Sunday: RubberDucks 7, Baysox 6: After Bowie took a 6-0 lead into the bottom of the fourth inning, Akron had its largest comeback win of the season. **Micah Pries** had a team-high three hits, while **Angel Lopez** had his first RBI of the season with a two-run double. **José Tena** hit a game-tying RBI double in the eighth inning, followed by **Brayan Rocchio's** go-ahead sacrifice fly. Akron held Bowie scoreless for the final five innings (**Brett Daniels** 2.2 IP, **Kyle Marman** 2 IP, **Cade Smith** 1 IP).

Ducks slow down Baysox: After Bowie carried an eight-game winning streak into Canal Park, Akron won five of seven games, dropping Bowie 1.5 games behind first-place Erie. The RubberDucks had three walk-off wins, doubling their season total to six, and four comeback wins, all in their last at-bat.

Rocchio rolling: Since June 12, **Brayan Rocchio** is third in the Eastern League in runs (39), fourth in hits (57), total bases (98), batting average (.315) and slugging (.541), fifth in OPS (.932), tied for sixth in home runs (10), seventh in OBP (.391), and tied for seventh in extra-base hits (21), with 11 doubles and 28 RBI. Since his first game with Akron July 31, 2021, he has the most hits (146), doubles (32), extra-base hits (56), total bases (245), and runs (96) in the EL. He is fourth in RBI (76), fifth in batting average (.272), tied for fifth in OPS (.808), tied for fifth in triples (5), seventh in slugging (.456), eighth in OBP (.352) and tied for ninth in home runs (19).

Reliever resurgence: After allowing 10 earned runs in his first six Double-A outings (6.2 innings), **Cade Smith** has eight scoreless outings in his last nine appearances, allowing only one run in his last 13.2 innings, including his first three Double-A saves. **Kyle Marman** has seven straight scoreless outings (9.1 innings) since the All-Star break after allowing 16 earned runs in his last six outings before the break (7.2 innings, 18.78 ERA).

Strikeout leaders: RubberDucks pitchers have struck out 1,095 batters, the most in the Eastern League and tied for most in Double-A baseball. Akron's starting staff has 595 strikeouts, the most in minor league baseball. Former RubberDuck **Logan Allen** (still seventh in the Eastern League with 104 strikeouts) is fifth in the minor leagues with 136 strikeouts this season. Akron is second in the league in saves (32), hits allowed (759) and opposing average (.220), and third in runs allowed (452) and ERA (3.88).

Tight contests: Akron leads the Eastern League with 62 games decided by one or two runs. It is 36-26 in those games (20-16 in one-run games and 16-10 in two-run games) and 24-21 in games decided by 3+ runs.

RubberDucks visit SeaWolves: Akron is playing its last of five series with Erie this season. The teams enter this series with Akron leading the season series, 9-8, though Erie has outscored Akron, 92-80. In 2021, the teams split, 12-12, with Akron going 7-5 on the road. Series of drama: Akron leads the season series with Erie, 9-8, with seven one-run games (Akron is 5-2) and six two-run games (Akron is 4-2). The series has already featured seven last-at-bat wins (four by Akron), including five walk-offs (two by Akron). In five different games, one of the teams has tied the game when down to its final out. Three times that team has won the game (Akron once).

Former RubberDucks make MLB debuts: **Xzavion Curry** started Monday night in Game 2 of the Guardians' doubleheader with Detroit, joining **Hunter Gaddis** (Aug. 5 vs. Houston) as the two RubberDucks who began this season with Akron and have made their major league debuts for Cleveland. Curry also became the 10th player from the 2021 Akron club who has reached Cleveland this year. The others are **Will Benson**, **Alex Call**, **Tyler Freeman**, **Oscar González**, **Steven Kwan**, **Bryan Lavastida**, **Richie Palacios**, **Konnor Pilkington**, **Tanner Tully**. In total, Cleveland has had 14 MLB debuts this season.

Schneemann's hot hitting: **Daniel Schneemann** has hits in 16 of his last 22 games, including six multi-hit games, going 23-for-73 (.315) with two home runs, 10 runs, and 15 RBI – including seven go-ahead hits and one game-tying RBI. He hit Akron's first walk-off home run this season in a 4-2 win over Erie July 22 and hit the eighth-inning, go-ahead RBI singles in July 26 and July 29 wins over Harrisburg. His .212 batting average through July 29 was his highest since April 19.

