### GAME INFORMATION

**FRANCISCO LINDOR REHAB:** New York Mets **SS Francisco Lindor** is set to begin a rehab assignment tonight in Binghamton working back from a left calf strain that put him on the IL April 23. Lindor is a five-time All-Star, four-time Silver Slugger Award winner, two-time Gold Glove Award winner, and a one-time Platinum Glove Award winner (2016). The 32-year-old is in his 12th major league season and his sixth season with the Mets. The shortstop entered the 2026 season ranking seventh in Mets history in stolen bases, eighth in home runs, and 14th in runs batted in. He has recorded 30+ home runs and 30+ stolen bases twice in his career (2023 and 2025) and joined Howard Johnson as the only players in franchise history to post multiple 30/30 seasons. The Mets acquired Lindor and RHP Carlos Carrasco in a trade with Cleveland on January 7, 2021. In 2014, Lindor was with Double-A Akron (CLE) and played four games at NYSEG Stadium (April 3-6) and recorded a hit in each game and homered on April 5 at age 20.

**TYRONE TAYLOR REHAB:** New York Mets **OF Tyrone Taylor** will line up with Lindor and begin a rehab assignment. Taylor, whom the Mets placed on the 10-day injured list (right hip flexor strain) on May 26, has played in 43 games for the Mets this season and has slashed .186/.210/.320/.530 with 3 HR, 14 RBI, 8 R, 4 2B, 7 XBH, and 3 BB. In his third season with the Mets, he spent the first five years of his MLB career with the Milwaukee Brewers, after being selected in the second round of the 2012 MLB Draft out of Torrance High School in California. Taylor last went on a rehab assignment in September 2025 with Triple-A Syracuse when he was rehabbing from a left hamstring strain. The Mets acquired Taylor and RHP Adrian Houser from the Milwaukee Brewers in a trade that sent right-handed pitching prospect Coleman Crow to the Brewers on December 20, 2023.

**THE RUMBLE PEN:** Binghamton's bullpen is responsible for 20 of the teams 24 wins this year. They hold a 3.65 ERA across 291.0 innings and have combined for 371 strikeouts, while the starters are 5-27, with a 5.41 ERA after Jonathan Santucci got his second win last night. Over the last 123.1 innings the bullpen has allowed 47 earned runs and nine over the last 13 games. **RHP Douglas Orellana (5-1)** 3.48 ERA leads the team in wins, **RHP Brian Metoyer** has not allowed an earned run over his last five appearances and has a team lead four saves after striking out three over 1.1 innings last night and **RHP Saul Garcia** has allowed 1 ER over his last 6 APP, which have spanned 7.2 innings.

**PONIES PATH'S:** Over the last 30 games the Rumble Ponies are 2nd in the Eastern League in stolen bases with 48. On the year Binghamton has stole 103 bases which ranks 3rd in the EL. In the last 15 games Remier has six stolen bases which is T-4th in the EL. Reimer has stolen 13 bases this year in 48 games after stealing 15 bases last year in 122 games. Chris Suero leads the team with 18 stolen bases which is T-9th in the EL.

**POWER SURGE:** Binghamton has mashed 28 homers over the last month after Jose Ramos and Chris Suero blasted homers last night. Binghamton began a power surge on May 12 during a two-week road trip (@ Somerset and @ Richmond), unloading 17 home runs and nine in the series against Richmond. The Rumble Ponies hit 27 homers in May which was T-8th in the Eastern League after hitting 14 in April which was last in the league. Over the last 15 **Vincent Perozo** has clubbed five homers, **Chris Suero** has hit four, **JT Schwartz** has three and **Nick Lorusso** has two. Suero leads the team with 11 HR.

**JT SMOOTH:** **1B JT Schwartz** smashed his 7th home run of the year on Tuesday night (2-for-4, R, 2B, HR, RBI) and it was his seventh multi hit game. Over his last three games 5-for-16, (.312 AVG) he has 3 2B and a HR. Schwartz mashed his sixth home run of the year on June 3 and drove in a career-high seven runs and tallied his third-grand slam of his career, his first since August 25, 2023, at New Hampshire. Schwartz has hit 7 homers over his last 24 games and he smashed five home runs in 84 games with Double-A Binghamton last season and has surpassed that number with six home runs in 33 games this season.

