NATURALS OWNERSHIP GROUP



ROBERT E. RICH, JR. Owner/President

As Chairman of Rich Products Corporation, Robert E. Rich Jr. (Bob) has led the company to more than \$4 billion in worldwide sales revenue. Rich's continues to build business in new markets with cutting-edge management practices, high business ethics, and customer service standards, which have earned Bob distinction as one of the nation's most prominent business leaders.

In addition to his Rich Products leadership, Bob has played an important role in professional baseball in Buffalo, N.Y. In 1983, Bob purchased the then-struggling Double-A Buffalo Bisons professional franchise, in order to keep professional baseball in the Queen City. In 1984, he realized another major goal when he purchased baseball's Triple-A Wichita Aeros and moved the American Association franchise to Buffalo. Two years after arriving on the Triple-A baseball scene, Bob was named the 1986 American Association Executive of the Year. In 1988, Sporting News magazine tabbed him Minor League Executive of the Year.

In 1988, Bob cut the ribbon on Buffalo's new downtown ballpark, celebrating the fulfillment of a dream to build a new home for the Bisons and setting the franchise on a course that has since included two league championships and annual minor league attendance supremacy. He serves as President and CEO of Bison Baseball Inc., Northwest Arkansas Baseball Inc., and Morgantown Baseball Inc. He is also the past Commissioner of the National Baseball Congress, an organization of amateur and semi-pro baseball leagues operating in the U.S. and Canada.

His dynamic leadership was recognized with an appointment as Chairman of the U.S. based Grocery Manufacturers Association in 1999 and selection as a National Restaurant Association "Diplomat" in May 2000. Other noteworthy distinctions include his 1996 induction into the Frozen Food Industry Hall of Fame, making his father, Robert E. Rich, and him the first father-and-son team to be so honored. That same year, Refrigerated and Frozen Foods magazine selected Bob as its "Executive of the Year." In 2017, Bob and his father were inducted into the inaugural class of the Western New York Business Hall of Fame and joined a group of Buffalo's finest leaders celebrated for leaving an indelible mark on Buffalo Niagara.



MINDY RICH

Executive Vice Chairman, Rich Entertainment Group, Vice Chairman, Rich Products Corporation

As Vice Chairman and a Managing Shareholder of Rich Products Corporation, Mindy Rich shares responsibility for oversight, governance and the overall vision and strategic direction for Rich Products Corporation. Mindy joined the company in 1985 and has proceeded to work in various roles as part of the

leadership team including Executive Vice President of Innovation where she expanded the breadth and accelerated the pace of product development in support of Rich's long-term growth strategies. She has also focused on the development and nurturing of Rich's award-winning organizational culture and work/life programs.

Mindy serves on the corporate Board of Directors for M&T Bank Corporation; the Board of Directors of Grove Entertainment; the Fund Advisory Committee for BDT & Company, LLC; and is a member of the Cleveland Clinic Board of Trustees, serving on the Research and Education Committee. Mindy is a Trustee, Member of the Executive Committee and Co-Chair of the Marketing Committee for the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame + Museum. In 1986, Mindy and her husband, Bob Rich, Jr., founded Western New York United Against Drug and Alcohol Abuse, a nonprofit organization dedicated to fighting substance abuse and educating children throughout Western New York. Mindy and Bob continue to serve as Chairpersons Emeritus for this important local organization.

Among other charitable activities, Mindy is especially focused on fundraising geared toward finding a cure for cystic fibrosis. Mindy and Bob founded and chair the annual Greater Niagara BassEye Celebrity Challenge that has raised more than \$1.3 million for cystic fibrosis research.

JOE SEGARRA

President of Rich Entertainment Group, Senior Vice President of Finance and the Family Office for Rich Products Corporation

Mr. Segarra was appointed to the role of Chief Operating Officer for the Rich Entertainment Group of Companies in July 2013. Joe's affiliation with the Rich Entertainment Group and its parent company, Rich Products Corporation,

dates back to 1988 where he served on the accounting staff as a member of the Buffalo office of Ernst & Young. After spending several years with the firm and providing tax and related services to Rich Products Corporations and its subsidiaries, Joe joined the company in 1993 to guide their worldwide tax function as their Director of Tax.