Home run breakdown: The RubberDucks have hit 38 home runs in 38 second-half games, after their 59 home runs in the season's first half were the second fewest in the Eastern League. **Jhonkensy Noel** has nine Double-A homers, and his 28 home runs this season are tied for third in the minor leagues. The RubberDucks ended July allowing 19 home runs in a nine-game homestand, but they have allowed only six in 12 August games. Akron has allowed 25 home runs in 22 games since the All-Star break, after allowing 81 (second fewest in the Eastern League) in 85 games before the break.

- Entered 2022 ranked as the #7 prospect in Cleveland system according to *MLB.com*. Ascended to No. 3 in July re-rankings and No. 78 in the MLB Pipeline Top 100.
- Named Best Curveball in Cleveland system by *Baseball America* prior to 2022 season.
- At the time of his promotion to Akron June 6, he was second in the Midwest League in strikeouts (67) and ERA (1.40), and he led Guardians full-season minor leaguers in WHIP (0.87) and opponents' average (.167).
- Through July, his .165 opponents' average was the lowest in the full season minor leagues, his 1.69 ERA was third, and his 0.95 WHIP was eighth.

2021:

- Spent the bulk of his 2021 senior season in the East Carolina rotation, finishing 10-1 with a 1.88 ERA (81.1IP, 57H, 18R/17ER, 3HR, 21BB, 130SO-second-most in a single season in ECU history) to win the American Athletic Conference pitching triple crown and Pitcher of the Year.
- Named to six different All-America teams (fourth to do so in school history), in addition to being a finalist for both the Dick Howser and Golden Spikes Awards.
- Finished among overall 2021 NCAA leaders in K's-per-9.0IP (5th, 14.39), ERA (11th), strikeouts (11th) and wins (11th).
- Started the season 10-0 before losing his final start in the Super Regional Game 1 against Vanderbilt. Williams struck out 13 batters in a season-high 7.1 IP, but his team lost, 2-0, as Commodores RHP Kumar Rocker (later the No. 10 overall pick by the Mets in July) pitched 7.2 scoreless innings to earn the win. Vanderbilt swept the series the next day, with RHP Jack Leiter (later the second overall pick by the Rangers in July) allowing one run in seven innings in a 4-1 Vanderbilt win to advance to the College World Series.
- Listed as the No. 30 prospect in the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft by *Baseball America* and No. 31 by MLB Pipeline.
- Became ECU's second-highest-ever draft pick, and the first college pitcher Cleveland has drafted in the first round since 2010 (LHP Drew Pomeranz, Mississippi).

Amateur

- Pitched in parts of four seasons for the East Carolina Pirates, going 11-5 with a 2.65 ERA across 53 collegiate games/17 starts (149.1IP, 108H, 47R/44ER, 7HR, 53BB, 200SO).
- For all four years, Williams was a teammate of RubberDucks catcher Seth Caddell.
- Eight-time ECU Director of Athletics Honor Roll on the way to a degree in criminal justice...Four-time American Athletic Conference All-Academic Team selection (2018-21).
- Selected by Tampa Bay in the 2017 June draft (30th round) out of Cape Fear High School in Fayetteville, NC. He had been the draft's No. 114 prospect according to *Baseball America*, and the No. 2 right-handed high school pitcher in the state of North Carolina by Perfect Game.
- During four-year career at Cape Fear High School, with 18-1 with two saves in 29 appearances and had a 1.06 ERA with 212 strikeouts to 74 walks in 132 high school innings.
- Hit 95 mph with his fastball as a high school senior and reached 100 mph as a college freshman.

Scouting Report (MLB.com, Preseason 2022)

"Williams still can light up a radar gun, holding 94-97 mph fastball velocity for several innings and ticking triple digits. After showing little feel for spin before last year, he suddenly added power and shape to his curveball, which now sits in the upper 70s with outstanding metrics. He also turned a mediocre slider into a mid-80s offering that shows flashes of becoming solid while retaining his aptitude for throwing a mid-80s changeup with fade.

In addition to improving his breaking pitches, Williams also upgraded his strike-throwing, cutting his walk rate from 4.2 per nine innings in his first three college seasons to 2.3 in his fourth. He cleaned up his delivery during his time at East Carolina and began repeating it better last spring. If his breakout is sustainable, he won't need much time in the Minors before becoming a mid-rotation starter."

2022 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, Manager (Third Season) – Odor, 54, is in his 35th season with the Cleveland organization as a player, coach and manager. The 2022 season will be Odor's third as RubberDucks manager (tying him with Joel Skinner, Dave Wallace and Brad Komminsk for most seasons as Akron's manager). In 2021, Odor was named Double-A Northeast Manager of the Year after leading Akron to the Double-A Northeast championship and a 73-46 record. He also guided the RubberDucks to a 61-79 record in 2019. Odor entered 2022 with a career record of 534-513 as a manager.

