SUNDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the Curve, 6-5, to close the series at The Diamond. **Bo Davidson** hit a solo homer in the first inning, his third at Double-A, to open the scoring. **Diego Velasquez** hit an RBI single in the second. In the fourth, **Aeverso** **Arteaga** hit an RBI double and later scored on a balk to open a 4-0 lead. In the fifth, Javier Rivas closed the score to 4-2 with a two-run homer. In the top of the sixth, Omar Alfonso singled in a run to pull the Curve within a run. Nick Cimillo hit a two-run homer in the top of the eighth to give Altoona a 5-4 lead. **Sabin Ceballos** tied the score with a two-out double in the bottom of the eighth. In the bottom of the ninth, **Scott Bandura** hit a walk-off single to win the game.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the opener of a six-game series against the Chesapeake Baysox, Double-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles. This series is the final between the two teams this year. The Flying Squirrels dropped four-of-six at The Diamond against the Baysox from April 15-20. Chesapeake won two-of-three from July 1-3 at The Diamond before the Flying Squirrels swept three games in Bowie from July 4-6 in their last head-to-head series before this week.

PACKING THE HOUSE: This season the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,585 fans per home game, which leads Double-A and ranks seventh among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history. Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance was the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS are in fourth place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, 3.5 games behind first-place Altoona. They dropped four-of-six in last week's series against the Curve in Richmond. After going 10-2 from July 4-20, they dropped six-of-seven from July 22-30 before going 8-8 in their last 16 games dating back to August 1. Of Richmond's 68 losses this season, 39 of them have been by two runs or less (24 by one, 15 by two). Their 24 one-run losses are tied for the most in the EL, even with Reading. Richmond's +10 run differential in the second half is third-best in the league.

THE BAYSOX are in last place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, 10.0 games behind first-place Altoona. Last week, the Baysox split a six-game series at home against the SeaWolves. They lost nine consecutive games from July 30-August 9 before going 3-4 in their last seven games since August 10. Chesapeake's roster features seven players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Orioles prospects list, including OF Enrique Bradfield (No. 6), RHP Juaron Watts-Brown (No. 9), RHP Michael Forret (No. 11), RHP Nestor German (No. 17), RHP Tyson Neighbors (No. 24), RHP Levi Wells (No. 26) and INF Aron Estrada (No. 27). MLB.com's top-30 Orioles prospects list features seven Chesapeake players, including Bradfield (No. 4), Forret (No. 11), Watts-Brown (No. 13), German (No. 14), Wells (No. 22), Estrada (No. 25) and OF Austin Overn (No. 30).

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander **Shane Rademacher** makes his fourth Double-A start and his first against the Baysox. He last pitched on Wednesday against the Curve and allowed six runs over three innings in a no-decision. Among full-season Giants minor league pitchers this year, Rademacher ranks first in WHIP (1.10), third in ERA (3.31), third in BAA (.233) and tied for third in innings pitched (108.2). He started the season with High-A Eugene and went 6-5 with a 2.60 ERA in 18 outings (16 starts) before being promoted to Double-A on July 29. With the Emeralds, he was leading the Northwest League in ERA (2.60) BAA (.219), WHIP (0.98) and BB/9 (1.39). For the year, he leads the Giants organization in ERA (2.59), WHIP (1.01) and BAA (.219). After allowing one run in four relief innings in his High-A debut, Rademacher threw four consecutive scoreless starts from April 13-May 1, earning two Northwest League Pitcher of the Week awards and was named the league's April Player of the Month. In Rademacher pitched at NCAA DII Chowan University in North Carolina for four seasons and signed with the Giants as a non-drafted free agent in 2023. **For more on Rademacher, see page two.**

FOR CHESAPEAKE: Right-hander Blake Money makes his fifth Double-A start and his second against the Flying Squirrels. He last pitched last Tuesday against the SeaWolves out of the bullpen and allowed six runs over six innings, striking out nine. He faced Richmond on July 4 at Prince George's Stadium and allowed four runs over 5.2 innings in a loss. Money began the year with High-A Aberdeen and went 2-3 with a 3.57 ERA in 11 outings (nine starts). He was promoted to Double-A on June 17. Money was selected by the Orioles in the 12th round of the 2023 MLB Draft out of LSU.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan** and **Onil Perez** have combined to catch 60 stolen base attempts this season, which first among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 43 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing **Jackson Williams'** mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 56 runners caught stealing for his career is second-most in franchise history. He is six behind the Flying Squirrels career record of 59, set by Williams (2010-11, '15).

BERI BOMBS: **Victor Bericoto** hit his 10th homer of the season on Friday night, which leads active Richmond players for the year. It was the 32nd homer of his Flying Squirrels career, which is third-most in team history. He is now one homer behind **Jacob Heyward** (2019, '21-22) for second place on the list and six behind **Ricky Oropesa's** (2013-16) franchise record of 37. Bericoto now has 126 career RBIs with Richmond, trailing only Oropesa's record of 165. In 15 August games, Bericoto is batting .249 (15-for-51) with two homers, two doubles and nine RBIs.