Along with this role, Joe assumed the position of Director of Finance for the Rich Baseball Organization and in 1999 was promoted to Vice President of Finance for Rich Products. In 2003, he assumed a new position as Vice President of Finance in the Shareholder Risk Management group where he continues to have oversight responsibility for their Tax, Internal Audit and Shareholder Planning activities. In 2011 he was appointed Chief Financial Officer for the Rich Entertainment Group of Companies and in 2013 he was also promoted to the position of Senior Vice President of Finance for Rich's.

He currently serves as Treasurer of the Rich Family Foundation, a private operating charitable foundation and also as a Board member of the recently created Buffalo Bisons Charitable Foundation. He is a Certified Public Accountant and a member of both the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and New York State Society of Certified Public Accountants.



MIKE BUCZKOWSK President, Rich Baseball Operations

Mr. Buczkowski begins his 33rd season with the Buffalo Bisons and his 26th season as the club's General Manager, the longest tenure of any General Manager in the 135-year history of the franchise. In March 2019, Mike was named the President of Rich Baseball Operations, overseeing the overall operations of not only the Bisons, but also the Northwest Arkansas Naturals,

a Double-A affiliate of the Kansas City Royals, and the MLB Draft League's West Virginia Black Bears.

During Mike's tenure as Bisons General Manager, the club has led their league in attendance seven times, including the International League's all-time attendance record set in 1998. In December 2001, Mike accepted the prestigious Bob Freitas Award from Baseball America on behalf of the Bisons, becoming the first Triple-A team to win the award twice (also in 1991). Mike is responsible for the strategic planning of the Bisons organization and manages all day-to-day operations of the front office staff. He is also responsible for the coordination of the player development contract with the Bisons' Major League parent clubs, including the Pittsburgh Pirates (1994), Cleveland Indians (1995-2008), the New York Mets (2009-2012) and the Toronto Blue Jays (2013-present).

Mike began with the Bisons in 1987 as a Public Relations Assistant during the team's final season at War Memorial Stadium. Coinciding with the club's move to Pilot Field in 1988, Mike was promoted to Public Relations Coordinator and then to Public Relations Manager in 1989. During the 1992 season, he was promoted to Assistant General Manager and was named General Manager on December 17, 1993. He became Vice President of Bisons Baseball in 1999.





The Buffalo Bisons (Triple-A, Toronto Blue Jays) have been owned and operated by Rich Products since 1983 and are a member of the Triple-A East League. The West Virginia Black Bears moved from Jamestown, Pennsylvania to Morgantown, West Virginia prior to the 2015 season and are members of the new MLB Draft League.

Mr. Justin Cole enters the 2021 season as his seventh as the Naturals' Vice President/General Manager. He served as Assistant General Manager the previous six seasons at Arvest Ballpark, after spending four seasons working with the Rich Baseball owned and operated Wichita Wranglers. Cole served as co-General Manager during the team's final season in Wichita, Kan. Before making the move to Springdale with the

team in late-2007. 2020 will be Justin's 17th season in Minor League Baseball.

The 2016 recipient of the **Matt Minker Award**, Cole grew up in Barker, N.Y. and is a December, 2002 graduate of the University at Buffalo. He began his career in baseball by serving as an intern with the Buffalo Bisons, then the Triple-A affiliate of the Cleveland Indians.

Cole roots for the Naturals' parent club, the Kansas City Royals, and like all western New Yorkers, is a devoted Buffalo Bills fan. He resides in Springdale with his wife, Kristin, and their children Olivia and Carson.

Telephones will not be available. The Press Box can be accessed via the elevators located on the first base side of Arvest Ballpark or the stairs near the Naturals' Team Store.

