**LAST NIGHT:** The Skeeters lost to Oklahoma City 5-4 in 11 innings Monday night at Constellation Field. The Skeeters entered the ninth inning with a 4-2 lead. The Dodgers plated two runs, giving Ronel Blanco his first blown save of the year. Cristian Santana hit an RBI single off Francis Martes in the 11th inning to lead OKC to the win. It was the first game this season that the Skeeters lost when leading through the seventh and eighth innings.

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to their game Monday vs. Baltimore, the Astros recalled RHP Andre Scrubb and optioned IF Taylor Jones to the Skeeters. Scrubb has gone 0-0 with a 1.35 ERA (1 ER/6.2 IP) and seven strikeouts in six relief appearances with the Skeeters. Jones began the Triple A season with the Skeeters and was recalled to the Astros on 5/22, making his second stint with them this season. Jones has hit .174 (8x46) with two doubles and four RBIs in 18 games with the Astros this season. He's hit .356 (16x45) with two home runs and 13 RBIs in 12 games with the Skeeters.

**ENOLI:** Astros right-hander Enoli Paredes is set to begin an MLB Rehab Assignment with the Skeeters on Tuesday. Paredes has been on the 10-Day IL since 6/11 with a right shoulder strain. The 25-year-old has logged a 6.23 ERA (6 ER/8.2 IP) with 15 strikeouts in 12 relief appearances with the Astros this season. He made his Major League debut in '20 and went 3-3 with a 3.05 ERA (7 ER/20.2 IP) in 22 relief outings. He also made seven relief appearances in the '20 MLB Postseason.

JAKE RAKES: Over his last 10 games, Jake Meyers has hit .489 (22x45) with eight home runs and 15 RBIs. He leads the Skeeters with three multi-homer games this season. His 14 home runs lead the Skeeters and are tied for third-most in Triple A West. He's set his career high in home runs, surpassing his previous mark of nine homers from '19 with Fayetteville (A+) and Corpus Christi (AA). Meyers is also fifth in Triple A West with a 1.020 OPS and eighth with a .327 average.

**ON THE OFFENSIVE:** The Skeeters have scored a combined 57 runs over their last eight games, also collecting 104 hits. The Skeeters have hit a combined .337 (104x309) over the last eight games.

**CRUZIN'**: Bryan De La Cruz logged his second multi-homer game of the season on 6/20 ELP. He also recorded his 19th multi-hit game of the season Friday (2x4), which leads the Skeeters. De La Cruz has hit .351 (20x57) with two home runs and 12 RBIs over his last 13 games. He's third in Triple A West hits (58) and tied for fourth in runs (35).

**HINA'HERO':** CJ Hinojosa snapped an 11-game hitting streak in Friday's loss and has hit .381 (24x63) with a home run and nine RBIs over his last 15 games. . Bryan De La Cruz has the longest Skeeters hitting streak this season (15 G). Hinojosa is tied for fifth in Triple A West with 14 doubles.

**SUPER 'SIRI'OUS:** Jose Siri has three home runs over his last eight games and has hit .400 (12x30) with seven RBIs over that stretch. Siri is fifth in Triple A West with 39 RBIs. He's collected four-or-more RBIs in five games this season to lead the Skeeters (no other player has recorded more than one of such games). Siri is also tied for third in Triple A West with 10 stolen bases.

**REHAB STINTS:** RHPs Bryan Abreu and Austin Pruitt began rehab assignments with the Skeeters this homestand. Abreu threw a scoreless inning, striking out two, in Saturday's win. Pruitt got the start Sunday and threw a planned 23 pitches through 1/3 of an inning. Abreu (left calf strain) was placed on the IL on 5/29 and Pruitt on 3/29 (right elbow surgery). Pruitt has not pitched at the MLB level this season while Abreu has gone 2-3 with a 4.21 ERA (12 ER/25.2) in 21 games with the Astros in '21.

**GEAUX PAPPY:** Michael Papierski ranks sixth in Triple A West with a .428 on-base percentage. The LSU alum has reached safely in 11 straight games. He's also amidst an eight-game hitting streak and has hit .414 (12x29) with a home run and nine RBIs over that stretch.

**K-MART:** Seth Martinez is second of Triple A West relievers with 38 strikeouts and is fifth with 25.1 IP

**OH SO SWEET:** The Skeeters are tied for second in all of non-complex Minor League Baseball teams with a .287 average.

FANTASTIC FOURS: A Skeeters player has recorded a four-hit game in four of their last eight games. The Skeeters had not had a four-hit game prior to their 24-15 win on 6/20 in El Paso. Jake Meyers went 4-for-5 on Saturday and Bryan De La Cruz went 4-for-5 with two doubles and two RBIs on Tuesday. Michael Papierski (4x6) and JJ Matijevic (4x5) collected their four-hit games in Monday's win. CJ Hinojosa (4x6) and Meyers (4x5) recorded the first two four-hit games for the Skeeters this season in Sunday's win.

**TRIPLE A WEST, EAST LEADERS:** The Skeeters are in first place in Triple A West, ahead of Round Rock by a half-game. The Skeeters have remained in first place since their win on 6/18 at El Paso

**ROAD TRIP:** The Skeeters went 4-2 on their six-game road trip in El Paso. The Skeeters have won nine of 11 games against the Chihuahuas this season. The Skeeters scored 10-or-more runs in three of the six games, including a franchise-record 24 runs on 6/20. The Skeeters have won two-of-four road series this season.

