Today: The Lugnuts and TinCaps play the third game in a six-game series, the Nuts' 15th meeting of the year with the 'Caps. This is also Lansing's ninth game in a 12-game, 13-day trip to conclude the 2021 road schedule. The two ballclubs split a doubleheader to open the series last night, and have now halved their first 14 contests this year.

Yesterday:

Game 1 - Nuts 7, TinCaps 3. Lansing jumped on Fort Wayne's Connor Lehmann for four runs in the 1st inning, added three insurance runs late, and seized the series opener behind 5 1/3 innings from Osvaldo Berrios and quality relief work from Brock Whittlesey.

Game 2 - TinCaps 2, Nuts 1. Frustrated for the majority of the nightcap, the 'Caps received a walk-off two-run single up the middle from Kelvin Alarcon off Charles Hall to spoil Lansing's hopes of a sweep.

On Deck: Following the Sunday conclusion of this series, the Lugnuts return home to Jackson Field to wrap up the 2021 season with a six-game series against archrival West Michigan from Tuesday, September 14, through Sunday, September 19.

What's New in 2021: Entering this season, the Lugnuts' stadium name changed from Cooley Law School Stadium to Jackson® Field™, Lansing moved up to the High-A Central and the ballclub accepted an invitation to affiliate with the A's, the Nuts' fourth MLB partner, following the Royals (1996-98), Cubs (1999-2004) and Blue Jays (2005-2020).

Lug. Notes: Headlines and Points of Interest

Let's Play Just One Today: With yesterday's twinbill, the Lugnuts have played four doubleheaders in their last three series: one at home against West Michigan, two at Dayton to begin this road trip, and then one last night to open this series.

Leading Off With a Bang: Shane Selman's leadoff home run in Game 2 last night was the Lugnuts' second leadoff home run of the year at Fort Wayne, joining Max Schuemann from May 23. Selman's season has taken off with his move to the No. 1 slot in the lineup, where he's slashing .325/.438/.613 in 23 starts, 24 games total, with five home runs. The Lugnuts' record is 13-10 in his starts as the leadoff hitter.

Off the Schneid: Austin Beck went 1-for-2 with a walk in the nightcap yesterday, ending an 0-for-23 slump during this road trip that began after a single in his very first plate appearance at Dayton. Beck is now 2-for-25 in the month of September.

Strong Arms: It has been Lansing's pitching that has largely carried the club during this final stretch, with a 3.02 ERA posted during the eight games played of this road trip, allowing only two home runs and recording 62 strikeouts next to just 17 walks in 56 2/3 innings.

Reid All About it: Starting pitcher Reid Birlingmair ranks third best in the High-A Central with a .233 batting average allowed. The right-hander from UIC has not missed a start all year, making his 20th start of the season tonight. He comes in with four quality starts, tying for the team lead, including one (six innings of one-hit shubut ball) at Fort Wavne.

Tough Actin' Acton: Reliever Garrett Acton had not appeared in a game since August 22 due to dental reasons, but did not miss a beat in his return to the mound against the Dragons, striking out the side in the eighth inning on Friday night and following up with the save in Game 1 on Sunday, recording the final two outs, including a game-ending K. Acton has now whiffed 27 batters (while walking just three) in 14 innings with the Lugnuts after a call-up from Low-A Stockton. In his last 34 innings, spanning two levels and beginning on June 4, Acton has allowed just 14 hits and five runs (1.32 ERA), with 55 strikeouts against only nine walks. Acton was signed as an undrafted free agent in 2020 after serving as a record-breaking closer at the University of Illinois, where he set the school record for saves.

Withers vs. Cancer: Reliever Brandon Withers is working with Vs. Cancer, with an official Pledgelt.org page to raise money to battle against Pediatric Brain Cancer with every strikeout he records in September. So far: two appearances this month, 3 2/3 innings total, 6 strikeouts recorded, including four in 1 2/3 hitless innings in Game 2 on Sunday.