MEDIA LOUNGE AND WORKROOM is located inside the Press Box behind the working press area. Meal service will begin approximately one hour before game time to ACCREDITED WORKING MEMBERS OF THE MEDIA ONLY.

INTERVIEW periods are arranged prior to and following Naturals games through the Naturals Media Relation Department. All interviews should be completed at least 45 minutes prior to game time.

PREGAME: The manager, coaches and player are generally accessible after batting practice socially distanced next to the field or on Zoom. Players are not available during stretching, batting practice and pregame interviews should not interfere with players' specific game preparations. **Manager Scott Thorman** is available upon request prior to the game.

MANAGER POSTGAME: The Naturals will conduct a postgame interview with manager Scott Thorman, on Zoom immediately following each Naturals' home game. Postgame interviews with all personnel should be related to the game and not of the feature variety.

PLAYERS POSTGAME: Interviews will be granted upon requested and based on player availability.

ARVEST BALLPARK INFORMATION

The Northwest Arkansas Naturals celebrates the franchise's 13th season at Arvest Ballpark in 2021. Named the 2008 Ballpark of the Year by baseballparks.com, Arvest Ballpark was designed by HOK (now Populous) which has been designing Minor League Baseball stadiums for more than 20 years including six Major League Ballparks. Populous also assisted in the renovations at Kauffman Stadium that commenced in 2010.

The Arvest Ballpark investment reached \$50 million which included parking lots and surrounding road improvements. The City of Springdale has enhanced fans' ability to and from the ballpark by adding an exit ramp off I-49 (Exit 70 - Don Tyson) along with widening roads, providing a round-about and basic road maintenance over the past two season.

Prior to the 2017 season, in trend with much of professional baseball, the Naturals extended the netting above each dugout to allow fans further protection from batted balls and/or flying objects. The team then extended the netting down each baseline after the 2019 season

The grandest upgrade to Arvest Ballpark occurred prior to the 2016 season. A complete high-definition video board made the screen from 20' x 30' to 17' x 66'. 2017 improvements include extended netting above the dugouts, upgraded picnic areas among other upgrades.

Through the first 12 seasons of Naturals' baseball, nearly 3.5 millions fans have walked through the gates at Arvest Ballpark. The average single-game attendance is 4,517 over the first 12 seasons.

Voice of the Naturals

Nicholas Badders begins his first season as the "Voice of the Naturals" and fifth broadcaster professional baseball. Badders was named the third ever "Voice of the Naturals" on April 28, 2021, following Benjamin Kelly (six seasons) and Stephen Davis (six seasons).

Badders works all 60 regular-season home games and select road games, broadcasting each game on at NWANaturals.com and on MiLB.tv.

Badders joined the Naturals in April 2021 after a season in the Appalachian League (Advanced Rookie) with the Elizabethton Twins, affiliate of the Minnesota Twins, as their Broadcast and Media Manager. Prior to his season in the Appy League, Badders got his start in professional baseball in the Pacific Association (Independent) with the Sonoma Stompers in 2018 as the team's Broadcasting and Media Relations Director.

Following his time with the E-Twins, Badders has spent the past two seasons in the Australian Baseball League with the ABL's Melbourne Aces. He began with the Aces as the club's Broadcast and Media intern for the 2029/20 season and was promoted to the Director of Broadcast and Communications following the conclusion of the season. He also served as the "Voice of Australian Baseball," calling the league's nationally televised games on Fox Sports, as well as International Telecasts in the United States on AT&T Sportsnet, NBC Sports Regional Networks, Cox Sports Televisions, and other RSNs.

Badders is a 2020 graduate of Arizona State University's (Pac-12) Walter Cronkite School of Journalism and Mass Communication in Phoenix, Ariz., where he served as the voice of Sun Devils Women's Soccer and Women's Hockey. He also called ASU basketball, baseball, softball and men's ice hockey between the Pac-12 Digital Networks (Pac-12 Plus) and the student-run radio station, Blaze Radio ASU. He served as the President and Editor-In-Chief of the Walter Cronkite Sports Network, Technical Director and Anchor of WCSN's live studio show, Cronkite Sports Live, and in his three years on campus in the Valley of the Sun, shot photos of nearly every sport Sun Devil Athletics has to offer.

