Dayton Dragons (5-7) at Great Lakes Loons (5-7)

RH Chase Burns (0-1, 1.17) vs. RH Brooks Auger (1-0, 0.00)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Great Lakes Loons (affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers) in the fourth game of a six-game series.

Last Game. Thursday: Dayton 9, Great Lakes 2. The Dragons put together two big innings, scoring three in the third and five in the ninth as they took advantage of 12 walks and two hit batsmen by Loons pitchers. Peyton Stovall, Ricky Cabrera, and Connor Burns each had two RBI for Dayton (Stovall and Cabrera each had two hits as well). Three Dayton pitchers combined to allow just five hits while striking out 14. Starter Luke Hayden allowed one run in four and one-third innings. Easton Sikorski closed the game, working three scoreless innings to earn a save. He surrendered just one hit.

- Dragons starting pitchers have combined to pitch 49.2 innings while allowing just eight runs (seven earned) in 12 games (1.27 ERA, best in Minor League Baseball—120 teams, 11 leagues, next best is 1.97). Dragons starters have also allowed the fewest runs in Minor League Baseball. The Dayton starters' WHIP of 1.01 is tied for fourth in the minors. Dayton starters have allowed an opponent's batting average of .176 (fifth in the minors).
- The Dragons are 5-3 since starting the season with four consecutive losses.
- **Anthony Stephan** ranks sixth in the Midwest League in OPS (.949). Stephan in his last seven games is 8 for 22 (.364) with a home run, double, triple, and seven RBI. For the year, Stephan has more walks (9) than strikeouts (8).
- **Peyton Stovall** (2024 4th round pick, Arkansas) has reached base safely 10 times in his first three games with Dayton with four hits and six walks.
- **Leo Balcazar** hit home runs in the first two games of the current series at Great Lakes, both to the opposite field.
- **John Michael Faile** over his last three games is 5 for 14 (.357) with a home run, double, and three RBI.
- The Dragons are hitting only .195 on the year, but they are batting .238 in the current series, averaging 8.0 runs per game.
- The Dragons are hitting just .154 with runners in scoring position, ranking 119th among 120 teams in the Minor Leagues (.242 in current series).

A Look at 2025 for the Dragons: Manager Vince Harrison Jr. returns for his second season with the Dragons. The Dragons roster is headlined by starting pitcher Chase Burns, the second overall selection in the 2024 draft, and the Reds #1 prospect based on MLB Pipeline's rankings. Burns is #2 on the Reds list in the Baseball America rankings, behind former Dragon Rhett Lowder. Also ranked among the Reds top prospects based on the MLB Pipeline and Baseball America rankings are third baseman Ricardo Cabrera (#10 on both lists), starting pitcher Adam Serwinowski (#12 on MLB; #18 on BA); shortstop Leo Balcazar (#25 on MLB; #23 on BA); center fielder Carlos Jorge (#21 on MLB; #30 on BA); catcher Connor Burns (#24 on BA); second baseman Peyton Stovall (#27 on MLB; #35 on BA), starting pitcher Luke Hayden (#30 on MLB; #37 on BA), and outfielder Yerlin Confidan (#32 on BA). The Dayton roster includes 17 players who spent all or part of the 2024 season with the Dragons, including several key members of last season's playoff team.

More on Chase Burns: Burns has a plus fastball that has reached 99 mph with the Dragons this season, and he also possesses a slider that is graded higher by some scouts than the fastball. He spent the final season of his college career at Wake Forest in 2024 after two seasons at Tennessee. Burns was named Atlantic Coast Conference Pitcher of the Year in 2024, going 10-1 with a 2.70 ERA and breaking the school record for strikeouts while leading the nation with 191 in 100 innings. He was selected First Team All-American by *Baseball America*. In six of Burns' 16 starts in 2024, he struck out at least 14 batters including a career-high 16 against Clemson.

- Starting pitcher Nestor Lorant was selected as the Reds Minor League Pitcher of the Year and the Florida State League Pitcher of the Year in 2024.
- Ariel Almonte finished second in the Florida State League in home runs in 2024 with 20 with 20.
- Catcher/first baseman John Michael Faile finished his college career ranked #1 in career home runs and RBI in NCAA Division II history.
- Outfielder Myles Smith was selected as the Big West Conference Player of the Year in 2024 after batting .401 with 10 home runs with UC-Irvine.

