

At first glance, Dillon Lewis' decision to play at Queens University appears simple. His dad T.J. was a college basketball player at Queens. However, that didn't actually factor into Lewis' decision. Lewis grew up in Maryland but moved to North Carolina before his senior year of high school. Just down the road from his new home, the Royals program gave him a chance to play collegiately.

"It's funny, it really wasn't a big driving piece," Dillon Lewis. "Growing up I had been around the school and the campus, but it had never been a main focus like I want to play ball here. But the opportunity came to be able to be local and to play with a good community around me. So it ended up being a good fit."

Lewis struggled to find opportunities to play collegiate baseball coming out of high school. The decision ended up paying major dividends. He felt wanted at Queens, and he is forever grateful for their belief in him.

"It means everything," Lewis. "It was during a time where it was kind of difficult to find opportunities during the pandemic and everything. It definitely allowed me to get my feet wet in college baseball. In my second year, we made the step up to Division-I which was a whole other set of circumstances and competition."

As his freshman season was winding down in 2022, Lewis and his teammates watched as Queens worked through the process of becoming a D-1 program. It was a unique experience to be at the school while the transition was taking place. Every day, there seemed to be a new twist in the story.

"It was very interesting," Lewis said. "I remember we had our trainer in the dugout during games saying, hey the Big South is coming, the ASUN is coming. We didn't really know where we'd end up until halfway into the summer. But at the same time, it definitely provided a lot of excitement because it's a new step up. You're going to do things a little more formally. You're going to play some big programs. You're going to travel a little more. So it was pretty fun."

After two up-and-down seasons at Queens for Lewis in 2022 and 2023, the Royals hired a new coaching staff. Jake Hendrick was hired as the new head coach and James Cullinane arrived as the program's hitting coach. These changes played a big role in Lewis' outstanding junior season. After hitting 13 total home runs in his first two seasons, Lewis hit 22 long balls in 2024. He hit .371 with a .729 slugging percentage, driving in 63 runs.

"I think the second time through the journey of the season, you get a better mental picture of what's going to happen," Lewis said. "I had some injuries that I dealt with earlier on that I was able to move past. Our hitting coach James Cullinane, I was able to really connect with him and build a good relationship. We worked all fall throughout the spring on the little things just to touch up the game, putting a more complete product on the field instead of just being raw or occasionally lucking your way into results."

In the end, playing for a smaller program like Queens has its benefits. Lewis is grateful that he had the chance to work through everyday challenges. There wasn't the same pressure for him to succeed right away, with less concern about losing playing time to other teammates.

"At bigger schools, you get handed some more opportunities in terms of there's more out there to see," Lewis said. "I think with smaller schools, it forces you to make your way. You're going to discover what works for you, the lanes you're going to take, the relationships you have to build. I was able to find my way early on. I wasn't really guided to do much. I had to just figure out what works best for me and continue to grow through that."

After his First-Team All-ASUN performance in 2024, Lewis started getting attention from MLB organizations. He didn't get his hopes up, but when the call came from the Yankees in the 13th round last year, it felt like his hard work was rewarded.

"I really had no clue what was going to happen until that call came through," Lewis said. "It's been great. I grew up a Yankee fan and getting an opportunity to put the pinstripes on and be a part of this organization that I've rooted for, meeting players that I've been watching on TV for 20 years, is very special."

The start of Lewis' professional career has featured many highlights. After a brief debut following last year's draft, Lewis began his first full season with Single-A Tampa. In May, Lewis was named Florida State League Player of the Month. He slashed .309/.381/.660 with eight home runs, 26 RBIs, and a 1.041 OPS. The guidance of Yankees coaching has been very impactful already.

"It's just the preparation really," Lewis said. "Being able to create routines. We were exposed to a lot of stuff very early. The organization is very process-oriented, which is big. The results aren't always going to be there, especially at these levels while you're learning. But understanding that there's still growth in that, and to be able to find success in that good process has definitely helped me long-term."

When Lewis earned the callup to Hudson Valley in early June, the Renegades were beginning a road trip in Aberdeen. The outfielder grew up in Columbia, Maryland, just down the road. He got the chance to make his High-A debut with friends and family in attendance.