Welcome Aboard: First baseman/outfielder Lawrence Butler was activated from the Injured List over the weekend, with corner infielder/left fielder Jordan Díaz placed on the Injured List. Butler, the Athletics' 2018 sixth-round selection from Westlake High School (Atlanta, Ga.) and Ml.B.com's No. 1 A's first base prospect and No. 22 overall A's prospect, joined the Lugnuts on August 24 from Low-A Stockton, though he was placed on the Injured List on August 25. On Sunday, Butler became the 54th Nut to suit up this season, tying the team record for most players used in a year, and the 858th Lugnuts player all-time. In 88 games in Low-A, he led the Ports in runs (62), hits (88), total bases (167), extra-base hits (41), home runs (17), RBIs (67), walks (55) and stolen bases (26). The 21-year-old Atlanta native was drafted out of Westlake High School in the sixth round in 2018, signing away from a commitment to West Virginia. He delivered two walk-offs for Stockton, including a game-winning RBI single on July 4th. On August 20th, Butler memorably crushed a 482-foot homer vs. Modesto.

Alumni Report: 2019 Lugnuts outfielder Griffin Conine continues to lead the minors in homers, with 36 roundtrippers currently as a member of Miami's system.

TODAY IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2003: Game 1 of the Midwest League Championship Series went to the Lugnuts in ten innings, 7-6, over the Beloit Snappers. Félix Pié went 3-for-5 and scored three runs, including the game-winning run on a one-out Brian Dopirak ground ball knocked down by Snappers third baseman Adam Heether, who threw late to the home plate in an attempt to cut down Pie. The Lugnuts rallied from an early 5-0 deficit.

2011: Down to their last out in Game 2 of the Eastern Division Semifinals against

2011: Down to their last out in Game 2 of the Eastern Division Semifinals against powerful Dayton and untouchable closer Drew Hayes, eighth-place hitter Matt Nuzzo rocked Cooley Law School Stadium and shocked the Midwest League with a two-run game-winning homer. The Dragons' championship dreams ended one day later in a 4-3 loss to the Lugnuts.

New Talent Infusion: The Lugnuts have five 2021 Athletics acquisitions on their roster in infielders Brett Harris (drafted in the 7th round, Gonzaga) and Drew Swift (8th round, Arizona State), outfielder Jonny Butler (14th round, North Carolina State), and pitchers Kyle Virbitsky (17th round, Penn State) and Jack Owen (undrafted free agent, Auburn).

Root, Root for the Home Team: July 4th's Lugnuts/Dragons series finale drew a season-high attendance of 10,109. That's higher than the average attendance in MLB for the Baltimore Orioles, Pittsburgh Pirates, Tampa Bay Rays, Miami Marlins and Oakland Athletics. Only nine of the 119 other Minor League teams have drawn a larger crowd to a game this season: Albuquerque, Nashville, Salt Lake, Charlotte, Fresno, Indianapolis, Round Rock, Durham and Las Vecas.

Pitching is an Art... and So is Sculpting: Blake McFarland, who pitched for the 2012 Lansing Lugnuts, is now a professional sculptor who competed on NBC's reality show "Making It," hosted by Nick Offerman and Amy Poehler, but was eliminated in the fifth episode.

Major League Lugnuts: Six former Nuts have made their Major League debuts this season - pitcher Ty Tice '18 (Toronto, now with Arizona), outfielder Josh Palacios '16-'17 (Toronto), pitcher Tayler Saucedo '16-'17 (Toronto), pitcher Conner Greene '15 (Baltimore), pitcher Kirby Snead '16-'17 (Toronto) and infielder Otto Lopez '19 (Toronto). Tice and Palacios made their first MLB appearance in the same game for the Toronto Blue Jays on April 9th. It was the seventh time in team history that two Lugnuts made their MLB debut in the same game, with the first occurring on September 14, 1998: Carlos Febles and Carlos Beltrán for the Kansas City Royals. Snead most recently debuted, appearing in relief for the Blue Jays on July 28.

