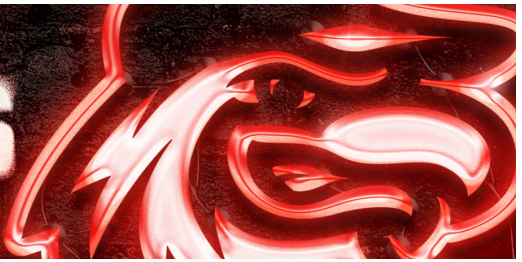

WSH AFFILIATE NOTES

Washington picked up their first opening day victory since 2021 Thursday, with a 10-4 win over the Cubs...RF **JOEY WIEMER** picked up three hits including a homer in his team debut.

SEASON'S GREETINGS: The Rochester Red Wings embark on their 98th season in the International League, and sixth season as the Triple-A Affiliate of the Washington Nationals tonight in Jacksonville...this marks the 13th matchup between the two teams since the start of last season after not facing each other since 1970...also marks the fourth time Rochester has opened the season in Florida, and the first time since 1967 when the Red Wings beat Jacksonville 9-2...LHP **ANDREW ALVAREZ** will take the mound for Rochester for his second consecutive Opening Day start, against Jumbo Shrimp southpaw Robby Snelling...

R Rochester picked up a 4-2 series victory in their lone visit to Jacksonville a season ago, avenging a six-game sweep in Rochester earlier in the season, which propelled Jacksonville to a first-half title.

EARLY BIRD SPECIAL: March 27th is the earliest start to a season in Red Wings history, and is the earliest start to a Minor League season since the 1951 Pacific Coast League, which started the same day to open their 167-game season...Rochester is in search of their first Opening Day victory since 2019 at Lehigh Valley...

R The Red Wings are 3-3 in March games since they were implemented in 2023.

R This is the fourth consecutive season that the Red Wings have set a record for earliest start date in franchise history.

FOLLOW THE LECROY: Manager **MATTHEW LECROY** takes the helm of the Red Wings for his sixth consecutive season, becoming the fourth skipper in Red Wings history to do so, joining Red Wings Hall of Famers Joe Altobelli (1971-76), George Stallings (1921-27), and John Ganzel (1909-1914)...on 8/2 of last year, LeCroy became the eighth Rochester manager to earn 300 career wins with a 9-8 comeback win at Charlotte, and moved into seventh place on the Red Wings all-time wins leaderboard with his 301st win the next day.

NEW CHICKS IN THE NEST: Hitting Coach **BRIAN DAUBACH** (6th season) and Defensive Coach **MARIO LISSON** (2nd season) join LeCroy as the only returners to this year's field staff...Pitching Coach **FERNANDO NIEVE**, Assistant Hitting Coach **TRAVIS FITTA**, Assistant Pitching Coach **SAM NARRON**, and Quality Control & Development Coach **ANTHONY DELED** all join the Red Wings staff for the first time.

HEY, WE KNOW THIS GUY: LHP **ANDREW ALVAREZ** will toe the rubber for Rochester tonight in what will be his third consecutive Opening Day start and second with the Red Wings...the southpaw has combined to toss 10.0 innings without allowing an earned run with 13 strikeouts across both starts, including 5.0 innings in Buffalo on 3/28/2025...the California native is coming off a 2025 season in which he combined to make a career-high 30 starts across Rochester (25 GS) and Washington (5 GS), and set a career-high with 134 strikeouts...he became the first Red Wings southpaw to make at least 25 starts since both Pat Dean and Taylor Rogers made 27 in 2015...

R Alvarez is the first left-handed Red Wings pitcher to start multiple Opening Days' since at least 2000.

FAMILIAR FACES & FUTURE STARS: Rochester's Opening Day roster includes 18 players who have previously represented the Red Wings, four of which were a part of last year's Opening Day lineup...this includes 2025 team MVP **ANDREW PINCKNEY**, Opening Day starting pitcher **ANDREW ALVAREZ**, outfielder **ROBERT HASSELL III**, and infielder **TREY LIPSCOMB**...two of the Nationals top 10 prospects in C **HARRY FORD** (No. 3) and RHP **LUIS PERALES** (No. 4) will begin the 2026 campaign with Rochester.

Entering his fifth professional season, all with the Nationals organization after he was selected in the 12th round of the 2021 MLB Draft, out of California Polytechnic State University...named a MiLB.com Organization All-Star in 2023...named South Atlantic League Pitcher of the Week on 8/13/2023, with Wilmington.