**BLUE ON BLUE:** Oklahoma City is making its first-ever trip to Constellation Field in Sugar Land. The Skeeters traveled to Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark in Oklahoma City from June 3-8, with OKC winning the series, 4-2.

**RECORD NIGHT:** The Skeeters set the following franchise records in Sunday's win, including their time from 2012-19 as an independent team in the Atlantic League of Professional Baseball:

- 24 runs scored was a single-game record ... Surpassed previous record of 18 runs (accomplished twice
  and last done on September 9, 2016 vs. the Southern Maryland Blue Crabs ... Most from a Triple A team
  this season and tied for second-most from any MiLB team
- 7 home runs were a single-game record ... Surpassed previous high of six home runs from July 2, 2019
  vs. the Long Island Ducks ... Tied for the most from a Triple A team this season and tied for second-most
  in all of MiLB
- 23 hits were a single-game record ... Surpassed the previous record of 22 hits on September 9, 2016, vs. the Southern Maryland Blue Crabs ... Second-most from a Triple A team this season
- Jake Meyers became the first player in Skeeters history to hit three home runs in a game
- 12 extra-base hits matched Skeeters single-game record set on September 9, 2016, and are the most from a Triple A team this season and tied for second-most of all MiLB teams
- 50 total bases is a franchise record ... Surpassed previous high of 37 from July 2, 2019 ... Most from a MiLB team this season

**ROAD TRIP:** The Skeeters went 4-2 on their six-game road trip in El Paso. The Skeeters have won nine of 11 games against the Chihuahuas this season. The Skeeters scored 10-or-more runs in three of the six games, including a franchise-record 24 runs on 6/20. The Skeeters have won two-of-four road series this season.

**MiLB HONORS:** RHP Brett Conine was named the Triple A West Pitcher of the Month for May by Minor League Baseball. Conine went 4-0 with a 0.95 ERA (2 ER/19 IP) through four games (three starts) in May. He recorded the lowest ERA in Triple A West and led the league in wins, opponent batting average (.167) and WHIP (0.95) at the end of the month.

**CLOSE TO HOME:** Based on approximate mileage, the Skeeters are located second-closest to the stadium of their parent club out of Triple A teams. The St. Paul Saints are located approximately 11 miles from Minnesota's Target Field.

**PUT IT ON THE MANTEL: Ronnie Dawson**, **Alex De Goti** and **Peter Solomon** each made their Major League debuts with the Astros this season. Dawson went 1x5 with a run through 3 G, De Goti went 2x6 with a run and RBI through 6 G and Solomon tossed a scoreless 2 IP in relief, allowing just one hit and striking out two. **Ralph Garza Jr.** recieved his first promotion to the Major Leagues on May 26. He made his Major League debut on May 29 vs. San Diego and threw an inning of relief.

**FRANCHISE RECORD:** Jose Siri drove in seven runs on May 13 at Round Rock, setting the Skeeters franchise record, including their n--ine seasons as an independent franchise. Siri accomplished the feat with a grand slam and three-run double. Five players in Skeeters history had recorded six RBIs in a single game. The seven RBIs are tied for the second-most in a game this season of Triple A players.

**NOW HERE'S A STOREY: Mickey Storey** is entering his third year as the manager of the Astros Triple A affiliate. He led Round Rock to the best record in Triple A in 2019 (84-56) and to the Pacific Coast League Finals. Storey got his first managerial job in the Astros system in 2018 with Class A Quad Cities, winning the Western Division of the Midwest League. Storey appeared at the MLB level with the Astros in 2012 and the Blue Jays in 2013 as a right-handed pitcher. He still holds numerous career pitching records for Florida Atlantic University. He finished his career second all-time in strikeouts, tied for second in wins and finished top 10 in strikeouts per nine innings, games started, fewest walks per nine innings and innings pitched. Storey

**REST OF THE CREW:** Joining Mickey Storey on his staff are pitching coach Erick Abreu, hitting coach Ben Rosenthal and development coach Sean Connole. John Gregorich and A.J. Smith are the Skeeters' athletic trainers and Hazael Wessin is the team's strength and conditioning coach. Abreu is in his eighth season with the Astros organization and his first as the organization's Triple A pitching coach. Rosenthal is in his fifth season with the Astros and third as the hitting coach for their Triple A affiliate. Connole is is in his second season with the Astros and his first as the development coach for the team's Triple A affiliate.

A LITTLE ABOUT US: Through their first nine seasons, the Skeeters played in the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. They won the Atlantic League Championship in '16 and '18 and appeared in the post-season in five of nine seasons. The Skeeters still hold the Atlantic League single-season record for wins (95) and winning percentage (.679) from their '13 season. The Skeeters have been managed by former Major Leaguers Gary Gaetti (2012-17) and Pete Incaviglia (2018-20). As an independent team, the Skeeters went 601-502. Notable people to appear for the Skeeters include: LHP Scott Kazmir, RHP Roger Clemens, IF Rafael Palmeiro, Tracy McGrady, IF James Loney, C Derek Norris, OF Willy Taveras and RHP Felipe Paulino
