TODAY'S GAME / OPPOSING STARTER: The Curve take their first road trip of the season to Richmond. The Curve and Flying Squirrels play the first-ever game at Carmax Park today.

Cesar Perdomo is slated to start the first home game of the season for the Flying Squirrels. Perdomo was signed as an international free agent in 2021 and hails from San Juan de los Morros in Venezuela. He made 39 starts at High-A Eugene over the last two seasons, turning in a solid campaign a year ago with a 3.96 ERA in 26 starts. His 118 strikeouts in 127.1 innings pitched ranked 8th among Giants farmhands.

A SLOW START: The Curve have started 0-3 for the third time in their last six seasons (2023, 2021). Prior to the cancelled 2020 season, Altoona hadn't started 0-3 in a season since 2009 (started 0-8).

SURE, I'LL TAKE FIRST: In his Double-A debut on Thursday, INF **Keiner Delgado** drew a walk in each of his first four plate appearances and stole three bases. It was the first game by a Curve hitter with 4 walks since Yoynér Fajardo on August 7, 2024 at Portland.

KKKKKKKKK: Righty **Khristian Curtis** punched out 9 hitters in his Opening Day start against Harrisburg on Thursday. It was the most strikeouts in an Opening Day start for the Curve since **Roansy Contreras** struck out 11 batters in 2021. He is just the fourth pitcher in franchise history to strike out at least 9 batters (**Alex McRae** 2017, **James Marvel** 2019 and **Contreras**) on Opening Day.

THE 2026 CURVE: Back on the field after their first playoff appearance since 2018, the Curve return several members of their starting lineup from last season headlined by OF **Mitch Jebb**, INF **Duce Gourson**, INF **Javier Rivas**, and C **Omar Alfonzo**. 20 of the 29 players on Altoona's Break Camp roster have previous experience with the Curve.

Omar Alfonzo (No. 13 MLB Pipeline, No. 17 Baseball America), **Khristian Curtis** (No. 15/24) and **Duce Gourson** (No. 21/29) each rank among the Pirates top-30 prospect lists to begin the season.

WHAT DOES THE FOX SAY: Manager **Andy Fox** returns for his second season at the helm in Curve, PA. Fox is the first Manager to hold the role for at least 2 seasons since **Michael Ryan** (2017-19).

THE SAGINAW KID: Infielder **Mitch Jebb** stole 33 bases last season, 5th-most by an Eastern League player. He is the first Curve player to steal 30 bases in a season since **Jared Oliva** stole 36 bases in 2019. Last season's Unsung Hero award winner, Jebb played 122 regular season games, tied for 3rd among Pirates minor leaguers. He finished the season among the Eastern League leaders in hits (6th, 118), SB (6th, 33), 3B (3rd, 6), and BB (8th, 59).

PLAYOFF HISTORY: Altoona's qualification for the postseason in 2025 was the 10th time in 27 years of play that the team has reached the playoffs. The Curve swept the SeaWolves in 2004 on their way to a championship series defeat at New Hampshire. All-time, the Curve are 24-24 in postseason play.

NEW BUCS: Altoona's Opening Day roster features 3 pitchers, **Brandon Neeck**, **Dominic Pipkin** and **Tyrone Yulie**, who are new to the organization in 2026. Neeck was a minor league Rule 5 selection from the LA Dodgers this past off-season where he spent the entire 2025 season on the staff for their Double-A affiliate in Tulsa. Pipkin, who has previous Eastern League experience with Reading in 2023 and 2024, was signed as a minor league free agent after missing 2025 recovering from Tommy John surgery. Yulie, a former New York Yankees farmhand, also joined Pittsburgh this offseason after missing 2025 with injury.

CAREER NOTES

2025: Began the season on the IL with a left elbow injury... Returned to the mound on rehab in the FCL on July 1 and made appearances with Bradenton and Greensboro before joining Altoona on August 1 at Portland... Tossed 5.0 scoreless innings at Portland in his first outing with ALT... Allowed 18 Runs in last 12.1 IP over his next 4 starts... Earned a win in each of his last 2 starts in the regular season (6.0 IP, 0 R at Harrisburg, 5.2 IP, 3 R, vs Richmond)... Tossed 2.0 innings in Game 2 of the Southwest Division series at Erie, allowing two runs... After the season played with the Salt River Rafterers in the Arizona Fall League...

2024: Finished the season 4th among PIT MiLB in IP (114.2), 1 of 6 PIT minor leaguers to throw 100.0 IP or more, also ranked 3rd in strikeouts (121), 1st among LHP in the Pirates system... After the season was named a South Atlantic League Post-Season All-Star... Assigned to Greensboro to begin the season and worked as a length reliever three times, totaling 10.1 IP, 4 H, 1 R (0 ER), 4 BB, 7 K... Transferred to ALT on 4/25... Made his team debut with 3.0 IP of relief (4 H, 3R, 2 BB, 2 K)... Made a spot start on 5/2 @ HBG in the 2nd of a DH, took the loss allowing 4 runs (3 ER) in 4.0 IP, 7 H, 3 BB, 2 K... Picked up his first professional save with 4.0 scoreless innings on 5/8 vs. Somerset, combined with Ashcraft on a 3-hit shutout... Transferred to GBO on 5/9 and slotted into their rotation going 4-3 with a 2.42 ERA in 13 games, 10 starts... Led the SAL in ERA (2.42), BAA (.175), WHIP (0.87), also ranked 4th in strikeouts (74) in that time (5/14-8/6)... Was named the SAL Pitcher of the Week on July 28 after striking out a career-high 11 batters on 7/25 at Asheville... Transferred to ALT on 8/6... Allowed a career-high 9 hits on 8/17 vs Bowie... Shepaug Valley is one of the smaller school districts in Connecticut's Public School system, ranking 167th out of 185 in terms of size... His brother, Michael, plays basketball at Division II Bentley University, his sister Marissa plays Soccer at Division III Salve Regina...

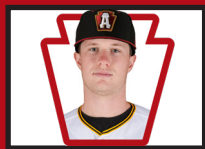