Dragons Team Facts

The Dragons are celebrating their 25th Season in 2025. All 25 seasons have featured a partnership with the Cincinnati Reds. Over the Dragons history, 149 players have played for the Dayton club before reaching the Major Leagues.

The Dragons compete in the Midwest League (classified as High-A) and play a 132-game schedule (66 home games) from April 4-September 7. The MWL features 12 teams from Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, Iowa, and Wisconsin. The Midwest League has been in operation since 1947 and has been known by its current name since 1956.

Three members of the Reds Hall-of-Fame have served as coaches for the Dragons including Ken Griffey Sr., Chris Sabo, and Tom Browning.

Every season in Dragons history has featured a future Major League player/s on the Dayton roster. Most recently: Rhett Lowder in 2024; Blake Dunn and Julian Aguiar in 2023; Elly De La Cruz, Rece Hinds, Noelvi Marte, Andrew Abbott, Connor Phillips, Evan Kravetz, Joe Boyle, and Julian Aguiar in 2022.

Attendance Leader: The Dragons finished third in all Minor League Baseball in 2024 in attendance average per game (8,012). They have ranked first in attendance at the Single-A level for each of their 24 seasons, and first among all teams below Triple-A for 18 straight seasons. The Dragons have ranked in the top-10 among all classes of the minor leagues for each of their 24 seasons.

Vince Harrison Jr. returns to the Dragons for his second season as manager after leading the team to a second half division title in 2024. Under Harrison's leadership in 2024, the Dragons full-season winning percentage of .561 ranked third best among the 24 years in Dragons franchise history. The Dragons finished with a winning record in both halves for the second time in franchise history. After going 34-32 in the first half, they went 40-26 in the second half to win the East Division title. Harrison enjoyed a nine-year professional career as a player, playing in the Rays, Mets, and Marlins systems as a third baseman. After his playing career ended following the 2011 season, he was hired as a coach by the Pirates. He joined the Diamondbacks organization as a hitting coach in 2014 and spent five years in that role before becoming a manager. He managed for three years in the Diamondbacks system before joining the Reds organization in 2023 as a coach with Louisville. Harrison played at Princeton High School in Cincinnati before starring in both baseball and football at the University of Kentucky. He was drafted by the Tampa Bay Rays in 2001 and spent four years as a player in their farm system, reaching the Double-A level. Harrison's younger brother, Josh Harrison, spent 12 years as a player in the Major Leagues, collecting more than 1,000 career hits while playing in two MLB all-star games.

Historically Speaking

All-Time Best Dragons: The team named their 12 Greatest Dragons in franchise history as part of this season's celebration. Those players, listed alphabetically, are Homer Bailey, Jay Bruce, Zack Cozart, Johnny Cueto, Elly De La Cruz, Adam Dunn, Todd Frazier, Hunter Greene, Billy Hamilton, Austin Kearns, Joey Votto, and Jesse Winker.

The First Season: After a 48-year absence of professional baseball in Dayton, the Dragons came to life in 2000. The first home game was played on April 27, 2000, and featured a lineup that included future Reds stars Adam Dunn and Austin Kearns. The manager of the first Dayton team was Freddie Benavides, now the Reds bench coach.

Six Great Achievements in Dragons History:

- Austin Kearns hit home runs in eight consecutive games, July 17-24, 2000
- Billy Hamilton stole 103 bases for the Dragons in 2011, most for any player with a single team in Reds history (Major League or Minor League). Hamilton stole 155 the next season, splitting his season between two clubs, the highest total in baseball history.
- Donald Lutz hit for the cycle in reverse order (home run, triple, double, single), all within the first five innings, July 21, 2011.
- Jose Siri broke the Midwest League record for longest consecutive game hitting streak with 39 from June 22-August 3, 2017.
- Elly De La Cruz hit home runs from both sides of the plate twice within three days, July 7-9, 2022.
- Luis Mey threw a 103 mph fastball to break the Day Air Ballpark record on May 2, 2024.
