YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels extended their winning streak to seven games, beating the Curve, 9-8, in 10 innings. Richmond took a 2-0 lead in the first with a run scoring on an error and an RBI groundout by **Bo Davidson**. In the third, Davidson added a sacrifice fly for a 3-0 lead. The Curve got a run in the fourth before an RBI groundout by **Adrian Sugastey** and an RBI sacrifice bunt by **Jonah Cox**. In the sixth, the Curve scored four runs to tie the score, capped with a three-run double by Omar Alfonso. **Charlie Szykowny** hit an RBI double in the seventh to break the tie before the Curve evened the score with a bases-loaded walk by P.J. Hilson in the eighth. Derek Berg hit a two-run single in the top of the 10th for an 8-6 Altoona lead. In the bottom of the 10th, **Sabin Ceballos** drove a pinch-hit, RBI double, Cox tied the game with an RBI single and **Dayson Croes** grounded into a fielder's choice to plate the walk-off-winning run.

WELCOME TO CARMAX PARK: This week marks the inaugural series at CarMax Park, the Flying Squirrels' new home stadium. A groundbreaking ceremony was held on September 6, 2024. The announcement of the name, "CarMax Park," was held on September 4, 2024, at the The ballpark is situated next to The Diamond, which was home to the Flying Squirrels from 2010-2025 and hosted Minor League Baseball in Richmond dating back to 1985. Professional baseball was played in that spot dating back to 1954 with the opening of Parker Field. CarMax Park can house nearly 10,000 fans and will serve as a year-round events venue for the Richmond region.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the finale of a six-game series against the Altoona Curve, Double-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates, in the first home series of the 2026 season. The Flying Squirrels are looking to extend their winning streak to eight games. The 7-1 start matches the team's best record through eight games in franchise history, even with 2021. A win tonight would match the 2021 season as the best start through nine games with a 8-1 record. That same stretch from May 5-13 is also the team record for the longest win streak in franchise history at eight. The Curve are looking for their first win of 2026.

STARTING STRONG: The Flying Squirrels' 7-1 start matches the team's best record through eight games in franchise history, even with 2021. A win today would match the 2021 season as the best start through nine games with a 8-1 record. That year, the Flying Squirrels lost their season opener before winning eight straight from May 5-13.

LUCKY SEVEN: The Flying Squirrels' seven-game win streak is tied for the second-longest in franchise history, even with April 27-May 3, 2010, June 20-26, 2024, April 28-May 5, 2022 and September 2-9, 2023. The only longer win streak was a run of eight consecutive games from May 5-13, also beginning with the second game of the season. In the seven wins of the current streak, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in five of them. In four of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. Last Saturday, they scored two in the ninth for an 11-9 win at Erie. In Tuesday's home opener, they never trailed but jumped ahead in the bottom of the eighth for a 3-2 win over the Curve. On Thursday, they scored two in the eighth for another 3-2 win against Altoona. On Saturday, the Curve scored two in the top of the 10th before the Flying Squirrels walked off with three in the bottom of the 10th.

MEET THE TEAM: This year's season-opening Flying Squirrels roster including 19 players who have previously played in Richmond. There are nine players who have made their Richmond debuts this season, including **Maui Ahuna**, **Charlie Szykowny**, **Mitch White**, **Darien Smith**, **Greg Farone**, **Logan Martin**, **Cesar Perdomo** and **Dylan Carmouche**. Each of the newcomers also made their Double-A debuts this season. Of the 28 players, 11 were acquired by the Giants in the MLB Draft, five were signed by the Giants as international free agents, five were signed by the Giants from independent teams, four were acquired via trade and three were signed as non-drafted free agents.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS went 56-79-1 in 2025, which was sixth in the Eastern League Southwest Division. They went 21-46-1 in the first half before posting a 35-33 record in the second half, finishing 3.5 games out of first place in the division. This year, they opened the season taking two-of-three on the road against Erie last weekend. This year, the Richmond offense leads Double-A win batting average (.300) and runs (61) and also leads the Eastern League in hits (83), total bases (124), OBP (.401) and OPS (.849).

