**LEADING OFF**--The Travs look to bounce back and win a series.

**LOOKING BACK**--Arkansas hit four home runs but could not hold a sixth inning lead as Springfield came back to rout the Travs 14-7...all four Travs pitchers gave up at least three runs...Jack Anderson was charged with the blown save and the loss...Patrick Frick, Julio Rodriguez, Jack Larsen and Joe Rizzo hit the four home runs for Arkansas.

**J-ROD SHOW TURNED ON**--Julio Rodriguez went 1-4 and homered for the second consecutive game last night...was his third homer in the past two nights...has had a hit in 12 of his last 13 games, batting .481 with eight extra base hits in that time...slashing .423/.513/.608 in 25 games since returning from the Olympics...hit .417 with two doubles, a homer and four RBIs over the course of the Olympic tournament helping the DR to the bronze medal.

**DOWN THE STRETCH THEY COME**--The top two teams in the Double-A Central, regardless of division, qualify for this season's best-of-five championship series...Wichita currently holds the top spot...the Travs and Frisco are in virtual tie for second place 2.5 games back...Northwest Arkansas and Tulsa are still alive as well as they are 2 and 2.5 games back respectively of the two second place clubs...earlier today, Wichita defeated NW Arkansas 6-2 and Tulsa won at Amarillo, 8-7...tonight, Frisco hosts San Antonio.

**SEPTEMBER STARTERS**--Through the first 10 games in September, the starting pitchers have been spectacular...Steven Moyers (twice), Matt Brash

(twice), Brandon Williamson (twice), George Kirby (twice), Tyler Driver and Tyler Herb have combined for a 2.03 ERA (13 runs, 12 earned) in 53.1 innings...they have struck out 72 against only 13 walks and given up just 42 hits and one homer...the team has posted a 7-3 record in those 10 games and had the lead in the sixth inning or later in all 10.

**STRYFFELER STIFLING**--Reliever Michael Stryffeler locked down the save in Thursday night's win...has allowed only one earned run in his last 21 outings dating back to the start of July...over 25 innings in those games he has a 0.36 ERA with five hits, 15 walks and 38 strikeouts.

**HOMER HUNGRY**--Through 113 games including 60 in Dickey-Stephens Park, the Travs have hit 120 home runs, 43 at home...they are on pace for 127 homers in this year's 120 game season...they are the first Travs team in the Dickey-Stephens Park era (2007-present) to hit at least as many home runs as games played in a season...the most homers by any Travs team in that time is 128 (in 140 games) by the 2008 squad...before belting nine home runs in the past two games, the near record pace had slowed recently with Arkansas hitting only 13 long balls in their previous 31 games.

**ROSTER RESHUFFLE**--The Seattle Mariners made transactions affecting the Travs roster...RHP Joseph Hernandez was sent in today from the Arizona League with OF Dom Thompson-Williams being placed on the Development List...at the beginning of the week, INF Jose Caballero joined the team from High-A Everett.

**PROSPECTING**--Arkansas has seven of Seattle's top 30 prospects based on the updated MLB pipeline rankings on the active roster...that group is headlined by two players ranked in the top 35 overall...OF Julio Rodriguez is the Mariners top prospect and #2 overall while RHP George Kirby is ranked #3/#35...other Travs in Seattle's top 30 include OF Zach DeLoach (#6), LHP Brandon Williamson (#7), RHP Matt Brash (#10), INF Kaden Polcovich (#19) and INF Patrick Frick (#28)...none of those seven players began the season with Arkansas.

**SCOUTING SPRINGFIELD**--The Cardinals (St. Louis Cardinals) came into this series after splitting six games against the Tulsa Drillers on the road last week...their offense ranks middle of the pack in most categories while their pitching staff ranks dead last in ERA and home runs allowed...Springfield features five of St. Louis' top 30 prospects according to rankings from MLB Pipeline...ranked Springfield prospects include C Ivan Herrera (#7), INF Malcom Nunez (#9), INF Delvin Perez (#13), 1B Luken Baker (#14) and C Julio Rodriguez (#21).

### Tonight's Starter - 33 Joseph Hernandez

- Joseph Hernandez makes his Travs and Double-A debut...up from the ACL Mariners team where he was 4-0 with a 4.35 ERA in 31 innings...has pitched in 10 games (4 starts) with 49 strikeouts and 18 walks and a .221 opponent batting average...last pitched eight days ago giving up a run on two hits over 2.2 innings with three walks and four strikeouts against the ACL Padres...has thrown 5+ innings on three different occasions including a season high six on August 21
- Hernandez did not pitch in 2020 due to the cancelled minor league season
- Joseph was limited in 2019 due to injury throwing only six innings in four games for the Mariners DSL team...pitched for the DSL club in 2018 as well and threw 39 innings with a 4.62 ERA in 15 games (six starts)...posted 42 strikeouts while walking 22 and recorded a 4-2 record
- 21-year old is in his first season pitching in the United States...signed with Seattle in July of 2017...hails from Cotui, Dominican Republic

- allowed 1+ runs in each of last four outings: 0-1, 2 BS, 5.2 IP, 14.29 ERA, 11 H, 9 R...pitched in Mariners Player Development Fall League last year
- spent all of 2019 with the Travs...posted a 1.50 ERA over 54 innings (51 K, 16 BB) while tying for team lead in appearances (41)...TL midseason All-Star
- with Class-A Modesto for all of 2018 (44 games, 53.2 IP, 2.68 ERA, 2 saves, 57 Ks, 14 BB, .251 OBA...graduated after pitching four seasons at Penn State

#### 10 Dayeison Arias

- 10-38, 3 BB, (.263/.317/.316), 2 2B, 4 RBI in 9 games since rejoining Travs on 8/27...caught combined no-hitter on 9/2...first 3 Double-A hits were homers...played primarily with Everett this year hitting .239/.306/.505 with 11 2B, 3B, 12 HR and 40 RBIs in 48 games...took part in the Mariners Player Dev. Fall League in 2020 - spent most of 2019 with West Virginia where he slashed .213/.288/.374 with 12 HR, 43 RBIs in 81 games...SAL midseason All-Star...also 11 games with Modesto - 2nd highest draft pick ever from NCAA D2 Nova Southeastern where he was an All-American...left as the school's all-time HR leader ahead of J.D.