**LO KNOWS:** **INF Nick Lorusso** tallied his 12th multi hit game last night which leads the team (2-for-4, R, BB). He smacked a two-run double on Wednesday. His 31 RBIs are now second on the team. The 25-year held a 13-game on-base streak, until May 19 night which still leads all players for Binghamton and his nine-game hit streak, which was snapped on May 14 which was also the longest for any Pony this year.

**SLUGGING SUERO:** **C/INF/OF Chris Suero** the Mets No. 14 prospect, hit his team leading 11th home run of the year last night. Suero is T-17th in the EL in home runs is T-4th in BB with 40, and T-9th with 18 SB on the year. Both his walk and stolen base numbers lead the team. Suero has three homers over his last six games.

**PEROZO POWER:** **C/OF Vincent Perozo** is 12-for-39 (.308 AVG) has 2 2B, 4 HR, 6 RBI over his last 10 games. In his 26 games with Binghamton he is slashing .266/.314/.521/.835 with 6 homers which ranks fifth on the team and his .521 SLG ranks 1st on the team. Perozo leads the squad with a .266 AVG. The 23-year old from Barquisimeto, Venezuela began the year with High-A Brooklyn where he slashed .258/.333/.355/.688 with 2 HR and 7 RBI.

# 2026 COACHING STAFF



## 18 MICHAEL COLLINS MANAGER

**YEAR WITH BNG:** 1st      **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st      **HOMETOWN:** Canberra, Australia

-Michael Collins, Binghamton's 19th manager all-time, is in his first season managing the Rumble Ponies and his first season in the Mets organization.

-Collins spent the last eight seasons (2018-25) with the Houston Astros, as a bullpen catcher in 2018 and serving as the Astros' major league catching coach for the last seven seasons (2019-25), including the 2022 World Series championship.

-Collins worked in the San Diego Padres organization as a manager for the DSL Padres (2012), AZL Padres (2013, 2016-17), High-A Fort Wayne (2014), and Single-A Lake Elsinore (2015) for six seasons between 2012-17.

-He also managed the Canberra Cavalry in the Australian Baseball League in 2012-14, right after his playing career ended. He led the Cavalry to the Claxton Shield as national champions for the first time.

-Collins debuted as a player in the minor leagues in 2001 at the age of 16 with the AZL Angels. He spent 10 seasons in the minor leagues with the Angels and Padres, and reached as high as Triple-A in 2009 and 2010. Collins also played in the ABL and was an All-Star catcher.

-Collins has coached for Team Australia in the World Baseball Classic in 2026, 2017, and 2013. He played for Team Australia in the WBC in 2009 and 2006. Born July 18, 1984 in Canberra, Australia. On May 3, 2024, he became a United States citizen.



## 25 MARIANO DUNCAN BENCH COACH

**YEAR WITH BNG:** 5th      **YEAR WITH NYM:** 8th      **HOMETOWN:** San Pedro de Macoris, DR

-Mariano Duncan begins his fifth year as bench coach with the Rumble Ponies and eighth year in the Mets organization. He previously served as the bench coach for the Brooklyn Cyclones in 2021 & in the same role with Kingsport in 2019.

-Duncan has Major League coaching experience, after serving as the first base coach for the Los Angeles Dodgers for five seasons from 2006-2010. He has spent time on various minor league staffs affiliated with the Dodgers and Chicago Cubs, before joining the Mets organization in 2019.

-The former infielder played 12 major league seasons with the Dodgers, Cincinnati Reds, Philadelphia Phillies, New York Yankees, and Toronto Blue Jays. He is a two-time World Series champion ('90 Reds and '96 Yankees), one-time All-Star (with Philadelphia in 1994), and was part of the 1993 Phillies team that won the National League pennant. He was inducted into the Dominican Republic Baseball Hall of Fame in 2008. He made his MLB debut for the Dodgers on April 9, 1975, at the age of 22. Duncan finished third for the N.L. Rookie of the Year.



## 32 MATT CARASITI PITCHING COACH

**YEAR WITH BNG:** 1st      **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st      **HOMETOWN:** Berlin, Conn.

-Matt Carasiti is in his first season as the pitching coach for the Rumble Ponies and with the Mets organization.

-Carasiti spent the 2025 season as the pitching coach for the High-A Everett AquaSox in the Seattle Mariners' organization.

