Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Yorman Gomez** to the mound tonight, still searching for his first win of the season (topped out at 4.1IP three times this year). The Saints will counter with RHP **Trent Baker**. Columbus is 41-29 (.586) versus right handers this year. Baker has pitched against the Clippers four times in his career (all in St. Paul), going 0-0 with a 0.00ERA (6.1IP, 5H, 0R, 0ER, 1BB, 8K).

vs. the Saints

Columbus went 4-2 against the Saints in Minnesota last year, on the way to a 9-7 series record, and has won 50 of the last 81 overall opposing the Saints (441-352 run differential; 14 of 31 losses by a single run, only 11 losses by more than two runs). Individually, **Angel Genao** has hit .325 (13x40) with 3HR and 12RBI in 10G against St. Paul in his career (**Kahlil Watson** has 4HR and 15RBI in 13G).

Outliers

The Clippers picked up their 52nd win last night, having done so with negative differentials in runs (-27; of seven teams with at least 52 wins, only team in the red, all others at least +31 and averaging +55), homers (-11, only team in the red, all others average +28) and hits (-26, others average +38; St. Paul brings up the rear, -46). In the second half, Columbus is being outscored 138-117 and outthomered 40-24.

Ingle is Back

In 10G since his option, **Cooper Ingle** is 16x42 (.381), drawing 6BB (.458OBP) with 6XBH (1HR, .571SLG). Thursday's 4x5 performance pushed his season average over .300, while also qualifying him for rate statistics, as he is one of two players in the IL, along with Iowa's **BJ Murray**, hitting .300/.400/.500. At catcher, Ingle has a 1.301OPS (11HR) in 33G (.617OPS and 2HR in 27G between DH and LF).

Angel Ascendant

Over his last 28G, since 6/18, **Angel Genao** leads the IL in OBP (.496) and walks (22), while ranking 2nd in batting (.392, 40x102) and 5th in OPS (1.084). He owns an 17% walk rate in that time (127PA; 8% in first 35G with Columbus) and his 8K yield a 6% rate (21% in first 35G). Wednesday's strikeout snapped a 40PA streak without (50PA with 0K from 6/23-7/3; has not had a multi-K game since 5/31).

Looking to Rebound

Ralph Velazquez produced a multi-hit game on 7/19 vs. Indianapolis, a day after his career best 30G on base streak was snapped (.383OBP from 6/3-7/10, 4th longest in the IL this year), but he is 0x13 in 4G since (longest hitless stretch of the season, average has dipped 20 points). Velazquez has struggled away from Huntington Park, with a .626OPS in 23G (.863OPS in 23G at home).

Brito Piling Up Numbers

Last night marked **Juan Brito**'s 250th career game in a Columbus uniform (55th to reach 250, **George Valera** became the 54th earlier this year) and his triple was his 101st XBH (tied with **Yandy Diaz** for 20th most doubles, 65). He is just 3RBI from 150 (37 Clippers have 150+, with Valera sitting at 149) and his 158BB are 20th most (only 5BB in last 60PA, 8%; Valera is 18th at 160BB).

Two at a Time

Alfonsin Rosario is only 3x21 (.143) since joining the Clippers last week, but all of his hits have been doubles and all three times he has scored after putting himself in scoring position. Combined between Akron and Columbus, Rosario now has a career best 23 doubles (22 between Lake County and Akron last season) and he is pacing to cross the plate 69 times (personal best of 69 last year).

Serious Growth

Kody Huff clubbed his 13th HR of the season on Tuesday, equaling his total from the last two seasons combined. Having already also established career bests in runs, triples, RBI and walks, Huff's steal last night set a new personal best (8). Huff is 5x9 in his last 3G (nine hits and four doubles from career highs) and his .911OPS is 6th best in the IL (.682OPS in MiLB career prior; **Cooper Ingle** leads: .979).

Rare Company

Dating to the nightcap vs. Scranton/WB on 6/19, **Milan Tolentino** is 25x83 (.301) in his last 26G, collecting 13XBH (.566SLG) and 15RBI (was 5x39, .128, in 13G prior). Over his last 19G, Tolentino has drawn 17BB to 14K (71PA; 8BB and 42K in previous 33G, 114PA). He is one of 10 in the IL with at least a dozen HR and SB, along with **Kahlil Watson** (Columbus and Omaha are only teams with two).

This Date in Clipper History

7/25/1996

Columbus beat Norfolk by a score of 3-1 at Harbor Park. **Ramiro Mendoza** tossed 8.0 innings, allowing a single run, and **Dave Pavlas** came on in the 9th for his 21st save. Pavlas would end up with 26 saves on the year (currently the 5th most saves in a Clipper season) and his 57 career saves for Columbus rank as 2nd most all-time, 10 saves behind **Jay Tessmer**.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,458 to 1,401).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 144-116 (.554) in pitch reviews, with batters going 74-74 (.500) and pitchers/catchers going 70-42 (.625). They have run out of challenges in 41G and have not challenged in 4G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .571), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 801, would rank as 6th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 117 through 99G (on pace for 176SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 32CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 3rd most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (48; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighth's

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 152 runs while crafting a .915OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 81 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +71 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 232-145 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 79 grand slams and 1,961RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.39 through the first 99G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 190HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 5th in the IL this year (.981), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 55G this season (32-23, .582), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 3rd most last at bat wins this year (14, one off the lead) while playing in the 2nd most games decided in the last at bat (26, Memphis has 28). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 100G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-52 (.480, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 438-453 (.492), 408-407 with Columbus (.501).

Injury Delay:

Gomez was slated to make his Triple-A debut during the season-opening series at Iowa, but injured his shoulder in his last preseason bullpen to wind up on the shelf (missed 72G; Clippers went 40-32). He was sent to Arizona at the end of May to rehab, appearing in 4G for the Guardians.

Rocky Start:

When he did make his Triple-A debut, 6/20 vs. Scranton/WB, Gomez was touched for a 2-run homer in the 1st inning, but settled down to retire 10 of the next 12BF (7K). He has not given up a run in the 1st inning since. While with the AZL Guardians, he gave up 5ER over the course of 4.0IP in the 1st inning and 2ER in 6.1IP thereafter.

Right Stuff:

While in the Rookie League, Gomez mowed down opposing right-handers, racking up 10K against 21BF (48%; 4K to 23BF on the left side, 17%). When they did put the bat on the ball (5x20, .250), righties notched 3XBH (all doubles; .400SLG), compared to .295 (5x17, all singles) from lefties. His strikeout rate in Triple-A is fairly even (16K against 46BF from the left and 13K vs. 44BF from the right), but right handers are still teeing off when they do connect (9x38, 4HR).

Racking Up Strikeouts:

Since his Triple-A debut on 6/20, Gomez has averaged 12.8K/9IP, good for the best rate in the IL (29K, 20.1IP). In terms sheer numbers, his 29K rank 7th in the IL, trailing teammates **Logan Allen** (2nd, 36K) and **Trenton Denholm** (3rd, 32K). As a team, the Clippers have the 2nd most strikeouts in the league since 6/20 (252K in 27G), trailing Durham by 15K (the Bulls have pitched only 25G).