Originally from Livermore, California, Badders currently resides in Springdale, Arkansas.



MANAGERIAL CAREER

- Scott Thorman was promoted to Naturals manager in January 2020 and enters his eighth season coaching in the Royals organization.
- He joins Northwest Arkansas after leading Wilmington (A+) to the Carolina League championship in 2019, winning five playoff elimination games with the Blue Rocks en route to the 2019 Mills Cup Championship, the first Carolina League title for Wilmington since 1999.
- From 2017 to 2018, he served a two-season stint with the Class-A Lexington Legends, guiding the Legends to a 2018 South Atlantic League Championship, the first one for the organization since 2001 with a three games to one series win over the Lakewood BlueClaws (Philadelphia Phillies).
- Prior to his two-year stint with Lexington, Thorman skippered the Burlington Royals (2015-2016) and while spending his first year
 in the Royals' organization in 2014 as the bench coach for the B-Royals.



Clint Robinson is arguably the greatest Natural in the franchise's history. Drafted in the 25th-round in 2007 by Kansas City, Robinson produced one of the greatest, single-season performances in Texas League history becoming just the third player to win the Triple Crown. The Dothan, Ala. native yielded a slash-line of .335/.410/.625, clubbed 29 home runs and drove in 98 runs en route to the Naturals' first ever Texas League Championship. Robinson made his Major League debut for the Royals in 2012 and later appeared in the big leagues with the Los Angeles Dodgers

The 2010 Texas League Manager of the Year led the Naturals to four straight Texas League postseason appearances from 2008 to 2011 while his club was the outright North Division Champion for both the first and second halves of the 2010 championship season. Poldberg finished with 495 career victories in Northwest Arkansas and won more games during his six year span than any Texas League manger in that time.

From the outset of 2011, then-20 year-old Salvador Perez displayed great hands, superb reflexes and a cannon-like arm. In three months, "Salvy" threw out nearly 48-percent of base runners while the rest of the catchers in the Texas League averaged a 27-percentage rate. TRANSACTION TERMINOLOGY

Active List: The roster of players eligible to participate in a game.

- AAA: 28 players from opening day through the end of the championship season
- · AA: 28 players from opening day through the end of the championship season
- A: 30 players from opening day through the end of the championship season

Reserve List: The roster of players eligible for placement on the Active List

• AAA: 38 players • Class AA: 37 players • Class A: 35 players (all levels)

Championship Season: The regular season of games, not including any post-season playoffs.

Contract Voided: A player's contract is terminated under provisions described in the contract. A player whose contract is voided becomes a free agent and may sign with any Club.

Designated For Assignment (DFA): A player (on a major league contract) is immediately removed from the 40-man roster. This allows the team time to decide what to do with the player while freeing up a roster spot for another transaction, if needed. Once a player is designated for assignment, the team has ten days to do one of the following things: the player can be traded, the player can be released, or the player can be put on waivers and, provided he clears, be sent outright to the minors.

Injured List (IL): An injured player may be placed on this list during the championship season only and must remain on the DL for a minimum period of seven days before the player can be reinstated to the Active List. A player on the Disabled List does not count against a Club's Active List limits, but does count against a Club's Reserve List limits.

Disqualified List: A player who violates a player contract or reservation may be placed on this list. There is no minimum number of days the player must remain on the Disqualified List before the player can be reinstated to the Active List. A player on the Disqualified List does not count against a Club's Active List limits or its Reserve List limits.

Emergency Disabled List: An injured Minor League Player may be placed on this list during the championship season only. A player on the Emergency Disabled List must remain on the list for a minimum period of 60 days or until the end of the championship season (whichever is earlier) before the player can be reinstated to the Active List. A player on the Emergency Disabled List does not count against a Club's Active List limits or its Reserve List limits.