"It was great," Lewis said. "It was a really good introduction to the next stop on the journey. Anytime you can get that support, it means everything because this game is a little isolating sometimes. You're doing this every single day. You never know where you're actually going to be, so being able to have that support definitely means the world."

In July, Lewis really hit his stride with the Renegades. From July 10 to August 3, the Hudson Valley outfielder slashed .352/.429/.648 with eight extra-base hits, 18 RBIs, and a 1.077 OPS. Lewis moved into the Yankees Top 30 prospects list with his performance.

"I think it's just been getting adjusted, Lewis said. "Getting adjusted to the new surroundings, getting adjusted to a new level of baseball. I think that's something that takes time. I just feel like I've been able to do what I'm capable of and get the most out of myself."



The MLB Draft and trade deadline have come and gone. After a very active July in the Yankees organization, the farm system looks quite different. With some departing the organization in trades, the opportunity has opened for new players to enter the prospect radar.

Here is MLB Pipeline's updated Yankees Top 30 Prospects list. You'll find excerpts from Pipeline bios for current Renegades included below, courtesy of MLB.com. Among the group of 30 players, 10 players have spent a portion of their season with Hudson Valley (indicated in **bold**).

Cunningham works with a mid-90s fastball that tops out at 97 mph, and he leared last spring to more consistently avoid barrels by locating it up in the zone with quality carry. The shape of his heater plays extremely well with his hard upper-80s changeup that fades and skins so much that it can be difficult to land for strikes. His sweeping mid-80s slider gives him an effect third pitch – one that the Yankees specialize in refining. If New York can upgrade his slider, he could become the system's best pitching prospect.

Smith's best attribute is his ability to spin the ball, which produces a plus mid-80s slider with two-plane depth and a solid low-80s curveball with similar depth. He also generates high spin rates on his fastball, which operates at 92-94 mph and touches 96 with carry. While Smith is a bit smaller than a typical starter, he has a quick arm and a relatively clean delivery. He relies on chases more than landing his pitches in the zone, so he'll need to learn to command his fastball and control his breaking balls as he rises through the Minors. He has the ceiling of a mid-rotation starter and a sturdy floor as a multi-inning reliever.

14. Kyle Carr


After dealing at 91-95 mph and touching 97 with his fastball at Palomar, Carr worked more at 88-92 and topped out at 94 with his two-and four-seamer in 2024. Carr's walk rate also doubled from 6 percent in junior college to 12 percent at High-A as he became reluctant to attack hitters with diminished stuff. His athleticism and arm speed help him overcome a lack of physicality, and offseason workouts have the Yankees optimistic that he's recapturing his Palomar form. If that happens and he adds some strength and polish, he could still become a No. 3 or No. 4 starter.

A right-handed hitter with an upright stance, Lewis generates some of the best exit velocities in the system and attempts to maximize his at least plus raw power by looking to launch balls in the air to his pull side. His approach produces extra-base hits but also results in strikeouts. Lewis has solid speed and plays quicker than that on the bases. He has divided his time among all three outfield positions in pro ball, and he's a decent center fielder, but more effective on the corner; with fringy arm strength, he may be best suited for left field.

Rossi's mid-80s slider has continued to overmatch batters at two Class A level, featuring huge sweep at its best. He sets up his slide piece with a fastball that parks at 94-96 mph and touches 98, and he'll alternate between carrying it at the letters and throwing it with downhill plane lower in the zone. His upper-80s splitter can make hitters look foolish too. A physical 6-foot-3, 230-pounder, Rossi works from a low arm slot and uses his size to create extension. He has the stuff to advance quickly if he can find the strike zone on a regular basis.

Catching Up With:

Renegades pitcher **Hayden Merda**

After missing the entire 2024 season recovering from an arm injury, Hayden Merda returned this year and was immediately a key cog in the Hudson Valley bullpen. He moved up to Double-A Somerset mid-season, but before he left, he sat down with Renegades Magazine to talk about his season and his path to where he has gotten to in the Yankees system.



You grew up in Southern California. When you had time away from baseball, what were some of the things you liked to do growing up there?

Hayden Merda: I was big into surfing, riding bikes with my buddies, just going on hikes and doing all that outdoorsy stuff.

You decided to play college baseball at Division II Asuza Pacific University. What were some of the motivations behind that decision?

