Aviators vs. Express: The Las Vegas Aviators professional baseball team, Triple-A affiliate of the Oakland Athletics, will open a six-game road trip this afternoon against the Round Rock Express, Triple-A affiliate of the 2023 World Series Champions Texas Rangers, in Pacific Coast League action at Dell Diamond (13,500)...Las Vegas was 4-3 on the just completed seven-game homestand against the Reno Aces...the Texas six-game road trip will conclude on Sunday, May 12...the Aviators will then return home and host the El Paso Chihuahuas, Triple-Affiliate of the San Diego Padres, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, May 14-19.

Las Vegas defeats Reno 6-4 in series finale (Sunday, May 5): The Aviators defeated the Aces 6-4 in the finale of the seven-game homestand before a crowd of 6,211 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas Offense: The Aviators recorded 9 hits and built a 5-0 lead after five innings. Left fielder **Daz Cameron** was 3-for-4, two doubles, stolen base, RBI, run scored. Third baseman **Drew Lugbauer** was 2-for-4, double, two-run home run; designated hitter **Tyler Soderstrom** was 2-for-4, RBI, run scored and second baseman **Jordan Díaz** was 1-for-3, double, walk, run scored.

Reno Offense: The Aces recorded 11 hits and stranded seven runners on base. First baseman **Ronaldo Hernández** was 3-for-4, solo home run. LF **Kyle Garlick** was 2-for-4, double, RBI and catcher **Adrian Del Castillo** was 2-for-4.

Las Vegas Starting Pitching: Right-hander **Aaron Brooks** recorded the victory with 6.0 shutout innings. He allowed 4 hits, issued no walks and struck out 1 on 77 pitches (48 strikes).

Aviators Bullpen: Left-hander **Francisco Pérez** pitched 1.1 innings and allowed 4 hits, 3 runs and struck out 2. Right-hander **Gerardo Reyes** pitched 0.2 scoreless and allowed 1 hit, walked 1 and struck out 1. Right-hander **Vinny Nittoli** pitched 1.0 inning and allowed 2 hits and 1 run.

Las Vegas defeats Reno 8-0 in game four of the series (Thursday, May 2): The Aviators defeated the Aces 8-0 in game four of the seven-game homestand before a crowd of 6,373 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas Offense: The Aviators recorded 11 hits and built a 6-0 lead after five innings. Center fielder **Daz Cameron** was 4-for-5, lead-off home run, double, 3 RBI, two runs scored. Shortstop **Logan Davidson** was 2-for-3, walk, double, 2 RBI, run scored; second baseman **Hoy Park** was 1-for-2, two walks, double, run scored and first baseman **Drew Lugbauer** (1-for-4) hit a solo home run.

Reno Offense: The Aces recorded 4 hits and stranded five runners on base. Third baseman **Andres Chaparro** was 1-for-3, walk. First baseman **Ronaldo Hernández** was 1-for-3, double.

Las Vegas Starting Pitching: Right-hander **Oswaldo Bido** recorded his fourth victory with a season-high 7.0 shutout innings. He allowed 2 hits, walked 1 and struck out 8 on 90 pitches (61 strikes).

Aviators Bullpen: The pitching staff recorded its second shutout of the season. Right-hander **Michel Otañez** pitched 1.0 inning and allowed hits and right-hander **Tyler Baum** pitched 1.0 inning and allowed 2 hits and struck out 1.

Reno defeats Las Vegas 13-10 in game five of series (Friday, May 3): The Aces defeated the Aviators 13-10 in game five of the seven-game homestand before a crowd of 7,727 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas Offense: The Aviators recorded 9 hits and rallied for seven runs in the sixth inning to take a 9-7 lead. Center fielder **Daz Cameron** was 2-for-4, walk, double, triple, 4 RBI, run scored. Left fielder **Carlos Pérez** was 2-for-3, two walks, double, RBI, two runs scored and second baseman **Hoy Park** was 1-for-2, double, RBI, two walks, stolen base, two runs scored.

Reno Offense: The Aces recorded 14 hits and stranded six runners on base. Reno, trailing 10-7, scored six runs over the final two innings. Right fielder **Brett Johnson** was 2-for-4, walk, double, HR, 5 RBI, two runs scored. Catcher **Jose Herrera** was 3-for-5, solo home run, three runs scored.

