TODAY'S GAME: The Curve continue their 25th anniversary season on Saturday afternoon with the finale of a 3-game set.

LAST TIME OUT: New Hampshire built a 5-0 lead after 3 innings and cruised to a 7-2 win. **Mason Martin** matched his career-high with 3 walks, but the Curve left 14 men on base in the defeat.

MISSED OPPORTUNITIES: Altoona has left 26 runners on base across their first two games of the season against New Hampshire.

LOOKING BACK AT LAST YEAR: Pittsburgh's seven minor league affiliates combined for a 370-346 record (.517 winning percentage) in 2022, the fourth-best winning percentage among all National League organizations behind the Colorado Rockies (.549), Los Angeles Dodgers (.545) and San Diego Padres (.522).

PROSPECT PARTY: The Curve roster features several top Pirates prospects according to MLB Pipeline led by No. 3/No. 57 overall C **Henry Davis**, No. 6 INF **Liover Peguero**, No. 11 RHP **Jared Jones**, No. 17 OF **Matt Gorski**, No. 20 RHP **Kyle Nicolas**, and No. 23 OF **Matt Fraizer**.

HEY, WE KNOW YOU: The Pirates initial break camp roster named 33 players to the Altoona roster, 25 of which have previously suited up for the Curve. Several players suited up for Altoona prior to the 2023 season including INF **Mason Martin**, a Post-Season All-Star for the Curve in 2021 and INF **Drew Maggi**, an Eastern League All-Star in 2014.

RECORD SETTING: The 2022 Curve set a host of franchise records including: Most home runs in a season (143), most home runs hit in home games (74), most players 20+ HR (2 players - **Andres Alvarez** and **Aaron Shackelford**), matched for 4th time in franchise history), most stolen bases in a season (162), most lead-off home runs hit in a season (6), most strikeouts in a season (batting, 1,254), fewest complete games thrown in a season (0), most strikeouts in a season (pitching, 1,247), most wild pitches thrown (98), most starting pitchers used (matched, 22), and most consecutive Games with a home run (12).

Altoona also matched or set several single-game records including runs scored in a game (5/19 vs. Richmond, 19), hits in an inning (matched, 6/2 vs. Bowie, 9), most triples in a game (matched, 6/2 vs. Bowie, 3), and most home runs allowed in an inning (4, 4th inning on 4/13 vs. Richmond.)

20/20 VISION: Infielder **Andres Alvarez** recorded the first 20/20 season in Altoona's franchise history in 2022 finishing with 20 home runs and 21 stolen bases. For his efforts, Alvarez earned Altoona's Unsung Hero Award at the end of the campaign. **Matt Gorski** later joined the 20/20 club with his 20th stolen base of the season on September 11 at Erie. While the majority of Gorski's production took place in Greensboro, he and Alvarez were the first duo in Pittsburgh's minor leagues to record a 20/20 season since 1992 when Keith Thomas and Al Martin both did it. 20/20 seasons by Pirates minor leaguers since 1992 include: **Adam Boeve** (2007), **Craig Stansberry** (2005), **J.J. Davis** (2003), **Chad Hermanson** (1998), **Jose Guillen** (1996)

THE FISHER KITTIES: Cesar Martin returns for his 3rd season leading New Hampshire. The 'Cats feature two of the top-10 prospects in the Blue Jays minor league system in INF Orelvis Martinez (No. 4) and RHP Sem Robberse (No. 7). Their Opening Day roster features 22 returners from the 2022 squad, including 14 of 15 pitchers.

THE FIRST TO PAW FROM THE MOUND: Left-hander Jimmy Robbins makes his season debut for New Hampshire this afternoon. A 20th round pick of the Jays in 2019 from Division-II Rollins College (FL), Robbins flew through the Jays system in 2022 recording a 2.59 ERA in 76.1 IP with Dunedin, Vancouver and New Hampshire. He made five starts for the Cats late last season and recorded a 1.52 ERA (4 ER / 23.2 IP) with 26 strikeouts. Robbins played his college ball at Troy for 2 seasons and then finished at Rollins College where he missed pitching with former Curve RHP Brad Case who was drafted by the Pirates in 2018. Robbins missed the 2021 season recovering from Tommy John surgery and got a late start to the 2022 season as a result, getting activated to the active roster on April 22.