-Carasiti pitched in the major leagues for parts of four seasons with the Colorado Rockies (2016, 2023-24) and the Seattle Mariners (2019). He made his MLB debut for the Rockies on August 12, 2016, at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia. In his MLB career, Carasiti made 53 appearances (48 in relief) and went 2-2 with 50 strikeouts in 58.1 innings.

-Pitched for parts of 10 seasons in affiliated baseball. Underwent Tommy John surgery prior to the 2020 season and missed all of 2020 and 2021 seasons. Returned and pitched for the Long Island Ducks of the Atlantic League in 2022 and also pitched professionally in Japan in 2018. Last appeared in MLB on June 7, 2024 for the Rockies.

-Was a Double-A Eastern League All-Star for the Hartford Yard Goats (Colorado Rockies) in 2016.

-Drafted by the Colorado Rockies in the sixth round of the 2012 MLB Draft out of St. John's University (N.Y.). Originally drafted by the Texas Rangers in the 36th round of the 2009 draft, but did not sign.

-Pitched for three seasons (2010-12) at St. John's and made 66 appearances and 22 starts, and went 16-11 with a 4.19 ERA and recorded 137 strikeouts in 180.1 innings. He recorded eight saves in 2011, which ranked fifth in the Big East.

-Grew up in Berlin, Connecticut, and attended Berlin HS and was the 2009 Connecticut Gatorade Player of the Year.



## 5 RACHEL FOLDEN HITTING COACH

**YEAR WITH BNG:** 1st      **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st      **HOMETOWN:** Baldwin Park, Calif.

-Rachel Folden begins her first season as the hitting coach for Binghamton and with the Mets organization.

-Folden spent the previous five seasons as a coach in the Chicago Cubs organization in various roles: Arizona Complex League hitting coach (2021-22), Minor League hitting coordinator (2023), Double-A Tennessee hitting coach (2024), and Triple-A Iowa hitting coach (2025). Was the first female coach in the history of the Chicago Cubs organization.

-Folden played professional softball with the Chicago Bandits (2008-12) and Carolina Diamonds (2012) in the National Pro Fastpitch league.

-She began her coaching career in softball at Encinal High School (2009) while working as a GA at Holy Names University. Folden was also an assistant softball coach at Valparaiso University for two seasons (2010-11).

-Folden was a four-time All-American in softball at Marshall University (2005-08) and was inducted in the Marshall Athletics Hall of Fame in 2019. Folden was a two-time Conference USA Player of the Year, four-time All-Conference First Team selection, and won the triple crown (.386 AVG, 18 HR, 56 RBI) in CUSA as a sophomore in 2006. She was the Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year in 2005, before moving to CUSA.



## 9 JAKE HAGER ASSISTANT HITTING COACH / INFIELD COACH

**YEAR WITH BNG:** 1st      **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st      **HOMETOWN:** Sierra Vista, Nev.

-Jake Hager begins his first season with the Rumble Ponies and first as a coach in the Mets organization.

-Hager played infield for parts of two seasons in the major leagues with the New York Mets (2021) and the Arizona Diamondbacks (2021-22). Hager made his MLB debut for the Mets on May 15, 2021, at Tropicana Field against the Rays. He played in five games for the Mets and totaled 42 games in his MLB career.

-Played for parts of 12 seasons in affiliated baseball, including 1,037 games in the minor leagues for six different organizations. Retired from playing in 2024 and last played for Triple-A Iowa in the Chicago Cubs organization.

-Drafted by the Tampa Bay Rays in the first round (32nd overall) in the 2011 MLB Draft out of Sierra Vista HS (Nevada). Was the Nevada Gatorade Player of the Year as a senior and was committed to play at Arizona State University, before the draft.

-Played on the same 12U Southern Nevada Bulldogs travel team with Bryce Harper and Joey Gallo.

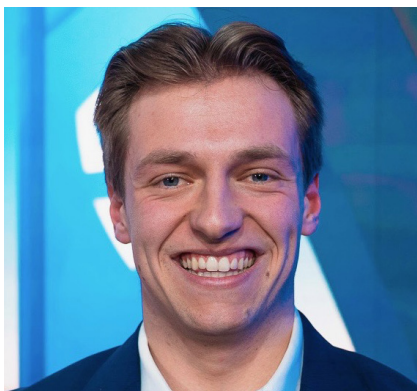
