TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes evened the series at a game apiece yesterday with a 14-12 triumph over Tacoma ... The win ended Albuquerque's three-game skid ... Noah Davis is expected to take the hill for the Isotopes while Jhonathan Diaz is slated to start for Tacoma.

DOUBLE-DIGITS: Yesterday was the 99th game in Isotopes history in which Albuquerque and their opponent both reached double-digits in the run column. It was the sixth occurrence in 2024 (last: 12-11 victory vs. Salt Lake in 11 innings, June 28). All-time, 84 of these contests have taken place at Isotopes Park.

THIS SERIES: The Isotopes and Rainiers have combined for 45 runs, 56 hits, 22 walks and 33 runners left on base through the first two games of this series.

RUNS: The Isotopes plated their second-most tallies in a contest this season yesterday (most: 15, March 31 vs. El Paso).

VS. TACOMA: Yesterday tied for the third-highest scoring game between Albuquerque and Tacoma (also 26 runs: April 14, 2019 at Cheney Stadium, 17-9 Isotopes victory). The most combined runs for the two clubs is 29 (June 28, 2019 in Albuquerque, 15-14 Tacoma triumph).

RUNS IN AN INNING: Albuquerque's six-run fourth inning yesterday was their largest output in a frame since June 15 vs. El Paso (six in the second), and marked their sixth instance of plating at least six in a single inning this year.

SAVE: Curtiss secured a five-out save yesterday after throwing 36 pitches. In Curtiss' last 14 appearances in Triple-A dating back to May 15, he has compiled a 0.57 ERA (15.2 IP/1 ER) with only 12 hits allowed during the stretch.

MARGIN: Albuquerque improved to 11-23 in contests decided by one or two runs, (last such win: June 28 vs. Salt Lake (12-11)).

SWIPES ALLOWED: The Rainiers swiped five bases yesterday, the most allowed by Albuquerque since a franchise-record seven at Tacoma on Aug. 19, 2022.

ATTENDANCE: Over 46 openings, Albuquerque has tallied the fifth-highest total attendance in all of Minor League Baseball (304,051) and second-highest in the Pacific Coast League ... The club is also averaging 6,610 per game, the highest in the PCL.

ANNIVERSARY: Tacoma skipper John Russell managed the IL squad at the 2007 Triple-A All-Star Game on this date in the Duke City.

BOOCHIE THE BRUIN: Sean Bouchard has hit safely in five consecutive contests, compiling multiple knocks in four of them ... Extended on-base streak to 17 games, fifth-longest active stretch in the PCL, slashing .356/.493/.661 with eight extra-base hits, 16 RBI and 13 walks during the stretch ... Additionally, Bouchard has reached base in 24 of 25 games with the Isotopes in 2024.

MONTI: Elehuris Montero has registered multiple hits in four of five games since rejoining Albuquerque on July 5 ... The solo homer yesterday accounted for his 125th RBI in 133 contests as an Isotope (2021-24). ... Has recorded an RBI in four of five games with the Isotopes ... Five of his nine hits have been doubles (one homer).

BIG WILLIE STYLE: Willie Maclver tallied two hits yesterday for his 18th multi-hit contest of the year and his fifth-straight, first time in career has five-straight multi-hit games ... Has a seven-game hitting streak, slashing .520/.536/1.040 with four doubles, three homers and nine RBI.

JC: Julio Carreras finished 2-for-4 yesterday, his 13th multi-hit game of 2024, fourth in eight contests in July ... Has compiled a .303/.351/.404 slash line since June 6 (26 games), raising his overall average from .187 to .225 ... Has stolen a base in three-straight contests for second time in 2024 (also: May 30-June 1)... Swiped a career-high 23 bags this season.

TAKE FLIGHT: Jimmy Herron extended his hit streak to eight-games yesterday with a single. Slashing .484/.500/.839 with three doubles, a triple, two homers and 14 RBI ... Has a hit in 15 of his last 16 games, raising his batting from .269 to .302 during span.

MR JONES: Greg Jones delivered a two-run single while also drawing three walks yesterday, tying a season-high for free passes drawn by an Isotope, fifth time (last: Grant Lavigne, June 14 vs. El Paso) ... Is 5-for-36 with 16 strikeouts in last nine games.

VANDY: Connor Kaiser connected on his third home run of the season yesterday, a solo blast to right-center which traveled 420 feet ... First since June 8 at Sacramento.

PCL LEADERBOARD: Drew Romo is 10th in average (.300) ... Sean Bouchard is T-4th in triples (6) ... Julio Carreras is 6th in SB (23).

TEAM STATS: Offensively in MiLB, the club is 1st in triples (41), and total bases (1,502), 2nd in hits (875), slugging (.481) average (.280), 3rd in OPS (.840) and T-4th in runs (534).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.

Was on the hill for UCSB's win against Miami in the College World Series on Jun. 20, allowing one run and two hits over six full innings
- Pitched for the 2017 Cotuit Kettlers of the Cape Cod League

- ♦ Made 11th appearance July 6 at Tacoma did not factor into the decision ... Tossed 4.2 innings and allowed five runs on five hits, one homer, one hit batter and four walks with two punchouts ...
