LET'S GET IT ROLLING: The fourth season of Fredericksburg Nationals baseball has arrived. The FredNats will open the 2024 Carolina League campaign at home at Virginia Credit Union Stadium in the Single-A version of the Beltway Series against the Baltimore Oriole-affiliated Delmarva Shorebirds. Tonight marks the fourth baseball season for the franchise in Fredericksburg. Since moving down I-95 from Potomac, the FredNats are 185-196 and 104-87 at home. The team captured the second half championship in the Carolina League North in 2022, and will look to win the franchise's first Mills Cup in 10 seasons. Flamethrowing righty Jarlin Susana gets the Opening Night start for Fredericksburg, and this will be the third season the 20-year-old has appeared in Fredericksburg. Ranked as the Nationals' No. 10 overall prospect by MLB Pipeline, Susana joined the team in August 2022 when he was part of the Juan Soto trade with the San Diego Padres. He spent his entire 2023 season here, and gets the Opening Night Start tonight.

EXPERIENCED BUNCH: 24 of the 29 players on the FredNats Opening Day roster have appeared in at least one game for Fredericksburg in the past, including every member of the pitching staff.

FAMILIAR FOE: For the third time in the four years of the team being in Fredericksburg, the opponent weekend opponent is the Delmarva Shorebirds. Fredericksburg went 14-9 last year against the Shorebirds, 17-7 in 2022, and 11-25 in the inaugural season in 2021, which adds up to a 42-41 record for the FredNats against Delmarva since the move to Fredericksburg in 2020. Delmarva swept Fredericksburg on Opening Weekend in 2021, and the FredNats took two out of three games from Delmarva on Opening Weekend 2022 in Salisbury, MD.

PROSPECTS IN THE 'BURG: Three of the Nationals' Top-30 prospects will begin the season with Fredericksburg, and all three spent time with the FredNats in 2023, and all three of those prospects are ranked in the Top-10 in the system. Elijah Green is ranked as the 6th-best prospect in the system according to MLB Pipeline, Cristhian Vaquero is the 9th-best, and Jarlin Susana is the 10th ranked prospect. All three are also in the Top-10 in the Baseball America prospect rankings.

THE SKIP IS BACK: The FredNats' leader from the last two seasons returns to the Managerial role for 2024. Jake Lowery is back for another year in the 'Burg Lowery, 34, was selected by Cleveland in the fourth round of the 2011 Draft out of James Madison University, where he was given the Johnny Bench Award as the nation's top collegiate catcher. The Midlothian, Virginia native played in the Nationals organization from 2016 to 2019, including parts of two seasons with the Potomac Nationals. Lowery reached the Triple-A level in 2018 and transitioned to a managerial role in 2021 after nine seasons in the minor leagues. Lowery is the 28th manager in franchise history dating back to 1978. Lowery is 141-120 in his two years as Manager in Fredericksburg, including the 2022 Carolina League playoffs.

THE STAFF: The majority of the 2023 coaching staff returns for 2024, with the lone exception being Hitting Coach Mike Habas. Pitching Coach Justin Lord, Development Coach Carmelo Jaime, Performance Analyst Josh Freligh, Strength & Conditioning Nathan Sier and Athletic Trainer Jake Meyer are all back from last year's staff. Lord, 44, will begin his fourth season coaching in the Washington organization. He was scheduled to be the FredNats' Pitching Coach in the team's 2020 inaugural season that was ultimately canceled due to Covid, and ended up serving as the Pitching Coach for the Double-A Harrisburg Senators before coming to Fredericksburg in 2023. The Alabama native and Florida State alum pitched six seasons professionally before transitioning to coaching, spending time in the Baltimore organization prior to joining the Nationals.

Habas, 33, begins his first season in the Washington organization after spending the last four seasons coaching in the Milwaukee Brewers organization. He was the hitting coach for the ACL Brewers the last two seasons, and was an Assistant Coach for the independent Gary SouthShore RailCats prior to his time with Milwaukee. While coaching with Gary, he was also the Head Coach at Prairie State College, a Junior College in the Chicago area. He began his playing career in Junior College before transferring to Division II powerhouse North Greenville in Tigerville, S.C., playing two seasons for the Crusaders.

Jaime, 38, was Detroit's 24th round selection in the 2008 Draft out of Miami Dade College. The Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic native reached Double-A in his three-year minor league career, and has served as the first base coach and infield coach with the FredNats the past two seasons, roles he will continue in 2024. Sier begins his second year with the FredNats and Nationals as a whole in 2024 after previous stops at Macomb Community College (Michigan), and ZSP Sports. Freligh will remain in the Performance Analyst role that was created in 2023 after previous stops with the Boston Red Sox and Los Angeles Dodgers. Meyer begins his seventh season with Washington and second in Fredericksburg after he spent his first five seasons with the Nationals at the Spring Training facility in West Palm Beach, FL.

A LASTING LEGACY: The Fredericksburg Nationals adopt the franchise history of their predecessors in the Carolina League dating back to 1978...the Alexandria Dukes (1978, 1980-83) and Alexandria Mariners (1979) played at Four Mile Run Park in Alexandria, Virginia...the Prince William Pirates (1984-1986), Prince William Yankees (1987-1988), Prince William Cannons (1989-1998), Potomac Cannons (1999-2004) and Potomac Nationals (2005-2019) played at G. Richard Pfitzner Stadium in Woodbridge, Virginia...the franchise has won five Mills Cup Championships, as the Dukes in 1982, as the Yankees in 1989, and as the Nationals in 2008, 2010 and 2014.

TONIGHT'S START: Jarlin Susana and his dynamic fastball earned the nod for Opening Night 2024. The big righty features a heater that routinely exceeds triple digits, to go along with a fading changeup and a sharp slider that will touch the low 90's.

EARLY-SEASON HIGHS: After an up-and-down April, Susana really hit his stride going into May. From his start on 5/3 vs Down East, Jarlin was flat out dominant. Over his next eight starts, Susana worked to a 2.35 ERA across 30.2 IP, with opponents hitting a measly .167 against him.

LATE-SEASON LULL: Unfortunately, Susana faltered as the season went on. After the aforementioned eight-start stretch, Jarlin made just four more starts the rest of the season. He struggled with his command, walking 15 batters in 22.2 IP, with an ERA north of 9.00. Susana made his final start of the year on 8/5 against Salem before being placed on the Development List to end his season.
