HILLCATS ANNOUNCE COACHING STAFF

The Lynchburg Hillcats in conjunction with the Cleveland Guardians are pleased to announce their coaching staff for the 2024 season.

For the second straight season, Jordan Smith will serve as the manager for the ballclub with Tony Arnold returning as pitching coach. Cole Nieto will step in as the hitting coach and Erlin Cerda will be the bench coach. Rounding out the coaching staff are Yuka Ogata as the athletic trainer and Jack Baldwin as the strength and conditioning coach.

Smith served at the helm during the 2023 season, his first as a full-season manager. He led the team to a 67-63 record, while also finishing the second half of the season six games above .500.

"We are excited to welcome Jordan Smith and his family back to Lynchburg for a second season with the Hill-cats," General Manager Matt Ramstead said. "The Smith's have been a great representation of what the organization stands for. Jordan has done an excellent job of connecting with the players and our fans alike."

"We look forward to having Jordan, his wife Ashley, and their two kids back in the ballpark this Spring."

Smith's coaching experience extends from the conclusion of his playing career, of which he spent its entirety in the Cleveland Indians organization. He began coaching in 2019 as the bench coach of the Lake County Captains and would return to that role in 2021.

For the second straight season and fifth time in his career, Tony Arnold will serve as the pitching coach with the Lynchburg Hillcats. This will also be the third straight season that Arnold has worked alongside Smith. Arnold, a former professional with the Baltimore Orioles organization has been coaching in minor league baseball since 1990.

Arnold spent the entirety of his playing career with the Orioles, making the majors in both 1986 and 1987. He would post an ERA of 5.08 in his 38 appearances.

Cole Nieto is a Cleveland-native who spent his collegiate career at Baldwin Wallace University in Berea, Ohio. He was a pure hitter in college, posting a .312 AVG and a SLG of over .900 in his two seasons with the Yellow Jackets. Following his playing career, Nieto would go on to serve as an assistant coach at the University of Dubuque in Iowa.

Nieto spent last season as the hitting coach with the Guardians Dominican Summer League Blue Squad. This will be his first year of full-season Minor League Baseball.

Erlin Cerda returns to Lynchburg as the bench coach after spending a portion of his playing career in the Hill City. Cerda, a native of the Dominican Republic, played a total of 32 games with the Hillcats during the 2018 season. He spent a total of six seasons in the Guardians organization as a player, totaling an average of .252 with an impressive 12 triples.

Cerda spent last season as the bench coach with the Guardians Arizona Complex League affiliate alongside former Lynchburg hitting coach, Craig Massoni.

Also new to the staff this year is Yuka Ogata, who will function as the teams athletic trainer. Last season, they spent time with the Lake County Captains as their athletic trainer.

Ogata graduated from Waseda University in Tokyo, Japan in 2018 before completing their master's degree in Athletic Training from the University of Arkansas.

Rounding out the coaching staff is Jack Baldwin, who will serve as the strength and conditioning coach. This will be Baldwin's first season with the Guardians organization.

The 2024 season is set to begin on April 5th with a trip to North Carolina to take on the Down East Wood Ducks. The Hillcats home opener is scheduled for Tuesday, April 9th against the Fredericksburg Nationals. Tickets are available at Lynchburg-hillcats.com.



PREVIEWING THE 2024 ROSTER

The Lynchburg Hillcats in conjunction with the Cleveland Guardians have announced their Opening Day roster for the 2024 season.

The roster features six players within the Guardians Top 30 list according to MLB Pipeline. In addition, three of which land in the top ten.

The list of players in the top 30 include Ralphy Velazquez, Jaison Chourio, Alex Clemmey, Angel Genao, Jackson Humphries, and Rafael Ramirez Jr.

Velazquez, currently ranked 5th in the organization, comes in as one of the highest touted prospects to start their career in Lynchburg since the Guardians took over. He was the Guardians first round pick (pick 23) in the 2023 MLB Draft and spent the remainder of last season in the Arizona Complex League.

While in the ACL, Velasquez hit .348 with two home runs and eight RBI's. He also finished the year with a 1.132 OPS. Only 19-years-old, Velazquez will focus on transitioning from catcher to first base.

Chourio (ranked 6th) will be returning for his first full season in Lynchburg. He served as a mid-season call-up last year where he struggled at the plate in nine games. However, in his professional career, he has slashed .304/.446/.411.