- Opened the year with Rochester, making a team-high 25 starts with a 4.10 ERA (96 ER/123.0 IP)...also led the Red Wings with 114 strikeouts, and held a share of the lead (Adrian Sampson, min. 50.0 IP) with a .246 batting average against.
- Became the first Red Wings left-handed pitcher to log at least 25 starts in a season since Pat Dean & Taylor Rogers in 2015.
- Struck out a season-high eight batters on 8/14 vs SYR.
- Fourth Rochester southpaw since 2000 to make the start on Opening Day (3/28 at BUF)...allowed one unearned run across 5.0 innings, the first Red Wings pitcher to log at least 5.0 frames without allowing an earned run on Opening Day since Jose Berrios (2017).
- Had his contract selected by Washington on 9/1, and made his MLB Debut the same day against Miami...tossed 5.0 shutout innings with four strikeouts and two walks on just one hit...struck out Joey Weimer in the third inning for his first Major League strikeout...earned the win, becoming the sixth pitcher in Nationals history (2005-pres.) to win in his Major League debut.
- Eclipsed 400 Minor League strikeouts on 6/17 vs LHV, which was also his 100th career appearance.
- Became the first pitcher in Nationals' history (2005-pres.) to throw 5.0 shutout innings in Major League debut...one hit was tied for the fewest hits allowed by a Nationals' starter in his debut (5.0-plus IP) with Collin Balester on 7/1/2008 at Florida.
- Pitched to a 1.15 ERA (2 ER/15.2 IP) in his first three career starts...only Tanner Roark (0.95, 2 ER/19.0 IP) produced a lower ERA in first three career starts in Nationals history (2005-pres.).
- Matched the Major League record for a starting pitcher in his first five career games by not allowing a run in three of first five starts...he was the first National (2005-pres.) and 22nd Major Leaguer to do so.
- Ranks second among Red Wings Nationals Era pitchers with 201.2 career innings pitched.
- Has made five starts in MLB, all with the Nationals, pitching to a 2.31 ERA (6 ER/23.1 IP) with a 1-1 record, 20 strikeouts, and 10 walks.
- Pitch mix; Four-seam FB - 91.5 MPH, 28% usage; Sinker - 91.1 MPH, 13% usage; Changeup - 85.9 MPH, 14% usage; Slider - 83.5 MPH, 23% usage; Curve - 83.0 MPH, 22% usage.

Entering his sixth professional season, second with the Nationals organization after he was acquired from Los Angeles-AL with INF Sam Brown in exchange for LHP Andrew Chafin and RHP Luis García on 7/30/2025...originally selected by Miami in the fourth round of the 2020 MLB Draft, out of Vanderbilt University...named an Arizona Fall League Rising Star in 2023 with Glendale...named an MiLB.com Organization All-Star, a Southern League Post-Season All-Star, and was a Futures Game Selection in 20221 with Double-A Pensacola (MIA).

- Began the 2025 season with Triple-A Salt Lake (LAA)...made three starts, and was recalled by Los Angeles-AL on 4/26...optioned to Salt Lake on 5/3, and recalled a second time on 5/25...optioned on 5/28, recalled for his third stint with the Angels on 7/11, and optioned on 7/24 prior to the trade on 7/30.
- Appeared in eight total games with Los Angeles-AL out of the bullpen...logged a 4.91 ERA (10 ER/18.1 IP), while holding opponents to a .224 batting average against...logged a 6.11 ERA (43 ER/63.1 IP) across 13 starts with Salt Lake.

Entering his 14th professional season, second with the Nationals organization after he was claimed off waivers from Los Angeles-NL on 8/17/2025...originally signed with Colorado as an international free agent on 7/2/2012...named a Mexican League Mid-Season All-Star in 2024 with El Aguila de Veracruz...earned Northwest League Mid-Season All-Star honors in 2016 with Boise (COL).

- Struck out the side against Buffalo on 9/11, collecting his 150th Triple-A strikeout.
- Recorded his first save with Rochester on 9/5 at MEM.
- Collected his 300th minor league strikeout on 8/27 at Jacksonville
- Made his Red Wing debut on 8/20 against Toledo
- Made 35 appearances (4 starts) with Triple-A Oklahoma City (LAD) this season, logging a 3-0 record with a 3.05 ERA (14 ER/41.1 IP) with 49 strikeouts and 15 walks, while holding opponents to a .240 batting average...appeared in one game with Los Angeles-NL on 7/7 at MIL, after having his contract selected earlier that day...optioned to OKC on 7/8, and designated for assignment on 8/15.

- Spent the 2025 season primarily with Triple-A Tacoma (SEA, 22 G), with a brief stint with Arizona Complex League Mariners (2 G, rehab assignment)...logged a 7.40 ERA (17 ER/20.2 IP), 19 strikeouts, and eight walks across both levels.
- Placed on the 7-day Injured List on 3/28...sent on a rehab assignment to ACL Mariners on 5/3...activated on 5/10.
- Did not play in 2024 due to injury (Tommy John surgery).
