TODAY'S GAME: The Comets hold a 2-1 series advantage after a 9-3 triumph last night, the Isotopes' second-straight defeat after winning the series opener ... Albuquerque has lost multiple games in-a-row for the first time since July 23-26 when the club lost four-straight.

IN THE BOX: After scoring 131 runs on 167 hits in a stretch in which the club won 11 of 13 games from July 28-August 11, the Isotopes have been held to three runs on 13 hits over the last two nights.

GEORGIA BOY: Charlie Condon went 0-for-4 last night and is slashing .212/.310/.313 with two doubles, a triple, two homers, 14 RBI, 10 walks and 35 strikeouts over his last 25 games, with 10 hitless contests during the stretch.

-Has 118 hard hit balls in 2026—7th-most in PCL—with an average exit velocity of 90.1 MPH, 5th-highest in PCL (min. 250 AB).

EL MACHIN: Vimal Machin went 0-for-4 yesterday, snapping his modest seven-game hit streak. During the stretch he slashed .367/.424/.567 with three doubles, one homer, three RBI and three walks.

-Has 31 multi-hit games on the year, second on the team behind Zac Veen (34), and eight multi-hit contests in his last 18 games, slashing .316/.356/.526 (24x76) with seven doubles, three homers, six walks and 12 RBI.

-His 12 dingers in 2026 are the second-most in a season during his career (most: 18, 2025, Norfolk).

SUPERMAN: Nic Kent went 2-for-3 last night with a double and RBI, his third-straight game with a double and fourth in his last five contests.

-Over his last nine games, is 14-for-33 with five doubles, one triple, two homers, 11 RBI and four multi-hit games.

CC: Conner Capel went 2-for-4 last night with two singles, one of just two multi-hit games for the Isotopes Thursday (other: Nic Kent).

-Since July 12, Conner Capel is slashing .302/.348/.508 with six doubles, two triples, one homer, five walks and 12 RBI.

JC: Jose Cordova went 2-for-4 Wednesday with a double ... Has a hit in all four games played in August, going 6-for-15 with one double and four RBI.

THE RIT MAN: Ryan Ritter went 1-for-3 with a walk and single last night ... Is slashing .410/.486/.557 with four doubles, a triple, a homer, 10 RBI, eight walks and four steals over his last 17 contests with eight multi-hit efforts during the stretch.

BRAX: Braxton Fulford went 1-for-3 Thursday with his fifth homer of the year, a walk and RBI ... Was his first homer with Albuquerque since being optioned on July 31.

-Has 87 hits in 79 career Triple-A games (all with Albuquerque: 2023, 2025-26) and over half (44) have gone for extra bases (23 doubles, two triples, 19 homers).

THE ROCK: Roc Riggio made his Triple-A debut Thursday and went 1-for-4 with an eighth-inning single.

PCL LEADERS: Vimal Machin: T-9th, hits (108); T-11th, TB (171); 13th, RBI (63); T-14th, XBH (36) ... Chad Stevens: 6th, AVG (.317); 7th, OBP (.405); 13th, OPS (.876); T-13th, 3B (4); ... Nic Kent: T-13th, HR (13).

-Charlie Condon: 3rd, runs (85) & TB (203); 4th, HR (22); 4th, XBH (47) & 3B (7); 5th, SLG (.533); 6th, OPS (.925) & RBI (73); 7th, BB (59); 13th, OBP (.392); T-13th, hits (105).

HOMERS VS. REHAB: Since 2025, four Isotopes batters have homered off rehabbing Dodgers starters: Aaron Schunk off Clayton Kershaw (May 11, 2025 at OKC), Michael Toglia and Sterlin Thompson off Emmet Sheehan (June 12, 2025 at ABQ) and Braxton Fulford off Gavin Stone (last night).

RISP: The Isotopes went 1-for-6 with RISP last night, ... Over the club's last nine games, they are 20-for-102 (.196) with RISP.

@ OKC: Over the last four seasons, the Isotopes are 22-20 at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark, compiling a 3-2-2 series ledger ... The club won both sets in 2023 (5-1 and 4-2) and one series in 2024 (4-2, June 18-23) ... Split both sets in 2025.

-Of the 159 total innings the Comets have batted against the Isotopes this season, Albuquerque has retired Oklahoma City in order in just 27 frames.

HOMERS ALLOWED: Thursday was the seventh time in 2026 the Isotopes allowed at least four home runs in a contest this year (last: June 17 vs. Sugar Land – six, season-high).

TRANSACTIONS: After no call-ups between July 12 and August 2, six Isotopes have been promoted since August 3.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 22nd year as a minor league manager and fourth guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history and is in his sixth year overall with the club, becoming the longest-tenured coaching staff member in franchise history. Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, when the Isotopes defeated the Bees 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CRAIG BJORNSON: Begins his first season as Isotopes pitching coach, and 27th year in the professional coaching ranks ... Was previously in the Rockies organization from 2009-11 as the pitching coach for the Casper Ghosts of the Rookie Level Pioneer League ... Most recently spent three seasons in the Braves organization as a pitching coach (Triple-A Gwinnett, 2023), roving pitching instructor (2024) and bullpen coach (Gwinnett, 2025). Was in the Major Leagues as a bullpen coach for the Houston Astros (2012, 14-17) and Boston Red Sox (2018-20) ... Won back-to-back World Series championships with the Astros in 2017 and Red Sox in 2018 ... Spent a total of 13 seasons as a Minor League pitching coach from 1999-2011 in the Montreal/Washington, Kansas City, Los Angeles (NL), and Colorado organizations. Signed as a free agent by the Astros in 1991 and pitched for parts of three seasons in their Minor League system. Attended Arizona Western Junior College where he was teammates with Pedro Lopez, and also played collegiately at Nicholls State University.

LUIS LOPEZ: Joins Albuquerque as bench coach after spending the past four seasons in the same role with the Double-A Hartford Yard Goats ... Began his coaching career as a Minor League hitting coach in the Red Sox organization from 2008-11. Was the Braves' Minor League infield coordinator from 2012-17, then managed the Gulf Coast League Tigers in 2018 and 2019. Appeared in parts of 11 MLB season from 1993-2005 with San Diego, New York (NL), Milwaukee, Baltimore and Cincinnati.

MATT SNYDER: Enters his first season in the Colorado Rockies organization as the Isotopes hitting coach ... Previously had stints in the Marlins system as hitting coach with High-A Beloit (2021-22) and Double-A Pensacola (2023) before serving as Minor League hitting coordinator in 2024. Last season, he was the hitting coach for the High-A Jersey Shore Blue Claws in the Phillies organization ... Was a 10th round pick by the Yankees in 2012 and played eight Minor League seasons with New York-AL (2012-18) and Miami (2019). Reached Triple-A with New Orleans in 2019.

CHECK-SWING CHALLENGE: Starting May 5, the Check-Swing Challenge will be used in the PCL. In addition to being able to challenge ball/strike calls, players will also be able to challenge the umpire's call of swing or no-swing. A batter will be judged to have offered at a pitch when the bat head gets ahead of the knob and creates an angle greater than 45 degrees. The 45-degree threshold allows umpires to use the baselines as a visible point of reference.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the fourth-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 21) will host the second half winner (beginning June 23) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 26. The Isotopes have not reached the playoffs since 2012, tied with Charlotte for the second-longest drought among all 30 Triple-A teams. Only Louisville has gone longer without reaching the postseason, as they last qualified in 2010.