Odor was the first member of the Guardians organization to be a member of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and RubberDucks. He was an infielder for Canton-Akron for parts of the 1991, 1993 and 1994 seasons. Odor served as the Aeros hitting coach in 2012 and served as the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014.

A native of Maracaibo, Venezuela, Odor was a 32nd round selection by Cleveland in the 1988 draft out of the University of New Orleans. The former shortstop played in the minor leagues for Cleveland from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. The 2019 season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League (1999-2000), the Burlington Indians (2001-2004), the Mahoning Valley Scrappers (2005-2006), and Gulf Coast League Indians (2007-2008). In 2009, Odor began serving as hitting coach for the Kinston Indians (2009-2010), Double-A Akron Aeros (2011-2012), High-A Carolina Mudcats (2013), Double-A Akron RubberDucks (2014), and Triple-A Columbus Clippers (2015-2017).

Odor resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of major league infielder Rougned Odor.

#35 Owen Dew, Pitching Coach (Second Season) — Owen Dew, 33, is in his sixth season in the Cleveland organization and second as RubberDucks pitching coach. In 2021, Dew led the Akron pitching staff to a 3.78 ERA (second best in the Double-A Northeast) and a franchise record 1,190 strikeouts. Prior to coming to Akron, Dew was the pitching coach for the Mahoning Valley Scrappers in 2017, AZL Indians in 2018 and Lake County in 2019.

Dew was a 21st round selection by Cleveland in 2010 out of the University of Central Florida. He spent parts of three seasons in the Cleveland organization, logging 58 appearances and 152.1 innings. Dew began his baseball journey as a right-handed pitcher for Seminole State College of Florida (2008-2009), before moving to the University of Central Florida in 2010. That same year, Dew advanced through Mahoning Valley with a strong 2.64 ERA in nine starts for the Scrappers. At Class-A Lake County, Dew was converted to a relief pitcher where he appeared in 15 games over the 2010 and 2011 seasons. In Dew's final season as a player, the right hander appeared in 34 games, accruing 70 innings and posted a 3.86 ERA with 41 strikeouts.

Since his playing career, Dew served as an assistant coach at Seminole State College of Florida while also assisting the Cleveland Indians as an associate scout from 2014-2017.

#16 Junior Betances, Hitting Coach (Second Season) — Betances, 49, is in his 25th season with the Guardians organization as a player, coach or executive and second as the hitting coach for the RubberDucks. In 2021, Betances guided the RubberDucks hitters to a .254 average (third best in the Double-A Northeast) with 116 home runs and 577 RBI (second best in the Double-A Northeast).

Betances came to the organization via the 1996 Rule 5 draft after spending six seasons in the Brewers organization. He batted .289 over 165 games in 1998 and 1999 for the Akron Aeros. Betances joined the coaching ranks in various roles for Cleveland's Dominican Summer League team from 2000-2010. Betances then served as Arizona League Indians coach from 2010-2015, and moved to Lake County in 2017 as the Bench coach for Manager Larry Day.

#28 Mike Mergenthaler, Assistant Hitting Coach (Second Season) — Mergenthaler, 33, is in his sixth year with the Cleveland organization and second season with Akron. Mergenthaler spent 2021 as the bench coach for the RubberDucks. Prior to coming to Akron, Mergenthaler was the bench coach with Lynchburg in 2019. In 2018 and 2019, Mergenthaler worked as a hitting coach for the Cleveland and Milwaukee joint Dominican Summer League team. The Thiells, New York, native was drafted as a player in the 32nd round of the 2011 amateur draft by the San Francisco Giants, playing in their system for parts of 2011 and 2012.

#27 Juan De La Cruz, Bench Coach (Second Season, not consecutive) – De La Cruz, 28, is in his fourth season with the Cleveland organization and second season with Akron, where he was the bench coach in 2019. Akron Baseball: A Winning Tradition

This is the 33rd season of Double-A baseball in Northeast Ohio, and the 25th in downtown Akron. The franchise began as the **Canton-Akron Indians** in 1989, and then moved to **Canal Park** in Akron as the **Aeros** in 1997, later becoming the **RubberDucks** before the 2014 season. The club has made the Eastern League playoffs 18 times overall, and 12 of the last 19 seasons. The team has captured **six league titles**—2003, 2005, 2009, 2012, 2016 and 2021.