Star of Stars: The 2021 MLB All-Star Game MVP Award was won by 2017 Lugnut Vladimir Guerrero, Jr., who went 1-for-3 with two RBIs, including a 468-foot home run, in the American League's 5-2 victory. Fellow 2017 Lugnut Bo Bichette came off the bench for the A.L. as reserve shortstop.

Record-Setting, Single Game, Stolen Bases: On June 15, Max Schuemann broke Samad Taylor's franchise single-game record of four steals in a game (set July 1, 2018) with five stolen bases against the Great Lakes Loons.

Record-Setting, Single Game, Home Runs Allowed: On June 20, Stevie Emanuels broke the franchise single game record, tied many times before, of three homers served up in a game, giving up four HRs to the Loons - two apiece by Deacon Liput and Andy Pages.

Record-Setting, Single Game, HBPs: On July 14, Lansing Lugnuts pitchers hit seven Lake County Captains, breaking the franchise single game record, and the second-highest single game HBP total for a team plunked by one pitching staff behind the 1993 Gulf Coast League Braves, who were hit eight times on June 18, 1993.

Representing His Country: 1B/3B Jordan Díaz played for Colombia in Olympic Baseball Qualifying play, blasting a game-tying home run in the 9th against Venezuela, but Colombia lost all three games in opening pool play and was eliminated. Team USA won the tournament, punching a ticket to Japan.

Front Office Connections: Lugnuts pitching coach Don Schulze was drafted 11th overall by the Chicago Cubs in 1980, 12 picks before Oakland Executive Vice President of Baseball Operations Billy Beane was drafted by the New York Mets. Lugnuts first baseman Patrick McColl set a new Harvard baseball single season record with 70 hits in 2019, breaking the previous record held by Athletics General Manager David Forst.

International Appeal: Seven nations are represented on the Lugnuts' roster: USA, Colombia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Japan, South Africa (Anthony Phillips) and Venezuela (Javier Godard).

Welcome to the Pros: Pitchers Jeff Criswell, Stevie Emanuels, Jack Owen, Kyle Virbitsky and Shohei Tomioka, catchers Jared McDonald, Drew Millas and William Simoneit, infielder Patrick McColl, and outfielder Michael Guldberg have all made their professional debut with the Lugnuts this season.

So Many Starters: The Lugnuts have used 19 different starting pitchers this season, namely Brady Basso, Osvaldo Berrios, Reid Birlingmair, Charlie Cerny, Jeff Criswell, Jack Cushing, David Leal, Stevie Emanuels, Richard Guasch, Jorge Juan, Rafael Kelly, Bryce Nightengale, Jack Owen, Colin Peluse, Leudeny Pineda, Seth Shuman, Shohei Tomioka, Kyle Virbitsky and Brock Whittlesey.

Three Nuts Go to Washington: On July 30, catcher Drew Millas and pitchers Richard Guasch and Seth Shuman were traded by the Athletics to the Washington Nationals in exchange for catcher Yan Gomes and utilityman Josh Harrison.

Personal: Reid's last name is pronounced "BIR-ling-MY-er"... instructor at the K's Training Academy in the offseason, located in Normal, as is college/Lugnuts teammate and best friend Charlie Cerny (pronounced "Cher-nee").

Facing Fort Wayne: Pitched brilliantly May 21 at Parkview Field with six one-hit scoreless innings... did not fare as well on July 30 in Lansing, allowing five walks in 2 1/3 innings in a no-decision... among active TinCaps, Tirso Ornelas (single, double, walk in four plate appearances) has fared best in a limited sample... all told, has limited Fort Wayne to five hits in 26 at-bats with six total walks.

