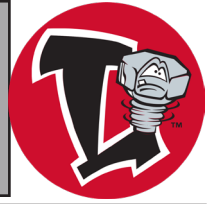

THIS YEAR

Opening Day Roster Rundown: 10 players (of 30) spent at least a portion of the 2023 season with Great Lakes

- Three players were selected by the Dodgers in the 2023 MLB First-Year Player Draft
- Seven players were drafted by the Dodgers in the 2022 MLB First-Year Player Draft
- 13 players originate from outside the United States (5 Dominican Republic, 3 Venezuela, 3 Mexico, 1 Canada, 1 Puerto Rico)
- Three Loons appear on MLB.com's list of top 30 Dodgers prospects (Ferris - 8, Liranzo - 10, Miller - 27)
- The top five strikeout leaders with Low-A Rancho Cucamonga in 2023, are on the Loons 2024 Opening Day roster. Heubeck (91), Campos (85), Reinoso (83), Karros (75), Romero (74)
- The average age of the roster is 22.5 years old. With the youngest players being 20 (Liranzo, Ferris) and the oldest at 25 (De La Paz, Reinoso)

Like Father, Like Son: Kyle Nevin broke off Fort Wayne's attempt at a no-hitter on Sunday, singling with one out in the ninth inning. Kyle's father Phil Nevin, an 11-year MLB player and the manager of the Los Angeles Angels in 2022-2023 broke up a no-no on June 8th, 1997. Phil singled against Randy Johnson in the eighth inning. Nevin was a Tiger, and Johnson a Mariner in Seattle's 5-2 win at Tiger Stadium.

On April 5th, 2024, Phil was in Detroit, to watch the Tigers Home Opener against the Oakland Athletics and then made the trek to Midland for the Loons Opening Day. Kyle's brother Tyler is a member of the Athletics.

WALK OFF WINNER ON OPENING DAY: For the first time in Loons history they were victorious via a walkoff on opening day. Noah Miller, provided the heroics with a RBI single in the bottom of the 11th in his first game in the Dodgers organization. It now brings the Loons Opening Day record to 8-9, 3-7 at home and 5-2 on the road. It was the first Loons opening day win since 2016.

LOON -> SHOW: In 2024, three former Loons have made their MLB Debut. Jordan Leasure is the 108th Loon to appear in MLB.

LAST YEAR

CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES: The Great Lakes Loons appeared in the Midwest League Championship for the second time in their 16-year franchise history.

The Loons made the postseason for the ninth time in ever. Great Lakes became the second team in MiLB to secure a postseason berth. The Loons secured their best half in franchise history with a 45-20 mark, a .692 winning percentage in the first half. Besting the 2010 Loons who went 47-23 in the second half - a .671 winning percentage.

TEN... AGAIN!: The Loons won 10 consecutive games from May 24 to June 3, matching a franchise record. It was the fourth time in franchise history Great Lakes has achieved a double-digit winning streak. The three other instances were all 10 straight. April 26-May 6, 2019, June 3-15, 2015 and June 11-20, 2009.

Oh What a RUSH: Dalton Rushing ranked second in the Midwest League in OBP (.404) and second in OPS (.856) in 89 games played. He mashed 15 home runs, six in the final 13 games of his season.

Only The Young... CAN SAY: Taylor Young stole 56 bases in 124 games, leading the Midwest League. Young has the second-most stolen bases by a Loon in a single-season. Young saw the most pitches of any MWL player, 2321.

Loons flying from base to base: The Loons led the Midwest League with 200 stolen bases in 131 games. 200 is the most stolen bases in a single-season in Great Lakes history, beating 189 back in 2012. Four players had over 20 stolen bases, with Taylor Young leading the way with 56.

Every Day is K Day: Through the 131 games played in the regular season, the Great Lakes Loons finished first in the Midwest League in pitcher strikeouts with 1303. The franchise record is 1398 set in 2022.

LOON -> SHOW: In 2023, seven former Loons have made their MLB Debut. Michael Busch became the 100th Loon to reach the majors.

Loons Coaching Staff

MANAGER

Jair Fernandez

The Great Lakes Loons in conjunction with the Los Angeles Dodgers, named Jair Fernandez as their manager for the 2024 season. Jair Fernandez becomes the 11th manager in the 17-year history of the Loons. Last season, Fernandez served as skipper for the Los Angeles Dodgers Arizona Complex League team, his seventh season coaching in the organization and fourth in Arizona. This will be Jair's second stint with the Great Lakes Loons. He served as the hitting coach in 2017 and 2018. The Loons hit a combined .240 in those two seasons, accumulating 192 home runs. For his home country, Fernandez has served in a multitude of coaching roles. In 2017 and 2023, he coached for Team Colombia in the World Baseball Classic. He manned third base in the 23' Classic. In the Colombian League, played annually from October to January, Fernandez managed two different franchises from 2016 to 2018. Leones de Monteria for two seasons and Tigres de Cartagena midway through the end of the 2018 campaign. Fernandez, 37, debuted in minor league baseball in 2007 at the age of 18 in the Seattle Mariners organization. The Colombian-born catcher spent nine seasons in baseball, appearing with two teams at the Triple-A level. Fernandez played within four major league organizations, the Mariners, Minnesota Twins, Houston Astros, and Chicago Cubs. Two summers were spent in the Midwest League. In 2008, he was an MWL All-Star with the Beloit Snappers, now the Beloit Sky Carp. Beloit was a then affiliate of the Twins. He had 36 hits in 36 games, batting .283 and posting a .703 OPS. Before that season, he was traded from the Mariners organization to the Twins organization for 34-year-old R.A. Dickey. Fernandez totaled 470 games in his minor-league career, 31 at the Triple-A level including two with Oklahoma City, in 2012. Since 2015, Oklahoma City has been a Dodgers affiliate.

