RIDERS WIN SERIES IN SAN ANTONIO WITH BIG OFFENSIVE DAY:

The Frisco RoughRiders slugged their way to a 12-2 win over the San Antonio Missions on Sunday afternoon from Nelson W. Wolff Municipal Stadium. **Evan Carter** started the game for the Riders (5-4) with a leadoff home run, his third home run of the season, all of which came in the San Antonio series. Carter finished the day 2-for-3 with a home run, three RBIs and three walks. Later in the inning, Frisco added on when **Diosbel Arias** singled to the Missions (3-6) shortstop **Evan Mendoza** and **Dustin Harris** then came into score on Mendoza's throwing error to make it 2-0. After the Missions scored a run on a sac fly in the bottom of the first, Frisco answered back with three more runs in the second without the aid of a hit. Carter drew a bases-loaded walk before **Luisangel Acuña** and **Thomas Saggese** lifted back-to-back sacrifice flies to push their lead to 5-1. In the third, **Chris Seise** plated a run with an RBI single and **Kellen Strahm** added another with an RBI single of his own in the fourth to move the advantage to 7-1. Harris then crushed a seventh-inning grand slam for his first homer of the season, putting the Riders up 11-1. The Missions answered back with a run on an error in the seventh, but Carter singled home another tally to boost the lead to 12-2. **Nick Starr** (1-1) earned the win out of the bullpen for the Riders, firing two shutout innings with three strikeouts, while Efrain Contreras (0-3) took the loss for San Antonio.

DRIVERS, START YOUR ENGINES:

The RoughRiders have started their offense early and often so far this season. They have score in the first inning in the last four games and in the first or second inning in the last five games in a row. Through nine games, the RoughRiders are outscoring their opponents 9-2 in the first inning and 23-6 over the first two innings. The RoughRiders nine runs in the first inning are third in the Texas League to Arkansas (12) and Wichita (10) while their 23 runs in the first two innings are first in the Texas League. Arkansas is second with 22 runs in the first and second inning.

THIS PEN IS NO BULL...:

To start this season, the RoughRiders bullpen has been brilliant. Through nine games, the Riders have just allowed one home run and own a 1.76 ERA. That is good for first in the Texas League and second in all of Minor League Baseball (Harrisburg, 1.32). Against San Antonio, the Riders pen only ceded three earned runs for a 1.08 ERA in the six games. Six different Frisco relievers have thrown at least two times without allowing a run. Overall, the RoughRiders have a team ERA of 2.62 which is the best in the Texas League (Tulsa is second with a 3.87 ERA) and sixth in all of Minor League Baseball.

RISP-ECT THIS:

In Sunday's 12-2 win, the Riders went 6-for-17 with runners in scoring position. Through nine games, Frisco is fifth in the 10-team Texas League, batting .293 with RISP. Overall, the RoughRiders are hitting .293/.420/.435/.855 in those situations and all in all, they are batting just .232/.342/.342/.684 as a team. With two outs and runners in scoring position, Frisco is slashing .279/.415/.442/.857. As a team, through nine games, Frisco only has 21 extra base hits, which is third-to-last in the Texas League, though they are first with four triples.

DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS:

The RoughRiders have just committed three errors through nine games and committed their first position player error on Sunday. The team's .991 fielding percentage is second in Minor League Baseball (Clearwater, .994).

WALK THIS WAY:

The Riders hitters worked 40 walks in the six games against the San Antonio Missions, which was the sixth-most in the minors last week. On the season, Frisco's 52 walks, tied for seventh in Minor League Baseball (among non-Triple-A teams) while their .356 team OBP is fourth in the Texas League.

I LIKE BIG WINS AND I CANNOT LIE:

The RoughRiders five wins this season have come by eight, six, seven, seven and 10 runs, respectively, while their four losses have come by a combined 11 runs. That gives Frisco a +27 run differential through nine games, which is the best in the Texas League despite being tied with Amarillo (5-4 record, -6 run differential) in first in the South Division. The only team with a +20 run differential in the league is Tulsa, which is 6-3 (+23).