He is the brother of Jackson Chourio, the Milwaukee Brewers top prospect and the second ranked in all of baseball. His brother, several years older, is slated to make his Major League debut this season. Jaison, a natural outfielder, added significant muscle this past off-season to improve his power numbers.

Alex Clemmey is the highest ranked pitcher on the Hillcats this season (9th). The New England native boasts one of the best fastballs in Minor League Baseball, and an equally impressive curveball. His 70-grade fastball tops out at 99 MPH which he partners with a 60-grade curveball and 50-grade slider.

Clemmey was drafted in the second round of the 2023 MLB Draft and is slated to make his professional debut this season. MLB Pipeline lists him as a potential frontline starter.

Angel Genao returns for a second full season in Lynchburg. He was originally called up mid-season in 2022 before spending all of last year in the Hill City. Genao, ranked 12th according to MLB Pipeline, was a versatile infielder who excelled at the plate while growing into a defensive menace.

Genao missed the first few months of last season due to a knee injury. At only 19-years-old, he shows plenty of upside to be a staple in the Hillcats lineup this season.


Jackson Humphries is the second highly graded pitcher on the staff this season. At 19-years-old, Humphries slots in at 14th in the top prospects list. His fastball, curveball, and slider all rate as plus pitches (55-grade) and improved command helped him succeed last season.

He spent most of last season in Arizona but did make six starts for the Hillcats a year ago. The left-hander finished the season in Lynchburg 0-1 with a 5.32 ERA and 24 strikeouts.

The final member of the Guardians Top 30 list is Rafael Ramirez Jr. (24th). Ramirez, the son of a former all-star shortstop by the same name, is arguably the most physical of the infielders in the Guardians system. According to MLB Pipeline, he plays roughly 15-pounds above his listed weight and has the power to slug for 15-20 home runs a season.

Last season in the ACL, Ramirez showed discipline at the plate, finishing second in walks (50) and seventh in on-base percentage (.453). The 18-year-old was born in New Jersey but grew up in the Dominican Republic.

Beyond the Top 30 list, Lynchburg boasts a strong number of returning players from last season. Of the 29-man roster, 17 players spent time in a Hillcats uniform a year ago. A few notable returners include Manuel Mejias, Juan Benjamin, Wuilfredo Antunez, Yorman Gomez, Alonzo Richardson, Jack Jasiak, and Wardquelin Vasquez.

Through these teams, he created opportunities for aspiring players, entertained countless fans, and contributed to the growth and development of the sport. He was inducted into the Pacific Coast League and Texas League Halls of Fame and was recognized as King of Baseball in 2016.

Beyond his involvement in professional baseball, David Elmore's visionary leadership extended to various sports ventures. Dave Elmore had a passion for hockey, owning the Utah Grizzlies and the Idaho Falls Spud Kings. Dave along with his wife, Donna Tuttle, moved the Grizzlies from Denver to Utah, and aided West Valley City in the development of the Maverik Center in Salt Lake City, a state-of-the-art sports and entertainment arena which hosted the 2002 Winter Olympics. This multi-purpose facility became a hub for sporting events, concerts, and community gatherings, providing an unforgettable experience for attendees and contributing to the local economy.

As we mourn the loss of David Elmore, let us also celebrate his profound contributions to professional baseball, the sports industry, and the Olympic movement. His visionary leadership, unwavering commitment, and entrepreneurial spirit have left an indelible mark, igniting the passion for sports in communities and fostering a legacy of excellence and inclusivity.





Central Virginia FCU NEW SURVEY SHOWS HILLCATS AS ONE OF THE BEST BARGAINS IN BASEBALL

According to a new report released by Minor League Baseball, the Lynchburg Hillcats find themselves as one of the cheapest, fan-friendly options in all of the country.

The report, titled the 2023 Fan Cost Survey published by Minor League Baseball, calculated the average cost of attending a normal game for a family of four. The survey used a formula of two adult tickets, two child tickets, two beers, two sodas, four hot dogs, and parking to calculate what a family could expect to spend when attending the game.

Based on the results, Lynchburg found themselves as one of the cheapest options in all of baseball at an average of \$73.50 for a family of four to attend a game. For comparison, the average across all of MiLB was slightly over \$91. That means, it is nearly \$20 less expensive to attend a game at Bank of the James Stadium than elsewhere in the country.

When compared to the other teams in the Carolina League, the Hillcats still found themselves to be the cheapest and most affordable option.

The Hillcats are proud of the results of the survey, as we strive to provide the best experience for our fans at the cheapest price possible. We look forward to bringing affordable, family fun to our community for years to come.