HM: Coming out of high school, I had no other options. I was a walk-on at Asuza and then redshirted in 2019. COVID hit in 2020. I got a couple of innings my junior year in 2021 and then my senior year in 2022 took off from there.

What makes Division II baseball unique and how do you think that experience shaped you?

HM: I think Division-II is unique because coaches look for guys that can develop and not guys that can play right away. So that was where I set myself apart. I was there to develop and get better, and as time went on I improved a lot.

What did you love about the Asuza program and what were they able to give you as a pitcher?

HM: I think they gave me some good lessons for how to compete. I had to work my way into innings. Nothing was given to me, so I really had to earn the ball every time I went out there and that was something I took away from it.

Having the perspective of being someone that didn't have any offers going into college, being a walk-on, what advice can you give to teammates when things aren't going their way to help with maintain confidence?

HM: You never know what's going to turn your way and what is going to be on the other side of that stone. So you just got to keep going and believe in yourself.

You were drafted by the Yankees after your redshirt junior season in 2022. What did that mean to you to get that opportunity in pro baseball?

HM: It was really cool. I had no idea it was coming. I went to a workout a week before the draft. They were there for Eric Reyzelman, and I just happened to be throwing right after him. They liked what they saw and picked me up.

After being a reliever primarily in college, you made the transition to a starting role in your first pro season in 2023. How did get yourself ready for that?

HM: My first season was diabolical. I had no idea what starting was going to be like. I tried to learn from Drew Thorpe and some of my other buddies on the team, and I just couldn't figure it out.



You missed all of 2024 with injury. What did you find yourself doing during that time you wouldn't have had otherwise away from the field?

HM: I got the chance to rehab with a bunch of longtime big leaguers at home. Asking the right questions, picking their brains, and just learning from those guys was extremely beneficial for me. It helped set me up for this season.

What would be your advice to a guy that goes through a season-long rehab to help them prepare for game action?

HM: You have to learn from the pain and learn from the experiences. You got to grow from it. It might set you back, but you just got to keep on pushing and one day you'll watch yourself start to feel better.

Where have you felt like that year off helped you coming into 2025?

HM: I think leaving 2023 hurt, I knew had something to prove in 2025. I think that's where I had the shift. Trying to prove something and letting everyone know that I'm out here and I still got it.

How nice has it been to be back in the bullpen? That's a familiar role for you, so how much are you enjoying hanging out with the relievers during games?

HM: Those are my boys. I missed that camraraderie in the bullpen. It's been a lot of fun every game.

What's the best part of being in this clubhouse and the chemistry you guys have built in the bullpen?

HM: We have fun. We keep it loose. I love it.

What do you think has been the biggest contributor to your success this season, returning to that reliever role?

HM: I've just shifted my mindset. Coming out and doing it right. I'm not wasting time. I've changed my process and I make sure that I'm doing the small things the right way.

What do you think pitching coach Demetre Kokoris has done for you this season?

HM: Demetre and I go back a little while actually. He turned me down at Point Loma Nazarane actually coming out of high school. So when I ran into him the first day here, I brought that up and he said, oh my gosh, I totally remember you. He's been great. He really pushes you to stick to the process. Do what you know how to do and do it well.

Renegades pitcher Matt Keating is still new to the art of pitching. This season marks just his third as a full-time pitcher in his baseball career. Following a successful campaign as a two-way player in junior college and at USC, Keating made the transition as a professional to a full-time relief pitcher role. The learning process is constantly evolving.

"I feel like as I've pitched more and more, I feel like the less I know," Keating said. "This is a great place for me, especially with the Yankees. The pitching department is unbelievable, and they've been so good about answering all the questions I have. The more I ask, the more I realize I don't know. But I'm excited to keep working with them and continue to keep growing."

In 2021, Keating began his college journey in his hometown of Omaha, Nebraska at Southeast Community College. Keating was a star two-way player, particularly exceling at the plate. As a freshman, he hit .404 with a school-record 19 home runs. In 16 innings on the mound, Keating struck out a whopping 33 batters and had a 0.56 ERA.

The following season, Keating went to Southern California to join the Trojans and spent most of his time on the mound. He continued to display high strikeout rates, punching out over 13 batters per nine innings while earning seven saves. The pitching success caught the eye of the Yankees in the summer of 2022, who selected him in the ninth round.