Las Vegas Starting Pitching: Left-hander **Jack O'Loughlin** pitched 3.2 innings in the no decision. He allowed 8 hits, 6 runs, walked 1 and struck out 4 on 74 pitches (50 strikes).

Reno defeats Las Vegas 9-6 in game six of series (Saturday, May 4): The Aces defeated the Aviators 9-6 in game six of the seven-game homestand before a **STAR WARS** crowd of 8,110 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

Las Vegas Offense: The Aviators recorded 8 hits and stranded five runners on base. Left fielder **Daz Cameron** was 2-for-4, double, walk, 2 RBI, two runs scored. Right fielder **Hoy Park** was 2-for-4, double, run scored and designated hitter **Yohel Pozo** was 1-for-3, SF, 2 RBI.

Reno Offense: The Aces recorded 9 hits and stranded nine runners on base. Reno built a 7-1 lead after 4 ½ innings. Left fielder **Brett Johnson** was 2-for-3, two walks, double, triple, 2 RBI, three runs scored. First baseman **Tristin English** was 2-for-5, two-run home run and third baseman **Andres Chaparro** was 1-for-3, walk, double, 2 RBI, run scored.

AVIATORS INFLIGHT NEWS – Las Vegas opens a Texas six-game road this afternoon against the Round Rock Express, Triple-A affiliate of the 2023 World Series Champions Texas Rangers...the Aviators were 4-3 on the just completed seven-game homestand against Reno...the Aviators are 14-8 (.636) over their last 22 games...the series against Round Rock will conclude on Sunday, May 12...Round Rock and Las Vegas will play each other a total of 12 times in 2024...following the road trip, the Aviators will return home and host the El Paso Chihuahuas, Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, May 14-19...the 2024 season will feature six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday and off days on Mondays (one exception, July 1 vs. Oklahoma City)...the '24 campaign will feature 150 games (75-home; 75-away).

2024 PCL PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Right-hander **Oswaldo Bido** from April 29 – May 5 (defeated Reno on May 2 at Las Vegas Ballpark: season-high 7.0 shutout innings, two hits, one walk, eight strikeouts).

2024 PCL PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Outfielder **Daz Cameron** from April 29 – May 5...appeared in seven games vs. Reno and batted .591 (13-for-22) with five doubles, triple, home run, five walks, two stolen bases and 10 RBI...recorded four straight multiple-hit games.

41st SEASON IN THE SILVER STATE (1983-2024) – The Aviators are playing in their 41st season (42nd calendar season) in the Silver State as a proud member of the Pacific Coast League...**the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being Nevada's longest enduring professional sports franchise**...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a sellout crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8)...catcher **Bruce Bochy** has the distinction of hitting the first Triple-A home run in Cashman Field history for the Las Vegas Stars on April 10, 1983.

PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE: The PCL is in its 121st season (1903-2020, 2022 -) and consists of two divisions for a total of 10 teams. **West Division:** Las Vegas Aviators, Reno Aces, Sacramento River Cats, Salt Lake Bees, Tacoma Rainiers; **East Division:** Albuquerque Isotopes, El Paso Chihuahuas, Oklahoma City Baseball Club, Round Rock Express, Sugar Land Space Cowboys. The 10-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A West and returned as the PCL in 2022!

INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE: The IL consists of two divisions for a total of 20 teams. **East Division:** Buffalo Bisons, Charlotte Knights, Durham Bulls, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Norfolk Tides, Rochester Red Wings, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, Syracuse Mets, Worcester Red Sox. **West Division:** Columbus Clippers, Gwinnett Stripers, Indianapolis Indians, Iowa Cubs, Louisville Bats, Memphis Redbirds, Nashville Sounds, Omaha Storm Chasers, St. Paul Saints, Toledo Mud Hens. The 20-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A East and returned as the IL in 2022!

