Today's Game
The Fightin Phils remain on the road and continue a 12-game road trip, continuing a six-game series at the New Hampshire Fisher Cats, Double-A affiliate of the Toronto Blue Jays. It is the 15th-of-18 matchups between the teams this season and third-of-six games at Delta Dental Stadium in Manchester. The Fightin Phils took four-of-six games from New Hampshire from May 13-18, then the teams split the series from June 10-15. Reading leads the season-series 8-6.

Game 102 Recap
The Fightin Phils snapped a four-game losing streak with an 8-1 win on Wednesday morning at New Hampshire to even this week's series. Reading struck with two runs in the first when Paul McIntosh doubled to score Aidan Miller and Carson DeMartini to make it 2-0. In the bottom of the first, Je'Von Ward doubled home Charles McAdoo to cut the score in half. From there, Wil Crowe shut down the Fisher Cats' bats. In the win, Crowe allowed one run on four hits over five innings, with a pair of strikeouts. Reading scored two more runs in the third, one coming on a single from Felix Reyes and Reyes would later score on an infield hit from Dylan Campbell. In the sixth inning, Leandro Pineda hit his sixth home run of the season to make it 6-1. Meanwhile, Reading's pitching kept New Hampshire quiet, with Gabriel Barbosa firing two-scoreless innings, then Andrew Walling and Tommy McCollum each posted a zero over an inning each. Reading tacked on another run in the seventh on a Nick Dunn single and then Dunn homered in the ninth to make it 8-1.

The 40 Club
With his 40th stolen base on Wednesday, Aidan Miller became the first Fightin Phil to steal 40+ bases in a season since Quintin Berry (48) in 2009. The last to steal 50 in a season was Jose Leiva in 1987 and Miller has 34 games to do that if he remains with Reading for the rest of the season. Miller now ranks tied for first in the Eastern League with Hartford's Cole Carrigg with 40 stolen bases, and he is tied with Jersey Shore's Bryan Rincon for most stolen bases in the Phillies organization. Miller is also currently riding an eight-game hitting streak and is slashing .387/.486/.613 (1.099 OPS) over the streak.

Can't Catch Carson
Carson DeMartini matched a season, and career-high, with three stolen bases on Wednesday. DeMartini also stole three bases last Saturday at Hartford. Since July 29, DeMartini leads the Eastern League with nine stolen bases, with second place over that stretch having four. Since his Double-A debut on June 10, DeMartini ranks second in the Eastern League with 20 stolen bases. In the Phillies organization, DeMartini is third in stolen bases with 38, trailing only Aidan Miller and Bryan Rincon, who both have 40.

King Felix
Felix Reyes has been red-hot as of week and is currently riding a nine-game on-base streak (dating back to July 27) and is slashing .395/.439/.658 (1.097 OPS) over the streak. He has added 10 runs, four doubles, two home runs and six RBI. Reyes' 11 home runs this season lead the Fightin Phils and ranked tied for fifth amongst all Phillies minor leaguers entering play on Thursday. Since the start of June, Reyes holds the following Eastern League ranks: 1st AVG (.322), 9th OBP (.373), 1st SLG (.577), 1st OPS (.950), T-9th hits (48), T-4th XBH (21), T-5th total bases (86) and T-7th runs (29).

Swiper "Yes" Swiping
The Fightin Phils turned in a season-high seven stolen bases in Wednesday's game. It was the most bags Reading has swiped in a game since stealing nine on July 23, 2024, also at New Hampshire. Reading has stolen 19 bases on the current road trip (since July 29), which is tied with Hartford for the most stolen bases over that stretch. The R-Phils sit at 120 stolen bases on the season, which enters play today ranked as tied for seventh in the Eastern League.

The Bats are Clicking
It's been a good start to the week offensively for the Fightin Phils. Through the first two games of the week, Reading leads the league in average (.329), runs (14) and stolen bases (8).

This Day in Baseballtown History
August 7, 1967: At the Abraham Lincoln Hotel, Phillies president Ruly Carpenter and farm director Paul Owens announce that the Phils have renewed their stadium lease with the city of Reading for the 1968 season. Carpenter and Owens are "extremely pleased with the Reading operation" and would be "extremely pleased if renewal becomes feasible on an annual basis."

Playing the Cats
New Hampshire enters today with a 45-58 overall record and 16-18 mark in the second half, which sits tied for fourth in the Northeast Division. The Fisher Cats took five-of-six games at Chesapeake last week, winning five straight to finish the series. After this week, New Hampshire begins a two-week road trip at Binghamton, then Akron. New Hampshire's roster features five of the Blue Jays' top-30 prospects: Trey Yesavage (2), Victor Arias (10), Charles McAdoo (12), Jace Bohrofen (22) and Dasan Brown (29).

Cats Pitcher
Righty Alek Manoah makes a big league rehab start tonight for the Fisher Cats. Manoah had Tommy John Surgery in June of 2024 and is working his way back to the Blue Jays. Manoah has made a start each with the FCL-Blue Jays (ROK) and Dunedin (A) this season. Prior to his injury last season, Manoah made five starts for Toronto, going 1-2, with a 3.70 ERA. He also made stops in Dunedin and Buffalo (AAA). Manoah made 20 starts for the Blue Jays in 2021, 31 in '22 and 19 in '23. His best season was 2022, when he went 16-7, with a 2.24 ERA over 31 starts, tossing 196.2 IP. The 27-year old was a first round pick (11th overall) by the Blue Jays in the 2019 draft out of West Virginia. He made his big league debut on May 27, 2021.
