ADJUSTING WELLS: After beginning his Double-A career, 1-for-17 in his first 4 games, Austin Wells has adjusted well at the plate. He enters today on a career-best 8-game hit streak, which includes five multi-hit games. Over this streak, Wells is 12-for-35 (.343/.378/.400) with a .778 OPS. Across Wells' 12 hits, only two have gone for extra bases.

ANSWERING THE BELL: Chad Bell's 7th inning grand slam on Friday night served as the game-winning shot in Somerset's 10-8 victory over Reading. Going back to the Patriots' last series vs. the Fightin' Phils (6/28-7/3), Bell has homered in five straight games vs. Reading. Over his last five games vs. Reading, Bell is 9-for-22 with 5 HR, 8 RBl and 7 R. Of Bell's team-lead-tying 13 HR this season, six of them have come against Reading. His grand slam on Friday was his first homer (of six) this season against the Phils that was not a solo HR.

TOP OF THE HEAP: With his game-tying tworun homer in the 8th inning on Saturday night, Anthony Volpe picked up his 38th extra-base hit of the season, tied for the most of any player in the Eastern League.

BULLPEN BE-ĞONE: This weekend, the Patriots had two members of their bullpen transferred to Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. On Sunday, RHP Emmanuel Ramirez earned a promotion after going 3-0 with a 1.59 ERA and 0.62 WHIP in 18 appearances with the Patriots to start this season. Over his last 10 outings (12.1 IP), Ramirez gave up only one hit with no earned runs. On Friday, RHP Carlos Espinal was promoted to Triple-A as well. Across his two separate stints with the Patriots this season, Espinal appeared in 22 games and went 2-0 with a 2.27 ERA. Over his last seven apperances (10 IP), Espinal had a 1.80 ERA.

- Became a starter in 2021, spending the entire season in Hudson Valley and posting a 3-4 record and 5.29 ERA over 23 appearances. His 20 starts, 105 IP and 118 K led the Renegades.
- Worked solely as a reliver in 2019 with Pulaski, making 16 appearances out of the bullpen, tying for 2nd on the team, going 3-2 with a 3.54 ERA, 4 saves and 29 K over 28.0 IP.
- Attended the University of South Carolina-Aiken, where he started out as solely a reliever with all 16 of appearances coming out of the bullpen as a freshman in 2017. After posting a 7.56 ERA that year, Spence became a starter for the final two seasons (2018-19) of his college career, starting 28/31 appearances. He set career-best college marks as a sophomore with a 3.03 ERA and 117 strikeouts
- Born in Kirkland, WA, claims Cary, NC as his hometown. Attended Green Hope High School in Cary, where he became the school's all-time leader in ERA and saves. Avid Carolina Hurricanes fan. Grew up a Seattle Mariners and Seahawks fan, Ken Griffey Jr. his favorite player.

SOMERSET PATRIOTS ACTING MANAGER SERGIO SANTOS | FCL YANKEES MANAGER

BORN: 7/4/83 (39) in Los Angeles, CA | RESIDES: Hacienda Heights, CA Santos is currently in his first season as a coach in the Yankees organization and makes his professional coaching debut as manager of the FCL Yankees in 2022. He previously served as a coach and mentor at the MLB Urban Youth Academy in Compton, CA from 2018-22.

PLAYING CAREER: Santos was selected by Arizona in the first round (27th overall) of the 2002 MLB Draft. Drafted as an infielder, Santos played his first seven pro seasons as a SS (.248 career AVG, 72 HR in 771 MiLB games from '02-'08 between ARI, TOR and MIN organizations). He converted to pitching full-time in 2009, breaking into the big leagues as a reliever. Over parts of six MLB seasons with CWS (2010-11), TOR (2012-14), NYY (2015) and LAD (2015), he went 7-12 with a 3.98 ERA and 227 K in 194 relief appearances.....

COACHING STAFF



DAN FIORITO ★ MANAGER

Born and raised in Yonkers, NY, Dan Fiorito enters his sixth season with the Yankees organization and his first as Somerset's manager. Fiorito is also the Yankees' Roving Upper Level IF/OF Instructor. He served as the manager of High-A Hudson Valley in 2021, after making his managerial debut in 2019 with the GCL Yankees East. Fiorito also had been slated to manage the Yankees' former short-season Single-A affiliate, Staten Island in 2020,

before the minor league season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He served as the defensive coach at the Yankees' former Single-A Charleston affiliate in 2018, after making his professional coaching debut as defensive coach with the Yankees' former Rookie-level Pulaski affiliate in 2017.

His playing career began when he was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent in 2012. Over four seasons as an infielder in the Yankees system, he batted .240 (264-for-1102) with 107 runs, 52 doubles, six triples, seven home runs and 98 RBI in 322 career minor league games. Fiorito played three years at Manhattanville College (Purchase, NY) and is a 2008 graduate of Fordham Prep (Bronx, NY).



GERARDO CASADIEGO ★ PITCHING COACH

Gerardo Casadiego will begin his first season in Somerset and 10th in the Yankees organization. He held the same position in Hudson Valley last season, where the Renegade staff ranked second in the High-A East division in strikeouts (1,308, sixth in MiLB) and third in ERA (4.12). The Venezuela native has also previously served as the pitching coach for former Rookie-level Pulaski (2017-2019), DSL Yankees 1 (2014-2015) and DSL Yankees 2 (2016).

JAKE HIRST ★ HITTING COACH

Jacob Hirst will serve as hitting coach in his first season with Somerset and fourth with the Yankees organization. He was the hitting coach for Hudson Valley in 2021, when the Renegades' batters ranked second among High-A East clubs in triples (33) and OBP (.341), third in doubles (217) and fourth in home runs (156), batting average (.255), slugging percentage (.446) and OPS (.787). The Iowa native served the same role with the GCL Yankees West (2019-2020).



AARON BOSSI ★ DEFENSIVE COACH

Aaron Bossi begins his first season with Somerset after making his coaching debut in the same role with Hudson Valley in 2021. His prior experience for the organization was assisting rehabbing players at the minor league complex from 2017-2019. The St. Louis, MO native was signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Yankees on June 24, 2016 as a catcher/infielder. He played in 22 games for the GCL Yankees East in 2016.