2023 SEASON – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 75-74 (.503) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division. The Reno Aces captured the West Division with an overall record of 88-62 (.587). Oklahoma City baseball club recorded the best record (90-58, .608) in the 10-team PCL and defeated the Round Rock Express, 2-games-to-0 to capture the PCL Championship. The Norfolk Tides defeated OKC, 7-6, in the **Triple-A National Championship** game on September 30 before a sellout crowd of 8,556 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

2022 SEASON – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 71-79 (.473) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division. The Reno Aces captured the West Division with an overall record of 85-63 (.574). The Aces captured the PCL championship and defeated the El Paso Chihuahuas, Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, 6-2, on September 30 in the inaugural **Triple-A Triple Championship Weekend** at Las Vegas Ballpark. The Durham Bulls, Triple-A affiliate off the Tampa Bay Rays, captured the Triple-A National Championship and defeated Reno, 10-6, on October 2 at Las Vegas Ballpark. The Bulls defeated the Nashville Sounds, Triple-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers, 13-0, to capture the IL championship on October 1 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season six times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590)); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580)); **83** (83-57, .593 in 2019); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563))...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014)...the 83-57 record in 2019 marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

LAS VEGAS BALLPARK HISTORY: Howard Hughes Holdings Inc. (NYSE: HHH) announced on **October 10, 2017** its plans to develop and construct a baseball stadium in Downtown Summerlin® on approximately eight acres just south of City National Arena, the National Hockey League practice facility for the Vegas Golden Knights. The announcement on October 10, followed a vote by the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors approving a marketing partnership that gives **LVCVA** naming rights to the stadium. The Las Vegas Ballpark was designed by HOK, a global architecture firm with an expertise in stadium design and constructed by **HUNT/PENTA**.

The groundbreaking ceremony took place on **Friday, February 23, 2018** before a crowd of several hundred people! The 8,196-fan-capacity stadium blends the distinct architectural style of the Summerlin® community with the aviation legacy of Howard Hughes. The ballpark provides a wide range of seating options including 22 suites, club seats, berm seating, party zones and decks, picnic tables, kids' zone, bars and even a pool beyond the outfield wall. Designed to create a festival-like atmosphere in Downtown Summerlin, the site is landscaped to complement the master planned community. Parking is conveniently located on adjacent sites. The grand opening took place on **Tuesday, April 9, 2019** before a sellout crowd of 11,036 and the Aviators defeated Sacramento, 10-2.

LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LOGO AND INFORMATION: Howard Hughes Holdings Inc. (NYSE: HHH), owner of the city's professional Triple-A baseball team of the Pacific Coast League, and developer of the Summerlin® master planned community and the Las Vegas Ballpark® located at Downtown Summerlin®, announced on **December 8, 2018** the team's new name - the **Las Vegas Aviators®**.

The name change completed a rebrand that included the team's new two-year Player Development Contract (PDC) with the Oakland Athletics (2018) and the opening of the Las Vegas Ballpark, the state-of-the-art Triple-A baseball stadium, that now serves as the home of the Aviators.

The name change (from 51st) pays homage to the company's namesake, **Howard R. Hughes, Jr.**, one of the twentieth century's most successful businessmen whose passion for aviation and legacy of innovation includes significant aviation-related firsts and accomplishments. In the H-1 Racer, a plane he designed and built, Hughes set the land speed record of 352 miles per hour in 1935. Hughes went on to set other records, including the fastest coast-to-coast flight in 1937 and the fastest circumnavigation of the globe in 1938, then acquiring and successfully operating major airlines and aviation companies.

AVIATORS LOGO DESIGN AND CONCEPT:

The color inspiration: the Las Vegas Sunset; the mountain range featured in the Aviators' sunglasses resemble the mountain range found in the Summerlin logo!

Team colors are navy, orange, tangerine, gold, yellow, gray.

SOUTHERN NEVADA AVIATION HISTORY:

Nevada's High-Flying Aviators (from UNLV News) - Nevada has a rich history in Aviation; with 500 miles between the state's two largest cities (Reno and Las Vegas), aviation was ideal for Nevada.

Aviation History in Las Vegas (from McCarran Airport) - Aviation grew exponentially throughout the 1900s, bringing more and more travelers to our city.

