Today's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Yorman Gomez** to the mound today looking to snap a 4G losing streak (last 5G: 8/22-8/27/25). The Indians will counter with RHP **Antwone Kelly**. Columbus is 40-27 (.597) versus right handers this year. Kelly has pitched against the Clippers once in his career, taking the loss on 4/4 in Huntington Park (4.0IP, 10H, 7R, 7ER, 3BB, 2K).

vs. the Indians

Columbus is 7-7 against Indianapolis this year, posting a -13 run margin (9-9, +13 in 2025; 12-5, +45 in 2024; 10-8, -23 in 2023; 12-8, +53 in 2022). Since the start of the 2022 season, the Clippers are 18-9 (.667) in games against Indianapolis that are decided by at least five. Individually, **Bo Naylor** has 4HR and 17RBI in 23G against Indy and **Cooper Ingle** is 17x58 (.293) with 3HR, 9RBI in 17G.

Outliers

The Clippers reached 50 wins last week, having done so with negative differentials in runs (-22; of eight teams with at least 49 wins, only team in the red, all others at least +40 and averaging +53), hits (-17; other seven teams average +41) and homers (-4; other seven at +22). In the second half, Columbus is being outscored 105-89 and outthomered 28-19 (have more hits than the opposition, 173-170).

Series-ous Problem

Last night's loss doomed the Clippers to their second straight series loss (4-0-8 in previous 12) and first at home since 8/19-8/25/25 vs. Omaha (6-0-3 in between). It also marked the first 4G losing streak of the season (last IL team to lose four straight). A loss today would result in a sweep, marking the first sweep loss since 5/26-6/1/25 at Rochester (last sweep loss at home: 6/6-6/10/23 vs. Louisville).

Ingle is Back

Cooper Ingle's two week stint in the Majors (.095/.208/.095 in 7G) dropped him below qualification for rate statistics in the IL this year (debuted as the leader on 6/7). Including a 4x4 (3HR) game on 6/18 vs. Scranton/WB, he has slumped to a line of .241/.328/.491 in his last 28G with Columbus. At catcher, Ingle has a 1.293OPS (11HR) in 31G (.625OPS and 2HR in 24G between DH and LF).

Martinez Rehab

Angel Martinez joined the Clippers on rehab Friday, working his way back from a fractured left foot (out since 6/16). Martinez hit .239/.276/.442 with 11HR and 33RBI in 66G with Cleveland this season, but was just 14x78 (.179) over his last 21G before injury. This marks his second rehab stint with Columbus (4/9-4/17/24 for a bruised right foot, fractured his left wrist during the assignment).

Angel Ascendant

Angel Genao has a 1.137OPS in the last 23G, batting .420 (34x81) while drawing 18BB in 102PA (18%) over that time (11BB in 139PA, 8%, in first 35G with Columbus). Genao has 20 runs in those 23G, collecting 13RBI and 10XBH (.617SLG). Among IL hitters with at least 35PA from the 7th inning on, Genao has the 2nd best OPS (1.210; 1st- **Travis Bazzana**, 12th- **Cooper Ingle**, 14th- **Kody Huff**).

Tough Way to Go

Ralph Velazquez was pulled from Friday's game after 1AB (K), snapping his career best on base streak at 30G (.383OBP, 6/3-7/10). His streak is the 3rd longest in the IL and, from its start, he watched his OBP balloon by 79 points, his average jump 66 points and his SLG climb 137 points (6XBH in first 8G, 1XBH in middle 16G, 4XBH in last 6G). He has hit in 17 of his last 21G (.325, 25x77, 3HR).

Stepping Up

Alfonsin Rosario made his Triple-A debut on Friday (300th career game, played 99G in Double-A), bringing with him 53HR and 50SB in his career. Beginning with consecutive multi-hit games to end May, Rosario hit .331/.399/.676 in his last 36G with Akron, collecting 10HR and 35RBI (led EL in SLG and RBI over that stretch). He swiped a base last night (successful on 14 straight since 9/12/25).

Rare Company

Dating to the nightcap vs. Scranton/WB on 6/19, **Milan Tolentino** is 21x67 (.309) in his last 21G, collecting 11XBH (.574SLG) and 13RBI (was 5x39, .128, in 13G prior). Over his last 14G, Tolentino has drawn 12BB to only 13K (58PA; had 8BB and 42K in previous 33G, 114PA). He played in his 200th game as a Clipper on 7/9 and is one of five with at least 30HR and 30SB (only two are 40-40).

This Date in Clipper History

7/19/1992

Torey Lovullo blasted a 2-run, walk-off HR to give Columbus a 4-2 win over the Richmond Braves. It was the 4th of five straight wins over the 2nd place R-Braves, as the Clippers would embiggen their lead in the IL West to 14 games after the series ended. The '92 Clippers ended up winning the division by 22 games, turning in the highest winning percentage in the IL (.660, 95-49) since 1938 (Newark).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,455 to 1,400).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 137-113 (.548) in pitch reviews, with batters going 71-73 (.493) and pitchers/catchers going 66-40 (.623). They have run out of challenges in 40G and have not challenged in 4G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .571), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 799, would rank as 6th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 115 through the first 94G (on pace for 182SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 31CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 2nd most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (49; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighth's

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 142 runs while crafting a .911OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 75 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +67 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 222-137 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 79 grand slams and 1,961RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.31 through the first 94G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 181HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 7th in the IL this year (.981), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 51G this season (30-21, .588), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the most last at bat wins this year (14, tied with Syracuse) while playing in the 2nd most games decided in the last at bat (25, Memphis has 27). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 98G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-50 (.490, 14th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 436-450 (.492), 406-404 with Columbus (.501).

Injury Delay:

Gomez was slated to make his Triple-A debut during the season-opening series at Iowa, but injured his shoulder in his last preseason bullpen to wind up on the shelf (missed 72G; Clippers went 40-32). He was sent to Arizona at the end of May to rehab, appearing in 4G for the Guardians.

Rocky Start:

When he did make his Triple-A debut, 6/20 vs. Scranton/WB, Gomez was touched for a 2-run homer in the 1st inning, but settled down to retire 10 of the next 12BF (7K). He has not given up a run in the 1st inning since, as the 3rd has been his undoing in his last 2GS (6ER, 2.0IP). While with the AZL Guardians, he gave up 5ER over the course of 4.0IP in the 1st inning and 2ER in 6.1IP thereafter.

Right Stuff:

While in the Rookie League, Gomez mowed down opposing right-handers, racking up 10K against 21BF (48%; 4K to 23BF on the left side, 17%). When they did put the bat on the ball (5x20, .250), righties notched 3XBH (all doubles; .400SLG), compared to .295 (5x17, all singles) from lefties. His strikeout rate in Triple-A is fairly even (12K against 31BF from the left, 38.7%, and 12K vs. 36BF from the right), but right handers are still teeing off when they do connect (5x32, 3HR).

Racking Up Strikeouts:

Since his Triple-A debut on 6/20, Gomez has averaged 13.5K/9IP, good for the best rate in the IL (24K, 16.0IP). In terms sheer numbers, his 24K rank 6th in the IL, trailing teammates **Trenton Denholm** (2nd, 28K) and **Logan Allen** (3rd, 27K). As a team, the Clippers have the 2nd most strikeouts in the league since 6/20 (213K in 22G), trailing Durham by 2K (the Bulls have pitched only 20G).
