Today's Games

The Clippers will send LHP **Logan Allen** to the mound today, followed by RHP **Rorik Maltrud** in the nightcap. Scranton/WB will counter with RHPs **Adam Kloffenstein** and **Dom Hamel**. Columbus is 33-17 (.660) versus right handers this year. Both have faced Columbus before: Kloffenstein once in 2025 with Buffalo (0-1, 5.0IP, 3ER) and Hamel twice in 2024 with Syracuse (1-0, 9.2IP, 4ER).

vs. the RailRiders

Since a 14 game win streak over the RailRiders from 4/24/13-8/9/14, the Clippers have gone 18-24 against Scranton/WB (4-2 in last series played, 2023 in Huntington Park). Prior to Tuesday, no active Clippers had ever played against the RailRiders (**George Valera** played in the 2023 series, but is currently on waivers; **Kolby Allard** had pitched 3G, but was released on Monday).

After You

Yesterday's win evened the Clipper record at 19-19 when allowing the opponents to score first (.500, best in the IL), while also serving as the 25th comeback win of the year (most in the IL, +3 on 2nd). Last season, Columbus was 20-54 when the bad guys plated the first run (.270, 18th), while collecting a measly 28 comeback wins (2nd fewest). At home, the Clippers are 12-8 when giving up the first run.

Close-ing the Gap

Columbus has won five straight 1-run games (Sunday's was the lone game of Indianapolis series not decided by at least five) and seven of the last eight, improving to 9-7 in those games (.562, t-7th in the IL). In addition, the Clippers have gone 13-4 in the last 17G with a margin of three or fewer (27-18, .600, 3rd best). Over the last 27G, in which the Clippers are 18-9, they have a +5 run margin (139-134).

Getting There

Cooper Ingle reached the qualification level for rate statistics in the IL on 6/7 and his current .436OBP ranks 2nd in the IL. Ingle has slumped to a .315OBP over the last 19G (19x78, .244, 9BB, 21K), but since his Triple-A debut on 8/13/25, he has the best OBP in the IL (.417, +14 points on 2nd place). As a catcher, Ingle has a 1.293OPS (11HR) in 31G (.480OPS and 1HR in 15G between DH and LF).

Juan Up, Juan Down

Juan Brito is 6x41 (.146) in his last 11G (4x5 on 6/13) after hitting .400 (12x30) in the previous 8G (5/28-6/5; was hitless in each of 5G prior to that, 18AB). Brito is coming up on 1,000PA in his Clipper career (999, would be 53rd player to reach the plateau after **George Valera** did earlier this year). His 58 doubles (three in last 32G) are three short of the franchise top 25 (4BB from top 25, Valera is 22nd).

Naying It

Bo Naylor has reached base in 16 of 17G, posting a .405OBP (13BB in last 51PA; also has 2HR and 16K, yielding a 61% three true outcome rate). Since joining the team on 5/27, he is tied for 2nd most RBI on the team (11), while scoring the most runs (13). Columbus catchers are hitting .308/.447/.575, leading the IL in all three categories by a wide margin (2nd in all is Memphis: .284/.397/.511).

Learning Experience

Ralph Velazquez has struck out in 29% of his plate appearances in Triple-A (26K, 91PA), after turning in a rate of 17% in 64G at Double-A over the last two seasons (50K, 295PA). He averaged a homer every 21.4AB in Akron, but has just 1HR in 83AB with the Clippers (6/7 vs. Omaha). Over his last 14G, Velazquez is hitting .196 (11x56), but has 6XBH (.357SLG) and 22K (36%).

Struggling Slugging

CJ Kayfus enters today with a .314SLG since getting optioned on 4/13 (5XBH in 24G, all doubles). Last season, Kayfus had 31XBH in 68G for the Clippers, including 13HR (last on 7/19/25 at Iowa, 115AB since). Aside from a 4RBI outing on 4/26 at Buffalo, Kayfus doesn't have any other multi-RBI games in his last 39G, dating to 7/3/25 (18RBI total; had 36RBI in first 52G with Columbus).

Out(field) of Position

A day after **Milan Tolentino** made his pro debut in the outfield (553G on the infield), **Ralph Velazquez** will make his 25th career appearance in the outfield (221G at first base), alongside **Dayan Frias** (16th career appearance, 13th with Columbus this season). **Cooper Ingle** is the designated hitter in game one, but has played 4G in left this year (first games of his career).

