**CHASED BY THE STORM:** Tuesday's game between the Omaha Storm Chasers and the Louisville Bats was suspended due to rain with one out in the top of the sixth inning with runners on first and third and the Storm Chasers trailing, 3-1. **C MJ Melendez** hit a solo home run in the first inning—his second straight game with a homer—to give Omaha a 1-0 lead, while **LHP Austin Cox** threw 4.0 scoreless innings before allowing the game-tying run in the fifth. Cox threw 5.0 innings, allowing one run on four hits with three strikeouts and three walks. Louisville took the lead prior to the suspension of the game on a two-run homer by Ronnie Dawson. Omaha and Louisville will play Wednesday's regularly-scheduled nine-inning game following the conclusion of Tuesday's suspended game.

**WELCOME BACK TO WERNER PARK:** The Storm Chasers play their first game at Werner Park in 2022, officially opening the franchise's 11th season in Papillion, Neb. Omaha has an all-time record of 369-334 (.520) in games played at Werner Park, including a 6-4 record in home openers. Overall, the Storm Chasers have outscored their opponents 46-31 in the first home game of the season. In 2021, the Storm Chasers defeated the St. Paul Saints, 8-2, on May 4, 2021, a game that included four home runs in the first five innings and 5.1 shutout innings with nine strikeouts from eventual Triple-A East Pitcher of the Year **RHP Jackson Kowar** in his Triple-A debut.

**FEELIN' 2022:** 2022 marks the 11th season of Storm Chasers baseball (2011-pres.) and the 53rd season in franchise history (1969-pres.). Since 1969, 1,316 players have appeared in either an American Association, Pacific Coast League, or Triple-A East game for Omaha. Of those 1,316 players, 988 (75%) have appeared in a Major League game. 312 players in franchise history (24%) made their debut with Omaha prior to their MLB debut, including **INF Bobby Witt Jr.** (Apr. 7 vs. CLE), **RHP Collin Snider** (Apr. 9 vs. CLE), and **INF Lucius Fox** (Apr. 10 vs. NYM), who have each made their Major League debuts in 2022.

**THE MIGHTY THOR:** **Scott Thorman** is in his first season as the manager of the Omaha Storm Chasers, taking over for **Brian Poldberg**, who retired from managing following the 2021 season. Thorman, who played for Omaha in 2009 and 2010, is the 19th manager in franchise history and the sixth Omaha manager to have previously played for the franchise. He has won Minor League titles in each of the last three seasons, winning with Double-A Northwest Arkansas in 2021, High-A Wilmington in 2019, and Low-A Lexington in 2018. Thorman, 40, was drafted by the Atlanta Braves in the first round (30th overall) of the 2000 MLB Draft and later made his Major League debut with Atlanta on June 18, 2006. A Kitchener, Ontario, Canada, native, Thorman began his coaching career in 2014 as the bench coach for the Burlington Royals under manager **Tommy Shields**, who serves as the Storm Chasers' bench coach in 2022.

**FOR OMAHA:** **RHP Jonathan Heasley** gets the start in Wednesday's regularly scheduled game. He made his season debut and Triple-A debut on Thursday, April 7, in Game Two of a doubleheader against Indianapolis, when he allowed one run on two hits in 3.0 innings with four strikeouts and one walk. Heasley posted a 3.33 ERA in 22 games (21 starts) with Double-A Northwest Arkansas last season before making his Major League debut with Kansas City—skipping Triple-A—on Sept. 17, 2021 vs. Seattle. He made three starts for the Royals in 2021, recording a 4.31 ERA in 14.2 innings with six strikeouts and three walks. During 2022 Major League Spring Training, he allowed 10 runs on 12 hits in 8.0 innings for an 11.25 ERA with seven walks and five strikeouts.

**FOR LOUISVILLE:** **RHP Randy Wynne** takes the hill for Louisville in Wednesday's regularly scheduled game. He faced St. Paul on Thursday, April 7, in his 2022 debut, allowing one run on five hits—including one home run—in 5.0 innings with zero walks or strikeouts to help Louisville earn its lone win of the series and season. Wynne spent the entire 2021 season with Double-A Chattanooga, posting a 4.94 ERA across 89.1 innings in 25 outings (14 starts) with 67 strikeouts and 11 walks. Wynne went undrafted out of Missouri Baptist in 2015, pitching for the Birmingham-Bloomfield Beavers in the United Shore Professional Baseball League for two seasons before joining the Evansville Otters in the Frontier League in 2018. He signed with the Reds as a free agent in June of 2019.

### HEASLEY NOTES

- Made Triple-A debut and season debut on 4/7 (2) @ IND, allowing one run on two hits with four strikeouts and one walk
- Made four outings (two starts) during 2022 Major League Spring Training, posting a 11.25 ERA in 8.0 innings, allowing 10 runs on 12 hits (including three home runs) with five strikeouts and seven walks
- Made his Major League debut with Kansas City on Sept. 17, 2021 vs. Seattle, allowing four runs on six hits—including two home runs—with two strikeouts and one hits batter in 4.0 innings
- Upon his MLB debut, became the fifth member of the Royals' 2018 draft class to make a start in 2021, marking the first instance of an organization have five pitchers from the same draft class (Brady Singer, Jackson Kowar, Kris Bubic, Daniel Lynch, Jonathan Heasley) make a start in the same season in MLB history
- Spent all of 2021 with Double-A Northwest Arkansas prior to making his MLB debut, earning a promotion from Double-A and skipping Triple-A Omaha
- Did not allow more than two earned runs in his first five starts with the Naturals, posting a 1.78 ERA in 25.1 innings in May
- Threw a 7.0-inning, complete-game shutout on Aug. 14, 2021 (1) vs. Frisco, striking out five, allowing five hits and vomiting behind the mound before delivering a 3-2 pitch with two outs to record the final out
- Recorded a 1.00 ERA across five starts in August with Northwest Arkansas
- Spent the 2020 season at the Royals' Alternate Site in Kansas City, Kan., and then participated in the organization's postseason camp at Kauffman Stadium
- Earned Lexington Pitcher of the Year honors with the Legends in 2019, ranking third in the South Atlantic League in ERA (3.12) and opponent's batting average (.222) among qualified starters
- Made two starts during the 2019 postseason, allowing three runs across 12.0 combined innings to help lead Legends to South Atlantic League Championship
- Pitched at Oklahoma State University for two seasons (2017-2018), compiling a 5.19 ERA in 118.0 innings with 110 strikeouts and 57 walks
- Was the Cowboys' Opening Day starter in 2018, leading them to a second-place finish in the Big 12
- Earned All-Star honors in football in high school at Prestonwood Christian Academy in Plano, Texas, while also going 29-3 with a 1.47 ERA for the baseball team