Nellis Air Force Base (in Las Vegas) is "Home of the Fighter Pilot" and home to the United States Air Force Warfare Center - the largest and most demanding advanced air combat training mission in the world. Aviators on Radio in 2024: Russ Langer will broadcast the 150 games on **Raider Nation Radio 920 AM** (selected games on **Fox Sports 1340 AM** and **98.9 FM**) on www.aviatorslv.com. Langer is in his 24th season broadcasting baseball to the Las Vegas Valley and 37th year overall in the business....over his career, Langer has received numerous awards, including being named 1993 Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues....in 1995 and 2016, he broadcast the Triple-A All-Star game; in 1999, he was named the New Mexico Sportscaster of the Year; and in 2002, he was named Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by Minor League News.com...Langer also is a 12-time recipient (13 overall and seven consecutive years from 2007-13) of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2021, 2023), which is presented by the National Sports Media Association (NSMA)...Langer's inaugural season in Las Vegas was in 2000, the final year the franchise was known as the Stars...prior to arriving in Las Vegas, Langer called Pacific Coast League games for the Albuquerque Dukes (1996-99) and Phoenix Firebirds (1992-95)...began his broadcasting career with Single-A Springfield Cardinals in 1987 and 1989, sandwiched around a year in Vero Beach (1988)...moved up the ranks to Double-A, calling games for the Midland Angels in 1990 and '91 before advancing to Triple-A Phoenix...he realized his longtime goal of broadcasting Major League baseball when he worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons, followed by nine games for the Baltimore Orioles in 2006...has also broadcast selected spring training games for the Los Angeles Dodgers (2006-08), Toronto Blue Jays (2009-10) and Chicago White Sox (2012-20)...on April 6, 2023, marked his 3,000th broadcast for the Triple-A Las Vegas Stars/51^s/Aviators franchise...also in 2023, Langer completed his 12th season as the radio play-by-play voice for the UNLV football team on the UNLV Sports Properties/ Learfield Network.

Matt Neverett will also serve as the play-by-play voice for home games and selected road games...in his fifth season with the Aviators, and his fourth in the broadcast booth...he returned to his birthplace of Las Vegas in 2020 after spending two years with the Bradenton Marauders, Single-A Affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates, as the play-by-play broadcaster and media relations director...after graduating from Appalachian State University in Boone, NC in 2017, he spent one season with the Birmingham Barons, Double-A Affiliate of the Chicago White Sox, as a media relations manager and pre/post game host...also broadcast selected UNLV Runnin' Rebel basketball games, UNLV baseball and UNLV football on SSSSEN...his father, Tim, is a former play-by-play voice of the Las Vegas 51^s and current play-by-play voice of the Los Angeles Dodgers.

ROBERT J. BLUM BROADCAST BOOTH AT LAS VEGAS BALLPARK:

The "Aviators Home Radio Booth" was renamed the "**Robert J. Blum Broadcast Booth**" prior to the 2013 season at Cashman Field (and currently at Las Vegas Ballpark) to honor the then-51s Special Assistant to the General

Manager...“The Blummer” passed away on July 22, 2012 at the age of 91...also served as the play-by-play voice for Stars/51^s baseball in selected seasons from 1985-2005 & 2008-10...his company, Robert J. Blum Productions, also produced Las Vegas Triple-A professional baseball games broadcast on radio and television for several seasons.

Aviators Manager Fran Riordan - **2019 & 2023 PCL Manager of the Year**

He was named the 25th manager (November 8, 2018) in the history of the Las Vegas franchise (1983-2019, 2021-23, 40 seasons). **Career Summary:** He has recorded 23 seasons overall in professional baseball and has been a member of the Oakland Athletics organization for the past nine seasons (2015-23).

Riordan has compiled an overall managerial record over 23 seasons of 1,251-1,213 (.508), **current**. He entered the '24 season ranked eighth among active leaders in minor league managerial wins.

Triple-A Las Vegas: He has a five-year record of 310-288 (.518). He is 14 wins shy of becoming Las Vegas' all-time leader in managerial wins: 1. **Jerry Royster**, 1996-98; 2005-06 (323-387, .455); 2. **Wally Backman**, 2013-16 (309-267, .536).

2023: Named Pacific Coast League Manager of the Year for the second time in four seasons. The Aviators compiled an overall record of 75-74 (.508) and finished in third place in the West Division.

2022: The Aviators compiled an overall record of 71-79 (.473) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division.

2021: Riordan guided the Aviators to an overall record of 65-61 (.516) and finished in third place in the Triple-A West (Western Division).

2020: With the Minor League Baseball season canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Riordan worked with the Athletics' 60-man player pool at the team's alternate training site located in San Jose, California.

2019: Named Pacific Coast League Manager of the Year and led Triple-A Las Vegas to the second-best record in the 16-team PCL (83-57, .593) and a Pacific Southern Division Championship...Las Vegas returned to the playoffs for the first time since 2014 and lost to Sacramento, 3-games-to-2, in the conference championship series...the Aviators' record marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).
