson Morales now has six outfield assists this year, which is tied for the most in baseball (majors & minors) with the Guardians' Steven Kwan, Baltimore's Tyler O'Neill and minor leaguers Anthony Gutierrez and Garrett Spain. He's already just the 5th-ever Saint with at least six OF assists in a season, joining Jimmy Kerrigan (2x, 9-2021, 6-2021), Mark Contreras (8-2022), DaShawn Keirse, Jr. (7, 2024), and Jake Cave (6, 2022).

THE STARS OF TOMORROW, TODAY: The Saints currently tout three of Minnesota's top-10 prospects on the MLB Pipeline list and St. Paul's roster overall features eight of Minnesota's Top-30 prospects according to MLB.com and Baseball America: OF Emmanuel Rodriguez (No. 2, MLB.com, No. 2 BA), RHP Marco Raya (6/8), RHP Andrew Morris (9/10), RHP Cory Lewis (11/20), INF Payton Eeles (23/17-currently on 7-day IL), RHP Travis Adams (22/22), C Diego Cartaya (24/21), & C Jair Camargo (-/23). Rodriguez checks in at the No. 19 on the MLB Pipeline's top-100 prospects and No. 37 by BA.

TWINS REPORT: The Minnesota Twins (29-22) walked it off on the Royals 5-4 yesterday afternoon at Target Field, overcoming a 4-0 deficit at one point. Kody Clemens' fourth homer tied the game in the sixth and Brooks Lee's single walked it off in the 9th. Down on the farm, Double-A Wichita (23-21) have lost 4-of-5 in San Antonio (SDP) this week after falling 5-2 yesterday. INF Tanner Schobel extended his hit streak to 13 straight games after going 1-4. High-A Cedar Rapids (25-18) beat Fort Wayne (SDP) 12-4 yesterday. Twins No. 4 prospect Kaelen Culppepper has hit safely in 14 straight after going 2-4 yesterday & ranks top-10 in the MWL in hitting (.323) & OPS (.941) for the Kernels. Low-A Fort Myers (20-24) snapped a four-game skid in Lakeland yesterday. Payton Eeles is hitting .304 (7-23) in seven games on his rehab assignment on the Saints' IL.

LAST APPEARANCE: Made his third start of the season in game two of a doubleheader on Thursday at Iowa. Gave up a leadoff homer to Cubs top prospect Matt Shaw but settled in to throw up four zeros on the board despite pitching around traffic in each inning. Left the game with the Saints leading 4-1 after five in a dramatic comeback for the Iowa Cubs in extra innings. Threw 24 sweepers (28%), 23 four-seamers (27%), 20 changeups (24%), and 18 sinkers (21%). Generated nine swings-and-misses (the 3rd-most he's recorded in an outing this year), led by four each on his sweeper and four-seam fastball. Four of his five K's came on fastballs (2 each on the four-seamer and sinker) with one punchout coming on the sweeper.

I'VE BEEN EVERYWHERE, MAN: Last season was a tumultuous year for the veteran right-hander, McCaughan. After spending the first seven years of his professional career with the Mariners, he was traded for cash after being designated for assignment in February 2024, and spent the season on the Triple-A/Major League shuttle. He was optioned to Triple-A on five separate occasions, and also recalled to the Majors five different times, splitting the season between the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp and Miami Marlins, as well as the Columbus Clippers and Cleveland Guardians. After he was DFA'd by Miami and traded to Cleveland on May 9, the Guardians DFA'd him on June 30 and he was claimed off waivers on July by the Marlins, the same organization that had designated him for assignment less than two months earlier (he was optioned to Jacksonville and finished out the year appearing for both the Jumbo Shrimp and the Marlins). After signing with the Twins as a Minor League free agent in December, the Saints will mark the 10th different team that McCaughan has suited up for between the Majors and Minor Leagues.

A MEMORABLE FIRST GAME IN THE BIGS: Making his Major League debut as a 25-year-old, McCaughan realized a dream, making his Major League debut. The right-hander came on in extended relief for the Mariners on July 21, 2021 at Coors Field vs the Rockies. McCaughan managed to give up a run despite throwing five hitless innings; he worked around three walks without recording a strikeout, becoming only the third pitcher since the mound was moved to its current distance in 1893 to throw five hitless innings in his MLB debut, and the first in 54 years to do so (per the Elias Sports Bureau). The others to accomplish the feat were Bill Dillman on April 14, 1967 for the Orioles against the Kansas City A's, and Hank Borowy on April 18, 1942 for the Yankees vs the Red Sox. McCaughan retired Raimel Tapia for a lineup in the Bot 2 for his first Big League out, and faced the minimum through his first two innings of work with the help of a double-play. He took a no-decision as the M's lost 3-6.

THIS GUY'S A REAL DIRTBAG, AND WE MEAN THAT AS A COMPLIMENT! Before being drafted in the 12th round of the 2017 Draft by the Mariners, McCaughan had a remarkable career for Long Beach State, where he pitched three seasons from 2015-17, accruing a 23-5 record and a sparkling 2.31 ERA with 234 strikeouts in 280.2 innings. McCaughan appeared on the Golden Spikes Award mid-season watch list as a sophomore in 2016 and earned 2nd-team All-American honors in both 2016 & 2017 from multiple outlets, becoming the first Long Beach State pitcher since Jared Weaver (2003-04) to do so in consecutive seasons. Long Beach's program compete in the Big West and are nicknamed "The Dirtbags," a moniker that dates back to 1989, when the then-head coach Dave Snow inherited a program in the doldrums. He put an emphasis on finding "hard-nosed players with something to prove" and drove his players to take a tough and gritty approach that included making diving plays, sliding hard into second, and generally dirtying the uniform. The nickname has stuck to this day. McCaughan is one of more than 60 former "Dirtbags" that have appeared in a Major League game, a list that includes Jason Giambi, Evan Longoria, Troy Tulowitzki, Jeff McNeil, and Jared Weaver.