TODAY IN CURVE HISTORY

2004 - Curve open season vs. Portland and win 3-2. Ian Snell returns to Altoona after reaching Curve, PA the previous August, pitched five scoreless innings for win; Nate McLouth made AA debut and doubled, the first of franchise record 40 two-baggers on the season; 2004 EL batting champ Jeff Keppinger goes 1-3 in AA debut

2010 - The Curve roll out a lineup loaded with top prospect vs. Harrisburg during a 5-1 Opening Day victory. Led by No. 5 prospect Chase d'Arnaud, Top 30 prospects Jordy Mercer, Josh Harrison and Gorkys Hernandez were all in the Opening Day lineup while top prospects Daniel Moskos, Tim Alderson, Rudy Owens were also on the Opening Day roster. d'Arnaud, Mercer, Harrison and Alex Presley all made their AA debuts and recorded their first hits in the contest.

CAREER NOTES

2023: Was a non-roster invitee to Pirates Spring Training...

2022: Spent the entire season with High-A Greensboro where he led the South Atlantic League and Pirates minor leaguers with 26 starts and 142 strikeouts... Also ranked second among Pirates minor leaguers in innings (122.2) and walks (51)... His 142 strikeouts were the most by a Pirates minor leaguer since Luis Escobar recorded 168 strikeouts during the 2017 season... Improved his walk rate from 4.64/9 innings in 2021 to 3.74/9 during the season... Held his opponent to two runs or fewer in 13-of-26 starts... Struck out at least six batters in four of his five outings of the season... Struck out a season-high 10 batters across 5.0 innings on 5/28 at Asheville... Finished the month of June with his longest start of the season, a career-high 7.0 innings, on 6/26 against Asheville, allowed just four hits, one run (solo HR), no walks and 9 strikeouts... Tossed a career-high 96 pitches on July 15 at Brooklyn across 6.0 innings of one-run ball with 8 strikeouts... Threw 78 pitches or fewer in each of his final six starts of the season and finished the season with twice as many innings pitched than 2021 where he threw 66.0 innings for Low-A Bradenton... Went 1-2 with a 2.32 ERA (8 ER / 31.0 IP) in six starts made during the day...

2021: Spent the season with Low-A Bradenton where he went 3-6 with a 4.64 ERA in 18 appearances, 15 starts, struck out 103 batters in 66.0 innings... Aided the Marauders to a Low-A Southeast Championship, but did not appear in postseason play after hitting his inning limit for the season... His 103 strikeouts were tied for 5th-most in the Low-A Southeast and also 5th-most among Pirates minor leaguers... Held a 2.41 ERA through his first six appearances of the season (with 33 strikeouts and 8 walks)... Struck out a career-high 11 batters across just 4.0 innings on 6/27 against Jupiter... CAREER TRANSACTIONS: Drafted by the Pittsburgh Pirates in the second round (44th overall) of the 2020 First-Year Player Draft out of La Miranda High School (CA)... Signed on July 2, 2020

CURVE CUTS: Jared Keith Jones... His father, Keith, was drafted by Arizona in 1997 and spent two seasons in their system as an infielder... Selected by the Pirates 13 picks after Carmen Mlodzinski in the 2020 MLB Draft and signed with the Pirates for a bonus of \$2,200,000... Played outfield and pitched in high school and was viewed by scouts as one of the best athletes in the high school class of the 2020 draft... Was committed to play collegiately at the University of Texas... Added the curveball to his pitch mix during the COVID-19 shutdown in the spring and summer of 2020... In his final full high school season in 2019 was named the Whittier Daily News' Player of the Year after leading his team to the CIF-SS Division Semifinals with a 7-1 record and a 0.77 ERA, also hit .457 at the plate... Three times during his amateur career was a member of USA Baseball's Junior National Teams... Was Named the 2019 Perfect Game/Rawlings National High School Two-Way Player of the Year...
