### THIS DATE IN HISTORY

On this date in 1984, Jim DeShaies threw the first no-hitter in Sounds team history. The no-no was of 7-inning variety against Columbus.

**Tonight's Game:** The Nashville Sounds return to action tonight for Opening Day in Toledo. Tonight's game marks the beginning of the 2021 season and a six-game series between the two clubs.

**Josh Lindblom:** 33-year-old Josh Lindblom gets the ball for the Sounds in the season opener. The right-hander is making a Major League rehab start after being placed on Milwaukee's 10-day injured list on April 24 with right knee effusion. Lindblom has made five appearances for Milwaukee in 2021 and is 0-0 with a 10.97 ERA. The Indiana native was forced into unexpected action his last time out after Brewers starter Brett Anderson left the April 23 game with just one out in the bottom of the first inning. Lindblom tossed 3.2 innings for Milwaukee but was tagged for eight earned runs, matching a career-high. He did not factor into the decision of Milwaukee's 15-2 loss to the Cubs. Lindblom was signed a three-year deal with the Brewers on December 16, 2019.

**Matt Manning:** 23-year-old Matt Manning starts for the Mud Hens in the opener. The right-hander last pitched in 2019 and went 11-5 with a 2.56 ERA in 24 games, all starts. Manning tossed a career-high 133.2 innings and struck out 148 batters while limiting them to a .192 average. His 2019 season earned him a variety of accolades, including Eastern League Pitcher of the Year and Eastern League Mid-Season and Post-Season All-Star. MLB Pipeline lists Manning as Detroit's #3 prospect on their Top-30 list. While he didn't pitch in official games in 2020, he spent the season at Detroit's Alternate Training Site in Erie. The California native was the ninth overall selection in the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of Sheldon (CA) High School.

**2021 Standings:** The Sounds have spent the following number of days in the Triple-A East Southeast Division standings in 2021: First: 0, Second: 0, Third: 0, Fourth: 0, Fifth: 0, Sixth: 0, Seventh: 0.

**The Long Layoff:** Tonight's game marks the first for the Sounds since September 2, 2019 when they played the San Antonio Missions in a 13-inning, 3-hour and 45-minute marathon at First Horizon Park. The Sounds walked off with a 6-5 win in the bottom of the 13th inning. The number of days between games is an astounding 609.

**Opening Day History:** Heading into year number 43, the Sounds are 19-23 all-time on Opening Day. In season openers on the road, the Sounds are 6-13 all-time. The last time Nashville opened a season on the road was in 2018 when they blanked New Orleans, 11-0.

**The Milwaukee Era:** A new era of Nashville Sounds baseball began on February 12, 2021 when the club announced its affiliation with the Milwaukee Brewers. The affiliation with Milwaukee came after the Sounds signed a 10-year Professional Development License (PDL) with Major League Baseball as part of the 20-team Triple-A East League. Within the Triple-A East League, the Sounds are a member of the seven-team Southeast Division.

**There's History Here:** The Sounds enjoyed 10 years as the Brewers' top affiliate from 2005-14. The 2005 season culminated with the Sounds winning the Pacific Coast League Championship – the City of Nashville's most recent championship in any sport. Nashville compiled a 723-713 (.503) record during the 10-year stretch and made three consecutive postseason berths from 2005-07. In 2007, the Sounds won 89 games, the second-most in franchise history (97 in 1980).

**Top Prospects:** Nashville opens the 2021 season with four players on the roster who are listed on MLB Pipeline's Top-30 Milwaukee prospects. Catcher Mario Feliciano is the No. 5 prospect, left-handed pitcher Aaron Ashby is the No. 7 prospect, outfielder Corey Ray is the No. 24 prospect and left-handed pitcher Clayton Andrews is the No. 25 prospect.

**How Sweet It Is:** Manager Rick Sweet is at the helm for the Sounds in 2021, as he was in 2014 when he led the club to a 77-67 record. Sweet has managed for all or parts of 30 seasons in the minor leagues and has compiled a managerial record of 2,031-1,922. The 2,031 wins are 11th-most all-time among all minor league managers. 10th on the list is Lefty O'Doul who won 2,094 games from 1935-57.

**That Doesn't Hurt So Bad:** Three Major League rehabbers will join the Sounds for Opening Day in Toledo. Right-hander Josh Lindblom (April 24 - right knee effusion), outfielder Derek Fisher (April 1 - strained left hamstring) and infielder/outfielder Jace Peterson (April 23 - cryotherapy on left thumb) are all on today's roster.

**Toledo History:** It has been a while, but these two teams are not complete strangers. The Sounds and Mud Hens played each other from 1988-1991 when the Sounds were a Cincinnati Reds affiliate in the American Association. Nashville leads the all-time series, 12-8, but trailed 7-4 in games played in Toledo.

**LAST OUTING:** Lindblom's last outing was on April 23 at Chicago-NL. He was unexpectedly called upon with just one out in the bottom of the first inning after Milwaukee starter Brett Anderson left with an injury. Lindblom went on to give the Brewers 3.2 innings but allowed 8 earned runs, which matched a career-high. He was placed on the 10-day injured list on April 24 with right knee effusion.

**AGAINST OPPONENT:** Lindblom faced Toledo three times in 2017 when he was a member of the Indianapolis Indians. He appeared out of the bullpen at home on April 6, started at Toledo on April 15 and pitched out of the bullpen again at home on June 20. In the three games he was 0-1 with a 6.43 ERA (5 ER/7 IP).