THE CURVE are the only team in MiLB without a win this season. Altoona had the third-best record in the Southwest Division last season, going 69-68. They went 30-38 in the first half, which was fifth in the division. In the second half, Altoona finished 39-30 in a tie for first place in the division and clinched the second-half's postseason spot, earning a playoff berth for the first time since 2018. The Curve opened this season being swept at home in three games by Harrisburg last weekend. This year's Altoona roster features three players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Pirates prospects list, including C Omar Alfonso (No. 13), RHP Christian Curtis (No. 15) and 2B Duce Gourson (No. 21). MLB.com's top-30 Pirates prospects list features four Altoona players, including Alfonso (No. 15), Curtis (No. 22), Gourson (No. 27) and 1B Callan Moss (No. 29).

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander **Darien Smith** makes his first Double-A start. He made his Double-A debut in a relief outing on Tuesday night in the Flying Squirrels' inaugural game at CarMax Park and picked up a win, allowing one run over four innings. Smith pitched collegiately at Jacksonville University (2019), JUCO Eastern Florida State College (2020-21), Florida Gulf Coast (2022) and NAIA Southeastern (2023-24). At Southeastern in 2024, he was named the ABCA/Rawlings NAIA Pitcher of the Year, going 12-0 with a 1.87 ERA in 17 games (16 starts). Smith signed with the Giants as a non-drafted free agent that summer. In his first professional season in 2025, Smith went 8-0 with a 1.91 ERA in 20 outings (three starts). **For more on Smith, see page two.**

FOR ALTOONA: Left-hander Dominic Perachi makes his second start of the season in his third season with the Curve. On Tuesday in the first game of the series, Perachi allowed two runs over five innings in a no-decision. Last year, he made eight Double-A appearances and went 3-1 with a 4.49 ERA. He also worked rehab outings with three Pirates affiliates. Perachi has made five previous starts against the Flying Squirrels, going 2-0 with a 5.11 ERA (14 ER/24.2 IP). Perachi signed with the Pirates as a non-drafted free agent in 2022. He pitched for the Salt River Ratters of the Arizona Fall League after the 2025 season.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan**, **Onil Perez** and **Drew Cavanaugh** combined to catch 74 stolen base attempts last season, which ranked first among the 30 Double-A teams and led the Eastern League by 20 over Hartford (54). Sugastey led all Double-A catchers with 50 runners caught stealing. He set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing Jackson Williams' mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 66 runners caught stealing is the most in franchise history, passing Williams' (2010-11, '15) previous mark of 59.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 267 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PACKING THE HOUSE: In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. Tuesday's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels. This season, the Flying Squirrels lead all 120 MiLB teams in average attendance (8,271).

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Drew Cavanaugh** is first in SLG (.889), first in OPS (1.489), tied for first in doubles (5), second in runs (8), tied for second in extra-base hits (6), third in OBP (.600) and fourth in batting average (.444). **Jonah Cox** is tied for third in stolen bases (6) and tied for sixth in RBIs (8). **Turner Hill** is first in runs (10), tied for first in triples (2) and tied for sixth in RBIs (8). **Dayson Croes** is second in hits (12). **Charlie Szykowny** is tied for second in runs (8). **Greg Farone** is fifth in strikeouts (13), sixth in WHIP (0.89) and 10th in ERA (2.00). **Jack Choate** is tied for first in wins (2). **Joe Whitman** is tied for sixth in strikeouts (12). **Tyler Vogel** is tied for first in saves (2) and tied for first in games pitched (4).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features three players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 24) and **Joe Whitman** (No. 25). **Adrián Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization and **Jonah Cox** is rated as the top defensive outfielder. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 7), **Maui Ahuna** (No. 20) and Whitman (No. 26).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1957: The Boston Red Sox beat the Philadelphia Phillies, 5-2, in an exhibition at Parker Field. Robin Roberts started for the Phillies and allowed two runs on two hits through seven innings. Richmond native Granny Hamner, who had been an All-Star shortstop in the early-50s, was being tried as a knuckleball pitcher. He entered in the eighth and allowed three runs. Ted Williams went 0-for-2 before leaving early, but did stop to sign autographs. **1958:** The Richmond Virginians beat the Boston Red Sox, 11-7, at Parker Field. After falling behind, 5-0, Richmond scored six unearned runs in the second inning. Ted Williams belted a pinch-hit home run in the eighth inning in his only plate appearance of the game. **1964:** The Richmond Virginians beat the New York Yankees, 3-2, at Parker Field. Horace Clarke hit a go-ahead single in the eighth. Mel Allen and Phil Rizzuto broadcast the game. **1987:** Tom Glavine picked up first Triple-A win, beating Syracuse, 6-2, at The Diamond. Glavine, who was 21 years old at the time, threw seven innings and allowed two runs.