Free Agent: A Minor League player is a free agent, able to sign with any club, when the term of the player's Minor League contract has expired. If the player has not re-signed with the same club, the player becomes a Minor League free agent on October 15 at 5:00 p.m. (ET).

Ineligible List: A player found to have committed misconduct may be placed on this list. There is no minimum number of days the player must remain on the Ineligible List before the player can be reinstated to the Active List. A player on the Ineligible List does not count against a Club's Active List limits or its Reserve List limits.

Loan: A Minor League player's contract may be loaned from one organization to another, so long as the new club is also under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Baseball. The assignor club retains contractual rights to the player. The player must be returned to the assignor club at the end of the championship season. Loans of players are most commonly made to Mexican League Clubs.

Outright Assignment: A player who is traded from one Major League organization to another is assigned outright. The assignor club transfers all contractual rights regarding the player to the assignee club.

"Outrighted to the minors": A player who is outrighted to a minor league club is removed from the 40-man roster but is still paid according to the terms of his guaranteed contract. A player can only be outrighted once in his career without his consent.

Rehabilitation Assignment: A Minor League Player on either the Disabled List or Emergency Disabled List may be sent to a Short-Season A or Rookie classification Minor League Club to play on a rehabilitation assignment, while the player remains on the Disabled List or Emergency Disabled List of the player's original club. A rehabilitation assignment may not exceed 20 days for non-pitchers or 30 days for pitchers. A player on a Minor League rehabilitation assignment does not count against the Active List or Reserve List limits of the Club for which the player is playing on the rehabilitation assignment.

Release: A player's contract is terminated and the player becomes a free agent.

TRANSACTION TERMINOLOGY

Restricted List: A player who fails to report or fails to sign a contract with the club to which the player is reserved may be placed on the Restricted List. There is no minimum number of days the player must remain on the Restricted List before the player can be reinstated to the Active List. A player on the Restricted List does not count against a club's active List limits or its Reserve List limits.

Return: The act of moving a loaned player's contract back to the Minor League Club that loaned the player. All players who have been loaned must be returned no later than September 30.

Rule 5 draft (Major League): If a player not on a 40-man roster has spent four years with a minor-league contract originally signed when 19 or older or five years when signed before the age of 19, he is eligible to be chosen by any team in the Rule 5 Draft during the offseason for a price of \$50,000. No team is required to choose a player in the draft, but many do. If chosen, the player must be kept on the selecting team's 25-man major league roster for the entire season after the draft—he may not be optioned or designated to the minors. The selecting team may, at any time, waive the Rule 5 draftee, such as when they no longer wish to keep him on their major league roster. If a Rule 5 draftee clears waivers, he must be offered back to the original team for \$25,000, effectively canceling the Rule 5 Draft choice. Once a Rule 5 draftee spends an entire season on his new team's 25-man roster, his status reverts to normal and he may be optioned or designated for assignment. To prevent the abuse of the Rule 5 draft, the rule also states that the draftee must be active for at least 90 days. Any player chosen in the rule 5 draft may be traded to any team while under the rule 5 restrictions, but the restrictions transfer to the new team—if the new team does not want to keep the player on their 25-man roster for the season, he must be offered back to the team he was on when he was chosen in the draft.

Rule 5 Draft (Minor League): There are Triple-A and Double-A segments of the Rule 5 draft, with price tags of \$12,000 and \$4,000 respectively. Minor league players not protected on the reserve lists at the Double-A and Class A levels are subject to selection. Minor league Rule 5 picks do not have to stay on a specific roster the following season, and do not ever have to be offered back their original teams.

Suspended List: A player may be placed on the Suspended List for misconduct or rule or contract violations. There is no minimum amount of days the player must be on the Suspended List before the player can be reinstated to the Active List. A player on the Suspended List does not count against a Club's Active List limits, but the player does count against its Reserve List limits.