PITCHING COACH

David Anderson

David Anderson continues his rise through the ranks of the Dodgers organization as the pitching coach for the Loons for a third season. Anderson, 27, joined the L.A. system as a development coach in 2020, and was assigned as the pitching coach for the organization's Arizona Complex League team in the 2021 season. He led his staff to the fourth-lowest ERA in the ACL at 4.06, the third-most strikeouts (617 in 488.0 innings pitched), and the second-best walks and hits per innings pitched. Anderson, a 2015 graduate of Muhlenberg College, got his start in coaching at his alma mater, serving as pitching coach for the NCAA Division III school in Allentown, Pa., for two years immediately after his graduation. After that, he became a volunteer assistant for Cornell in 2017 before landing at Atlanta's Emory University, serving as the school's pitching coach and recruiting coordinator. While in the college ranks, Anderson also got head coaching experience in summer collegiate ball as manager of the Watertown (N.Y.) Rapids of the Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League in 2018, leading the team to a 26-21 record in its inaugural season. He then went on to manage the now-defunct Fayetteville (N.C.) SwampDogs of the Coastal Plain League in 2019. Anderson, a native of Syracuse, N.Y., tossed four seasons at Muhlenberg. As a junior in 2014, he posted a 3.14 ERA over 63.0 innings, all as a starter. He walked just seven batters that season while striking out 28. He served as team captain as a senior, and led the team that year in innings pitched and strikeouts. After college, Anderson tested the waters in independent baseball. He appeared 16 times for the Newburgh Newts of the North Country Baseball League, with a stellar 2.38 ERA and seven saves. He then threw to a 2.67 ERA with the Bridgeport Bluefish of the Atlantic League, an MLB Partner League.

PITCHING COACH

Richard De Los Santos

Richard De Los Santos returns for a third year as a member of the coaching staff after serving as Assistant Pitching Coach in 2022. This year, Anderson and De Los Santos will share the title of Pitching Coach. The 38-year-old De Los Santos had a nine-year minor league career as a right-handed pitcher, mostly in the Tampa Bay system. He played a portion of the 2005 season for the Southwest Michigan Devil Rays in Battle Creek, who would be purchased in 2006 by the Michigan Baseball Foundation and become the Loons in 2007. De Los Santos pitched in 36 games over three seasons for Triple-A Durham, racking up 99 strikeouts in 169 1/3 innings at MiLB's highest level. Over the course of nine seasons in affiliated baseball, the Dominican Republic native accumulated up over 400 strikeouts on the mound.

HITTING COACH

O'Koyea Dickson

O'Koyea Dickson, 33, returns to Dow Diamond in a coaching role after spending the 2012 season as a player with the Loons. He was drafted in the 12th round of the 2011 draft by the Dodgers, and made his Major League debut with the club in 2017. 2024 marks Dickson's third year coaching in the Dodgers organization after he worked with Single-A Rancho Cucamonga in 2022 as the team's Hitting Coach. The 2022 Rancho Cucamonga team had the most hits and RBIs in the California League under Dickson's direction. The California native made his Major League debut in September of 2012 for the Dodgers, and appeared in a total of seven games after an injury cut his time in Los Angeles short. His lone hit in the big leagues came off Madison Bumgarner of the San Francisco Giants on September 23, 2017. He hit 24 home runs and drove in 76 runs in that 2017 season for Triple-A Oklahoma City. For the next two years, Dickson had stints in Nippon Professional Baseball, the Atlantic League, the Mexican League and the Pacific Association before entering coaching. Notably in 2007, as a fifteen year old sophomore at George Washington High School, Dickson became the first high-schooler to hit a home run at Oracle Park, then AT&T Park.

BENCH COACH

Elian Herrera

Former Loon Elian Herrera is back for a fourth season as the bench coach for Great Lakes. Herrera, a four-year big leaguer, begins his fifth season as a coach within the Dodgers' organization. The second baseman played over 20 games with the Loons in a span of two separate seasons, including the inaugural 2007 Great Lakes Loons, along with nine other future Major Leaguers. He also returned to the Loons for a portion of the 2009 season. From 2012-2018, Herrera played in 324 games at the AAA level, holding a .310 batting average in nearly 1200 plate appearances. Herrera made his major league debut on May 15, 2012 at Dodger Stadium, in a game where Kirk Gibson managed the Arizona Diamondbacks vs. Don Mattingly's Dodgers. Before joining the Loons staff in 2021, Herrera was the bench coach for the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes in 2019, helping lead the team to the playoffs after an 81-57 finish in the regular season, good for first in the South division of the California League.

Family Business: Jared is the son of Eric Karros. Eric played 14 seasons in MLB, 12 with the Dodgers. He was the 1992 National League Rookie of the Year and 1995 Silver Slugger Award Winner.

After his playing career Karros entered broadcasting and currently covers the Dodgers for Sportsnet LA. Karros has worked nationally for both ESPN and Fox Sports as a game and studio analyst.

Jared has a younger brother Kyle Karros, who is currently with an infielder with the Spokane Indians (High-A Colorado Rockies). Jared was drafted in the fifth round of the 2023 draft from UCLA.

College: Spent three seasons at the University of California Los Angeles. 2021 Opening Day starter, Pac-12 Academic Honor Roll. Played at the school his dad went to.

High School: Attended Mira Costa High School in Manhattan Beach, CA. Alums include Joe Moeller Dodgers pitcher (1962-1971), actor Dylan O'Brien and broadcaster Michelle Tafaoya.

Bay League Pitcher of the Year in 2019. 0.86 ERA as a senior. Ranked the 26th RHP and 77th overall prospect in California and 464th overall by Perfect Game in 2019.