Last Outing: September 3 at Dayton... suffered ninth loss of the year in Lugnuts' 3-2 defeat... gave up one run in the 3rd and two in the 4th in five innings, but struggled with base runners throughout ((five hits, two walks, two HBPs, plus threw two wild pitches)... 87 pitches, 59 strikes.

Professional Career: Made his professional debut in the AZL in 2018 (1.45 ERA, 18 2/3 IP, 5 R, 6 BB, 25 K) before moving up to Vermont on August 8 (2.25 ERA, 5 G, 3 GS, 16.0 IP, 10 BB, 8 K)... spent full 2019 in Beloit (4.02 ERA, 123 IP, 108 H, 50 BB, 120 K), pitching at least six innings in nine games, topping out at 7-IP, 1-R, 8-K on July 24th... faced the Lugnuts once (3 IP, 0 R) on May 4th... had overall numbers skewed by one bad month: 1.46 ERA in 24.2 IP in May, 10.72 ERA in 22.2 IP in June, 2.78 in 35.2 IP in July, 2.36 in 34.1 IP in August.

Draft Day: Selected 833rd overall in the 28th round from the University of Illinois at Chicago (the "Flames") in 2018... signed by Derek Lee... drafted 21 rounds after Charlie Cerny... the 2018 draft was fruitful for the Lugnuts roster, also producing Bryce Nightengale (16th round), Cobie Vance (18th round), Max Schuemann (20th round), Aiden McIntyre (22nd round).

Life as a Flame: Reid struggled as a freshman at the University of Illinois, Chicago (8.81 ERA, 17 G, 3 GS, 31 2/3 IP, 33 R, 24 BB, 27 K, 11 HBP) but bounced back to have a strong sophomore season (3.10, 15 GS, 1 ShO, 93.0 IP, 34 R, 25 BB, 81 K, 5 HBP) and better junior season (2.12, 10 G, 8 GS, 51.0 IP, 12 R, 21 BB, 57 K, 5 HBP), though he missed time from March 23-April 24 with an injury.

Baseball Over Nursing: In an interview with White Cleat Beat, Reid shared that nursing had been his first pursuit, starting with volunteering at OSF St. Joseph Medical Center, Carle BroMenn Medical Center,

and Camp Quality (serving children with cancer and their families). He applied to the nursing school at UIC as a sophomore before turning his attention fully toward baseball, majoring in liberal arts with a minor in psychology.

Major League Standouts: Only three UIC Flames have ever made the Majors, but each one is notable: Pete Mackanin (1973-1981), who managed the Pirates in 2005, the Reds in 2007 and the Phillies in 2015-2017; Ken Holtzman (1965-1979), who threw no-hitters for the Chicago Cubs in 1969 (despite not striking out a batter) and 1971 and was an American League All-Star with the Oakland Athletics' World

Series champions in 1972 and 1973; and three-time All-Star Curtis Granderson (2004-2019), who was taken by Detroit in the third round in 2002 and collected exactly 1800 hits in his 16-year MLB career.

High School Success, On and Off the Field: Pitched and played shortstop at Normal West High School, where he was named 3x 1st Team All-Big 12 and the Big 12 Conference Pitcher of the year as a senior... played second base in the 2015 Illinois Coaches Association (ICA) All-Star Game... member of the National Honor Society and Spanish Honor Society.

A Normal Background Check: Birlingmair's hometown, Normal, was originally named North Bloomington in 1854. The name changed in 1865 to reflect its place as the home of Illinois State Normal University, a teaching school, now called simply Illinois State University. (Teaching schools were known as "normal schools" because their purpose was to instruct the students, future teachers, in properly understanding and instilling the societal norms at the time. Many state schools began as normal schools, like UCLA, which was originally named the Los Angeles California State Normal School.) Normal is the home of the Normal Combelters, a member of the Frontier League from 2010-2018 and now a member of the Prospect League, playing their home games at The Corn Crib.