Temporarily Inactive List: A player with an excused absence to perform personal obligations is placed on this list. The player must be on the Temporarily Inactive List for a minimum of three days before the player can be reinstated to the Active List. A player on the Temporarily Inactive List does not count against a Club's Active List limits, but does count against its Reserve List limits.

Transfer: Minor League Player is moved from one Minor League Club to another within the same Major League organization.

Voluntary Retired: A player who wishes to retire is placed on this list. The player may not be reinstated until the player has missed 60 playing days of the championship season.

Veterans' Consent: If a player has 5 years of major-league service, he may not be assigned to a minor-league team without his consent, regardless of whether he has already been outrighted once, even if he clears waivers. If the player withholds consent, the team must either release him or keep him on the major league roster. In either case, the player must continue to be paid under the terms of his contract. If he is released and signs with a new team, his previous team must pay the difference in salary between the two contracts if the previous contract called for a greater salary.

Waivers: If a player placed on major league waivers is not claimed by another team within two business days after waivers have been requested, then the player has "cleared waivers" and the team has secured waivers for the remainder of the waiver period. The team can do one of three things:

- 1. Send him to the minors; or
- 2. Trade the player to another team; even if the trading deadline has passed; or
- 3. Do nothing at all

NOTE: Any trade involving 40-man roster players (July 31 through the end of the regular season) may only involve players who have declared major league waivers. If a player does not clear waivers (claimed by another team or teams), the club requesting waivers may withdraw the waiver request. If the club does not withdraw the waiver request, the player's contract is assigned as follows:

- · If only one claim is entered, the player's contract is assigned to that club
- If more than one club in the same league makes claim, the club currently lower in the standings is awarded
 the player

If clubs in both leagues claim the player, preference shall always go to the club in the same league as the club

MEDICAL TERMS

Abrasion: Any injury which rubs off the surface of the skin.

AC Joint: Acromioclavicular joint; joint of the shoulder where acromion process of the scapula and the distal end of the clavicle meet; most shoulder separations occur at this point.

Anterior: In front of; the front surface of.

Anterior Cruciate Ligament (ACL): A primary stabilizing ligament within the center of the knee joint that prevents hyper extension and excessive rotation of the joint. A complete tear of the ACL necessitating reconstruction could require up to 12 months of rehabilitation.

Arthroscopy: A surgical examination of the internal structures of a joint by means of viewing through an arthroscope. An arthroscopic procedure can be used to remove or repair damaged tissue or as a diagnostic procedure in order to inspect the extent of any damage or confirm a diagnosis.

Bruise: A discoloration of the skin due to an extravasation of blood into the underlying tissues.

Cartilage: Smooth, slippery substance preventing two ends of bones from rubbing together and grating.

Charley Horse: A contusion or bruise to any muscle resulting in intramuscular bleeding. No other injury should be called a Charley Horse.

Collateral Ligament: On either side of, and acting as a radius of movement of, a hinge joint, as of the elbow, knee and wrist.

Concussion: Jarring injury of the brain resulting in dysfunction. It can be graded as mild, moderate or severe depending on loss of consciousness, amnesia and loss of equilibrium.

Contusion: An injury to a muscle and tissues caused by a blow from a blunt object.

Deltoid Muscles Muscles at top of the arm, just below the shoulder, responsible for shoulder motions to the front, side and back.

Dislocation: Complete displacement of joint surfaces.

Fracture: Breach in continuity of a bone. Types of fractures include simple, compound, comminuted, greenstick, incomplete, impacted, longitudinal, oblique, stress or transverse.

Grade One Injury: A mild injury in which ligament, tendon, or other musculoskeletal tissue may have been stretched or contused, but not torn or otherwise disrupted.

Grade Two Injury: A moderate injury when musculoskeletal tissue had been partially, but not totally torn which causes appreciable limitation in function of the injured tissue.