UNTUCK: **Tyler Myrick** recorded his 10th save of the season on August 6 in a 6-3 win at Erie. It was his second straight day closing out a save. For the year, he leads the EL in saves. It was the 22nd save of his Flying Squirrels career, moving him into a tie for fifth place on the franchise's all-time saves list with **Josh Osich** (2013-16). His next save will tie him with **Rafael Cova** (2010) for fourth on the franchise's all-time saves list with 23. Myrick has converted six of his eight save attempts since July 1 over 12 appearances. He picked up his first win of the season on July 25 against the Sea Dogs, working the final four outs.

KING OF THE HILL: In his last 15 games since July 30, **Turner Hill** is batting .313 (15-for-48) with three doubles, six walks, a homer, four RBIs and 10 runs scored. Last Saturday night at Erie, he tied his Double-A career high with four hits and set a Double-A career high with three runs scored. On Tuesday night, he hit a three-run homer, his second this season.

CROES CONTROL: Since joining the Flying Squirrels on August 5, **Dayson Croes** is batting .364 (12-for-33) with a homer, a double, a triple, eight RBIs and four walks in nine games. He hit a two-run single in his Double-A debut on August 6 at Erie. On Thursday against the Curve, he picked up three hits, including his first Double-A homer. Croes is the first player in Flying Squirrels history born in Aruba. He played four seasons at NCAA DII Quincy before spending two seasons with the Winnipeg Goldeyes of the independent American Association, where he hit .347 in 187 games. Croes signed with the Giants on April and played nine games in the Arizona Complex League before spending 47 games with High-A Eugene.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is ranked fourth in hits (100), tied for fourth in walks (58) and seventh in OBP (.363). **Turner Hill** is tied for fifth in triples (5). **Seth Lonsway** is fourth in ERA (3.52). **John Michael Bertrand** is third in innings pitched (110.0), third in ERA (2.78), sixth in BAA (.242) and seventh in WHIP (1.27). **Jack Choate** is fifth in strikeouts (106). **Joe Whitman** is tied for sixth in strikeouts (103). **Tyler Myrick** is first in saves (10).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 245 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 10), **Joe Whitman** (No. 11) and **Jack Choate** (No. 30). **John Michael Bertrand** is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeverso Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 5), Whitman (No. 14) and Velasquez (No. 21).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1975: The Richmond Braves beat the Memphis Blues, 2-1, at Parker Field. Terry Childers gave Memphis a 1-0 lead in the fifth with an RBI single. Richmond tied the game in the sixth in the fifth inning on a wild pitch. In the bottom of the ninth, Ivan Murrell hit a solo homer to win the game. It was Clint Courtney Memorial Night at Parker Field, honoring the Richmond manager who passed away on June 16 while the team was in Rochester. **1987:** The Richmond Braves beat the Rochester Red Wings, 2-1, at The Diamond. Julian Eichenberger started for Richmond and held Rochester to five hits over 10 innings. After the Red Wings broke the scoreless tie in the top of the 10th, Chip Childress tied the score with an RBI single. In the bottom of the 12th, Gary Newsom, recently called up from Single-A Durham, drove a walk-off single to win the game. **1990:** The Richmond Braves beat the Tidewater Tides, 3-2, at The Diamond. In the bottom of the 10th, John Mizerock hit a two-out grounder that looked like it was going to end the inning but hopped over the head of second baseman Craig Shipley to score the David Justice and win the game. **2019:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Erie SeaWolves, 7-3, at The Diamond. After Kody Eaves gave Erie the lead in the top of the first, Joey Bart answered with a solo homer to even the score in the bottom of the inning. Heliot Ramos gave Richmond a 2-1 lead with an RBI double in the third before a Cam Gibson sacrifice fly tied the score, 2-2, in the fourth. In the fifth, Johneshwy Fargas brought in a run with a sacrifice bunt for a 3-2 Richmond lead. Josh Lester tied the score with a one-out, solo homer in the top of the ninth inning. Sam Wolff held Erie scoreless in the top of the 10th. With two outs in the bottom of the 10th, Jacob Heyward hit a pinch-hit, walk-off grand slam to win the game. **2023:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Harrisburg Senators, 7-6, at The Diamond. Trey Lipscomb hit a three-run homer in the top of the first for Harrisburg. Shane Matheny brought in a run with a sacrifice fly in the third and gave Richmond a 4-3 lead with a three-run homer in the fifth. Jackson Cluff moved the Senators ahead, 5-4, with a two-run double in the sixth and James Wood stretched the lead to 6-4 with a solo homer in the seventh. In the bottom of the eighth, Sean Roby hit a solo homer and Logan Wyatt drove a two-out single to even the score, 6-6. In the bottom of the ninth, Roby won the game with a walk-off sacrifice fly.