When Keating arrived in Tampa, the organization informed him he would become a full-time pitcher. This wasn't easy for Keating at first, but he quickly realized this was a path to a pro career.

"It was pretty tough to let go of the hitting side," Keating said. "But I had always told myself, if I get an opportunity to get paid to play, I'd be willing to let that piece of me go. Like I said, there is so much to learn that I'm always occupied trying to fine tune my craft that I really don't think about it that much anymore."

As Keating prepared for his first pro season in 2023, he spent a lot of time adapting his craft to the points of emphasis in the Yankees pitching department.

"Obviously the Yankees love velocity, so finding a way to do that has probably been a three-year process to where we're at now," Keating said. "I still feel like I'm trying to address that. We've added a couple of pitches along the way, kind of understanding how certain pitches play better to certain hands, and kind of optimizing my usage of each pitch so that it puts me in the best position to get outs."

After making 40 appearances in his pro debut with Single-A Tampa in 2023, Keating followed that up with another season of 40 appearances with Hudson Valley in High-A. Despite limited experience previously as a pitcher, Keating quickly became a workhorse in the bullpen. As Keating watches others grapple with long-term injuries, his durability to this point is something he has become very grateful for.

"I've been very blessed to have been healthy the last two years," Keating said. "And I think a large part of that is my daily routine after throwing in a game or just playing catch. I make sure to get my arm care in, using full prep time before I start playing catch. I think that's been what has really helped me stay healthy."

Now 24 years old, it's been four years since Keating's standout season at the plate for Southeast Community College. That doesn't mean his hitting background can't help his work on the mound. Having seen the other side of the matchup between batter and pitcher, Keating has key information that helps him attack hitters.

"Understanding hitter's approaches as a pitcher helps you kind of formulate your own plan," Keating said. "Understanding this is a pitch that is in the zone the majority of the time, this is a pitch that I get more swing and miss on, so I'll throw more of that with two strikes. I think that's really helpful coming from a hitter's perspective."

In his second season with the Renegades, Keating is part of a pitching staff that at one point featured six Yankees Top 30 prospects. Keating has relished backing up a star-studded rotation that has been consistently throwing deep into games.

"It's so much fun to watch," Keating said. "I've never seen or been part of a team that has a pitching staff as talented as we have right now. I think just appreciating that you are a part of something that is much greater than just one individual has been a blessing in of itself. And learning from those guys has been fantastic."

Keating was part of a bullpen that had the second-best ERA in minor league baseball during 2024. With a number of returners and key additions this season, the unit has picked up right where they left off. The bonds Keating has developed with his fellow bullpen arms mean so much.

"The people who are around you is everything, especially in the minor leagues," Keating said. "I've been so blessed with the teammates I've had and the guys I've gotten to spend time with in the bullpen. Not to mention the information that each person has and they can offer you. It's awesome to pick their brain. It's not all business out there. We have a really good time. I've been very fortunate."



Cooper, 42, begins his first season as the manager of the Renegades in 2025, and his third season overall as a minor league manager in the Yankees organization. He spent the 2024 season as the skipper for the Single-A Tampa Tarpons of the Florida State League, and managed the FCL Yankees in 2023, where he was named Florida Complex League Manager of the Year. Under his guidance, the Tarpons led the FSL in Stolen Bases (242) ranked second in AVG (.239), Hits (982) and Doubles (204), and fourth in OPS (.701). That came on the heels of his FCL team pacing its league in runs, hits, triples, RBIs, AVG, OBP, SLG and OPS in 2023.

Before managing in the Yankees system he was a defensive coach for one season with the FCL Yankees, where he won the FCL Championship in 2022 as part of a coaching staff that featured 2023 Renegades manager Sergio Santos, current Yankees Assistant Pitching Coach Preston Claiborne, and 2024 Renegades hitting coach Rick Guarno.

Before joining the Yankees, Cooper previously served as the head baseball coach at Grambling State University for 12 seasons from 2010 through 2021. He led the Tigers to the 2010 Southwestern Athletic Conference championship, and was named SWAC Head Coach of the Year in 2010 and 2017. He led the team to the SWAC Tournament 10 of the 11 years it was held in his tenure, and finished in the top two teams in the SWAC West Division in each of his final five full seasons at the helm.