Grade Three Injury: A severe injury in which tissue has been significantly, and in some cases totally, torn or otherwise disrupted causing a virtual total loss of function.

Hamstring: Category of muscle that runs from the buttocks to the knee along the back of the thigh. It functions to flex the knee, and is oft times injured as a result of improper conditioning or lack of muscle flexibility.

Lateral Collateral Ligament (LCL): Ligament of the knee along the lateral aspect that connects the femur to the fibula. It provides lateral stability to the joint.

 $\textbf{Ligament:} \ Band\ of\ fibrous\ tissue\ that\ connects\ bone\ to\ bone\ to\ cartilage\ and\ supports\ and\ strengthens\ joints.$

Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI): Imaging procedure in which a radio frequency pulse causes certain electrical elements of the injured tissue to react to this pulse and through this process a computer display and permanent film establish a visual image. MRI does not require radiation and is very useful in the diagnosis of soft tissue, disc and meniscus injuries.

Medial: To the inside of the body.

MEDICAL TERMS

Medial Collateral Ligament (MCL): Ligament of knee along the medial aspect that connects the femur to the joint.

Posterior: At the back part, or rear of the body.

Posterior Cruciate Ligament (PCL): A primary stabilizing ligament of the knee that provides significant stability and prevents displacement of the tibia backward within the knee joint. A complete tear of this ligament necessitating reconstruction could require up to 12 months of rehabilitation.

Proximal: Near the source, nearest any point being described. The elbow is proximal to the hand.

Quadriceps "Quads": A group of four muscles of the front thigh that run from the hip and form a common tendon at the patella; they are responsible for knee extension.

Radiography: Taking of x-rays.

Reconstruction: Surgical rebuilding of a joint using natural, artificial or transplanted materials.

Rotator Cuff: Comprised of four muscles in the shoulder area that can be irritated by overuse. The muscles are the supraspinatus (most commonly injured), infraspinatus, teres minor and subscapularis.

Rotator Cuff Impingement Syndrome: A microtrauma or overuse injury caused by stress. The four stages are: 1) tendentious with temporary thickening of the bursa and rotator cuff, 2) fiber dissociation in the tendon with permanent thickening of the bursa and scar formation, 3) a partial rotator cuff tear of less than 1 cm, and 4) a complete tear of 1 cm or more.

Sprain: Injury resulting from the stretch or twist of the joint and causes various degrees of stretch of tear of a ligament or other soft tissue at the joint.

Strain: Injury resulting from a pull or torsion to the muscle or tendon that causes various degrees of stretch or tear to the muscle or tendon tissue.

Stress Fracture: A hair-line type of break in a bone caused by overuse.

Tendinitis: Inflammation of the tendon and/or tendon sheath, caused by chronic overuse or sudden injury.

Tendon: Tissue that connects muscle to bone.

Ulnar Collateral Ligament (UCL): A band or sheet of fibrous tissue connecting two or more bones, cartilages or other structures, or serving as support for fasciae or muscles; located on the inside of the elbow. (Ligament that was replaced or repaired for the "Tommy John" surgery.)

Ultrasound: An electrical modality that transmits a sound wave through an applicator into the skin to the soft tissue in order to heat the local area for relaxing the injured tissue and/or disperse edema.

Wind Knocked Out: Syndrome describing a contraction of the abdominal nerve trunk, the solar plexus, as a result of an abdominal contusion.

TERMS OF INTEREST

Consecutive-Game Hitting Streaks: A consecutive-game hitting streak shall not be terminated if all the player's plate appearances (one or more) result in base on balls, hit batsman, defensive interference or sacrifice bunt. The streak shall terminate if the player has a sacrifice fly and no hit.

Consecutive-Game Playing Streak: A consecutive-game streak shall be extended if the player plays one-half inning on defense, or if he completes a time at bat by reaching base or being put out. A pinch-running appearance only, shall not extend the streak. If an umpire ejects a player from a game before he can comply with the requirements of this rule, his streak shall continue.

