Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Yorman Gomez** to the mound tonight, attempting to take a 2-0 series lead for the third straight week. The Storm Chasers will counter with RHP **Lucas Braun**. Columbus is 49-33 (.598) versus right handers this year. Braun has never pitched against the Clippers in his career (tonight will be 15th career game in the IL; 13G with Gwinnett from 2025-26).

vs. the Storm Chasers

Columbus has lost 50 of the last 83 regular season games against Omaha, dating to 5/5/22. Of those 83G, the Clippers are 12-47 (.203) when they allow at least four runs to Omaha (5-4 in last 9G), while going 21-3 (.875) when they hold the Storm Chasers to three or fewer. Individually, **Ralph Velazquez** has played 11G against Omaha in his career, hitting .340 (16x47) with 4HR and 10RBI.

Getting Offensive

Over the last 13G, the Clippers have plated a total of 106 runs (most in the IL, 8.2 per game), after coming out of the All-Star Break with 35 runs in the first 9G (16th in the IL, 3.9 per). They have scored at least five runs in 13 straight games (3rd longest stretch in full season ball). The scoring barrage has seen 73 tallied in the first four innings of the game (30 scored in the 1st), including five innings of 5+.

Best Offense is More Offense

The Clippers gave up 12 hits last night, prevailing for the 21st time when surrendering double digits (most in the IL; 21-24, .467, no other team is above .349) and they won for the 42nd time when giving up a homer (most in the IL; 42-40, .512, St. Paul is only other team with winning record, 41-40). When allowing 4+ runs, Columbus is an IL-best 36-45 (.444; 13 wins allowing 7+, three more than 2nd).

Homer Time

Columbus has gained 14 in the homer column over the last 13G (37-23; out-homered 36-21 in 19G prior) to get back in the black (+1, 8th in the IL). The 37HR hit in the last baker's dozen (most in pro baseball since 7/28) is the best 13G stretch for any team in the IL this season (60HR combined is the most hit and allowed over a 13G run; 4.6 per game). The Clippers have homered in 12 of the last 13G.

Ingle is Back

In 24G since his option, **Cooper Ingle** is 37x98 (.378), drawing 18BB (.470OBP) with 16XBH (6HR, .663SLG). He is one of two in the IL (**Max Anderson**, Toledo) hitting .300/.400/.500, while currently on a 16G on base streak (.481OBP since 7/23; reached base five times last night, second time this year). At catcher, Ingle has a 1.340OPS (15HR) in 41G (.660OPS and 3HR in 33G between DH and LF).

Bring it on Home

Ralph Velazquez had 4HR in 5G at Syracuse (21AB; had 2HR in 100AB of previous 25G on the road), boosting his OPS away from Huntington Park to .709 (.952OPS in 30G at home). He went deep twice last night (seventh time in career) and, dating to 7/28, he leads the IL in HR (9), RBI (19) and SLG (.915). Aside from the trip to St. Paul (0x21 in 6G, 7/21-7/26), he is hitting .326/.399/.636 since 6/18.

All or Nothing

Over his last 14G, since 7/25, **Kody Huff** is mired in a 7x48 (.146) slump, though he has connected for 5HR (18HR on the season; had 18HR in career prior). Dating to 7/21, he has scored 16 runs in his last 17G, bringing his Columbus career total to 99. This season, Huff has career highs in runs (68) and RBI (65), leading the team in both, and is set to become the fourth 70-70 Clipper since 2019.

Rosario on the Rise

Alfonsin Rosario saw his 6G hit streak snapped in the loss last Saturday (8x21, .381, from 7/31-8/7), as the Clippers trailed after every inning (1x27 with a double when Columbus is tied or trailing; 11x33 with 5XBH when team is ahead). Rosario has been successful in all three steal attempts with Columbus and is perfect on the year (12SB with Akron, one of six in MiLB with at least 15SB and 0CS).

Problems on the Back End

Since allowing 7ER in 4.1IP at Lehigh Valley on 7/12, the Clipper bullpen has registered an IL-worst 7.49ERA in 23G (93.2IP, 78ER). Clipper relievers have surrendered 19HR in that time (3rd most in the IL), allowing a line of .275/.390/.507. The bullpen has not put together a scoreless outing since back to back games vs. Louisville from 7/4-7/5 (92ER in 28G since; 62ER in 28G prior).

This Date in Clipper History

8/13/2011

Following a delay of 1:49, first pitch was delivered in Rochester at 8:54pm with the Red Wings jumping out to a 7-1 lead after four innings. When the final out came at 12:19am, the Clippers had scored 10 unanswered runs to cruise to an 11-7 win. **Jared Goedert** went 5x5 with 2RBI and **Tim Fedroff** pitched in 5RBI for the Clippers, while eventual Major Leaguer, **Matt Langwell**, notched his first Triple-A win.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,470 to 1,419).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 166-130 (.561) in pitch reviews, with batters going 84-79 (.515) and pitchers/catchers going 82-51 (.617). They have run out of challenges in 45G and have not challenged in 5G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 839, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 132 through 114G (on pace for 173SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 40CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (52; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighth's

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 164 runs while crafting an .898OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 105 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +59 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 261-168 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 79 grand slams and 1,978RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.46 through 114G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 200HR (2nd most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 7th in the IL this year (.981), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 62G this season (37-25, .597), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 6th most last at bat wins this year (14, four off the lead) while playing in the 8th most games decided in the last at bat (27, Norfolk has 34). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 101G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-53 (.475, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 447-459 (.493), 417-413 with Columbus (.502).
