#### SUGAR LAND SPACE COWBOYS (31-21) AT ALBUQUERQUE ISOTOPES (23-29)

#### RHP Aaron Brown (1-5, 9.41) vs. RHP Bradley Blalock (0-1, 10.80)

**TODAY'S GAME**: Sugar Land evened the series at a game apiece after a 9-2 win last night, snapping Albuquerque's seasonhigh four-game win streak ... Bradley Blalock is slated to start for the Isotopes while Aaron Brown is expected to take the hill for the Space Cowboys.

**RUN DIFFERENTIAL:** The Isotopes' run differential on the year is -11. Through May 28 of last season, the club's run differential was -111.

**THREE DINGERS**: Sugar Land's Shay Whitcomb belted three homers last night, the first opposing player to tally a three-homer game since Max Muncy on August 4, 2024, at Las Vegas. 16th time an opponent has registered three dingers and third Space Cowboy to do so (Joey Loperfido, April 12, 2024, and Jeremy Peña, September 21, 2021). Occurred eight times since 2021.

**FOUR-BAGGERS ALLOWED**: The Isotopes pitching staff permitted five homers yesterday, the most in a game since relenting seven on August 4, 2024, at Las Vegas. It's the 44th time since 2005 the club has allowed five-plus homers in a contest.

RISP: Albuquerque went 0-for-6 with runners in scoring position Wednesday, the 10th time in 2025 the club has not registered a hit with a runner in scoring position (last: May 13 vs. Tacoma).

RUNS SCORED: The Isotopes were limited to two runs last night, the 12th time plating two or fewer runs on the year (last: May 13 vs. Tacoma, one).

**HITS**: Albuquerque recorded just six hits Wednesday, the fewest in a contest since tallying four on May 13 vs. Tacoma.

**OPPOSING STARTER**: The Space Cowboys' Miguel Ullola spun 5.0 innings of one-run ball last night, allowing just four hits and two walks with five punchouts. He's the fifth opposing hurler to limit the Isotopes to one run or fewer over 5.0-plus innings (last: Blas Castano, May 17 at Reno; 7.0 IP, 1 R).

SERIES: The Isotopes have won the first two games of a set just once on the year: April 22-23 at Reno ... The club has won two of the first three contests in a set just twice in 2025 (also: April 15-17 vs. El Paso and April 22-24 at Reno).

**MLB REHAB**: Thairo Estrada played his fifth rehab game with the Isotopes Wednesday and went 1-for-4 with three strikeouts ... Over five games is 7-for-23 with a double, walk and five strikeouts.

**HOMERS**: The Isotopes have hit 12 homers in their last three games (seven Sunday at Reno, four Tuesday and one last night).

RIT: Ryan Ritter extended hit streak to 13 games last night, tied for second-longest active hit streak in PCL. During streak is slashing .443/.485/1.000 with nine doubles, two triples, seven homers and 20 RBI ... Third 13-game hit streak for an Isotope in 2025 (also: Keston Hiura, active, and Julio Carreras, April 23-May 9).

-During stretch leads MiLB in hits, total bases, homers, RBI, doubles and slugging ... Has 19-game on-base streak, second-longest active streak in PCL ... Has 10 multi-hit games in his last 12 games and team-leading 17 in 2025, four three-hit games.

-In May, slashing .368/.427/.874 with 10 doubles, two triples, 10 homers and 24 RBI after hitting .224 over first 26 games. During month, leads PCL in OPS, slugging, total bases and tied for first in homers and doubles.

**KESTDADDY**: Keston Hiura extended his hit streak to 13 games with a homer last night, tied for the second-longest active hit streak in PCL... During the stretch is slashing .365/.459/.827 with six doubles, six homers and 18 RBI.

-Has homered in three-straight games, third Isotopes to do so in 2025 (Braxton Fulford, April 4-8 and Ryan Ritter, May 3-7). The last Isotope player to homer in four-straight was Elehuris Montero (July 28-August 1, 2024). Has 10 RBI in last three games. Has five homers in his last 13 at-bats.

-Hiura has a hit in 19 of 20 games played in May ... During the month, is slashing .354/.433/.759 with a triple, six doubles, a triple, eight homers and 22 RBI after hitting .141 over first 24 games ... Has 20-game on-base streak, longest active in PCL.

YF: Yanquiel Fernandez extended his hit streak to nine games with two singles Wednesday. During stretch is slashing. 432/.500/.568 with five doubles and four RBI. Longest hit streak since 13-gamer from May 31-June 16, 2023. Has seven multi-hit games during stretch, including three-straight. Began streak with four-straight.

WARMING UP: Warming Bernabel tallied a double yesterday, third-straight game with a double. Has double in three-straight games for first time since a four-gamer from June 1-5, 2024. Has five-game hit streak ... Over last 10 games slashing .415/.479/.610 with five doubles, a homer and six RBI with six multi-hit games.

PCL LEADERBOARD: Ryan Ritter is 1st in runs (42), 2nd in homers (14), XBH (28), total bases (112) and slugging (.605), 3rd in OPS (1.010), 6th in RBI (36), 7th in OBP (.405), T-7th in walks (31) and T-8th in hits (54) ... Warming Bernabel is T-5th in doubles (15) ... Sterlin Thompson is T-6th in triples (3) ... Julio Carreras is 10th in SB (10).

#### **NUCLEI NOTES**

**SKIPPER**: Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

**AARON MUNOZ**: Takes over as Isotopes hitting coach after Jordan Pacheco was named one of two new hitting coaches for the Colorado Rockies on May 12 ... Began the 2025 season as the hitting coach for the ACL Rockies ... Spent nine seasons (2016-2024) as the Rockies bullpen catcher ... Was Isotopes bullpen catcher in 2015 ... Originally drafted by the Blue Jays in the 34th round of the MLB Draft ... Played parts of four seasons in the Minor Leagues (2011-14), making it to Double-A.

**SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT**: For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

**BALLS AND STRIKES**: The Challenge System, in it's third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