Determining Batting Average: Divide the number of hits by the number of official at-bats.

Determining Earned Run Average: Multiply the number of earned runs by nine; take the number and divide it by the number of innings pitched.

Determining Fielding Average: Divide the total putouts and assists by the total of putouts, assists and errors.

Determining the Magic Number: Determine the number of games yet to be played, add one, and then subtract the number of games ahead in the loss column of the standings from the closest opponent.

Determining On-Base Percentage: Add the total number of hits, walks and hit by pitches and divide by the total number of at-bats, walks, hit by pitches and sacrifice flies.

Determining Percentage of Games Won and Lost: Divide the number of games won by the total games won and lost.

Determining Slugging Percentage: Divide the total bases of all safe hits by the total times at bat (at-bats do not include walks, sacrifices, hit by pitcher, or times awarded first base because of interference or obstruction)

Earned Run Rule: The determination of an earned run is as follows: An earned run is a run for which the pitcher is held accountable. In determining earned runs, the inning should be reconstructed without the errors and passed balls; and the benefit of doubt should always be given to the pitcher in determining which bases would have been reached with errorless play. Until 1969, the reliever could not be charged with an earned run if he entered the game after the side could have been retired but for an error, no matter how many runs he subsequently gave up in that inning. Now, runs scored by batters who reach base off the reliever are charged as earned on that pitcher's record. They are not, however, shared as earned against the team as a whole. Therefore, a discrepancy may occur between the total earned runs charged against a team and the sum total of the earned runs charged against in the individual pitchers of that team.

Save Rule: A pitcher shall be credited with a save when he meets all three of the following condition:

- 1. He is the finishing pitcher in a game won by his club, and
- 2. He is not the winning pitcher, and
- 3. He qualifies under one of the following conditions:
 - a. He enters the game with a lead of no more than three runs and pitch for at least one inning,
 - He enters the game regardless of the count, with the potential tying run either on base, at-bat, or on deck (that is, the potential tying run is either already on base or is one of the two first batsmen he faces), or
 - c. He pitches effectively for at least three innings.

Winning Pitcher: The starting pitcher will be credited with the win only if the pitcher has pitched at least five complete innings and his team not only is in the lead when he is replaced, but remains in the lead for the remainder of the game. EXCEPTION: The "must-pitch-five-complete" rule in respect to the starting pitcher shall be in effect for all games of six or more innings. In a five-inning game, credit the starting pitcher with a game won only if he has pitched at least four complete innings and his team not only is in the lead when he is replaced, but remains in the lead the remainder of the game. When the starting pitcher does not meet the preceding criteria and more than one relief pitcher is used, the victory shall be awarded on the following basis:

- When, during the tenure of the starting pitcher, the winning team assumes the lead and maintains it to the finish of the game, credit the victory to the relief pitcher judged by the official scorer to have been the most effective.
- Whenever the score is tied, the game becomes a new contest insofar as the winning and losing pitcher is concerned.

TERMS OF INTEREST

- Once the opposing team assumes the lead, all pitchers who have pitched up to that point are excluded from being credited with the victory except the current pitcher.
- The winning relief pitcher shall be the one who is the pitcher of record when his team assumes the lead and maintains it to the finish of the game.

EXCEPTION: Do not credit a victory to a relief pitcher who is ineffective in a brief appearance, when a succeeding relief pitcher pitches effectively in helping his team maintain the lead. In such cases, credit the succeeding relief pitcher with the victory.

ARVEST BALLPARK GROUND RULES

- 1. Ball is in play behind home plate except when it goes into the dugout.
- 2. A batted ball that clears the top of the padded fence is a home run.
- A batted ball that hits the railing above the padded fence and returns to the park is a home run.
- A ball that enters an opening in the tarp, goes between the tarp and the wall or sticks under the tarp is dead.
- All eventualities and situations not expressly provided for above Ground Rules will be controlled by the Official Baseball Rules. No ground rules shall be in conflict with the Official Rules.