This Date in Clipper History

6/19/2011

The Clippers bested Scranton/WB 2-0, thanks to homers from **Chad Huffman** and **Luke Carlin**, kicking off a six game winning streak for Columbus (had five winning streaks of at least six games). Huffman was one of three Clippers to remain active for the entirety of their second straight National Championship season, while Carlin suited up only for the Clippers in 2011 (had two stints on the DL).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,440 to 1,389).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 99-90 (.524) in pitch reviews, with batters going 53-61 (.465) and pitchers/catchers going 46-29 (.613). They have run out of challenges in 35G and have not challenged in 3G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 3-3 in extra innings this season, after having gone 5-5 in 2025 and 9-9 in 2024 (most losses since 2013, 12). Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 53-36 when playing past regulation (.596, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 26-17 at home (.605, but 4-7 in last 11G). Of the 89G to require extra play, 70 have been resolved after one frame (including eight DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 innings on 9/20/22 at Toledo). From 7/31/19-6/26/21, Columbus played 85 straight within the allotted innings.

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to easily top 800 again, with an outside chance to establish a new team high (on pace for 830, would rank as 4th most all-time; 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 94 through the first 70G (on pace for 200SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 23CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 3rd most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (49; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 78 grand slams and 1,938RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

Hits the Spot

When turning in as many or fewer hits than their opponents last season, the Clippers went 18-64 (.220), coming in 13th out of 20 in the IL. The 2024 season saw them post an IL-worst .185 (12-53) winning percentage in such games. When allowing at least 10 hits last year, Columbus was 7-41 (.146, 20th in the IL; started the season 1-20).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.34 through the first 70G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 168HR (over 10HR under the average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 9th in the IL this year (.979), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 37G this season (25-12, .676), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Key to Victory

From 2022-23, Columbus owned the best record in the IL when holding opponents to three runs or fewer, going 95-8 (.922, no other team was above .880). The Clippers were 43-10 in such games in 2024 (.811, 13th in the IL), accumulating four losses by 4/14, and were just 47-10 (.825, 9th) last year, collecting four losses over 14G from 4/23-5/9 (had four losses total in both 2022 and 2023).

Good Baseball

Milan Tolentino bunted the winning run into scoring position in an extra-inning win at Indianapolis on 6/14. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 88-23 (.793) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 5-2 mark this season (.714, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 2nd most last at bat wins this year (11) while playing in the 2nd most games decided in the last at bat (Scranton/WB has played 20). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 93G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 45-48 (.484, 15th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 425-437 (.493), 395-391 with Columbus (.503).

Workhorse

Allen is the only Clipper averaging over 80 pitches a start this season, at 87.5 (along with **Ryan Webb**, only pitchers to throw more than 90 in a game multiple times). Averaging almost 93 pitches per outing in the Majors last season, Allen hit triple digits six times (Columbus has not had a pitcher reach 100 since **Peyton Battenfield** on 9/2/22, 534G ago)

On Guard(ians):

In two stints in the Majors this season (27th man in a DH on 4/5 and a two day excursion from 5/24-5/25), Allen has appeared once for Cleveland, closing out the game on 5/25 vs. Washington (4.0IP, 5H, 0R, 0ER, 1BB, 7K). The game was his second in relief at the Major League level (once last season) and he has just 4G out of the bullpen in the minors (all on starter's rest, three piggybacking rehabbing Major Leaguers).

Stellar Support:

Through 11GS, the bullpen has graced Allen with a 1.51ERA in relief (41.2IP, 7ER), stranding two of four runners inherited. The defense has committed only 8E in Allen's starts, while the offense has put forward 5.3 runs per game. That all adds up to a 9-2 record for Columbus when he takes the hill.

Tough Split:

In his first 5GS (103BF), Allen recorded 32K (31%) against only 10BB (10%), while painting the zone with strikes on 63% of his offerings. Once the calendar flipped to May, however, he made 4GS (87BF), watching his strikeout rate dip to 16% (14K) and his walk rate inflate (14%, 12BB; strikes on 57% of pitches). He has found his groove in June, starting with a 10K outing (fifth of career) on 6/6 vs. Omaha (15K to 46BF this month, 33%; 3BB, 7%, 65% of pitches have been strikes).

Cleaning Up:

Opposing cleanup hitters have just one hit off Allen in 25AB this season, though the hit went over the wall (**Charles McAdoo**, 4/26 at Buffalo). Looking at the lineup as a whole, the top five in the order have slashed .228/.319/.402 with 4HR in 127AB against Allen, while batters 6-9 have hit .372/.440/.667 with 5HR in 78AB.
