## NEWS AND NOTES

**THERE WERE FIREWORKS:** Luis Matos' walk-off hit in game one of the Saturday doubleheader was Nashville's fourth walk-off win of the season, and first since May 17 vs. Iowa. It was the third walk-off win against Jacksonville since Nashville joined the International League ahead of the 2021 season. The Sounds last walk-off against Jacksonville happened on August 22, 2024. Yesterday was Nashville's first walk-off win on the Fourth of July since 2011 against Memphis. Nashville has 137 walk-off wins since 2005, tied for the sixth-most in Triple-A during the span.

**GEEZ LUIS:** Saturday night was the first walk-off hit of Luis Matos' professional career. His first career walk-off RBI came via a sacrifice fly to beat the Philadelphia Phillies on May 28, 2024 with the San Francisco Giants in the 10th inning. His 2-for-4 day at the plate in game one was his seventh multi-hit game of the season with Nashville and his two RBI gave him his sixth multi-RBI performance with the Sounds. In 36 games, Matos is hitting .248 (32-for-129) with five doubles, three home runs, and 21 RBI.

**NAVA A DOUBT:** Andrick Nava swatted his second home run in his last three games and finished game one of Saturday's doubleheader with his second Triple-A multi-hit game going 2-for-3. Across his 15 games played this season with Nashville and High-A Wisconsin, the switch hitter is hitting .319 (15-for-47) with three homers, three doubles, and 11 RBI.

**STACK ON BLACK:** Tyler Black reached base safely in both games of the doubleheader to extended his current on-base streak to 16 consecutive games. He finished the day 2-for-5 with a double, two RBI, three walks, two stolen bases, and two runs scored between the two games. During his current streak dating back to June 13, Black is hitting .259 (14-for-54) with seven XBH, including three home runs, 14 RBI, 13 walks, seven stolen bases, and 15 runs scored. The longest Triple-A on-base streak of his career stands at 18 straight games (August 6-27, 2023) and he posted a career-best 35-game streak in 2023 with Double-A Biloxi.

**MY NAME IS JEF:** Brewers no. 9-rated prospect Jefferson Quero added to his team lead in RBI with his 48th of the season on a RBI single in the bottom of the third inning of game two. He ended the month of June hitting .312 (24-for-77) with 13 RBI and Saturday was his first RBI in July. His 48 RBI rank seventh in the Brewers farm system and are the fourth-most in a single-season of his career. He posted 57-RBI seasons in both 2022 between Low-A Carolina and High-A Wisconsin and last year with 44 RBI in Triple-A and another 13 in 11 games during a minor league rehab assignment in the Arizona Complex League. He had 49 RBI in 90 games played with Double-A Biloxi in 2023, which were the most he has ever had at one level in any of his six professional seasons.

**SEVEN 8:** With a hit in both games of the doubleheader, Brewers no. 5-rated prospect Jett Williams is riding an eight game hitting streak since June 23. After finishing Saturday night 3-for-7 with a triple and a walk, Williams is hitting .345 (10-for-29) over his last eight games. The eight-game streak is already the longest of his Triple-A career.

**LARA BOARD:** Brewers no. 4 rated prospect Luis Lara ended a 42-game homerless drought with his two-run homer in the bottom of the third inning on Thursday night. The 21-year-old set his single-season career-high with five home runs through his first 26 Triple-A games and had seven on the year through 33 games on May 6 to lead the club and ranked T-10th in the International League. His eight home runs now rank fifth on the team, breaking a tie with Brock Wilken. Despite going homerless during the 42 game stretch, Lara hit .320 (49-for-153) with six doubles, two triples, and 20 RBI while carrying a .820 OPS. **Lara Ranks Top 10 in the International League in: runs (1st, 64), OBP (2nd, .429), AVG (3rd, .320), walks (3rd, 52), hits (5th, 91), and stolen bases (9th, 23).**

**DOUBLE-DIP:** The Sounds own a 6-2 record in doubleheaders this season.