EVAN ALMIGHTY:

Outfielder **Evan Carter** has reached safely in eight of the nine games this season, batting .389 (14-for-44)/.500/.667/1.167 with a double, three home runs, eight walks, 15 RBIs and two stolen bases. Carter is 7th in the Texas League in average (.389), tied for third in hits (14), tied for first in home runs (three), second in RBIs (15) and 5th in OPS (1.167). On Wednesday, Carter crushed a three-run home run and a solo homer for his second two-home run game of his Minor League career before adding another home run on Sunday. The No. 1 prospect in the Rangers system won a MiLB Rawlings Gold Glove in 2022. The reigning Tom Greve Rangers Minor League Player of the Year, Carter joined the RoughRiders for the last week of the 2022 season and the playoffs. Carter is also the second-youngest player in the Texas League this season, trailing on 19-year-old Deyvison De Los Santos of Amarillo.

ABOUT JACK

-Leiter was drafted in the first round (No. 2 overall) in 2021 by the Rangers out of Vanderbilt University. With the Commodores, Leiter was a unanimous First Team All-American and a finalist for both the Golden Spikes Award and the Dick Howser Trophy.

-Threw first regular-season, complete-game no-hitter to start SEC play since 1971 against No.16 South Carolina on March 20th, 2021. He walked the first batter of the game before retiring the last 27 he saw with 16 strikeouts on 124 pitches. Followed up that no-hitter with 7.0 no-hit innings in his next start (20.2 consecutive no-hit innings over three starts from March 20th - April 2nd).

-Drafted in 20th round in 2019 by NYY out of Delbarton School (NJ). Named 2019 New Jersey Gatorade POY, striking out 95 in 57 innings as a senior.

-The family lineage is strong with Jack. His father, Al, pitched in 19 MLB seasons (1987-2005), making two All-Star teams and winning both the 1993 and 1997 World Series. His uncle, Mark, played 11 seasons in the majors (1990-99; 2001) and his cousin, Mark Jr., pitched two seasons (2017-2018) with Philadelphia and Toronto. Al now works as an analyst for MLB Network.

2023 SEASON

-Leiter entered the 2023 season as the No. 78 prospect in baseball according to MLB.com and the No. 5 prospect in the Rangers system.

2022 SEASON

-Leiter entered the 2022 season as the No. 17 prospect in baseball according to MLB.com and the No.1 prospect in the Rangers system.

-Leiter dazzled in his professional debut, striking out seven over his three innings against the Arkansas Travelers on April 9th. The righty helped draw the largest crowd since 2019 at Riders Field for the debut (9,322).

-Threw the Riders first quality start of the season on May 7th against Arkansas. Leiter retired the last 15 batters he saw, allowing just two hits (one in the first and one in the second inning).

-Leiter came out of the bullpen in a "start" to finish a suspended game on May 31st (game was finished on June 1st) and recorded a career-best eight strikeouts against Wichita over 5.2 innings. The game resulted in a 3-0 win for Frisco, the Riders second shutout win of the season to that point.

-The righty allowed just one home run over his first nine outings before allowing two against Amarillo on June 7th. The two home runs were a grand slam and a two-run shot in a 7-4 loss to the Sod Poodles.

-Leiter was placed on the Development List on June 28th and was activated on July 10th before his start against San Antonio.

-Pitched a 1-2-3 inning on nine pitches in The SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game from Dodger Stadium on July 16th.

2021 SEASON

-After being drafted second overall in the 2021 draft, Leiter did not pitch in the minor leagues. Instead, he returned to Vanderbilt to workout, continue college and prepare for 2022. Did not finish degree, but got closer.

-Leiter was high school teammates with Yankees No. 1 prospect (No. 8 in baseball) Anthony Volpe at Delbarton School (NJ).
